### HOW TO WATCH/LISTEN TO PATRIOT LEAGUE FOOTBALL THIS WEEKEND

Six Patriot League football teams will be in action in Week 11 with all three games available on the Patriot League Network (PLN). Lafayette travels to Holy Cross to kick off the week of action with coverage on the PLN and Charter TV 3 beginning at Noon. Colgate hosts Fordham with a 1 p.m. kick off on the PLN and Lehigh travels to Bucknell in the Stadium Game of the Week, also beginning at 1 p.m. Matt Martucci, Dave Owens and Morgan Uber will be on the call in Lewisburg, Pa.

### LAFAYETTE'S SHOEMAKER AND HOLY CROSS'S DOBBS ADDED TO JERRY RICE WATCH LIST

Lafayette freshman quarterback Keegan Shoemaker and Holy Cross freshman linebacker Jacob Dobbs were added to the STATS FCS Jerry Rice Award Watch List, presented annually to the top rookie in the FCS. Shoemaker leads the League in passing yards (234.2 ypg), total offense (261.8 ypg) and is among the leaders in pass efficiency (131.7). Dobbs leads Holy Cross and all League freshmen in tackles (6.7 tpg) to go along with 6.0 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks.

### LEAGUE FOOTBALL PROGRAMS PLACE AMONG NCAA LEADERS IN GRADUATION RATE REPORT

Patriot League football had five of its seven programs finish with a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) score of more than 90 percent, including Georgetown (97), Holy Cross (97), Lafayette (97) Bucknell (91) and Colgate (91). Each of the League's seven programs posted Federal Graduation Rate (FGR) scores of more than 70 percent, including Georgetown (88), Holy Cross (84), Colgate (80), Bucknell (78), Lafayette (76), Fordham (74) and Lehigh (73). Overall, the Patriot League led all conferences in the FGR.

## PATRIOT LEAGUE NOTEBOOK (WEEK ELEVEN)

### ZAYTHAN HILL RUNS INTO PATRIOT LEAGUE RECORD BOOK

Lehigh freshman running back Zaythan Hill's 94-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter against Fordham on Oct. 19 broke the Patriot League record for the longest run from scrimmage. The previous record of 92 yards was shared by Fordham's Carlton Koonce (2012) and Lehigh's Ronald Jean (1998) and Rabih Abdullah (1994). Lafayette freshman running back Jaden Sutton also had an 86-yard touchdown rush in Week 8, the second longest of the season.

### PATRIOT LEAGUE DEFENDERS TOP FCS ACTIVE LEADERS IN TFLS

The Patriot League boasts four of the top six FCS active leaders in tackles for loss per game, led by Fordham sophomore linebacker Ryan Greenhagen, a three-time League defensive player of the week this season. Junior linebacker and teammate Glenn Cunningham is second in the nation after leading the Patriot League and placing fourth in the FCS with 21.5 tackles for loss in 2018. Bucknell junior linebacker Simeon Page has 30.5 TFL's in 24 career games and stands fourth. Preseason Player of the Year Nick Wheeler, a senior defensive lineman at Colgate, has 50.0 TFL's in 40 games for the Raiders' defense.

### PAGE AND WHEELER ATOP FCS ACTIVE SACK LEADERS LIST

Wheeler became Colgate's career leader in sacks, passing Georgetown alum Alec May for fifth in League history and fifth among active FCS players with 29.5 career sacks, after posting 2.0 vs. Bucknell. He is sixth among active FCS players in career sacks per game with 0.80. Page recorded 3.0 sacks against Colgate and is third among active FCS players with 0.80 sacks per game. The Bison junior linebacker has recorded 19.5 sacks for a loss of 145 yards in 24 career games. Lafayette sophomore defensive lineman Malik Hamm, the 2018 Patriot League Rookie of the Year, has 13.0 sacks in 20 career games.

### ALEX PECHIN ATOP ACTIVE FCS PUNT AVERAGE LEADER LIST

Bucknell multi-year All-American punter Alex Pechin is averaging 49.0 yards per punt through eight games in 2019. The fifth-year punter has 26 punts of 50 yards or more with 22 inside the opposing 20-yard line. Pechin has been among the FCS's best at shifting field position, leading all active FCS punters with a 44.6 yards per punt average during his career in Lewisburg, Pa. Georgetown senior Brad Hurst is 16th among active FCS punters averaging, 41.4 yards per punt on 195 career attempts.

### GEORGETOWN'S DEFENSE AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

Georgetown is fourth among FCS teams in scoring defense, allowing just 15.4 points per game during their 5-4 start. The Hoyas are also sixth in the FCS in total defense, limiting opponents to 296.8 yards per game. The Hoyas have also been among the most opportunistic teams in the nation, holding a +0.78 turnover margin through nine games. Defensive backs Micah McNeil, Jonathan Honore and Delano Salgado, along with linebacker Justin Fonteneaux are tied for second the League lead with two interceptions apiece.

### LEHIGH PUTTING PRESSURE ON OPPOSING BACKFIELDS

Lehigh's defense ranks 21st in DI FCS in team sacks at 2.75 per game and 26th in team tackles for loss per game with 7.3. Senior linebacker Keith Woetzel is fourth in the nation in sacks (1.06 spg) and 28th in tackles for loss (1.4 tflpg). Junior defensive lineman Erik Slater is 17th in the FCS with 1.6 TFLs per game.

### WOETZEL EARNED STATS FCS NATIONAL DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Lehigh senior linebacker Keith Woetzel was named the STATS FCS National Defensive Player of the Week for his 15-tackle, 4.0-sack and one-interception performance against Fordham in Week 8. He is the second League player to earn national weekly accolades, joining Lafayette freshman QB Keegan Shoemaker, the Week 3 rookie of the week. Woetzel is first in the League and third among FCS players in tackles (12.0 tpg). He also leads all active FCS players in career solo tackles per game (6.00) and fourth in career total tackles per game (8.63).

### LAFAYETTE'S SHOEMAKER TOPS 500 YARDS TOTAL OFFENSE

Lafayette freshman quarterback Keegan Shoemaker received the STATS FCS National Rookie of the Week accolades on Sept. 16, following his record-breaking performance in the Leopards' loss vs. Sacred Heart. Shoemaker, who was also named the Patriot League Offensive Player and Rookie of the Week, became the first quarterback in League history to throw for more than 400 yards and rush for more than 100 yards in a single game. His 535 yards of total offense also broke a single-game Lafayette program record.

### TWO FORMER PATRIOT LEAGUERS SELECTED IN 2020 XFL DRAFT

Former Fordham offensive lineman Anthony Coyle and former Holy Cross offensive lineman Jimmy Murray were both selected in the 2020 XFL Draft this week. Coyle was selected by the New York Guardians in the fourth round with the No. 26 selection in the offensive line phase of the draft. Murray went to the St. Louis BattleHawks with the No. 62 pick in the eighth-round. Murray has been playing on the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad this season.

### SIX LEAGUE PLAYERS NAMED STATS FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Six Patriot League football student-athletes were recognized when STATS FCS named its 2019 Preseason All-America Teams. Bucknell fifth-year punter Alex Pechin and Colgate senior defensive lineman Nick Wheeler are first-team selections. Raiders' senior defensive back Abu Daramy-Swaray received a spot on the second team. Colgate senior offensive lineman Jack Badovinac and Georgetown senior defensive lineman Christian Tate placed on the third team.

### THREE NAMED TO 2019 FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Bucknell fifth-year Alex Pechin, Fordham junior Andrew Mevis and Georgetown senior Brad Hurst have been named to 2019 FCS Punter of the Year Watchlist. Pechin, a two-time All-American, finished third in the FCS with a 45.1-yard punting average in 2018. Mevis, a three-time Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week last season, averaged 41.3 yards per punt with a long of 70 yards. Hurst averaged 40.8 yards per punt and had 18 punts of 50 or more yards in 2018. The inaugural FCS Punter of the Year Award is sponsored by the Augusta Sports Council, the group that selects the FBS Ray Guy Award.

## PATRIOT LEAGUE NOTEBOOK (WEEK ELEVEN)

### THREE NAMED CAMPBELL TROPHY SEMIFINALISTS

Bucknell fifth-year punter Alex Pechin, Colgate senior placekicker Chris Puzzi and Holy Cross senior tight end Derek Mountain were named among the 185 semifinalists for the 30th Annual William V. Campbell Trophy, presented to college football's top student-athlete. To be eligible, a student-athlete must be a senior or graduate student with a 3.2 cumulative grade point average (GPA), have outstanding football ability and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

### WHEELER AND DARAMY-SWARAY NAMED TO BUCHANAN WATCH LIST

Colgate senior defensive lineman Nick Wheeler and senior cornerback Abu Daramy-Swaray were among the 25 nominees named to the STATS FCS Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The award is presented annually to the defensive player of the year in college football's Division I championship subdivision. Wheeler recorded 17.0 tackles for loss (TFL) and 9.0 sacks to finish among the League's leaders in 2018. Daramy-Swaray, a two-time First Team All-Patriot League selection has posted five career interceptions in Colgate's secondary.

### BRENNEMAN NAMED TO WALTER PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

Colgate junior quarterback Grant Breneman was named to the STATS FCS Walter Payton Award Watch List, presented to the FCS's offensive player of the year. Breneman led the Patriot League in pass efficiency (133.6), completing 126-of-204 pass attempts for 1,605 yards and six touchdowns with four interceptions in 10 games during the 2018 season. The Patriot League has had two previous football student-athletes win the Walter Payton Award, both Colgate running backs Kenny Gamble (1987) and Jamaal Branch (2003).

### PATRIOT LEAGUERS IN THE PROS

Seven former Patriot League student-athletes are playing in NFL organizations this season. Patriot League career rushing and scoring leader Chase Edmonds (Fordham, RB, '18), was a fourth-round pick by the Arizona Cardinals in the 2018 NFL Draft and is second on the depth chart with the Cardinals. Miami Dolphins offensive lineman Julien Davenport (Bucknell, OL, '17), a fourth-round selection by the Houston Texans in the 2017 draft, is listed atop the Dolphins' depth chart at left tackle. Davenport and Edmonds were taken in consecutive NFL Drafts, the first time League players have been selected in back-to-back years since 1988 and 1989 when a total of four players over two years were selected.

Five more former League stars are with NFL teams, including Bucknell defensive lineman Abdullah Anderson, the 2017 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year, who has been shuttled between the Chicago Bears active roster and practice squad. Former Colgate receiver Thomas Ives is on the Bears practice squad. Holy Cross offensive lineman Jimmy Murray is on the Kansas City Chiefs' practice squad and Crusaders receiver Kalif Raymond recently signed to the practice squad with the Tennessee Titans. Fordham defensive back Dylan Mabin is with the Oakland Raiders' practice squad.

### PECHIN NAMED LEAGUE MALE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

Bucknell football's Alex Pechin was named the 2018-19 Patriot League Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year. The award is presented annually to one female and one male Patriot League student-athlete. Candidates for the honor were previously named the scholar-athlete of the year in their respective sports. Pechin is the third football student-athlete to be recognized as the scholar-athlete of the year, joining David Bernardino (Bucknell, 1993) and Nick Martucci (Lehigh, 1999).

### TOM GILMORE RETURNS TO LEHIGH AS HEAD COACH

Tom Gilmore was named Lehigh football's head coach following the University's extensive search. Gilmore spent 14 seasons as head coach at Holy Cross, where he was a two-time Patriot League Coach of the Year and led the Crusaders to a Patriot League Championship and FCS Playoff appearance in 2009. His 72 victories rank second in Holy Cross history, including a 41-40 Patriot League record. Before his tenure in Worcester, Mass., Gilmore spent four seasons as the Mountain Hawks' defensive coordinator, helping the program to a 39-9 record and League titles in 2000 and 2001. He was named the AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year following the 2001 season when the program ranked fifth nationally in rushing defense and 12th in scoring defense.

### DAVE CECCHINI NAMED BUCKNELL FOOTBALL HEAD COACH

Dave Cecchini, who had a historic playing career as a wide receiver at Lehigh, was named the 27th Bob Odell Head Football Coach at Bucknell University. Most recently the head coach at Valparaiso University, Cecchini has a long track record of building explosive offenses at elite academic institutions. Cecchini served as offensive coordinator at Lehigh, The Citadel and Harvard University, where his offensive units have broken numerous school records, to help guide his teams to a combined seven conference championships. He was an All-American wide receiver at Lehigh during his playing days in the early 1990s and spent 13 of his 24 seasons as a coach at his alma mater.

### LEAGUE JOINS SIX-CONFERENCE OFFICIATING ALLIANCE

Jeff Cooney was named the Supervisor of Football Officials for the Patriot League and Ivy League in February. Cooney will serve in the role and work with the six-conference officiating alliance that will include the American Athletic Conference (AAC), Big South, Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), Ivy and Patriot Leagues. Cooney will assign officials for the Patriot League and Ivy League in addition to working with League coaches and institutions to evaluate game performances weekly during the season and communicate rules changes and interpretations. The alliance will enable all six conferences to work together on a wide range of officiating matters, including scheduling, training, development, recruitment, retention and evaluation. The long-term mission of the alliance is to increase proficiency and consistency among veteran officials across the collegiate football officiating landscape and to facilitate the entry of younger officials into the profession.

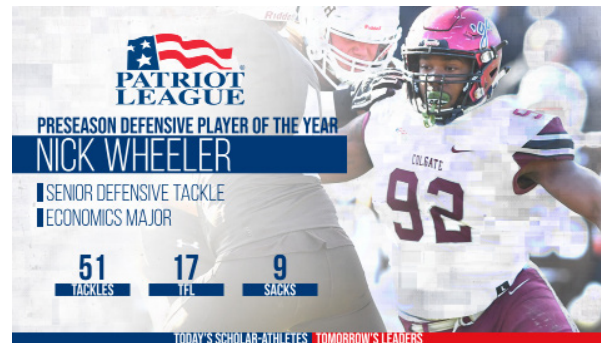

\*Breneman led the Patriot League in pass efficiency (133.6), completing 126-of-204 pass attempts for 1,605 yards and six touchdowns with four interceptions in 10 games during the 2018 season.

\*With Breneman behind center the Raiders' offense led the Patriot League's in scoring offense (27.0), total offense (344.3), time of possession (32:57) and committed the fewest turnovers (11).

\*The two-time All-Patriot League selection also rushed for 307 yards and seven touchdowns on 132 carries, while finishing third in the League in total offense per game (191.2).

\*Wheeler finished second in the Patriot League in sacks (9.0) and tackles for loss (17.0), while compiling 51 tackles in 12 games during the 2018 season.

\*The two-time First Team All-Patriot League selection helped the Raiders' defense tie an NCAA FCS record with five shutouts and lead the nation in total defense (237.7) and scoring defense (9.3) in 2018.

\*Wheeler enters the 2019 season ranked among active FCS student-athletes in career sacks per game (2nd, 0.78), career sacks (3rd, 23.5) and career tackles for loss per game (3rd, 1.22).

### RAIDERS PLACE A LEAGUE-HIGH 10 ON THE PRESEASON ALL-LEAGUE TEAM

Breneman and Wheeler were among Colgate's League-leading 10 student-athletes named to the 29-member Preseason All-Patriot League squad. Georgetown received seven spots on the preseason team, while Lafayette earned four selections. Holy Cross placed three student-athletes on the team, Bucknell and Fordham had two apiece and Lehigh had one member.

Overall, 25 of the 29 Preseason All-Patriot League selections were named first- or second-team All-League in 2018. Nine of the 13 preseason selections on offense were named to the 2018 All-League team, while Colgate senior offensive lineman Jovaun Woolford and running back Alex Mathews, along with Georgetown senior receiver Michael Dereus were 2017 All-League picks. All 12 members of the preseason defense claimed All-League honors in 2018, led by Tate, a three-time All-League selection. Daramy-Swaray - the 2017 Patriot League Rookie of the Year - Cunningham, Page and Wheeler are all two-time All-League honorees. On special teams, all four selections made the 2018 All-League team. Bucknell's Pechin is a three-time All-League member. Daramy-Swaray, Wilson and Colgate senior placekicker Chris Puzzi are all two-time All-League picks.

## 2019-20 PATRIOT LEAGUE ATHLETICS & ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Now in its third decade as an all-sport conference combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 24 men and women's sports. Initially started as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army West Point, Boston University, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh, Loyola Maryland and Navy as full members, and Fordham, Georgetown, MIT and Richmond as associate members. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country.

The Patriot League's mission is simple: to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society. During the 2018-19 academic year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams accomplished the following:

\*91 Patriot League teams (46.7 percent of League teams) earned NCAA Public Recognition Awards for ranking in the top 10 percent of their sport in Academic Progress Rate (APR), with 80 squads earning perfect scores.

\*The Patriot League ranked second among all conferences in Public Recognition Awards, and also placing second behind only the Ivy League for the highest percentage of teams earning the honor at 46.7 percent.

\*The League's 96 percent graduation success rate (GSR) is the second-best mark in the nation, finishing in the top-two in each year since the rating has been released in 2013. All 10 member schools were at 90 percent or higher, each exceeding the record-high national GSR of 88 percent. In addition the League's 84 percent Federal Graduation Rate (FGR) places it as the national leader for the sixth-consecutive year.

\*Loyola Maryland's Kristen Yanchoris (Women's Lacrosse) and Alex Pechin (Football) were named the Patriot League Female and Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year honorees, respectively.

\*12 student-athletes earned Google Cloud CoSIDA Academic All-America recognition, including first-team accolades for Army West Point's Lynne Mooradian (Women's Track & Field), Benjamin Petrella (Men's Track & Field), Bucknell's Jeff Gottesman (Baseball), Lafayette's Andrew Chuma and Trent Crossan (Football) and Navy's Sydney Fortson (Women's Soccer), Zach Piedt (Swimming), Stefano Pineda (Track & Field) and Anne Richter (Women's Lacrosse). Second-team honorees include Army West Point's Anthony Giachin (Baseball) and Navy's Patricia Mattingly (Volleyball) with Third-team recipient Conor Gaffney (Men's Lacrosse).

\*41 Patriot League student-athletes received Google Cloud/CoSIDA Academic All-District recognition.

\*There were a Patriot League record 3,123 student-athletes named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in 2018-19, besting the previous record, set in 2017-18, by 112 members.

\*Colgate's Regine Cooper (Women's Track & Field) and Holy Cross's Declan Cronin (Baseball) each received the Patriot League Award of Outstanding Leadership and Character.

\*Lehigh's Sam Benchehib (Men's Tennis) and Navy's Anne Richter (Women's Lacrosse) were named the League's Sportsmanship Award winners.

\*American's Rafaela Rubas (Field Hockey) and Loyola Maryland's Kristen Yanchoris (Women's Lacrosse) were the League's nominees for the NCAA Woman of the Year award.

\*Loyola Maryland's Pat Spencer (Men's Lacrosse) became the second Patriot League student-athlete to win the Tewaaron Award (nation's top men's lacrosse player). He was also a finalist in 2017 and 2018. He joins Colgate's Peter Baum (2012) as the only Patriot League Tewaaron Award winner.

\*Navy won the Patriot League Presidents' Cup for the sixth-straight time and seventh in the last eight years. Army West Point won the men's standings with a record 77 points, while Boston University topped the women's standings.

\*Navy and Loyola Maryland both qualified for the 2019 NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championships, marking the second time in as many years the League received two bids to the tournament. The Mids and Greyhounds both won their first-round matchups.

\*Also winning NCAA Tournament contests in 2018-19 were Colgate football and men's soccer, and Loyola Maryland men's lacrosse. Overall the Patriot League collected five NCAA tournament victories this season.

\*Colgate football received the Lambert Cup presented to the top FCS team in the East by the Metropolitan New York Football Writers. The Raiders ranked No. 7/8 in the final polls after advancing to the FCS Playoff Quarterfinals. Colgate tied an NCAA FCS record with five shutouts and led the nation in total defense (237.7) and scoring defense (9.3).

\*Eight Patriot League football student-athletes were named to the 2018 FCS ADA Academic All-Star Team, including Bucknell senior Alex Pechin, Colgate senior Dillon Delulius and junior Chris Puzzi, Holy Cross seniors Ryan Brady and Martin Dorsey, Lafayette seniors Andrew Chuma and Trent Crossan and Lehigh senior Harrison Kauffman.

\*Five Patriot League student-athletes were members of the Senior CLASS Award teams; men's lacrosse - Johnny Surdick (Army West Point, 1st team), Craig Chick (Lehigh, 1st), Pat Spencer (Loyola Maryland, 2nd) and Jacob Stover (Loyola Maryland, 2nd) and men's soccer - Mark Forrest (Lehigh, 1st).

\*A pair of Patriot League women's basketball student-athletes - Bucknell's Kaitlyn Slagus and Colgate's Summer King - are recipients of the Victory Scholarship for the 2019-20 to attend graduate school in Ireland and Northern Ireland. Twenty Patriot League graduates have participated in the program.

\*30 Patriot Leaguers were All-America selections, with first-team status for Bucknell's Alex Pechin (Football), Boston University's Ally Hammel (Field Hockey), Army West Point's Johnny Surdick and Loyola Maryland's Pat Spencer, Jacob Stover (Men's Lacrosse), Livy Rosenzweig (Women's Lacrosse) and Noah Song (Baseball).

\*The Patriot League had five student-athletes selected in the 2019 Major League Baseball Draft with Lehigh's Levi Stoudt (97th overall) and Navy's Noah Song (137th overall) being selected on the second day. The 2019 draft marks the first time that two Patriot Leaguers were selected in the top-200. Former Lafayette pitcher David Bednar made his Major League debut with the San Diego Padres in September.

\*Eight Patriot Leaguers were selected in the Major League Lacrosse (MLL) Draft, with four in the top-20, including Loyola Maryland's Pat Spencer, Navy's Grayson Torain, Lehigh's Craig Chick and Army West Point's Johnny Surdick. Three League student-athletes were picked in the inaugural Premier Lacrosse League (PLL) Draft, with Spencer taken with the first-overall selection. Loyola Maryland's Taylor VanThof and Lindsey Ehrhardt were picked in the 2019 Women's Professional Lacrosse League (WPLL) Draft. First-Year Player Draft and Lehigh forward Mark Forrest was taken in the Major League Soccer (MLS) SuperDraft.
