## All-Time Conference Standings

Team standings in head-to-head competition determined the regular-season champion in 1996, and starting again in 1998. In 2001, Texas-Pan American and Centenary College were added as affiliate members, giving the league one more than the minimum six teams needed to qualify for an NCAA automatic bid. The Southland lost its automatic entry for the 2004 season when Texas A&M-Corpus Christi joined the league as an affiliate member after the departure of Centenary; however, the conference regained its automatic bid in 2005.
