- E. Division II Athletics Directors Association Maisner/Matejkovic
  The Model DII Athletic Department document will be reviewed this year. D2ADA has established a Task
  Force to review the ISSG document and make recommendations to the NCAA for modification. Updated
  the group on a mentoring program for minorities, established by D2ADA.
- F. PSAC Advisory Council Murray Reminded group that Bruce Baumgartner and Kelli Milliner represented the Athletics Administrators.
- G. Path to Graduation Task Force Bamberger
  Updated the group on the preliminary work of the DII Academic Requirements Task Force (Path to Graduation) that is reviewing initial, continuing and transfer academic requirements for Division II.
  Reviewed a handout on the initial proposals and encouraged everyone to participate in programming at the upcoming NCAA convention regarding this issue.

## V. New Business – Conference Office

A. Conference Scheduling After Expansion

The group reviewed the proposals for scheduling, a straw vote by the institutions on scheduling formats and the coaches input for sports groups that had met in the Fall.

MOTION (Condino) That for the sport of Field Hockey, the conference conduct a Single Round Robin schedule among all members sponsoring the sport, with an additional four (4) mandated contests rotated among members sponsoring to provide scheduling opportunities. A total of 14 mandated contests would be provided to the member institutions

**SECOND (J. Michaels)** 

**MOTION PASSES** 

MOTION (Condino) That for the sport of Lacrosse, the conference will conduct a Single Round Robin schedule among all members sponsoring he sport. A total of 12 mandated contests would be provided to the member institutions

SECOND (Richards)

MOTION (Matejkovic) That for the sport of Volleyball, the conference will remain in two Divisions of 8 teams each, playing a Double Round Robin within the Division. Additionally, the conference will conduct a full crossover schedule between the two Divisions, with all mandated matches counting in the respective Divisional standings.

MOTION (Matejkovic) That for the sport of Men's Soccer and Women's Soccer, the conference will continue to conduct a Single Round Robin schedule of 11 matches for men and 16 matches for women. SECOND (Richards)

MOTION (Roach) That for the sport of Baseball, the conference will continue to conduct play in two Divisions of 8 teams each, playing a four game weekend series with each team in the respective Division for 28 games.

MOTION (Condino) That for the sport of Softball, the conference will conduct play in two Divisions of 8 teams each, playing four games against each opponent in the respective Division for a total of 28 games. The games will not be conduct in a four game series format with each opponent. SECOND (Bamberger)

MOTION (Condino) That for the sport of Women's Tennis, the conference will remain in two Divisions if 7 in a Single Round Robin format within the respective Division. Additionally, a crossover of 2-3 matches will be scheduled between the two divisions in the Fall portion of the season SECOND (J. Michaels)

MOTION (Hjerpe) That for the sport of Football, the conference will remain in two Divisions of 8 teams, playing 7 Divisional contests and three mandated crossover contests SECOND (J. Michaels)

MOTION (Condino) That in the sport of Basketball, the conference will play in two Divisions with 9 teams in each Division SECOND (Heitzman)
MOTION PASSES (23-8)

MOTION (Baumgartner) That in the sport of Basketball, the conference will conduct play in a Double Round Robin within each Division (16), plus play six (6) crossover contests with the opposite Division. All 22 contests would be counted in the respective Divisional standings for determination of representation to the conference tournament.

## VII Sport Committee Reports

1. Baseball - Roach

MOTION (Roach) That in the sport of baseball, bylaw 3.1.4 of the Baseball Operating Code be amended as follows: If because of weather or other natural causes it becomes impossible to complete the mandated schedule by the 48 hours prior to the PSAC Championship, the following criteria will be used to determine the seeding:

- a. Total wins in mandated league play
- b. Total wins in head-to-head league play
- c. Total games played
- d. Total wins versus division champion
- e. Total wins of opponents in mandated league play in rank order of finish
- f. Coin toss

#### II. OUTDOOR CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

MOTION (Grant) For the Outdoor PSAC Track and Field Championships, to eliminate the women's 3,000 meters and to replace it with the men's and women's 4x800 meter relay. SECOND (Barney)

MOTION (Grant): To have the Outdoor Championship 4x800 meter relay placed at the end of Friday's track schedule and to build in 15 minutes after the conclusion of the 3,000 meter steeplechase races on Saturday for awards presentations and to clear the infield prior to the 4x400 meter relay.

## 3. Tennis – J. Michaels

MOTION (J. Michaels) That in the sport of Tennis, IUP will host the team championships in the spring of 2013. SECOND (Hjerpe)

MOTION (J. Michaels) That in the sport of Tennis, beginning in the spring of 2013, the host rotation for the team championships will be Indiana, West Chester, Bloomsburg, and Shippensburg.

#### 4. Lacrosse

MOTION (Campbell) That in the sport of Lacrosse, the site of competition will be set up and available to teams a minimum of 60 minutes prior to the scheduled contest, facilities permitting.

MOTION (Campbell) That in the sport of Lacrosse, beginning in 2013-14, home teams are required to film conference contests and exchange tapes (or exchange digitally) within three business days, unless declined by the visiting team.

MOTION (Campbell) That in the sport of Lacrosse, each team will be permitted a total of 38 personnel in the bench area at conference championship. No more than 6 non-uniformed personnel are permitted in the bench area. Medical personnel are excluded from the bench personnel limit, i.e. ATC, student-trainers, physicians LACK OF SECOND

MOTION (Campbell) That in the sport of Lacrosse, each player's all-conference nomination will only include pertinent conference only statistics for voting consideration.

## 5. Softball - Decker

MOTION (Decker) That in the sport of Softball, a 10-team championship takes place if the two division alignment is chosen.

LACK OF SECOND

MOTION (Decker) That in the sport of Softball, all 16 teams will go to the championships. LACK OF SECOND

There was a discussion regarding the non-completion of a Football Contest and the policies regarding counting that contest in the conference standings. The following motion was adopted for emergency purposes until coaches could review it and make other recommendations, if needed

MOTION (Bamberger) That in the sport of Football, if a contest is suspended under Rule 3.3.3.a-b, before the end of the fourth period has concluded and cannot be resumed, the following policy will apply

- 1) If the game can not be resumed the following day, and less than one half of play has been concluded, the game shall be declared a "no contest"
- 2) If one half or more of play has been concluded, the score of the time of suspension shall be determined as the final score.

# 10. Soccer – Kauffman and McFarland

There was discussion regarding the splitting of the men's and women's schedules into separate entities due to what can be a sporadic schedule for the men's teams when scheduling of doubleheaders among men's and womens' teams from the same schools is a priority.

There were no motions. The conference took the scheduling dilemma under advisement and adapted the schedule to accommodate some of the concerns in scheduling.

Institution's will review the costs associated with split schedules to determine if future schedules should be completely split.

## 12. Athletic Trainers - Gioglio

Alerted the group as to recommendations likely coming from the Athletic Trainers regarding standardized lightning policies now that all institutions are on the same weather alert system.
