## ADAMS STATE UNIVERSITY (5-4-0, 3-3-0 RMAC)

**Team Notes:** The Grizzlies hosted Fort Lewis College last Friday at the ASU Soccer Field and were defeated 6-3. ASU got goals in the first period from freshman Ethan Jackson and freshman Symon Fabbicatore. In the second period, senior Eric Rickard added a goal for the Grizzlies. Adams State then played UC-Colorado Springs on Sunday at ASU Soccer Field. The Grizzlies won a close match 1-0 behind a goal by sophomore Aaron Fox just after the 80 minute mark. It was Fox's fourth goal of the season.

## COLORADO CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY (2-8-0, 1-5-0 RMAC)

**Team Notes:** CCU picked up a pair of losses Sunday, losing at home to visiting Metro State and Colorado Mesa teams. Now 4-6 overall, CCU will host Colorado School of Mines at Trailblazer on Oct. 13th.

## COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (7-1-1, 5-1-0 RMAC)

**Offense:** Tesho Akindele (Senior, Forward, 6-1, Thornton, Colo./Northglenn HS)

Akindele totaled five points between consecutive 2-1 wins over the weekend, recording his second multi-goal game of the season and 15th of his career Friday at Colorado State-Pueblo, before assisting on the equalizer Sunday against No. 24 Metro State. Tied for the RMAC lead in goals (8) and game-winners (4), and ranked second in points (21) and assists (5), Akindele is three goals and eight points shy of 25th all-time in both categories in the NCAA record book. The Division II active career leader with 159 points, 65 scores and 29 assists, he is one assist away from tying former teammate Alex Nass (30; 2009-12) for second in program annals and eight shots back of equaling Nass (251) for most shots.

**RMAC Defensive Player of the Week**

**Team Notes:** Mines extended its win streak to a season-high three straight games last weekend, capturing back-to-back 2-1 decisions against Colorado State-Pueblo and No. 24 Metro State. Senior Tesho Akindele totaled five points between the wins, recording his second multi-goal game of the season and 15th of his career Friday at CSUP, before assisting on the equalizer Sunday. Tied for the RMAC lead in goals (8) and game-winners (4), and ranked second in points (21) and assists (5), Akindele is three goals and eight points shy of 25th all-time in both categories in the NCAA record book. The men twice capitalized on set piece situations against the Roadrunners as sophomore Joe Haines and junior Jared Herselman scored the firsts of the season in the second half. Haines delivered on a rebound look 2:41 into the second following a blocked direct kick by Akindele, while Herselman notched the deciding score with 6:09 remaining in regulation, launching a left wing free kick from 38 yards to the right post. The opening score 1:48 into the match was the first lead in the series for the Roadrunners since Oct. 21, 2011 after suffering three shutout losses to Mines in 2012. Senior Colin Baker swiped four combined shots, posting a goals against average of 1.00 and save percentage of .667 over the full 180:00 minutes. Baker ranks second in the conference in GAA (.874) and save percentage (.805), and is third in saves per game at 3.67.

## COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (1-8-1, 0-5-1 RMAC)

**Defense:** Sam Haseltine (Sophomore, Goalkeeper, 6-3, 190, St. Louis, Mo./St. John Vianney HS)

Haseltine had seven saves out of eight shots on goal during the Pack's loss to Fort Lewis.

## FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (6-3-1, 3-3-0 RMAC)

**Offense:** Luke Lawrence (Freshman, Forward, 5-10, 150, Albuquerque, N.M./La Cueva HS)

Lawrence came off the bench Friday afternoon at Adams State to produce four points in the Skyhawks 6-3 win. In the 33rd minute, Lawrence scored a goal to even the game at 2-2. Three minutes later he assisted his brother, Zac Lawrence, to give the Skyhawks a 3-2 lead. Two minutes into the second half, Lawrence assisted Alberto Capdepon on a goal which proved to be the game-winning goal. In two games last week, Lawrence accumulated one goal, two assists, two shots and two shots on goal.

**Defense:** Ryan Schaul (Sophomore, Goalkeeper, 6-2, 175, Frisco, Texas/Wakeland HS)

Schaul earned wins number four and five this past weekend at Adams State (W, 6-3) and at home against CSU-Pueblo (W, 1-0). Against the Grizzlies, he made six saves in 90 minutes of action. On Sunday at home against CSU-Pueblo, Schaul recorded his second shutout **of the season in a 1-0 win. The lone goal of the game was an own goal. In seven games between the posts, Schaul has made 33 saves, allowed 11 goals and has recorded a 1.52 goals against average.**

 Akindele was named Daktronics and NSCAA First Team All-American in 2012. He led the RMAC in goals (22) and points (50), ranking second in Division II in both categories. The Daktronics South Central Region Player of the Year, RMAC Offensive Player of the Year, and RMAC Tournament Most Valuable Player also ranked fourth in per game averages in goals (1.05) and points (2.38) for an Ore-digger offense that ranked 15th nationally in points (139), 17th in goals (48) and 23rd in scoring offense (2.29 goals/game). A three-time Daktronics First Team All-American, three-time NSCAA All-American and three-time First Team All-RMAC selection.
