Game Storylines

- Pitt seeks its first ACC win when it faces Coastal Division foe Duke this Saturday at Wallace Wade Stadium. Both teams are looking to get back on the winning track. In their most recent outings, the Panthers lost to nationally ranked NC State, 35-17, while the Blue Devils fell to Florida State, 17-10.
- Pitt and Duke square off annually as members of the Coastal Division. The Panthers are 3-1 against the Blue Devils in ACC play and triumphed at Heinz Field last year, 56-14.
- Duke's lone win during this recent stretch was a two-overtime 51-48 decision in Pittsburgh during the 2014 season. In ACC play, the Panthers are 2-0 in Durham.
- Pitt's original starting quarterback, senior graduate transfer Max Browne, is out for the season due to an injury sustained at Syracuse (Oct. 7). In his absence, the Panthers' top two signal callers are sophomore Ben DiNucci and freshman Kenny Pickett.

- DiNucci has played in six games this year with two starts. He has completed 57% of his passes (55 of 97) for 612 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions. Pickett, who made his college debut two games ago at Syracuse, has thrown for 74 yards on 6-of-14 passing (43%).
- The Panthers will be significantly challenged by a Duke defense that ranks 19th nationally in fewest yards allowed (312.9 yards per game) and 16th in rushing defense (108 yards per game).
- Pitt is 2-5 for the first time since the 2001 season. The 2001 Panthers began the year 1-5 but rallied with six consecutive wins (including a bowl victory) to finish 7-5.
- Among the 22 starting positions listed in Pitt's probable lineup, only six are occupied by seniors (four on offense and two defense). One of those seniors is listed as a co-starter with an underclassman (at defensive end).

 $\sqrt{\text{Pat Narduzzi}}$ has directed Pitt to eight regular-season wins in each of his first two years, something the Panthers had not achieved since 2008-09.

 $\sqrt{\ }$ In his first two seasons, Narduzzi fashioned a 16-10 overall mark (11-5 in the ACC). The last Pitt coach to achieve as many victories in his first two years was the late Serafino "Foge" Fazio, who went 17-6-1 over his initial two seasons in 1982-83.

 $\sqrt{}$ In ACC annals, Narduzzi became only the fifth man to begin his head coaching career with at least eight wins in each of his first two seasons. The others are Charley Pell of Clemson (1977-78), Ralph Friedgen of Maryland (2001-02), Jeff Jagodzinski of Boston College (2007-08) and Jimbo Fisher of Florida State (2010-11).

 $\sqrt{\ }$ In 2016, Pitt was the only school to have wins over two teams that finished in the top 5 of the final College Football Playoff rankings. The Panthers gave No. 2 Clemson—the eventual national champion—its only loss (43-42) and kept No. 5 Penn State out of the playoff field by defeating the Nittany Lions, 42-39.

 $\sqrt{\ }$ In 2016, Quadree Henderson earned consensus All-America status as a return specialist after leading the country in kickoff return touchdowns (three) and combined kick return yards (1,166). Additionally, guard Dorian Johnson, now of the Arizona Cardinals, was a first team All-American.

 $\sqrt{\ }$ In his debut campaign at Pitt in 2015, Narduzzi led the Panthers to an 8-4 regular-season record, their best 12-game mark since 2009, and a Military Bowl invitation. Pitt finished as the runner-up in the ACC Coastal Division with a 6-2 mark, its best conference record ever.

 $\sqrt{}$ Pitt boasted the ACC's top offensive and defensive newcomers in 2015. Safety Jordan Whitehead was named the league's Overall and Defensive Rookie of the Year. Tailback Qadree Ollison was named the Offensive Rookie of the Year following a 1,000-yard rushing campaign.

√ Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight highly successful years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State under Mark Dantonio. The Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14.

 $\sqrt{\rm Michigan}$ State boasted the nation's top rushing defense in 2014, yielding just 88.5 yards per game. The Spartans finished third nationally with 34 turnovers gained and eighth in total defense, holding opponents to just 315.8 yards per contest.

√ In 2014, the Spartans finished with a No. 5 national ranking and 11-2 record following a stirring 42-41 victory over Baylor in the AT&T Cotton Bowl. Narduzzi's defense shut out the high-scoring Bears in the fourth quarter, opening the

door for 21 unanswered points by Michigan State in one of the most thrilling games of the 2014-15 bowl season.

 $\sqrt{}$ In 2013, Michigan State finished No. 3 in the country following a Big Ten title and 24-20 victory over No. 5 Stanford in the Rose Bowl. In the wake of that championship season, Narduzzi was named the 2013 recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.

 $\sqrt{\mbox{Narduzzi}}$ tutored an impressive list of decorated defensive players at Michigan State, including first team All-Americans in cornerback Darqueze Dennard, safety Kurtis Drummond, linebacker Greg Jones and defensive tackle Jerel Worthy. Dennard was a unanimous All-American in 2013, becoming the first Michigan State cornerback to earn that distinction. He also was the school's first winner of the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to college football's top defensive back.

 $\sqrt{}$ Dennard was a first-round NFL Draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 2014, the first Spartans defensive back taken in the initial round since 1961. In the 2015 draft, another Narduzzi pupil, Michigan State cornerback Trae Waynes, was a first-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings.

 $\sqrt{\text{Prior to Michigan State, Narduzzi spent three}}$ years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Dantonio at Cincinnati, helping the Bearcats to a pair of bowl invitations.

 $\sqrt{\mbox{In 2003}}$, Narduzzi was the defensive coordinator at Miami of Ohio under the late Terry Hoeppner. The RedHawks stormed to a 13-1 record that season, capturing the Mid-American Conference championship and defeating nationally ranked Louisville in the GMAC Bowl to finish No. 10 in the Associated Press poll.

√ Narduzzi served as linebackers coach at Northern Illinois for three seasons (2000-02). NIU won a pair of MAC divisional titles during his tenure and in 2002 had the league's top rushing defense. From 1993-99, Narduzzi coached at his alma mater, Rhode Island, serving as the Rams' defensive coordinator his final two seasons. He began his coaching career at Miami of Ohio, working as a graduate assistant in 1990 and 1991, before earning his first full-time position as receivers coach for the 1992 season.

 $\sqrt{\mbox{Narduzzi}}$ was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.

 $\sqrt{}$ Bill Narduzzi was head coach at YSU from 1975-85. He led the Penguins to two NCAA Division II playoff appearances, including the national championship game in 1979, and twice was named the Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year.



SERIES NOTES

This is the 22nd meeting between Pitt and Duke in a series that dates back to 1929...it is also the fifth Atlantic Coast Conference matchup between the two schools...Pitt and Duke meet annually as members of the ACC's Coastal Division...the Panthers lead the overall series, 12-9, and have won six of the past seven meetings...Pitt leads the ACC series, 3-1, and triumphed at Heinz Field last year, 56-14... in the last game played in Durham (2015), the Panthers claimed a 31-13 decision...in 2014, Duke defeated Pitt at Heinz Field, 51-48, in two overtimes...that marked the Blue Devils' first victory over the Panthers since 1966, snapping a four-game series losing streak... there have been some milestone moments in the Pitt-Duke series...on Sept. 29, 1951, Duke defeated Pitt, 19-14, in the first live nationwide telecast of a sporting event...NBC was responsible for the landmark broadcast...the inaugural game of the series was on Oct. 5, 1929, when Pitt defeated host Duke, 52-7, in the first game ever played at "Duke Outdoor Stadium," later renamed Wallace Wade Stadium... the 1937 and 1938 games featured two of the nation's very best teams and a pair of legendary coaches in Pitt's Jock Sutherland and Duke's Wallace Wade...on Nov. 27, 1937, the No.1-ranked Panthers defeated the No. 18 Blue Devils, 10-0...Pitt would finish 9-0-1 to claim the national title (Duke finished 7-2-1)...on Nov. 26, 1938, the No. 3 Blue Devils blanked the No. 4 Panthers, 7-0, in what would be Sutherland's final game as Pitt's coach...Duke finished the 1938 regular season unbeaten (9-0), untied and unscored upon, but lost to Southern California in the Rose Bowl, 7-3...Pitt, which did not go to a bowl, finished 8-2.

TEAM NOTES

PITT PENALTY PROFICIENCY

Pitt is doing an exceptional job at limiting penalties this season. The Panthers lead the ACC in fewest penalties per game (3.43), rank second in fewest total penalties (24) and are third in fewest penalty yards (231) and fewest penalty yards per game (33.00).

Pitt also boasts lofty national rankings in these categories as well. Pitt is second among all FBS schools in fewest penalties per game, sixth in fewest penalty yards per game, seventh in fewest penalties and 14th in fewest penalty yards.

LAUNDRY-FREE GAME

The Panthers did not incur a single penalty in its season-opening victory over Youngstown State. It marked the first time since a 21-14 win at Louisville on Nov. 12, 2011 that the Panthers went through a game penalty free.

RANK AND FILE

Pitt's 2017 schedule features five teams ranked in this week's Top 25 polls: Penn State (rated No. 2 by both the Associated Press and coaches), Miami (No. 8/7), Oklahoma State (No. 10/11), Virginia Tech (No. 14/14) and NC State (No. 16/17).

TRUE FROSH HIT THE FIELD

Six true freshmen have played for Pitt this season: long snapper Cal Adomitis, running back A.J. Davis, cornerback Damarri Mathis, quarterback Kenny Pickett, cornerback Jason Pinnock and tight end Tyler Sear.

MORE FRESH FACES

A further illustration of Pitt's youth is the number of redshirt freshmen who have played this season. A total of 15 redshirt frosh have made their collegiate debuts for the Panthers in 2017. Five of those players (center Jimmy Morrissey, cornerback Therran Coleman, safety Bricen Garner and defensive linemen Keyshon Camp and Rashad Weaver) have started.

YOUR 2017 PITT TEAM CAPTAINS

As selected by their teammates, the captains for the 2017 Panthers are senior quarterback Max Browne, junior safety Dennis Briggs, senior cornerback Avonte Maddox and senior wide receiver Jester Weah

Browne, a graduate transfer from USC, owns the distinction of also being elected a captain last season for the Trojans.

CLOSE SHAVES

Under Pat Narduzzi, the Panthers have a winning record in close contests. Narduzzi has directed Pitt to a 9-8 record in games decided by single digits. In contrast, the Panthers were 1-5 in single-digit contests in 2014, the year before Narduzzi's arrival. From 2010-14, Pitt was 8-17 in such games.

128 YEARS AND COUNTING

The 2017 campaign marks the 128th football season in Pitt history. The Panthers, who played their inaugural season in 1890, have a 714-525-42 all-time record (.574). The program's rich legacy includes 92 first team All-Americans, 24 College Football Hall of Famers, eight Pro Football Hall of Famers and nine national titles.



OFFENSIVE NOTES

SOPHOMORE ELDER STATESMAN

Sophomore Ben DiNucci is now the most experienced active quarterback on Pitt's roster. Original senior starter Max Browne was ruled out for the season after sustaining an injury at Syracuse on Oct. 7.

DiNucci has played in seven career games, including six this season. He has two starts under his belt: Sept. 23 at Georgia Tech and Oct. 14 against NC State.

On the season, DiNucci has completed 57% of his passes (55 of 97) for 612 yards with three touchdowns and three interceptions. He has also rushed for a touchdown and thrown a 2-point conversion pass (both at Penn State).

PICKETT ENTERS ACTIVE DUTY

Freshman quarterback Kenny Pickett, who enrolled at Pitt in January, has played in each of the past two contests and served as the top backup when the Panthers faced NC State last week.

On the season he has thrown for 74 yards on 6-of-14 passing (43%). Pickett has additionally run for 18 yards on four carries.

BROWNE'S BIG DAY

Max Browne had the most prolific game of his collegiate career in Pitt's 42-10 victory over Rice on Sept. 30.

Browne hit 88% of his passes (28 of 32) for 410 yards and four touchdowns with zero interceptions. He was 14 of 16 for 247 yards in the first half with the two incompletions coming on drops. Browne had a third incompletion due to a drop in the second half.

Browne's passing yardage was the highest by a Pitt player since Tom Savage threw for 424 at Duke on Sept. 21, 2013. Additionally, Browne's 28 completions were the most at Pitt since Savage also threw 28 at Syracuse on Nov. 23, 2013.

RARE COMPANY

Max Browne is one of only nine players in Pitt football history to throw for more than 400 yards. Prior to Browne's 410-yard passing effort against Rice, the last Panther to achieve the feat was Tom Savage, who threw for 424 against Duke in 2013.

Overall, Browne's 410 passing yards rank eighth all-time in Pitt annals.

Pitt followed its Clemson upset with a resounding 56-14 win over Duke...the 42-point margin of victory was Pitt's largest in an ACC game, eclipsing a 23-point win over Syracuse in 2014 (30-7)...it was the Panthers' biggest win over an FBS foe since a 45-point victory at UCF in 2006 (52-7)...James Conner rushed for 101 yards and two touchdowns, breaking a pair of ACC career records in the process... Pitt returns a 1,000-yard rusher for 2017 in junior Qadree Ollison, who netted 1,121 in 2015 en route to earning ACC Offensive Rookie of the Year honors. Ollison will attempt to become just the sixth player in Pitt history to achieve multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons.

The last player to accomplish the feat was James Conner, who had 1,092 yards in 2016 and 1,765 yards in 2014. The other Panthers in this elite group are Tony Dorsett (four from 1973-76), Curvin Richards (1988-89), LeSean McCoy (2007-08) and Dion Lewis (2009-10).

Through six games this year, Ollison has a team-high 266 yards on 65 carries.

O'NEILL FINDS THE END ZONE

Brian O'Neill has started 32 consecutive games at tackle for the Panthers. However, the junior's contributions have gone beyond the conventional duties of an offensive lineman.

In addition to paving the way for Pitt's backs, he actually is highly effective carrying the ball himself, evidenced by his three career carries for 39 yards (13.0 avg.) and two touchdowns.

O'Neill was showcased as a ball carrier again this past week against NC State when he took a throwback lateral 10 yards to the cusp of the goal line. One play later, tailback Darrin Hall plunged in from a yard out to make it 14-14.

In 2016, O'Neill carried the ball twice and scored touchdowns each time. His initial carry came on a throwback lateral that went for a 24-yard TD in the Panthers' 37-34 win over Georgia Tech. O'Neill reached the end zone again on an end-around play against Virginia Tech that resulted in a five-yard score. He had two carries for 29 yards on the year (14.5 avg.) and even threw two passes (both incomplete).

Originally a tight end who moved to tackle during the 2015 offseason, O'Neill's unconventional contributions earned him SB Nation's 2016 "Piesman Trophy," the only award in college football that honors offensive and defensive linemen who run, pass or catch the ball. He was also a 2016 All-ACC selection at tackle by the coaches (second team) and media (third team).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

HOT TURNOVERS

The Panthers' youthful defense has collected 11 turnovers this season. That total ranks second in the ACC and 39th nationally.

Pitt has an ACC-best five fumble recoveries on the year. The Panthers rank 35th nationally in total fumble recoveries. Five different players have recoveries this season: linebacker Oluwaseun Idowu, cornerback Avonte Maddox, safety Jordan Whitehead, linebacker Jalen Williams and cornerback Jason Pinnock.

Pitt has also intercepted six passes. That total ranks fourth in the ACC and 47th nationally. Cornerback Dane Jackson has a team-high two picks this year. Other Panthers to record interceptions this season are Maddox, safety Dennis Briggs, safety Bricen Garner and safety Damar Hamlin.

WHITEHEAD A TWO-WAY TERROR

Junior Jordan Whitehead is a two-time All-ACC performer at safety. His impact, however, has not been limited to defense during his career.

Whitehead has moonlighted as an occasional offensive player and this season is the Panthers' second-leading rusher with 150 yards on 18 carries (8.3 avg.). He has one touchdown (a 35-yard run at Syracuse) and also a 2-point conversion rush (also against the Orange).

During the 2016 season, he rushed for 98 yards on nine carries (10.9 avg.). That year he was actually a starter on both sides of the ball in the Panthers' 45-31 win at Virginia.

For his career, Whitehead has 39 carries for 370 yards (9.5 avg.) and three scores.

STRONG SENIOR YEAR FOR WINSLOW

Punter Ryan Winslow is performing like an All-ACC specialist in his final collegiate season. The senior is averaging a career-best 44.8 yards on 36 punts. His average ranks 18th nationally and fourth in the ACC.

Winslow has dropped 10 punts inside the 20-yard line, while 16 of his punts have resulted in a fair catch.

HENDERSON TAKES IT TO THE HOUSE

Junior all-purpose standout Quadree Henderson had an 80-yard punt return touchdown at Georgia Tech (Sept. 23). It marked Henderson's second career punt return touchdown and his sixth return for a score overall. He also owns four kickoff return TDs during his career. Henderson's 80-yard punt return touchdown was Pitt's longest since Jay Jones' 84-yarder against Syracuse in 1993.

NCAA MARK IN SIGHT

With six career kick return touchdowns, Quadree Henderson is in striking distance of the NCAA record of eight. The national mark is held by nine different players: Cliff Branch, Colorado, 1970-71 (6 punts, 2 kickoffs); Johnny Rodgers, Nebraska, 1970-72 (7 punts, 1 kickoff); Derek Abney, Kentucky, 2000-03 (6 punts, 2 kickoffs); Chad Owens, Hawaii, 2001-04 (6 punts, 2 kickoffs); C.J. Spiller, Clemson, 2006-09 (1 punt, 7 kickoffs); Phillip Livas, Louisiana Tech, 2007-10 (4 punts, 4 kickoffs); Adoree' Jackson, Southern California, 2014-16 (4 punts, 4 kickoffs); Janarion Grant, Rutgers, 2013-present (3 punts, 5 kickoffs); Dante Pettis, Washington, 2014-present (8 punts).

SETTING A HIGH BAR

Quadree Henderson was a 2016 consensus All-American as a return specialist. Henderson led the nation last season with a school-record three kickoff return touchdowns. He also had a punt return for a score in 2016. Henderson is the first Pitt player to earn All-America status as a return specialist.

PITT PUNT RETURN TDs

Since the 2000 season, Pitt has only nine punt return touchdowns, including two by Quadree Henderson (an 80-yarder at Georgia Tech this season and 65-yarder vs. Duke in 2016). Henderson is the first Pitt player to have multiple punt return touchdowns since Darrelle Revis accomplished the feat over the 2005-06 seasons.

UNPRECEDENTED IMPACT ON RETURNS

Since the 2000 season, Pitt has just 11 kickoff returns for touchdowns and Quadree Henderson is responsible for four of them. No other Pitt player during that span has more than one.

In the Panthers' 2015 Military Bowl game against Navy, Henderson took the opening kickoff 100 yards for a score—Pitt's first 100-yard kickoff return since 1990 (Ricky Turner vs. West Virginia). Henderson had his second 100-yard return at Miami during the 2016 season.

HOME RUN HITTER

For his career, Quadree Henderson has six kickoff returns that have gone for more than 80 yards. But perhaps the most memorable return of his career was one that didn't result in a touchdown. In the Panthers' stirring 42-39 victory over Penn State in 2016, Henderson made one of the game's critical plays when he returned a kickoff 84 yards to the Nittany Lions' 10 in the fourth quarter. Three plays later James Conner scored on a shovel pass to put Pitt up 42-31, providing the winning cushion.


