2013 RMAC WOMEN'S SOCCER NEWS & NOTES

Adams State University (6-6-6, 3-5-6 RMAC)

Offense: Allie Mercado (Junior, Forward, Rancho Cucamonga, Calif./Los Osos HS)

Mercado scored her team leading eighth goal of the season in a 2-0 win over Colorado Christian University this weekend. She attempted six shots over the weekend, placing five on goal.

Team Notes: The Grizzlies 2013 season has come to a close as they were four points away from qualifying for the RMAC tournament.

COLORADO CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY (4-13-1, 1-12-1 RMAC)

Team Notes: CCU earned one point over the weekend in their final pair of games for the 2013 season. The Cougars fell to the Grizzlies of Adams State in their final home game by a 2-0 score. They travelled to Gunnison, Colo. on Sunday for a rematch with Western State and battled for 110 minutes before settling for a 0-0 tie.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (7-11-0, 6-8-0 RMAC)

Offense: Leilani Wiernicki (Senior, Midfield, Stockton, Cali./Lincoln HS)

Wiernicki converted on her only penalty kick attempt of the season, to earn the game-winning goal for the Mavericks in a 2-0 victory over Adams State. She attempted three shots over the weekend from the midfield, placing two attempts on frame.

Team Notes: After a tight battle down the final stretch, the Mavs 2013 season has come to a close. CMU ends the season in seventh place in the RMAC standings, just one point off of qualifying for the RMAC tournament.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (17-0-1, 14-0-0 RMAC)

Offense: Anna Evans (Senior, Forward, Arvada, Colo./Arvada West HS) RMAC Offensive Player of the Week

Team Notes: Colorado Mines ended the regular season with its nation-leading 17th win and program-record 14th in a row, defeating Metro State 3-0 on Wednesday and No. 21 Fort Lewis 2-1 in overtime Sunday to become only the fifth team to go undefeated in conference history. Senior Anna Evans led the women with two scores and five points, all coming in Wednesday's 3-0 Senior Day shutout of Metro State. Evans recorded her conference-best fifth go-ahead score at 28:23 and turned on a left-footed, 16-yard strike 20:43 into the second half for her third multigoal game this season and second in three matches. Ranked second among active Division II career leaders in goals (53) and third in points (129), Evans is the current RMAC leader in goals (12), points (28) and shots (84) and is tied for sixth with four assists. Senior Bree Archuleta earned her sixth goal of the season on Wednesday off a lead pass from Evans with 6:28 remaining. Freshmen Cari Smith and Jaclyn Knott contributed both goals in the come-from-behind win at Fort Lewis. Knott collected her sixth of 2013, and first collegiate game-winner with 34 seconds remaining in the first overtime, and Smith scored the first of her career at 75:27 via a corner by senior Jordan Hopper. Hopper shares the team lead with four assists, tied for sixth-most in the RMAC. Sophomore Jayln Yates stopped nine of 10 shots, totaling a .900 save percentage and 0.48 goals against average in 189:26 to improve to 17-0-1. The conference leader in shutouts, goals against average (.271) and save percentage (.925), Yates tied her single-season record from 2012 with her 11th shutout on Wednesday and is four away from tying Briana Schulze (26; 2007-10) for the program lead in career shutouts with 22. The first-time RMAC regular season champions begin postseason play as owners of a 32-game unbeaten streak, tied for fifth-longest in Division II history. Mines ranks 17th in consecutive conference matches without a loss with 24 and is tied for 16th in consecutive conference wins with 17.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (7-10-0, 4-10-0 RMAC)

Offense: Amanda Garcia (Junior, Forward, Pueblo, Colo./South HS)

Garcia recorded nine shots over the weekend in matches against Regis and UC-Colorado Springs, placing seven of those attempts on goal. She scored the game winning goal on Sunday as the Pack defeated UC-Colorado Springs 1-0 on senior day, the final game of the season for the ThunderWolves.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (14-4-0, 10-4-0 RMAC)

Offense: Sam Weiss (Junior, Forward, Chandler, Ariz./Hamilton HS)

Weiss assisted on the game-winning goal, and the only goal of the game Friday afternoon in a 1-0 win at Colroado Mesa. She posted five shots, including three shots on goal, against the Mavericks. On Sunday, in a 2-1 overtime loss at home to Colorado School of Mines, Weiss scored the only goal of the game for FLC. All three shots that Weiss took in the game landed on goal.

Team Notes: The Skyhawks earned three points over the weekend to secure a third place finish in the RMAC standings after splitting a pair of final games over the weekend. FLC defeated Colorado Mesa on Friday by a slim 1-0 score. They hosted undefeated and No. 2 ranked Colorado Mines on Sunday, outshooting the Orediggers and forcing overtime before suffering the 2-1 loss. Fort Lewis will host a first round RMAC playoff game on Wednesday against familiar foe UC-Colorado Springs.

METROPOLITAN STATE UNIVERSITY OF DENVER (12-3-3, 10-3-1 RMAC)

Team Notes: Metro State earned three points after splitting their last two regular season matches. In their toughest match of the season, the Roadrunners suffered a 3-0 setback at unbeaten No. 2 Colorado Mines. the 2013 RMAC Regular Season Champions. Metro State was determined to finish strong and defeated Western State on the road 3-2 in Gunnison, Colo. The Roadrunners finished the regular season in second place in the RMAC standings, which qualified them for RMAC tournament and clinched them a bye in the first round. The will play the winner of the Fort Lewis/UC-Colorado Springs match in the RMAC semi-finals on Friday, Nov. 8.

New Mexico Highlands University (9-6-3, 7-6-1 RMAC)

Team Notes: New Mexico Highlands earned three vital points over the weekend after splitting a pair of final regular season matches. The Cowgirls defeated UC-Colorado Springs on the road on Friday by a 2-0 score. Freshman forward and last week's RMAC Offensive Player of the Week, Anyssa Dagnino, continued her goal scoring frenzy as she notched both goals for NMHU. Dagnino has netted seven goals in three games for the Cowgirls. NMHU couldn't find their offense on Sunday, however, as they suffered a 3-0 setback to Regis. A strong finish at the end of the regular season has qualified NMHU for the RMAC tournament as the fourth seed. They will host Regis on Wednesday in Las Vegas, N.M. in a rematch to decide who advances to the RMAC semi-final round.

REGIS UNIVERSITY (8-7-2, 6-6-2 RMAC)

Offense: CC Rinehart (Senior, Forward, Longmont, Colo./Silver Creek HS)

Rinehart converted on a penalty kick to lead the Rangers to a 3-0 win over New Mexico Highlands. She landed three shots on goal in four shots attempts for a .750 shot on goal percentage in two games over the weekend.

RMAC Defensive Player of the Week

University of Colorado Colorado Springs (9-7-1, 6-7-1 RMAC)

Team Notes: The University of Colorado Colorado Springs suffered a pair of consecutive shutout losses over the weekend for the first time this season. Despite outshooting both teams, the Mountain Lions dropped a 2-0 decision to N.M. Highlands and a 1-0 decision to CSU-Pueblo. UC-Colorado Springs have qualified for the RMAC tournament for the fourth time in the program's seven year history and will play No. 3 seed Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colo. on Wednesday afternoon.

WESTERN STATE COLORADO UNIVERSITY (6-10-2, 3-9-2 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Mountaineers finished their 2013 season, their first in the RMAC and second as a program, with a loss and a tie over the weekend. Despite outshooting the Roadrunners, WSCU dropped a close 3-2 decision to Metro State on Friday afternoon. WSCU held the shot advantage once again on Sunday, but couldn't find the back of the net as they tied Colorado Christian 0-0 after two overtimes. Goalkeeper Meghan Jedrzejewski earned the shutout for the Mountaineers, her fourth of the season.
