THE SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE

Well into its sixth decade of service, the Southland Conference continues to be a model of innovation, stability and consistent achievement as it celebrates the academic and athletic accomplishments of its member institutions and approximately 4.200 student-athletes.

Having commemorated its 50th anniversary in 2013, the Southland Conference has transformed itself into a dynamic and respected consortium of 13 member universities in three states. Beginning with a historic meeting of five institutions in Dallas on March 15, 1963, the Southland Conference set on an extraordinary course that has proven successful well into the 21st Century.

The successful transformation continued, as the Southland Conference welcomed four additional members in 2013: Abilene Christian University, Houston Baptist University, the University of Incarnate Word in San Antonio, and the University of New Orleans.

In addition to its newest members, the Southland consists of the University of Central Arkansas, Lamar University, McNeese State University, Nicholls State University, Northwestern State University, Sam Houston State University, Southeastern Louisiana University, Stephen F. Austin State University and Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi.

An original Southland member from 1963-73, Abilene Christian rejoined the league as one of the most decorated athletic programs in NCAA history; and the addition of Houston Baptist, UIW and New Orleans gives the Southland a regular competitive presence in the key metropolitan areas of Houston, San Antonio and New Orleans. Southland cities encompass approximately 14 million people, and six of its television markets rank among the top 100 in the U.S.

The membership of the Southland encompasses nearly 140,000 current students and an alumni base of 800,000. Famous alumni from current Southland Conference schools include former CBS news anchor Dan Rather (Sam Houston State), NBA executive Joe Dumars (McNeese), ABC News anchor Robin Roberts (Southeastern Louisiana), Major League Baseball star Wade Miley (Southeastern Louisiana), NBA legend Scottie Pippen (Central Arkansas), and track and field Olympians Kenta Bell (Northwestern State), Bobby Morrow and Billy Olson (both Abilene Christian).

Other notable alums from current members include Grammy Award-winning musicians Frank Ocean (New Orleans), Don Henley and Rodney Crowell (both Stephen F.Austin), and Ronnie Dunn (Abilene Christian), television personality and actress Ellen DeGeneres (New Orleans), current NFL standouts Lardarius Webb (Nicholls), Robert Alford (Southeastern La.) and Jeremy

Lane (Northwestern State), professional golfers Shawn Stefani and Chris Stroud (both Lamar) and Colin Montgomerie (HBU), award-winning filmmaker Richard Linklater (Sam Houston State), American Idol winner Kris Allen (Central Arkansas), NFL Hall of Famer Jackie Harris (Northwestern State), former NFL standouts Bobby Hebert (Northwestern State), Gary Barbaro (Nicholls), Wilbert Montgomery (Abilene Christian) and Gary Reasons (Northwestern State), former MLB star Kevin Millar (Lamar), NCAA football coach Charlie Strong (Central Arkansas), actors John Larroquette (New Orleans), Ricardo Chavira (UIW) and Jesse Borrego (UIW), and the late NFL coaching legend O.A. "Bum" Phillips (Lamar and Stephen F. Austin).

The Southland sponsors 17 championship sports, all at the NCAA Division I level. The eight men's sports include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field. The women compete for nine championships in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball. The conference earns automatic qualification to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and volleyball. The Southland Bowling League, an affiliated conference sport, originated in 2015, and four of its members filled out half of the eight-team NCAA Championship bracket, with Stephen F. Austin winning the national championship in 2016.

The Southland enjoys multiple national and regional television broadcast agreements and relationships with ESPN Networks, Cox Sports Television, Root Sports Southwest, Fox College Sports and Time Warner Cable Sports Channel. In recent years, the conference has won numerous broadcast awards for its quality of production.

The Southland Conference, in conjunction with the city of Frisco, Texas, and Hunt Sports Group, also serves as the host to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Game in Frisco, which has been home to the conference headquarters since 2006. The game is played at Frisco's Toyota Stadium, and after a pair of successful three-year agreements, the Southland and its partners were rewarded with a four-year renewal to serve as the national championship host site through the 2020 season.

Southland Conference football ranks among the best Football Championship Subdivision leagues in the nation, and enjoys an annual expectation of competing for the national championship with multiple teams advancing to the NCAA playoffs each year. Sam Houston State and Central Arkansas represented the Southland in the 2016 FCS playoffs, winning a

playoff game each. In 2015, two Southland teams – McNeese and Sam Houston State—both qualified for the NCAA Division I Football Championship, with the Bearkats reaching the national semifinals for the fourth time in five years. In 2011 and 2012, Sam Houston advanced to the national championship game. Also, in 2002 and 2003, McNeese finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in the nation, and advanced to the 1997 and 2002 national championship contests. The conference has been represented in eight national championship games since the league joined the FCS (formerly I-AA) in 1982. Southland teams have played in 123 Division I playoff games in 35 years, winning 61 of the contests.

Historically, the Southland's successful football heritage has sustained itself through numerous membership and classification changes. The Southland joined the NCAA College Division in 1964, and was designated as NCAA Division II in 1973 before joining Division I in 1975. The Southland was an NCAA Division I-A league from 1978-81, before joining the ranks of FCS in 1982.

During its tenure as a Division I and I-A conference, the Southland initiated the startup of the Shreveport, La.-based Independence Bowl in 1976. The Southland representative served as the host team of the bowl until 1980, compiling a 2-3 record in those contests.

The conference can lay claim to five national championships, including College Division championships through former members Arkansas State (1970, UPI) and Louisiana Tech (1972, National Football Foundation). Louisiana Tech also won the first NCAA-sanctioned national title, winning the Division II playoffs in 1973. Tech followed that with the UPI's Division II national championship in 1974. ULM won the 1987 Division II-AA national championship.

McNeese, winner of a record 14 Southland football titles, has made 16 appearances in the NCAA Division I playoffs, while Sam Houston has earned nine trips to the football playoffs. Stephen F. Austin played in the 1989 NCAA title contest and has seven playoff appearances, most recently in 2014. Northwestern State has advanced to the NCAA playoffs six times, Nicholls has participated three times in postseason, Southeastern Louisiana played in the 2013 and 2014 NCAA Championships, and Central Arkansas made consecutive playoff appearances in 2011 and 2012 and then a trip in 2016. On six occasions, the Southland has placed three teams in the NCAA playoffs.

The Southland has produced 184 first-team football All-Americans during its history. In 2010, Stephen F. Austin quarterback Jeremy Moses became the first player in Southland history to receive the Walter Payton Award, which is presented

annually to the most outstanding football player at the FCS level. Sam Houston State's Jeremiah Briscoe joined him, winning the award after the 2016 season.

The Southland is one of five FCS conferences with at least 200 selections (212) in the National Football League draft. Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford, was picked as the first FCS player in the second round of the 2013 draft. Lamar defensive back Brendan Langley was taken by the Denver Broncos in the third round in the 2017 draft.

Southland Conference alums in the NFL include New York Jets quarterback Josh McCown (Sam Houston State), who has been in the league for the last 14 seasons, and Baltimore's Lardarius Webb, who is currently the second-longest tenured player with eight seasons of experience. Other recent NFL additions from the Southland include New England's Kevin Hughes (Southeastern Louisiana), Seattle's Jeremy Lane (Northwestern State), Tennessee's Josh Aubrey (Stephen F. Austin), Atlanta's Robert Alford (Southeastern Louisiana) and Buffalo's Dezmin Lewis (Central Arkansas).

The Southland has seen former Nicholls players win Super Bowl rings in recent seasons, as former Colonel Antonio Robinson was a member of the Green Bay Packers' Super Bowl XLV champions. Nicholls-ex Webb was a member of the Super Bowl XLVII champion Baltimore Ravens.

Among the former NFL stars from the Southland include Fred Dean, who was inducted to the Professional Football Hall of Fame in 2008 to become the first former Southland Conference player to earn induction in Canton. Other great NFL players from the Southland include Super Bowl XXIX quarterback Stan Humphries, Bill Bergey, Mike Barber, Fred Barnett, Bubby Brister, Ray Brown, Roger Carr, Larry Centers, Bruce Collie, Jackie Harris, Buford Jordan, Tim McKyer, Kavika Pittman, Billy Ryckman, Rickey Sanders, Eugene Seale, Rafael Septien, Terrance Shaw, Leonard Smith, Marcus Spears, Pat Tilley and Marvin Upshaw. Both Dean and Smith are recent inductees to the College Football Hall of Fame.

The Southland Conference has also seen its share of great coaches during its history in Maxie Lambright, Ernie Duplechin, Sam Goodwin, Jack Doland, Bennie Ellender, Bobby Keasler, Larry Lacewell, Bill Davidson, Dennis Franchione, Pat Collins, and Ron Randleman.

In addition to football, the Southland Conference can point to a number of accomplishments in all sports.

Men's basketball has experienced a tremendous amount of success during the Southland's history. The league has sent four teams to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen, as well as a squad to the NIT Final Four. Basketball stars Karl Malone, Joe Dumars, Jeff Foster, Dwight "Bo" Lamar, Andrew Toney, Mike Oliver and Thomas Walkup played in the Southland Conference.

In 2015-16, Stephen F. Austin won its third consecutive regular-season title after going 18-0 in league play, advancing to the NCAA tournament for the third straight year. The Lumberjacks, seeded 13th, defeated No. 4 West Virginia, 70-56, before losing a last-second contest to Notre Dame. The 2013-14 SFA squad set numerous Southland records, including marks for victories in a season (32) and consecutive wins overall (29 straight) and in conference play (23 in a row). Playing as a 12th seed, the Lumberjacks knocked off fifth-seeded Virginia Commonwealth, 77-75, in the NCAA's Second Round. In 2006, Northwestern State, playing as the No. 14 seed in the NCAA tournament, defeated No. 3 seed lowa, 64-63, in first-round action. The league placed a record five men's basketball teams in the postseason in 2015 and 2017, and sent four teams to the postseason in 2016.

Coaches such as Billy Tubbs, Mike Vining, Brad Underwood, Scotty Robertson, Jack Martin, Andy Russo, Bob Marlin, Danny Kaspar, Mike McConathy, Bobby Paschal and Pat Foster have led successful teams in the Southland.

In women's basketball, the Southland also has its share of tradition with former member ULM advancing to the 1985 NCAA Women's Final Four, and Stephen F. Austin sustaining itself as one of the most successful programs in the history of the sport. In 2016, the Ladyjacks became the fifth program in NCAA Division I history to record more than 1,000 wins.

In each of the last seven seasons, at least three Southland teams reached the postseason, and in 2013, four women's squads earned postseason berths. A Southland team has played in the WNIT 15 times, including each of the last 10 years. Women's basketball all-stars have included Eun Jung Lee, Lisa Ingram, Portia Hill, Deneen Parker, Katrina Price, and Joskeen Garner, and coaches such as Gary Blair, Linda Sharp, James Smith and Linda Harper.

Baseball has emerged as a constant Southland Conference strength with the league earning numerous national rankings and NCAA tournament berths. The Southland consistently ranks among the top-10 conferences in the country. In 2011, 50 of

the league's 150 non-conference victories came against the Big 12, Conference USA, Sun Belt and SEC. Major Leaguers such as Wade Miley, Paul Goldschmidt, Jace Peterson, Hunter Pence, Ben Sheets, Micah Hoffpauir, David Segui, Brian Lawrence, Ben Broussard, Chuck Finley, Jerald Clark, and Terry Matthews once played in the Southland. In 2017, Sam Houston State became the first team in Southland history to advance past the regional round.

In 2012, Southeastern Louisiana's Stefan Lopez became the league's second winner of the national Stopper of the Year Award, which is selected by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers. Sam Houston State's Luke Prihoda won the award in 2007. Only the Big 12 has had more players win this award.

The Southland also fares well each year in the Major League Draft, and for the first time, two Southland players were selected in the first round of the 2013 draft. Stephen F. Austin shortstop Hunter Dozier was picked eighth by the Kansas City Royals making the Southland player and hitter of the year the league's top draft pick in any sport. Later in the first round, the Texas Rangers selected Oral Roberts right-handed pitcher Alex Gonzalez, Southland pitcher of the year, with the 23rd overall pick. The Southland has had eight first-round picks in its history.

In 2016, his final season of a 39-year career, Lamar head coach Jim Gilligan became the only Southland coach to win more than 1,350 games, ranking him 16th all-time in NCAA Division coaching. The Jim Gilligan Trophy is now annually awarded to the Southland regular-season champion. Gilligan leads an impressive list of coaches who have patrolled Southland Conference dugouts, including Mark Johnson, Mike Bianco, John Cohen, Mitch Gaspard, Smoke Laval, Butch McBroom, Pat Patterson, David Pierce, Tony Robichaux, Dave Van Horn and Jim Wells.

In 2017, Sam Houston State advanced to the super regionals to become the first Southland team to do so after winning the Lubbock Regional.

Softball continues to enjoy success on a national level, beating nationally-ranked opponents every year since 1995, including McNeese's win at No. 1 Arizona State early in the 2012 season. In 2013, the league had six wins against ranked opponents, including wins by McNeese at No. 7 Alabama and No. 8 Texas A&M. In NCAA tournament competition, the Southland has racked up 16 wins, including McNeese's opening

win against Arizona State in 2016.

The Southland also has a proud history in volleyball with former member UT Arlington representing the conference numerous times in the NCAA tournament, including a run to the NCAA Volleyball Final Four in 1989.

Track and field has also served as a proud asset for the Southland Conference as the league has produced numerous national champions and Olympic medalists. The Southland boasts 28 men and four women student-athletes who have won NCAA track and field national championships, including Southeastern Louisiana's Alexander Young, the 2016 NCAA men's indoor weight throw champion, Stephen F. Austin's Demi Payne, who won the 2015 women's pole vault, Northwestern State's Trecey Rew, who won the women's discus in 2011, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi's Shadrack Songok (men's 10,000-meter run) in 2007 and 2008 and McNeese's Brad Gebauer (men's pole vault) in 2007. The league has also produced U.S. Olympic track and field medalists Earl Bell, Thomas Hill, Al Joyner, Charles Austin, and Liudmila Litvinova, along with other Olympians. With the addition of 12 more All-Americans in 2016, the league continues to find national success in indoor and outdoor track and field. In the indoor circuit, the Southland boasts 69 unique all-time All-Americans that have won a combined 11 national championships. Likewise, in the outdoor season, the league has seen 177 different All-Americans, including 144 men and 33 women, who have combined to win 21 national championships.

Golf has traditionally been a strong Southland sport as exemplified by Lamar men's golfer Chris Stroud, who finished third individually at the 2003 NCAA National Championship and has 21 top ten PGA finishes since joining pro tour in 2007. Another Lamar alum, Shawn Stefani, had a pair of top seven finishes on the 2013 PGA tour. The league has sent multiple teams into postseason play on numerous occasions, including in 2012 when three Southland teams — Lamar, Southeastern Louisiana and UT Arlington — competed in the NCAA tournament. Additionally, during the past five seasons the Southland has sent 12 golfers to compete as individuals in regional play with five in 2009, three more in 2010, one each in 2011 and 2012 and two in 2013. Lamar won a pair of NCAA Division II national championships in 1967 and 1968.

In 2005, Lamar's Dawie Van Der Walt finished fourth individually and Lamar tied for 12th place at the NCAA Men's Golf Championship, before the Cardinals tied for ninth in 2006 and tied for third in 2007.

In women's tennis, Southeastern Louisiana won 46 consecutive conference matches during a four-year period that began in 2005, while in men's tennis Texas A&M-Corpus Christi has played in the NCAA tournament eight times in the last 11 years.

In women's soccer, Stephen F. Austin midfielder Kylie Louw became the first player in conference history to earn All-America honors when she earned third-team mention by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. A member of the South Africa Olympic team during the 2012 London Olympics, she also garnered first-team Academic All-America Honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America. In 2015, Southeastern Louisiana's goalkeeper Hope Sabadash became the second player in league history to earn All-America honors, earning a spot on the NSCAA Second Team. Abilene Christian's Brie Buschman was a first-team Academic All-American in 2013, and Stephen F. Austin's Morgan Glick earned the same honor in 2014.

In women's golf, the Southland sent two teams to 2012 NCAA regional play for the first time since the league added the sport in 2002. Lamar has a league-best seven Southland championships during that span.

The Southland Conference has repeatedly demonstrated its commitment to the academic and athletic success of its student-athletes. With the F.L. McDonald Postgraduate Scholarship Award, the league annually honors male and female scholar-athletes with a stipend for postgraduate study. The Steve McCarty Citizenship Award, initiated in 2005-06 and named after the former Stephen F. Austin athletic director,

properly recognizes accomplishments off the court for a male and female student-athlete. Also, student-athletes with grade-point averages above 3.0 are honored on the Southland's annual All-Academic teams and Commissioner's Honor Roll. A total of 2,379 student-athletes earned a spot on the Honor Roll at the end of the 2016-17 academic year.

The conference continues to make great strides in the classroom. During the last decade, no other Division I league has improved its Academic Progress Rate as well as the Southland Conference has. In fact, in 2009-10, the Southland ranked 10th among the 31 Division I leagues in men's basketball APR. The academic progress the league has shown ultimately leads to higher graduation rates for our student-athletes.



Southland Conference Commissioner 15th Year

Tom Burnett was named the Southland Conference's sixth commissioner on Dec. 23, 2002, and brought a diverse background in athletics administration experience at the conference and national levels. The second-longest tenured commissioner in league history, Burnett is now in his 15th year of service with the Southland, and has a conference administrative background reaching nearly 30 years.

Burnett has helped to enhance the Southland's membership, with the 2013 additions of Houston Baptist University, the University of New Orleans, Abilene Christian University and the University of the Incarnate Word. The newest institutions give the Southland 13 members in Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas.

The league's television exposure has advanced under his watch with the expansion of national and regional coverage, including the Southland's broadcast agreement with ESPN Networks that guarantees more than 120 national broadcasts through 2019-20. Additionally, the conference has enjoyed national and regional broadcasting partnerships with Sinclair Broadcasting/American Sports Network, Cox Sports Television, Fox College Sports, Fox Sports Southwest and Root Sports Southwest during his tenure. The award-winning Southland Conference Television Network existed from 2008-2014, and this creative in-house broadcast venture featured more than 170 unique sports and promotional telecasts to a potential viewing audience of more than 13 million television households.

Burnett also led a successful community-wide effort to bring the NCAA Division I Football Championship Games to the Southland's home base of Frisco, Texas, as the league has served as the host conference for the national title contests at Toyota Stadium since 2011. The NCAA has subsequently renewed the agreement twice to keep the national championship game in Frisco through the 2020 event.

He also initiated the Southland's football officiating consortium with the Big 12 Conference in 2007, a first of its kind dual program that combined singular training, observation, video review and development, a model followed by many other Division I conferences today. In 2014, the Southland became the first FCS conference to implement full NCAA football instant replay for all home games.

Recently appointed to a five-year term on the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee that begins in September, Burnett is also a member of the Board of Managers for College Football Officiating (CFO), LLC, an entity created by the NCAA and the Collegiate Commissioners Association to enhance and address college football's officiating matters. Burnett is also a member of the National Football Foundation/College Football Hall of Fame's Awards Committee and Divisional Honors Court, and he formerly served on the Board of Directors for NCAA Football.

A former member of both the NCAA's Division I Committee on Academic Performance and the Division I Football Academic Working Group, Burnett also served as the FCS Vice President for the Collegiate Commissioners Association (CCA) in 2007-08.

He represented the Southland Conference on the NCAA Division I Management Council in 2004-05, and served on the Division I FCS Governance Committee from 2004-06. Burnett previously served on the NCAA Playing Rules Oversight Panel, the NCAA Baseball Rules Committee and the Women's College Basketball Officiating (WCBO), LLC.

In 2004, Burnett began the league's renewed in-house efforts to secure corporate sponsorships. Since then, the Southland has secured sponsorship agreements with dozens of national and regional companies. In 2015, the Southland's corporate sales and marketing rights were acquired by Learfield Sports.

He also initiated efforts in 2007 to bring the Southland Conference basketball tournaments to a neutral site in the Houston area, giving the league a year-end celebration of the sport at a centralized location near much of the Southland's largest alumni and student bases. The tournament has remained in the Houston area since, and league administrators recently agreed to extend the stay at least through 2021-22.

Prior to joining the Southland, Burnett spent nearly 11 years in a number of roles with the Sun Belt Conference in New Orleans, including stints as associate and assistant commissioner, and director of communications. He also served two years on the staff of the American South Conference, and started his career on the athletic staff at Louisiana Tech University.

Burnett, a native of Houston, is a 1988 graduate of Louisiana Tech University, where he studied journalism and spent one year as the sports editor of the school's student newspaper. He and his wife Tracy are the parents of a son, Cole, a student at the University of Oklahoma, and a daughter, Jesse.

Now in his 41st year in football officiating, Byron Boston begins his eighth year as Southland Conference Coordinator of Football Officials. An accomplished official at every level, Boston is in his 23rd season as a game official in the National Football League. INSTANT REPLAY

The Southland Conference announced on May 21, 2014, that it would become the first Division I FCS league to implement full NCAA instant replay at all home football games, regardless of television coverage, effective with the 2014 season. In the first succesful season, the Southland partnered with DVSport, Inc., the leader in collegiate football high-definition, to provide the league and its 11 football-playing institutions with the cutting-edge technology for instant replay.

The initiative, proposed by the Southland coaches and ratified by the league's athletic directors, was ultimately approved by the Southland's presidential Board of Directors. The Southland staffs the replay operations within a press box booth at each stadium with a replay official, a communicator, a technician and a sideline assistant.

The permanent installation of replay highlighted another positive aspect of the Southland's longstanding officiating consortium with the Big 12 and Mountain West conferences, as qualified replay officials and communicators are readily available for Southland home games.

2017 NCAA FOOTBALL PLAYING RULES - RULE 12, Instant Replay

SECTION 1. Purpose and Philosophy

Purpose

ARTICLE 1. Instant replay is a process whereby video review is used to confirm, reverse or let stand certain on-field decisions (Rule 12-3) made by game officials.

Philosophy

ARTICLE 2. The instant replay process operates under the fundamental assumption that the ruling on the field is correct. The replay official may reverse a ruling if and only if the video evidence convinces him beyond all doubt that the ruling was incorrect. Without such indisputable video evidence, the replay official must allow the ruling to stand.

SECTION 2. Eligibility for Instant Replay Participation

ARTICLE 1.

- a. Any member institution may use instant replay, but there is no requirement to do so. If instant replay is used, it must be used in full compliance with this rule.
- b. For any nonconference game, if the home team is using instant replay, the visiting team does not have the option of declining its use for that game. If the home team is not using instant replay, it is not required to honor a request by the visiting team that it be used.

SECTION 3. Reviewable Plays

Scoring Plays

ARTICLE 1. Reviewable plays involving a potential score include:

- a. A potential touchdown or safety. [Exception: Safety by penalty for fouls that are not specifically reviewable.]
- b. Field goal attempts if and only if the ball is ruled (a) below or above the crossbar or (b) inside or outside the uprights when it is lower than the top of the uprights. If the ball is higher than the top of the uprights as it crosses the end line, the play may not be reviewed.

Passes

ARTICLE 2. Reviewable plays involving passes include:

- a. Pass ruled complete, incomplete or intercepted anywhere in the field of play or an end zone.
 - b. Forward pass touched by a player (eligible or ineligible) or an official.
- c. Forward pass or forward handing when a ball carrier is or has been beyond the neutral zone.
 - d. A forward pass or forward handing after a change of team possession.
 - e. Pass ruled forward or backward.
- 1. If the pass is ruled forward and is incomplete, the play is reviewable only if the ball goes out of bounds or if there is clear recovery of a loose ball in the immediate continuing action after the loose ball. If the replay official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which team recovers, the ruling of incomplete pass stands. (Exception: Rule 12-3-1-a)
- If the replay official reverses an incomplete forward pass ruling and the ball is recovered, it belongs to the recovering team at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.
- f. Location of the passer when he is obviously in the field of play and a ruling of intentional grounding would result in a safety by penalty.

Dead Ball and Loose Ball

ARTICLE 3. Reviewable plays involving potential dead balls and loose balls include:

- a. Loose ball by a potential passer ruled a fumble.
- b. Loose ball by a passer ruled incomplete forward pass when there is clear recovery in the immediate continuing action after the loose ball.
- 1. If the replay official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which team recovers, the ruling of incomplete pass stands.

- If the replay official rules fumble, the ball belongs to the recovering team at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.
 - c. Live ball not ruled dead in possession of a ball carrier.
- d. Loose ball ruled dead, or live ball ruled dead in possession of a ball carrier when the clear recovery of a loose ball occurs in the immediate continuing action.
- If the ball is ruled dead and the replay official does not have indisputable video evidence as to which team recovers, the deadball ruling stands.
- If the replay official rules that the ball was not dead, it belongs to the recovering team at the spot of the recovery and any advance is nullified.
- e. Ball carrier's forward progress, spot of fumble, or spot of out-of-bounds backward pass, with respect to a first down.
- f. Catch or recovery of a fumble by a Team A player other than the fumbler before any change of possession during fourth down or a try.
- g. Ball carrier in or out of bounds. If a ball carrier is ruled out of bounds, the play is not reviewable, except as in Rules 12-3-1-a and 12-3-3-d.
- h. Catch, recovery or touching of a loose ball by a player in bounds or out of bounds.
- i. A loose ball touching on or beyond a sideline, goal line, or end line, touching a pylon, or breaking the plane of a goal line.
 - j. Catch or recovery of a loose ball in the field of play or an end zone.
 - k. Forward fumble that goes out of bounds with respect to a first down.

Kicks

ARTICLE 4. Reviewable plays involving kicks include:

- a. Touching of a kick.
- b. Player beyond the neutral zone when kicking the ball.
- c. Kicking team player advancing a ball after a potential muffed kick/fumble by the receiving team.
- d. Scrimmage kick crossing the neutral zone.
- e. Blocking by Team A players before they are eligible to touch the ball on an on-side kick.

Targeting

ARTICLE 5

- a. The replay official shall review all targeting fouls, Rules 9-1-3 and 9-1-4. The review includes all aspects of the targeting foul to ascertain whether there is at least one indicator of targeting action (Note 1 to Rules 9-1-3 and 9-1-4), and:
 - 1. Whether the crown of the helmet is used to make forcible contact (Rule 9-1-3);
- Whether there is forcible contact to the head or neck area of a defenseless opponent (Rules 9-1-4 and 2-27-14).
- b. The replay official may create a targeting foul, but only in egregious instances in which a foul is not called by the officials on the field. Such a review may not be initiated by a coach's challenge.

Miscellaneous

ARTICLE 6. Situations that may be addressed by the replay official:

- a. The number of players on the field for either team during a live ball.
- b. Clock adjustment and status when a ruling is reviewed.
- c. Clock adjustment at the end of any quarter. (Exception: Rule 3-2-5-b)

If at the end of any quarter the game clock expires, either during a down in which it should be stopped by rule through play when the ball becomes dead or after the down upon a request for an available team timeout, the replay official may restore time only under these conditions:

- The replay official has indisputable video evidence that time should have remained on the game clock when the ball became dead or when the team timeout was granted;
- In the second and fourth quarters only, the team to which the ball would belong after it becomes dead would next put the ball in play from scrimmage (not the try);

INSTANT REPLAY



- 3. In the fourth quarter only, either the score is tied or the team that will next snap the ball is behind by eight points or fewer; and
- 4. The replay official's video evidence includes the timeout signal by an official in the case where the game clock should have stopped for a requested team timeout.
 - d. Correcting the number of a down.
- 1. This includes the result of a penalty enforcement that includes an automatic first down or loss of down
- 2. The correction may be made at any time within that series of downs or before the ball is legally put in play after that series.
- e. Any person who is not a player interfering with live-ball action occurring in the field of play (Rule 9-2-3).
 - f. An injured player at the initiation of the medical observer.

Limitations on Reviewable Plays

ARTICLE 7. No other plays or officiating decisions are reviewable. However, the replay official may correct egregious errors, including those involving the game clock, whether or not a play is reviewable. This excludes fouls that are not specifically reviewable (See Article 8, following).

Reviewable Fouls

ARTICLE 8.

The following plays are reviewable and the replay official may create a foul when there is no call by the on-field officials:

- a. Player making a forward pass or forward handoff when beyond the neutral zone or after a change of possession (Rule 12-3-2-c and -d).
 - b. Player beyond the neutral zone when kicking the ball (Rule 12-3-4-b).
- c. Blocking by Team B players before they are eligible to touch the ball on an onside kick (Rule 12-3-4-e).
 - d. The number of players on the field for either team during a live ball (Rule 12-3-6-a).
- e. Illegal touching of a forward pass by an originally eligible receiver who has gone out of bounds. (Rules 12-3-2-b and 12-3-3-h).
- f. Player who is out of bounds touching a free kick that had not been touched inbounds (Rule 12-3-4-a).
- g. Forward pass that becomes illegal as a second pass after an on-field ruling of a backward pass is reversed (Rule 12-3-2-e).
- h. A clear, obvious and egregious targeting foul (Rule 12-3-5-b).

SECTION 4. Instant Replay Personnel

Equipment and Location

Personnel

ARTICLE 1. Instant replay personnel shall consist of the number of persons needed to operate the replay equipment within the necessary time constraints. There shall be a minimum of three persons to ensure that all plays are reviewed in an efficient and timely manner. Such persons are normally referred to as replay official, communicator and technician. Additional personnel may be used as needed.

Equipment

ARTICLE 2. The type of equipment used to carry out necessary instant replay duties shall be determined by each conference or member institution using instant replay.

Location

ARTICLE 3.

- a. All equipment used reviewing a play during the replay process and the personnel using that equipment shall be located in a separate, secure location in the press box. This room shall not be available or accessible to any person not directly involved in instant replay.
- b. Additional telephonic equipment needed to allow instant replay personnel to communicate with the game referee when a game has been stopped for a play review shall be located on a sideline near the field of play and preferably outside a team area. Such equipment shall provide the game referee and the replay official a secure and private means of communication.

SECTION 5. Initiating the Replay Process

Game Stop

ARTICLE 1. There are two methods to stop a game to review a ruling on the field.

- a. The replay official and his crew shall review every play of a game. He may stop a game at any time before the ball is next legally put in play (Exception: Rule 12-3-6-d) whenever he believes that:
- There is reasonable evidence to believe an error was made in the initial on-field ruling.

- 2. The play is reviewable.
- 3. The outcome of a review would have a direct, competitive impact on the game.
- b. The head coach of either team may request that the game be stopped and a play be reviewed by challenging the on-field ruling.
- 1. A head coach initiates this challenge by taking a team timeout before the ball is next legally put in play (Exception: Rule 12-3-6-d) and informing the referee that he is challenging the ruling of the previous play. If a head coach's challenge is successful, he retains

the challenge, which he may use only once more during the game. Thus, a coach may have a total of two challenges if and only if his initial challenge is successful.

- After a review has been completed, if the on-field ruling is reversed, that team's timeout will not be charged.
- 3. After a review has been completed, and the on-field ruling is not reversed, the charged team timeout counts as one of the three permitted that team for that half or the one permitted in that extra period.
- 4. A head coach may not challenge a ruling in which the game was stopped and a decision has already been made by the replay official.
- 5. If a head coach requests a team timeout to challenge an on-field ruling and the play being challenged is not reviewable, the timeout shall count as one of the three permitted his team during that half of the game or the one permitted in that extra period.
- A head coach may not challenge an on-field ruling if all the team's timeouts have been used for that half or in that extra period.

When To Stop a Game

ARTICLE 2.

- a. A game may be stopped, either by the replay official or by a head coach's challenge, at any time before the ball is next legally put in play (Exception: Rule 12-3-6-d).
 - b. No game official may request that a game be stopped for a play to be reviewed.

SECTION 6. Reviewing an On-Field Ruling

Procedures

ARTICLE 1.

- a. When a game is to be stopped either by the replay official or by a head coach's challenge, the designated officials on the field will be notified by a buzzer system or other appropriate means.
 - b. If the review is initiated by the replay official, the referee shall announce:

"The ruling on the previous play is ... (brief description of ruling). The play is under further review."

If the game has been stopped due to a head coach's challenge, the referee shall announce:

- "The (name of institution) head coach has challenged the ruling of (state the ruling). The play is under further review."
- c. All reviews shall be based upon video evidence provided by and coming directly from the televised production of the game or from other video means available to the replay official.
- d. After the referee has conferred with the replay official and the review process has been completed, he shall make one of the following announcements:
 - 1. If the video evidence confirms the on-field ruling:
 - "After further review, the ruling on the field is confirmed."
 - 2. If there is no indisputable (conclusive) evidence to reverse the on-field ruling: "After further review, the ruling on the field stands."
 - 3. If the on-field ruling is reversed (Rule 12-7):
 - "After further review, the ruling is [followed by a brief description of the video evidence]. Therefore, [followed by a brief description of the impact of the ruling]."
- e. If a ruling is reversed, the replay official shall supply the referee with all pertinent data as needed (next down, distance, yard line, position of the ball, clock status/adjustment) in order to resume play under the correct game conditions.

Restrictions

ARTICLE 2.

- a. There is no restriction on the number of times the replay official may stop a game for reviews.
 - b. The replay official is under no time limit for a review.

SECTION 7. Reversing an On-Field Ruling Criterion for Reversal

ARTICLE 1. To reverse an on-field ruling, the replay official must be convinced beyond all doubt by indisputable video evidence through one or more video replays provided to the monitor.

SOUTHLAND TELEVISION







The Southland Conference's 2017 football television plans for the August and September portion of the schedule include 20 matchups across ESPNU, ESPN3, Cox Sports Television, FOX Sports Southwest and other outlets.

For games in October and November, the Southland will reveal a majority of its television selections 12 days prior to kickoff. This will allow for the best matchups to be selected each week for various broadcast partners.

The Southland schedule begins early with a live national broadcast, as Sam Houston State hosts Richmond in a matchup of nationally-ranked FCS powers on Sunday, Aug. 27, on ESPNU. Both SHSU and Richmond advanced to the NCAA FCS quarterfinals in 2016, and both are expected to be national contenders this season.

Four games are set to be broadcast Saturday, Sept. 2, on ESPN3 as Stephen F. Austin travels to SMU, Houston Baptist visits Texas State, Northwestern State travels to Louisiana Tech, and Southeastern Louisiana plays at UL Lafayette.

Two games will be available on Thursday, Sept. 7, as Sam Houston State is again featured in a national ESPNU contest at Prairie View A&M, while Houston Baptist's game against Texas Southern is set to air on FOX Sports Southwest and FOX College Sports.

Saturday, Sept. 9, features three Southland teams broadcast across ESPN networks, including Nicholls taking on Texas A&M on ESPNU. ESPN3 will also showcase Lamar playing host to UT-Permian Basin, and Stephen F. Austin meeting Southern Utah.

The exclusive Southland-ESPN3 Game of the Week schedule kicks off Saturday, Sept. 16, for the opening of Wildcat Stadium, as Abilene Christian welcomes Houston Baptist in the first game at the new on-campus facility. The highly-anticipated rematch of the top two Southland teams from last season, Sam Houston State at Central Arkansas, will be part of the Southland-ESPN3 package on Sept. 30.

Cox Sports Television is set to air two games in September that will also air live on ESPN3 outside of CST territory, including Lamar at Northwestern State on Sept. 16, and Southeastern at Northwestern State on Sept. 30.

Additional games from the early portion of the schedule may be selected at a later date. For games not selected by conference partners, individual schools will have the ability to produce broadcasts via traditional television or online outlets.

SOUTHLAND FOOTBALL HISTORY

1963

The Southland Conference is organized by five institutions: Abilene Christian College (Abilene Christian University), Arkansas State College (Arkansas State University) Arlington State College (University of Texas at Arlington) Lamar State College of Technology (Lamar University) and Trinity University.

1964

The Southland Conference begins football play. Lamar wins inaugural championship with a 3-0-1 league mark and falls in the Pecan Bowl to Northern Iowa, 19-17.

1965

Lamar repeats as Southland champion with a 3-1 mark (6-4 overall).

1966

UT Arlington and Lamar finish as co-champions with identical 3-1 marks.

1967

UT Arlington wins the league title with a perfect 4-0 record, and completes a 10-1 season with a 13-0 win over North Dakota State in Pecan Bowl.

Trinity defensive end Marvin Upshaw becomes the first Southland Conference player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft, the 21st overall selection by the Cleveland Browns.

1968

The Southland Conference begins competition in the NCAA's College Division.

Arkansas State takes the Southland title with a 3-0-1 mark, but loses in the Pecan Bowl to North Dakota State, 23-14.

1969

Arkansas State repeats as league champion, sweeping through the league at 4-0. ASU caps an 8-1-1 season with a win over Drake, 29-21, in the Pecan Bowl.

1970: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Arkansas State wins the Southland title for the third consecutive year and finishes the season with a perfect 11-0 mark, winning the UPI College Division National Championship. ASU capped the year with a 38-21 win over Central Missouri State in the Pecan Bowl.

Arkansas State head coach Bennie Ellender is named the National Small College Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association.

1971

Louisiana Tech University and the University of Southwestern Louisiana (UL Lafayette) join the Southland Conference. Louisiana Tech, Trinity and Lamar share the championship with 4-1 records. Louisiana Tech caps a 9-2 season with a 14-3 win over Eastern Michigan in the Pioneer Bowl.

1972: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana Tech wins its second straight championship with a 5-0 mark, and caps off a perfect 12-0 season with a 35-0 trouncing of Tennessee Tech in the Grantland Rice Bowl. The win gives Louisiana Tech a claim to the College Division National Championship.

McNeese University plays its first season in the Southland Conference. Abilene Christian plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Conference.

1973: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana Tech wins the league title with a 5-0 record on the way to a 12-1 season capped off by the league's first NCAA football championship, winning the Division II title, 34-0, over Western Kentucky.

1974: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Louisiana Tech wins its fourth consecutive league crown with a 5-0 mark on the way to an 11-1 overall record. Tech is declared UPI Division II National Champion.

Louisiana Tech wide receiver Roger Carr becomes the second Southland Conference player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft, the 24th overall pick by the Baltimore Colts.

1975

The Southland Conference begins play as an NCAA Division I league. Arkansas State wins the conference with a perfect 5-0 mark and rolls through the season with an 11-0 mark as one of two unbeaten, untied teams in Division I. Because of no postseason opportunities for Arkansas State, the Southland Conference and city of Shreveport, La., develop the idea for the Independence Bowl, to be hosted by the Southland champion.

1976

McNeese wins its first Southland title with a 4-1 mark. The Cowboys finish the season 10-2 after a 20-16 win over Tulsa in the inaugural Independence Bowl.

1977

Louisiana Tech claims its fifth Southland title with a 4-0 mark, and caps a 9-1-2 season with a 24-14 win over Louisville in the Independence Bowl.

1978

Louisiana Tech and Arkansas State share the title with 4-1 marks, and Louisiana Tech finishes a 6-5 season with a 35-13 loss to East Carolina in the Independence Bowl.

1979

McNeese wins its second Southland title with a 5-0 league mark. McNeese finishes with an 11-1 record, losing only to Syracuse, 31-7, in the Independence Bowl.

1980

McNeese rolls to another undefeated 5-0 conference record for its second straight title. The Cowboys lost to Southern Miss., 16-14, in the final Independence Bowl hosted by the Southland champion.

1981

UT Arlington wins its first league title in 14 years with a 4-1 mark on the way to a 6-5 overall record. UL Lafayette plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Conference.

1982

The Southland Conference is re-classified into the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, and begins participation in the NCAA Division I Playoffs. Northeast Louisiana University (ULM) plays its first season in the Southland Conference. Louisiana Tech claims its seventh Southland crown with a 5-0 mark, and finishes at 10-3 after advancing to the NCAA Division I semifinals and falling to Delaware, 17-0.

1983

North Texas plays its first season in the Southland Conference, and responds by sharing the league title with ULM with a 5-1 record. North Texas loses in the opening round of the Division I Playoffs at Nevada, 20-17, in overtime. McNeese defensive back Leonard Smith becomes the highest Southland Conference draft choice, taken as the 17th overall selection in the first round by the St. Louis Cardinals.

1984: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Louisiana Tech wins the championship with a 5-1 mark and finishes a 10-5 season by falling in the Division I National Championship to Montana State, 19-6.

Arkansas State also advances to the quarterfinals in the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling at Montana State, 31-14.

1985

Arkansas State claims the title with a 5-1 mark and advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Nevada, 24-23. UT Arlington plays its final season after discontinuing football, and withdraws from the Southland Conference. UTA returned to the league without football during the 1987-88 academic year.

1986: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Arkansas State wins its seventh league title with a perfect 5-0 record and completes a 12-2-1 season by advancing to the Division I National Championship game, falling to Georgia Southern, 48-21.

Arkansas State, Louisiana Tech and Lamar play their final season and withdraw from the Southland Conference. Lamar returns to the league without football during the 1998-1999 academic year.

1987: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

ULM runs through the Southland schedule at 6-0 and finishes a 13-2 season by winning the NCAA Division I National Championship with a 43-42 win over Marshall.

North Texas advances to the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling in the first round at ULM, 30-9.

Northwestern State University, Sam Houston State University, Southwest Texas State University (Texas State) and Stephen F. Austin State University play their first season in the Southland Conference.

Northwestern State running back John Stephens is

selected 17th overall in the first round of the NFL Draft by New England, matching the highest draft selection in Southland Conference history (Leonard Smith, McNeese, 17th pick, 1983).

1988

Northwestern State wins its first Southland championship with a perfect 6-0 mark, and completes a 10-3 season by advancing to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Idaho, 38-30. For the first time, the Southland sends three teams to postseason play as Stephen F. Austin advances to the second round before falling at Georgia Southern, 27-7. North Texas also earns a playoff bid, but loses in the first round at Marshall, 7-0.

1989: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Stephen F. Austin wins its first Southland championship with a 5-0-1 mark and completes a 12-2-1 season by advancing to the Division I National Championship game, falling at Georgia Southern, 37-34.

1990

ULM wins the league with a 5-1 mark, and finishes a 7-5 season by losing in the first round of the Division I playoffs, 27-14, at Nevada.

1991

McNeese, at 4-1-2, and Sam Houston State, at 5-2, share the conference title by virtue of identical .714 winning percentage. McNeese completes a 6-4-2 campaign with a first-round loss at Nevada, 22-16, in the NCAA Division I playoffs. Sam Houston State also earns its first bid into the NCAA Division I playoffs, but the Bearkats lose at Middle Tennessee, 20-19, in overtime. Nicholls State University plays its first season in the league.

1992


ULM completes an undefeated, 7-0, conference slate for its fourth league title. The Indians advance to the quarter-finals of the playoffs, falling to Delaware, 41-18. McNeese also earns a bid to the NCAA Division I playoffs, advancing to the quarterfinals, losing at Northern Iowa, 29-7.

1993

McNeese rolls through the league undefeated at 7-0 and advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing to Troy State, 35-28. For the second time in league history, three Southland teams earn berths into the NCAA Division I playoffs. ULM falls in the first round to Idaho, 34-31, and Stephen F. Austin loses a first-round contest at Troy State, 42-20. ULM plays its final football season and withdraws its program from the Southland Conference. ULM's remaining sports continue to compete in the Southland.

1994

North Texas earns its second league crown with a 5-0-1 mark, but loses in the first round of the NCAA Division I playoffs, 24-20. McNeese also receives a playoff bid, and the Cowboys advance to the quarterfinals, falling at Montana, 30-28. North Texas plays its final season and withdraws from the league.

1995

McNeese completes an undefeated league schedule at 5-0, and advances to the semifinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing to Marshall, 25-15. Stephen F. Austin also receives a playoff berth and also advances to the national semifinals, falling at Montana, 70-14.

1996

The Southland Football League, a seven-team entity formed by the remaining six Southland Conference football-playing institutions and Troy State University, is formed.

In its first year of Southland competition, Troy wins the league with a 5-1 mark, and advances to the semifinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling at Montana, 70-7.

Nicholls, completing a miraculous turnaround from an 0-11 season in 1995, finishes 8-4, and also receives a bid to the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Montana in the first round, 48-3. Nicholls head coach Darren Barbier wins the Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually to the FCS National Coach of the Year

1997: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

McNeese and Northwestern State share the Southland title with 6-1 records. McNeese concludes a 13-2 season by advancing to the NCAA Division I National Championship game, falling to Youngstown State, 10-9.

Northwestern State also earns a bid to the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Eastern Washington in the first round, 40-10. Jacksonville State plays its first football season in the league.

1998

Northwestern State wins its third Southland title with a 6-1 record. The Demons advance to the semifinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs before falling to Massachusetts, 41-31. The Southland again sends three teams to postseason play. McNeese falls in the first round to Massachusetts, 21-19, and Troy State loses in the first round

at Florida A&M, 27-17.

1000

Troy and Stephen F. Austin share the league crown at 6-1, and Troy advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing to Florida A&M, 17-10. Troy defensive tackle Al Lucas wins the Buck Buchanan Award, signifying the nation's top defensive player in the FCS.

2000

Troy wins its third Southland championship with a 7-0 record, and advances to the NCAA Division I playoffs, falling to Appalachian State, 33-30. Troy plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Football League.

2001

Sam Houston State and McNeese share the conference crown at 5-1. Sam Houston advances to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division I playoffs, losing at Montana, 49-24.

For the fourth time, the Southland sends three teams into postseason play. McNeese falls to Maine, 14-10, in the first round, and Northwestern State loses in the first round at Montana, 28-19.

The year marks the final season of the Southland Football League. The SFL identity will be returned into the Southland Conference beginning with the 2002 season.

Sam Houston State head coach Ron Randleman records his 200th career coaching victory.

2002: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

McNeese wins its record ninth Southland championship with a 6-0 mark. McNeese advances to the NCAA Division I National Championship game, falling to Western Kentucky, 34-14.

McNeese head coach Tommy Tate is honored with the Eddie Robinson Award.

Jacksonville State plays its final season and withdraws from the Southland Football League.

Southeastern Louisiana, a member of the Southland Conference in sports other than football, announces it will revive football after discontinuing the program in 1986. Southeastern will play two seasons as and FCS independent before playing in the Southland in 2005.

2003

The Southland Conference had an all-time high seven games broadcast on Fox Sports Net affiliates during the 2003 season. In addition, 10 other contests featuring at least one Southland team were aired on the College Sports Television (CSTV), The Football Network (TFN) and COX Sports Television outlets.

McNeese completes an undefeated 5-0 conference mark for its third consecutive league title and 10th overall. The Cowboys end the season with a streak of 16 consecutive wins in league play.

For the second year in a row, McNeese was the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division I playoffs. The Cowboys were ranked No. 1 nationally all but one week during the regular season, but lost their first-round playoff contest.

McNeese's Tommy Tate was named AFCA Region V Coach of the Year.

SOUTHLAND FOOTBALL HISTORY

2004

Sam Houston State capped a successful season in what would turn out to be the last for 36-year head coach Ron Randleman. The Bearkats had the best turn-around season in all of Division I football, going from 2-9 in 2003 to an 11-3 mark in 2004. Sam Houston notched its third Southland Conference championship in school history. The Bearkats shared the 2004 title with Northwestern State as each compiled 4-1 league records.

Northwestern State received the league's automatic berth to the NCAA playoffs after winning the fourth regular-season title in school history. The Demons fell in the first-round of the NCAA Division I playoffs to Montana.

Sam Houston used an at-large berth to the playoffs and advanced to the semifinal round of the tournament for the first time in school history. The Bearkats opened with an impressive 54-24 win over No. 3 Western Kentucky in round one. They then had to overcome a 20-point deficit in the fourth quarter to win, 35-34, at Eastern Washington in quarterfinal action.

Up next was a trip to Missoula where Sam Houston outgained the host Grizz, but lost the turnover battle. The Bearkats had four miscues while Montana did not turn the ball over. The first three turnovers by Sam Houston led to touchdowns for Montana. Included were two interceptions in the first half, which led to a 14-6 halftime cushion for the host.

The 2004 season marked the 12th time in the last 14 years the Southland Conference was represented by multiple teams in the 16-team NCAA Division I playoff field. Sam Houston State and Northwestern State were duplicates from the 2001 playoffs in a year when the Southland sent three teams with McNeese also advancing.

2005

Southeastern Louisiana, a member of the league in all other sports since 1997, began Southland Conference football competition. Hurricane Katrina and Hurricane Rita wrecked havoc on the 2005 schedule before Texas State and Nicholls shared the regular-season crown for the first Southland titles for either. The two advanced to the NCAA Division I playoffs with Texas State going all the way to the semifinals before losing in overtime to Northern Iowa, 40-37.

2006

With McNeese off to a 1-3 start, the 2006 season looked to be in trouble for success. But a turnaround happened as Matt Viator was named head coach on Sept. 13, 2006. Viator went on to lead the Cowboys to the NCAA Division I playoffs by posting a 6-2 record in his partial season. He was named both the Southland Coach of the Year and the Louisiana Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year and was a finalist in the balloting for Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

McNeese captured its 11th Southland regular-season title and fourth in the last six years by posting a 5-1 league record in 2006 to finish one game ahead of Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin.

Southland newcomer Central Arkansas posted the best overall record at 8-3, but did not play a Southland schedule.

2007

McNeese finished the regular-season 11-0, becoming the first Southland school to complete the regular-season undefeated since the Cowboys accomplished the feat in 1995. As a result, the school won its 12th Southland regular-season title. The Cowboys also hosted a first-round game in the NCAA Division I playoffs, becoming the first Southland school to host since Texas State hosted three in 2005.

The Southland won two games against FBS opponents in 2007, as Nicholls knocked off Rice 16-14 and McNeese defeated UL Lafayette 38-17. They were the 14th and 15th wins against the FBS for the Southland since 2000.

In the NFL Draft, the Southland had three players, McNeese's Bryan Smith, Nicholls's Kareem Moore and Northwestern State's Demetrius Bell all taken. Smith was taken No. 80 overall in the third round by the Philadelphia Eagles, becoming the highest Southland player to be selected since former Cowboy Keith Smith was taken No. 73 in the 2004 NFL Draft.

Lamar, a member of the Southland Conference in sports other than football, announces it will revive football after discontinuing the program in 1989. Lamar will begin play as an FCS independent in 2010 and will play a Southland Conference schedule in 2011.

2008

Texas State won its second Southland title with a 5-2 record after beating rival Sam Houston State in the regular-season finale. Central Arkansas, ineligible for the league championship during its transition to Division I from Division II, finished with a league-best 6-1 conference record. By virtue of winning the outright Southland title, Texas State earned the league's automatic bid into the NCAA Division I playoffs, where it collided with perennial power and fourth-seeded Montana. The Grizzlies went on to reach the NCAA Division I National Championship game after getting by the Bobcats 31-13 in the opening round.

Three players — Central Arkansas quarterback Nathan Brown and defensive end Larry Hart and Nicholls defensive back Lardarius Webb — as well as Central Arkansas head coach Clint Conque finished among the top 10 in balloting for the Payton Award, the Buck Buchanan Award and the Eddie Robinson Award.

The Southland led all FCS conferences with four NFL Draft picks in April. It was the most drafted out of the league since five were taken in 2002 and brought the total number of draft selections to 25 since the 2000 season. Webb was selected in the third round by Baltimore, while the New York Giants selected Sam Houston State quarterback Rhett Bomar in the fifth round. McNeese receiver Quinten Lawrence and Stephen F. Austin receiver Dominique Edison, were taken in the sixth round by the Kansas City Chiefs and Tennessee Titans, respectively. Another four players signed free agent contracts.

2009

Stephen F. Austin and McNeese each finished 6-1 in Southland Conference play to share the conference championship. SFA won its third conference title and first since 1999, while McNeese won its 13th conference championship and its sixth since 2000. The shared titles marked the first time since 2005 the league split its championship. SFA beat McNeese, 16-13, to clinch the league's automatic berth

in the NCAA playoffs. The Lumberjacks, who were 0-11 in 2007, picked up the first postseason win by the league since 2005 when Texas State reached the semifinals. In its first appearance in the playoffs since its semifinal run in 1995, SFA beat Eastern Washington at home but lost at Montana in the quarterfinals. McNeese, which was able to earn an at-large bid into the playoffs, also got a home game, but fell to New Hampshire.

Stephen F. Austin coach J.C. Harper was the runnerup for the Eddie Robinson Award, which is presented to the national coach of the year. The conference coach of the year, was just two points shy from winning the national award.

2010

Stephen F. Austin quarterback Jeremy Moses threw for 489 yards to lead the Lumberjacks to a 36-13 victory over Northwestern State in the regular-season finale. That win, coupled with McNeese's loss at Central Arkansas, gave SFA its first outright Southland Conference title since the 1989 season. It also marked the first time in program history that SFA won back-to-back conference titles. The Lumberjacks earned the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Division I playoffs and were awarded with a home game against Villanova, the 2009 national champion, but lost 54-24.

Moses went on to become the first Southland player to win the Walter Payton Award. The Lumberjacks' quarter-back set the FCS record for completions (1,184) and finished among the subdivision's all-time top 10 in total offense (13,201), passing yards (13,401) and touchdown passes.

The Southland Conference, based in Frisco, Texas since 2006, was named the host of the 2011 NCAA Division I Football Championship Game. The Division I playoff bracket expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams and the new format pushed the championship game into January. Eastern Washington defeated Delaware, 20-19, in the first of at least three national championship games to be played at Pizza Hut Park. The venue is scheduled to also host the games following the 2011 and 2012 seasons.

Central Arkansas became a full Division I member in 2010 and was eligible for a conference championship and playoffs. Lamar, already a conference member in other sports, returned to the gridiron after a 21-year absence, but played the 2010 season as an independent. The Cardinals will rejoin the Southland in 2011 for the first time since the 1986 season. Texas State played its final football season as a league member in 2010.

2011: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Sam Houston State cruised to the 2011 Southland Conference championship, becoming the first Southland team since McNeese in 2007 to go a perfect 11-0 during the regular season, including a 7-0 mark in conference play for its fourth league championship -- its first outright title. No other Texas team had navigated a perfect season in conference play.

The Bearkats were the only unbeaten team in the Football Championship Subdivision at the end of the regular season and were awarded the No. 1 seed in the Division I playoffs. It was Sam Houston's fifth Divison I playoff appearance. After a first-round bye, the Bearkats opened with a win over Stony Brook and followed with wins over long-time Southland nemeses Montana State and Montana to move to 14-0 and set up a date against North Dakota State in

the Division I Football Championship Game. The Bison snapped the Bearkats' 16-game win streak (dating back to the 2010 season) with a 17-6 win at FC Dallas Stadium in Frisco, Texas. Both teams finished with 14-1 records. The win total set a Sam Houston State school record. The title game appearance was the Southland's first since the 2002 season, marking the seventh time a Southland team reached the title game.

Central Arkansas, who finished second in league play at 6-1, made its first appearance in the Division I playoffs in just its second year of eligibility. Playing with an at-large berth, the Bears won the Southland's first road playoff game since 2004 with a 34-14 win at Tennessee Tech before ending its season with a loss at Montana.

2012: NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Sam Houston State returned to the 2012 Division I Football Championship Game for the second consecutive year after sharing the Southland Conference regular-season title with Central Arkansas. Both schools finished 6-1 in conference, giving the Bearkats their fifth league championship and the Bears their first conference title. In 2008, UCA finished 6-1 in league play and atop the standings but was ineligible for the conference championship during its transition to Division I.

Both Central Arkansas and Sam Houston earned a spot in the postseason, marking the second time in as many years the Southland sent two teams to the postseason, with UCA and Sam Houston also representing the league in 2011. The Bears earned an opening-round bye in the playoffs before falling to No. 5 seed Georgia Southern on the road 24-16 to finish its year 9-3 overall.

The Bearkats also received a bye in the first round and knocked off Cal Poly (18-16) at home in the second round before winning consecutive road games at Montana State (34-16) in the quarterfinals and at Eastern Washington (45-42) in the semifinals en route to their second consecutive trip to Frisco, Texas, for the championship game. The Bearkats earned a rematch against defending champion North Dakota State and fell to the Bison 39-13. Sam Houston reached the championship game for the second time in its history, and it marked the eighth time a Southland team reached the title game.

In the NFL draft, Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford was selected in the second round by the Atlanta Falcons. His 60th overall selection was the highest draft pick of a Southland player since Stephen F. Austin's Mikhael Ricks was taken 59th overall in the 1998 draft by the San Diego Chargers.

2013

Southeastern Louisiana won its first Southland football title after posting a 10-2 overall regular-season record and a perfect 7-0 mark against league opponents. The Lions finished one game ahead of McNeese, who ended the regular-season 10-2 overall and 6-1 in conference. This marked the first time in conference history the league has produced two 10-win teams before the start of the playoffs. The league had multiple double-digit winners in 1988 and 1995, but in both seasons, one or both teams needed the postseason to get there.

The Southland Conference placed three teams in the playoffs for the fifth time. Southeastern, McNeese and Sam Houston State represented the league. It was the first time since 2001 when Sam Houston, McNeese and Northwestern State each made the field.

The Bearkats opened the postseason against Southern Utah and posted a 51-20 win. However, Sam Houston drew Southeastern in the next round, where the Lions edged the Bearkats 30-29 in the closing seconds. It was the first FCS postseason win in Lion history. Southeastern, which earned the No. 4 national seed, fell in the quarterfinals 20-17 to New Hampshire. On the other side of the bracket, No. 6 seed McNeese lost to Jacksonville State 31-10 in the second round.

2014

Southeastern Louisiana and Sam Houston State shared the regular-season title after each school posted a 7-1 mark in conference play. The Lions and Bearkats finished two games ahead of Stephen F. Austin, Lamar and Central Arkansas, who all went 5-3 in Southland play.

For the second consecutive year, and sixth overall time in league history, the Southland sent three teams to the postseason with Sam Houston, Southeastern and SFA. However, the league co-champions, who did not face each other in the regular season, were matched up in the first round of the postseason with Sam Houston edging Southeastern 21-17. The Lumberjacks, who reached the postseason for the first time since 2010, drew Northern lowa in the first round and fell on the road to the Panthers 44-10, ending their season with an 8-5 mark.

The Bearkats, who finished the year 11-5, continued their postseason success with big road wins. In the second round, Sam Houston defeated Jacksonville State 37-26 before knocking off Villanova 34-31 in the quarterfinals. The Bearkats' road to the championship ended one game shy of Frisco with a 35-3 defeat against the eventually national champion North Dakota State.

Sam Houston finished No. 6 in both final polls while the Lions (9-4 overall) were No. 12 in the Coaches' Poll and No. 14 in the Sports Network Poll.

In the NFL draft, Northwestern State defensive tackle Deon Simons was taken in the seventh round (223 overall) by the New York Jets while Central Arkansas wide receiver Dezmin Lewis was selected 11 picks later in the seventh round (234 overall) by the Buffalo Bills.

2015

McNeese won its 14th Southland Conference regularseason title and its first since 2009 after the Cowboys rolled through league play at 9-0. The Cowboys finished two games ahead of Central Arkansas and Sam Houston State, both of which tied for second at 7-2 in conference.

The Southland was represented by McNeese and Sam Houston in the postseason. It marked the 16th FCS postseason appearance for the Cowboys and the ninth overall and fifth consecutive appearance for the Bearkats.

McNeese received the No. 4 seed in the playoffs and was set to host the winner of the first round game between Sam Houston and Southern Utah. The Bearkats won the offensive shootout with the Thunderbirds, 42-39, to set up

a rematch of the Nov. 7 meeting between McNeese, which the Cowboys won 27-10. This time around, the Bearkats came out on the winning side with a 34-29 upset of the Cowboys and put an end to the historic season in Lake Charles. McNeese finished its campaign at 10-1.

Sam Houston continued to roll through the playoffs as it hosted Colgate in the quarterfinal round. The Bearkats won 48-21 to reach the semifinals for the second straight year and for the fourth time in five seasons. Sam Houston's postseason drive came to a stop for the second straight year in the semifinals as they fell to No. 1 seed Jacksonville State. 62-10.

Sam Houston finished the year No. 3 in the STATS Poll and No. 4 in the Coaches' Poll, while McNeese finished the year No. 7 and No. 9 in the two polls, respectively.

In the NFL draft, Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Harland Miller was taken in the sixth round (205th overall) by the Arizona Cardinals while Central Arkansas defensive end Jonathan Woodard followed shortly behind in the seventh round (226th overall) by the Jacksonville Jaguars. Sam Houston State punter Lachlan Edwards was the final league player drafted as he went to the New York Jets in the seventh round (235th overall).

2016

Sam Houston State rolled to its seventh conference title, finishing 9-0 in conference play, led by the prolific offensive performance of junior quarterback Jeremiah Briscoe. Central Arkansas finished second with an 8-1 record behind the efforts of the Southland's stinglest defense. Southeastern Louisiana followed with a 7-2 conference mark, followed by McNeese and Nicholls with 5-4 records.

Sam Houston State and Central Arkansas both earned spots in the FCS Playoffs, both going 1-1. The Bearkats downed Chattanooga at home 36-31 before falling on the road to eventual national champion James Madison 65-7. Central Arkansas won at home in its first-round matchup with Illinois State, 31-24, before losing on the road at Eastern Washington, 31-14.

Briscoe and Bearkat defensive end P.J. Hall were both named First Team AP All-Americans. Briscoe finished the season as the all-time FCS leader in passing touchdowns with 57 and became the second Southland player to win the Walter Payton Award, given to the top FCS offensive player. He finished second nationally with 4,602 passing yards and an FCS-best 348 points responsible for. Briscoe averaged 354.0 passing yards per game and threw only 10 interceptions through 13 games played.

Sam Houston State finished fifth in the final STATS and FCS Coaches polls while Central Arkansas finished ranked 14th and 16th, respectively.

The Southland earned a lone 2017 NFL Draft pick in Lamar defensive back Brendan Langley, who was selected in the third round (101st overall) by the Denver Broncos.

The origin of the game's finest performers — Walter Payton, Jerry Rice, Buck Buchanan, Tony Romo, Kurt Warner, Steve McNair, Rich Gannon and Brian Westbrook — the FCS annually proves itself as fertile ground for talent and the development of future stars and professional Hall of Famers. Coaching legends such as Eddie Robinson, Bobby Bowden, Jim Tressel, Mack Brown and Tubby Raymond and all led programs at FCS institutions during their outstanding careers.

With an expansion to 24 teams in 2013, the NCAA Division I Football Championship annually gives the FCS a superb on-the-field playoff event, culminating with a

week-long celebration in Frisco, Texas. The Division I Football Championship is proving to be one of the NCAA's premiere postseason events. Frisco has played host to the game for the last eight seasons and will be home to the championship game through at least the 2020 season after receiving a four-year extension before the 2016 game.

Since 1982, the Southland Conference, which has been based in Frisco since 2006, has been a proud and prominent member of the FCS, and has an annual expectation of competing for the Division I national championship and placing multiple teams into postseason play. In addition to winning one Division I title, the Southland has also placed teams in eight National Championship Games, including in 2011 and 2012 when Sam Houston State and North Dakota State met. As a conference, the Southland has won 61 Division I playoff games.

The Southland is one of 11 prestigious leagues that earn automatic qualification into the Division I Football Championship, a group that includes the Big Sky, Big South, Missouri Valley Football, Mid-Eastern Athletic, Northeast, Ohio Valley and Southern conference as well as the Colonial Athletic Association and the Patriot and Pioneer leagues.

Sam Houston State Favored for 2017 Season

Sam Houston State was chosen as the unanimous favorites for the 2017 football season, according to a poll as voted on by the leauge's coaches and sports information directors.

Walter Payton Award winner Jeremiah Briscoe and the Bearkats head into this year's campaign following a 12-1 2016 season that saw the team make its sixth-straight trip to the FCS Playoffs. Sam Houston's season ended in the quarterfinals to eventual champion James Madison.

Central Arkansas earned an at-large bid to the postseason last year, defeating Illinois State 31-24 in the opening round. The Bears are tabbed to finish second in the league.

McNeese is picked to take third this season despite a 6-5 record last year. Southeastern Louisiana and Nicholls were selected as fourth and fifth place finishers, seperated by just three points.

Stephen F. Austin comes in at sixth with a 56-point cushion on Lamar, who is picked to claim seventh. Rounding out the last four spots, in predicted order of finish, are Abilene Christian, Houston Baptist, Northwestern State and UIW.

Central Arkansas, Sam Houston State Lead Preseason All-Conference Selections

The Bears earned 12 spots on the 2017 Preseason All-Conference teams while the Bearkats earned 11. Sam Houston State is headlined by the return of the heart of their high-powered offense in QB Jeremiah Briscoe and the WR duo of Yedidiah Louis and Nathan Stewart. Central Arkansas named five players to the First Team Defense, including senior DBs Tremon Smith and George Odum.

McNeese and Stephen F. Austin each earned eight spots, while Houston Baptist and Nicholls named five to the preseason teams.

Southeastern Louisiana earned four, followed by Abilene Christian (2), UIW (2) and Lamar (1).

Three Southland Teams Open Season in August

Sam Houston State will host Richmond for the first game of the 2017 season on Aug. 27. The match-up will be televised on ESPNU at 6 p.m. CT. Richmond went as far as the Bearkats in the 2016 FCS Playoffs, falling at Eastern Washington in the quarterfinals and finishing ranked No. 8 in the STATS FCS Top 25.

McNeese and Nicholls will clash in Thibodaux to open up conference play on Thursday, Aug. 31, opening the gates to opening weekend for the rest of the Southland.

Eight Southland Teams Take to the Field on Full Opening Weekend

All other Southland teams will be in nonconference action on Saturday, Sept. 2, for their first games of the 2017 season. Every team will be on the road, with Abilene Christian taking on New Mexico, Central Arkansas at Kansas State, Houston Baptist at Texas State, UIW at Fresno State, Lamar at North Texas, Northwestern State at Louisiana Tech, Southeastern Louisiana at UL Lafayette and Stephen F. Austin at SMU.

Multiple FBS Match-ups Await in 2017 Nonconference Schedules

The Southland will take on FBS schools 10 times this season, including three Mountain West Conference opponents, two Sun Belt teams, two Conference USA squads and one team each from the Big 12, Southeastern Conference and American Athletic Conference.

The conference only managed one win against FBS foes in 2016, with Central Arkansas winning 28-23 on the road at cross-state rival Arkansas State of the Sun Belt.

Southland teams will face outside FCS teams eleven times, with interconference action taking place against the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, Ohio Valley Conference, Southwestern Athletic Conference, Big Sky Conference and Colonial Athletic Association. The most common opponent will be Prairie View A&M of the SWAC, who will face Southland opponents three times in 2017.

Matchups with Division II teams Texas-Permian Basin (Lone Star Conference) and Florida Tech (Gulf South Conference) round out the nonconference slate.

Southland Welcomes Two New Head Coaches for 2017

Abilene Christian and Lamar both enter 2017 with new faces at the helm. The Wildcats named Adam Dorrel, the winningest active head coach in NCAA football, as the 20th head football coach in program history. Dorrel had spent the last six seasons as head coach of Division II Northwest Missouri State, where he won three national titles. In six seasons as a head coach, Dorrel has compiled a 76-8 record, a 90.5 winning percentage that is the best active mark in college football, ahead of Ohio State University's Urban Meyer (second at 85.5 percent). Dorrel led the Bearcats to the NCAA Division II playoffs in all six of his seasons as the head coach and coached them to 30 straight victories to end his tenure at his alma mater. The 30-game streak is the longest in the nation at any level.

Lamar named Mike Schultz as the program's second head coach since the team's rebirth in 2010. A 1979 graduate of Sam Houston State, who most recently spent five seasons under Dennis Franchione at Texas State, Schultz helped jump start a Texas Christian program that began in the Western Athletic Conference and has since become a national power in the Big 12. He helped lead them to the Sun Bowl in 1998, and the Frogs would go on to play in nine more bowl games in the final 10 seasons he was there.

Schultz has also spent coaching stints at Kansas State, Illinois, Middle Tennessee State, New Mexico, Sam Houston State, UTEP and Texas.

Abilene Christian Opens New Stadium for 2017 After 57 Seasons at Shotwell Stadium

Their home since 1960, the Wildcats played their last season at Shotwell Stadium in Abilene in 2016. In those 57 seasons, the Wildcats played 291 games at Shotwell and are 180-107-4 all-time with a winning percentage of .625.

ACU enjoyed seven perfect regular-season records in its 57 seasons at Shotwell and five perfect records overall. ACU posted perfect regular-season records in 1963, 1973, 1974, 1978, 2008, 2010 and 2013.

The Wildcats are 4-2 in postseason games at their former longtime home.

The new on-campus Wildcat Stadium will seat 8,500 with capacity for 12,000 fans. The inaugural game will be played against Houston Baptist in ACU's 2017 home opener on Sept. 16.

Mulitple Southland Award Winners Return

Last year's individual conference superlative winners will be well-represented again in 2017, with all but graduated Offensive Lineman of the Year Bridge Blount of Sam Houston State returning to the field.

Sam Houston State returns five award winners in Head Coach K.C. Keeler, quarterback Jeremiah Briscoe, defensive end P.J. Hall and the wide receiver duo of Yedidiah Louis and Nathan Stewart.

McNeese will return with the 2016 Newcomer of the Year, junior quarterback James Tabary.

Frisco Will Host FCS Title Game for Eighth Straight Year

Before the 2016 championship game, the NCAA agreed to a four-year extension with Frisco, Texas, for the Division I Football Championship title game to be held at Toyota Stadium.

The event is hosted by the Southland Conference, the city of Frisco and the Hunt Sports Group. Frisco has hosted the last seven FCS title games. The championship game is guaranteed to return through at least the 2020 championship.

Toyota Stadium is in the midst of extensive renovations, most notably a revamped south end which will include new locker rooms, separate field-level entrances, additional club seats and a patio area to increase capacity. The stadium will house the National Soccer Hall of Fame.

STORYLINES

- A season of firsts, this will be ACU's first year as fully eligible Division I members, first time with a permanent on-campus home stadium since the 1920s and first year with Adam Dorrel, the current winningest coach in the NCAA.
- The Wildcats open with back-to-back FBS road games at New Mexico and Colorado State, both of which reached bowl games in 2016.
- ACU's opponents were a combined 68-60 in 2016. ACU will be playing six teams that posted winning records in 2016, two FBS bowl teams, two FCS playoff teams and two defending conference champions.

OFFENSE

- Junior QB Dallas Sealey returns to run the Wildcats' offense after finishing second in the Southland in passing yards per game (277.3) and in total offense per game (302.0) in 2016.
- Senior RB De'André Brown will look to bounce back from injury-plagued junior season.
- ACU will have to deal with the loss of starting RT Riley Mayield to graduation. ACU has two OL transfer candidates for the spot in Keaton Bates (SMU) and Bill Webber (Toledo).

DEFENSE

- Senior LB Sam Denmark is just 63 tackles away from becoming ACU's all-time leader in tackles. He enters 2017 with 326. (Ryan Boozer is all-time leader with 388 from 1998-2001).
- 2016 Honorable Mention All-Conference senior Bryson Gates (64 tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss and a team-high 3.0 sacks last year) makes the move from outside LB to rush DE in 2017.
- ACU forced just 13 turnovers in 2016 (only 30 combined the last two seasons) and failed to record a defensive score. ACU's last defensive touchdown was in Nov. 2014 vs. Central Arkansas.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Senior PK Nik Grau returns for senior season with a chance to finish as ACU's all-time leader in field goals made and second in career PATs made and attempted and in career kicking points.
- ACU must replace P Austin Kilcullen, who was with the Wildcats for last four seasons and owns the program record for single-season punting average (44.2 in 2013).
- The Wildcats will return WR/KR Justin Miller, who averaged 21.7 yards per kickoff return.

Adam Dorrel – the winningest active head coach in NCAA football – is in his first season as the head coach of the ACU Wildcats.

Dorrel spent the previous six seasons as the head coach at NCAA Division II power Northwest Missouri State University before agreeing to leave his hometown and take over the Wildcats program. He was introduced as the ACU head coach two days after the 2016 Division II national championship game. Dorrel's team won its second straight national title and third under his leadership with a 29-3 win over North Alabama in the 2016 championship.

Dorrel is the first coach with previous collegiate head coaching experience ever hired by ACU to lead its football program, which dates back to 1919.

In six seasons as a head coach, Dorrel has compiled a 76-8 record with a 90.5 winning percentage that is the best active mark in college football, ahead of Ohio State University's Urban Meyer (second at 85.5 percent). Dorrel led the Bearcats to the NCAA Division II playoffs in all six of his seasons as the head coach and coached them to 30 straight victories to end his tenure at his alma mater. That 30-game streak is the longest in the nation at any level.

He was also voted the American Football Coaches' Association (AFCA) Division II Coach of the Year in 2013, 2015 and 2016.

Prior to being named head coach at Northwest Missouri State, Dorrel was the offensive coordinator for the Bearcats from 2007-10. During that stretch, Dorrel helped the Bearcats to an unprecedented five consecutive Division II championship appearances and their third national title in 2009. Dorrel became the 19th head coach in Northwest history in 2011. In Dorrel's 13 seasons with the Bearcats since joining their coaching staff in 2004, they recorded a 163-22 record and seven MIAA championships.

He is a former all-America offensive lineman and three-year captain at Northwest. He graduated in 1998 with a bachelors of science in physical education, and earned his masters of science (health and physical education) in 2000. A Maryville, Mo., native, Dorrel also was a two-time all-district and all-conference lineman at Maryville High School. Dorrel and his wife, Erin, have twin daughters, Allie and Sam.

STORYLINES

- UCA will try to make a return trip to the FCS Playoffs after reaching the second round last year. The first-round win vs. Illinois State was a programfirst home FCS Playoffs win.
- UCA opens the season at Big 12 Kansas State, facing legendary head coach Bill Snyder at the stadium that bears his name.
- The Bears host four teams in 2017 that finished in the top six in conference standings in 2016 (Sam Houston State, Southeastern La., McNeese and Stephen F. Austin).

OFFENSE

- The Bears return their entire offensive line, plus 2016 projected starter Austin Horton, who missed all of 2016 with injury. That group is led by All-Conference senior Stockton Mallett.
- UCA must replace two first-team All-Conference selections, its career receptions leader (Desmond Smith) and its career all-purpose record holder (Jatavious Wilson). The duo combined for 133 receptions for 1,784 yards and 11 touchdowns. Wilson led the league in all-purpose yards (123.6 per game) and Smith was second in receptions (70).
- Senior second team All-Conference QB Hayden Hildebrand returns after throwing for 3,051 yards and 19 touchdowns in 2016.

DEFENSE

- UCA topped the league in 2016 in total defense, scoring defense and rushing defense, allowing just 72.8 yards on the ground a year ago.
- The defense returns its two top leaders in senior rover George Odum and senior CB Tremon Smith. Odum led the Bears in tackles (86) and forced four fumbles, playing much of the season with a broken hand. Smith had 35 tackles and two interceptions.
- The Bears must replace two quality interior linemen in Terence Partee and Jordan Toliver, but do return two solid ends in Cardell Best and Chris Chambers.

RECORD AT SCHOOL 23-13 (THREE SEASONS)

Coach Steve Campbell, just the third head football coach at the University of Central Arkansas in the past 34 years, brought a new excitement to the program when he arrived prior to the 2014 season. He also brought an established winning tradition and an impressive resume to Conway.

He led the Bears to a 6-6 record in his first season with a new coaching staff and against a brutal schedule, and to a 7-4 mark and a second-place finish in the Southland Conference in his second year. The third year was even better as the Bears finished 10-3 overall and 8-1 in the SLC, losing their finale regular season game to drop out of a shot at another SLC championship. The Bears beat Illinois State in the first round of the FCS Playoffs at home on "The Stripes" before losing to eventual semifinalist Eastern Washington on the road in Cheyney, Wash.

Under Campbell's direction, the Bears had the top defense in the league last season, leading the conference in scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense, while also finishing second in the league in scoring offense and fourth in total offense. UCA topped the 50-point mark twice and averaged 33.1 points per game, while allowing just 21.7.

Campbell has won three national championships at three different schools, as a player and coach. Campbell was an All-Conference center when Troy State won an NCAA Division II national championship in 1987. As head coach at Delta State University, Campbell won another DII national title in 2000. Campbell then coached Mississippi Gulf Coast CC (MGCCC) to the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) championship in 2007.

Campbell, who played at Southeastern Louisiana and Troy, began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Auburn University in 1988-89 under legendary coach Pat Dye, then went to Delta State as offensive line coach and offensive coordinator from 1990-92. Campbell was offensive coordinator at Nicholls State and then running backs coach and head coach at Southwest (Mississippi) Community College before taking over the Delta State program as head coach in 1999.

The Statesmen went 27-8 during Campbell's tenure, including a 14-1 national championship season in 2000. DSU beat UCA 52-21 in Conway that year. Campbell was named the AFCA National Coach of the Year following that championship season. The Statesmen set D-II championship game records of 63 points, 649 yards and 36 first downs in the 63-34 win over Bloomsberg University. Campbell was offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Middle Tennessee State in 2002, and offensive line coach under Jackie Sherrill at Mississippi State in 2003. He took over at MGCSS in 2004 and won three state JUCO championships and led the Bulldogs to seven straight postseason trips.

- The Huskies will have to replace Tony Dawson, who threw for 1,702 yards and seven touchdowns, while rushing for 784 yards and six touchdowns as a senior last season.
- D'Angelo Wallace was the Huskies' leading WR with 24 catches for 308 yards in 2015, but received a medical redshirt after missing last season with a shoulder injury.

DEFENSE

- Senior LB Garrett Dolan led the Southland and ranked second nationally with 12.3 tackles per game (135 total) and has recorded 327 total tackles for his career.
- Senior CB Derek Broussard had a breakout season with 45 tackles, an interception and nine pass breakups
- Sophomore DE Andre Walker recorded 36 tackles, 10.5 for losses, and had 2.5 sacks in his first season as a Husky.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Junior kicker Alec Chadwick made the longest field goal in NCAA Division I last season with a 60-yarder at UIW in the season finale. He was 16-for-25 for the year, including 2-for-3 from 50-plus yards.
- Senior punter Christian Guzman enters 2017 with the third-longest career average in Southland Conference history at 42.9 yards.
- Senior Danny Garza is the only long snapper the Huskies have ever had, but will have a new holder for the first time due to the graduation of David Dunkin.

RECORD AT SCHOOL 11-29 (FOUR SEASONS)

Vic Shealy was named the first head football coach in Houston Baptist University history on April 9, 2012. Shealy won an NAIA national championship while head coach at Azusa Pacific University and served as defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of Kansas prior to arriving at HBU.

In addition to serving as head coach at Azusa Pacific, Shealy, 51, was an assistant at Kansas, Richmond, UNLV, Air Force, Austin Peay State, Mars Hill College and a graduate assistant at Baylor.

The Huskies had the best season in their young history by going 4-7 overall and 3-5 in Southland Conference play In 2016. HBU recorded its first-ever league road win with a 24-17 decision at Lamar on Oct. 29 and posted home wins over Abilene Christian and Stephen F. Austin. Senior linebacker Garrett Dolan earned AP and STATS All-America honors. Dolan, HBU's first-ever first-team all-conference selection, was one of eight Huskies to earn All-Southland honors and one was named to the academic all-conference team.

Shealy served as defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Kansas, was the defensive coordinator at Richmond in 2009 and a Austin Peay in 1994. At UNLV, he was the assistant head coach from 2005-08, after serving as secondary coach at Air Force from 1999-2004. Shealy was also assistant head coach at Austin Peay from 1988-89.

As the head coach at Azusa Pacific from 1995-98, Shealy led the Cougars to the NAIA national championship in his final season. He posted an overall record of 27-14-1 at Azusa Pacific, including a 12-2 record during the championship run. His first team went 4-4-1, followed by a 7-3 season in 1996, the program's first winning season in seven years. Shealy was named NAIA Coach of the Year and the Shutt National Coach of the Year in 1998.

While at Richmond, the Spiders were ranked No. 1 nationally for seven weeks and ranked ninth in scoring defense en route to an 11-2 season. Shealy helped Air Force to a pair of bowl appearances in the Silicon Valley Bowl in 2000 and the San Francisco Bowl in 2002. He also appeared with Baylor in the Liberty Bowl in 1985 and has seen six of his former players go on to careers in the National Football League.

Shealy earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Richmond in 1984, then a Master's degree in physical education from Baylor in 1986. He initially attended Liberty University, where he played quarterback, before transferring to Richmond and serving on his father's staff as a coach. His father, Dal, was the head coach at Mars Hill in 1969, at Carson-Newman from 1970-73 and at Richmond from 1980-88, compiling a 79-74 record. Dal also had stints as an assistant at Baylor, Tennessee and Auburn from 1974-1978.



HEAD COACH SIXTH SEASON LA VERNE, 1966

CAREER HC RECORD 32-53-3 (NINE SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 19-36 (FIVE SEASONS)

Veteran head coach Larry Kennan has quickly raised the profile of the University of the Incarnate Word football program in his first five years at the helm. Since joining the Cardinals in December of 2011, Kennan has brought experience, a positive attitude and a confidence that has transformed UIW football.

Kennan, a former NFL assistant coach and World Football League head coach, has the Cardinals on the cusp of being a major contender for a Southland Conference championship. Having recently completing the transition from NCAA Division II to Division I, UIW is immediately eligible for postseason play and prepared to compete against the top teams in the league.

The Cardinals finished 6-5 overall in the 2015 season and led all Division I programs in the state of Texas in fewest yards allowed per game. UIW stumbled with a 3-8 overall mark in 2016, but the Cardinals ended the year by earning back-to-back victories over Lamar and archrival HBU. Following the season, defensive end Alex Jenkins was selected by the New Orleans Saints, becoming the third UIW player in the last two years to reach the NFL ranks. He joins teammates Cole Wick (Detroit Lions) and Myke Tavarres (Philadelphia Eagles) as Cardinals selected by NFL teams.

Kennan has amassed an overall record of 32-53-3 as a collegiate head coach. He holds a 19-36 record through five seasons with the Cardinals, including a 10-16 mark in Southland Conference play.

Kennan patrolled the sidelines in 2012 for the first time since 1997, however he remained close to the game during his time away from coaching. Kennan served as the executive director of the NFL Coaches Association based in Washington, D.C. for 13 years prior to becoming the head coach of the Cardinals. He kept his hand in the game by tutoring quarterbacks as they prepared for their professional careers, including Tim Couch, Chad Pennington, Drew Brees, Tony Romo, Byron Leftwich, Eli Manning, Alex Smith, Drew Stanton and T.J. Yates.

Kennan has served as an NFL offensive coordinator, a quarterbacks coach, a tight ends coach and a wide receivers coach. He owns a championship ring from the Los Angeles Raiders Super Bowl XVIII win and was the head coach of the London Monarchs when they won a World Football League championship in 1991.

Prior to his career in the NFL, Kennan was an offensive coordinator for three seasons at both Nevada-Las Vegas and SMU. He took over as head coach at Lamar in 1979, where he spent three years in the Southland Conference.

RECORD AT SCHOOL 0-0 (FIRST SEASON)

After succeeding as the offensive coordinator of efficient, high-octane offenses for the better part of 16 years – 14 of those in the state of Texas – Mike Schultz will open the 2017 season in his first year as head coach at Lamar University. He was hired as the second head coach since the program's rebirth in 2010 on December 21, 2016.

The Houston native, who most recently spent five seasons under Dennis Franchione at Texas State, helped jump start a Texas Christian program that began in the Western Athletic Conference when they arrived that has since become a national power in the Big 12. Prior to their arrival, the Horned Frogs suffered a 1-11 mark in 1997 that turned into a 7-5 record and berth into the Sun Bowl in 1998.

He and the Frogs would go on to play in nine more bowl games in the final 10 seasons he was there.

When Gary Patterson took over the program, Schultz stayed on staff as offensive coordinator and the two built a program that was ranked in the AP and Coaches Top 25 polls in 2002, 2003, 2005, 2006 and 2008 by year's end. In 2005 TCU ranked ninth in the country as the Mountain West and Houston Bowl Champions. He was the mastermind that built the foundation for a dominant offense that lasted for more than a decade.

He was key in the maturation of TCU's all-time leading rusher LaDainian Tomlinson, who racked up 5,263 rushing yards in his career, but it was when Schultz showed up that he excelled. In 1999, Tomlinson ran for 1,850 yards and topped that his senior season (2,158) — each led the NCAA. Including Tomlinson's two seasons with more than 1,000 yards, Schultz tutored five 1,000-yard rushers with the Frogs, who only had four in the 100-year history of the program beforehand.

Tomlinson was a Heisman Trophy finalist and the Doak Walker Award winner before being picked fifth overall in the 2001 National Football League draft. He would go on to garner NFL Most Valuable Player honors following the 2006 season with 1.815 rushing yards and an NFL record 28 touchdowns.

As offensive coordinator, he helped groom Andy Dalton into an NFL quarterback. In 2007, Dalton was listed as a freshman All-American after he set the then single-season school records for pass completions (222) and attempts (371) all while notching second in yards (2,459) and fourth in completion percentage (59.8)

Schultz, who has coached both on the offensive and defensive sides of the ball, started his coaching career at his alma mater and Southland Conference rival Sam Houston State in 1979. He served as recruiting coordinator and coached line-backers in one season and flipped to quarterbacks and receivers in the next year. He also was a recruiting coordinator and coached receivers and tight ends at UTEP and Kansas State before joining Fred Akers' staff at Texas in 1985. Following that year, Schultz was an assistant and defensive coordinator at Westwood High School in Round Rock for four years before joining Franchione's staff at Texas State in 1990 – his first stint at TSU.

Throughout his career, Schultz has worked with QBs, running backs, receivers, tight ends, secondary and linebackers.

Lance Guidry was a star on the field for the McNeese Cowboys in the early 90s, became a star on the sideline as a defensive coordinator in the 1990s and the 2000s before becoming McNeese's 15th head coach in school history.

He wore No. 15 as an All-Southland Conference defensive back, helping the Cowboys to two conference championships, and the program's first-ever playoff appearance and victory (1991 and 1993).

Now in his second season at the helm, he's reassuming the controls of a defensive unit that has been one of the most dominant in the league since his playing days – the Defense With Attitude – as he looks to build on McNeese's league-record number of conference titles to capture the number he wore from 1990-93 – No. 15.

Guidry and the Cowboys went through some growing pains in 2016 as the team featured a new quarterback, young running back and offensive line groups, and some young defensive backs. The Cowboys also dealt with some injuries to some key players but still managed to post a 6-5 record for their 12th consecutive winning season – the fourth longest streak of all current FCS teams.

Three of McNeese's five losses were by a score or less while the other two were to the No. 1 team in the country (56-43 at SHSU) and 35-0 vs. No. 22 Central Arkansas.

Offensively, the Cowboys posted one of their greatest seasons in school history, led by transfer quarterback James Tabary who threw for 3,036 yards, the second-most in a season in school history, and 23 touchdowns. The New Orleans native who came to McNeese via Arkansas State, set records for most completions (249) and attempts (415) in a season; most games with 25 or more completions (6); and tied records for most games throwing for 300 yards or more (4) and touchdown passes in a game (5).

McNeese ranked second in the league in total, rushing and scoring defense, but the 285 points allowed were the most given up in three years while the unit ranked near the bottom of the league in red-zone defense by allowing 28 scores in 30 tries.

In 2015, Guidry, as the team's defensive coordinator, helped McNeese win its 14th Southland Conference championship, a league record, while the team posted a perfect regular season.

His defense ranked 12th nationally in total defense (allowing a tad over 300 yards per game), third in both scoring defense and red zone defense, and fourth in rushing defense. In addition, the Cowboys' defense ranked second in 4th-down conversion defense sixth in first downs defense, and seventh in 3rd-down conversion defense.

He acted as interim head coach at Miami University (Ohio) in 2010 and Western Kentucky University in 2012, leading both teams into postseason bowl games.

He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at McNeese in 1994 then returned as the school's defensive coordinator from 2000-04, and in 2008, coached the defensive backs.

Guidry served as defensive coordinator at Western Kentucky in 2011 and 2012 and was named interim head coach on Dec. 8 of 2012.

Guidry led the Redhawks to a 10-4 season after going 1-11 the previous year. Miami became the first FBS school to go from double-digit losses to double-digit wins in consecutive seasons.

Guidry helped orchestrate a similar turnaround in 2011, helping WKU to back-to-back winning seasons in 2011 and 2012, including the program's first-ever bowl bid since joining the FBS.

In between his stints at Carencro, Guidry served as defensive coordinator and coached the secondary at McNeese (2000-04).

Guidry was also a team captain, four-year letterman (1990-93) and all-conference defensive back at McNeese and was a part of two conference championship teams (1991, 1993).

RECORD AT SCHOOL 8-14 (TWO SEASONS)

The Colonels have improved in both seasons under head coach Tim Rebowe and expectations are high for the 2017 squad. Last year's team was filled with young talent and Nicholls will have to replace just a handful of its key contributors from 2016's fourth-place team.

Rebowe completely changed the culture in his first year, ending a program-record losing streak and led Nicholls to a pair of road victories in Southland play. Last season, the Colonels recorded their first winning campaign in the SLC since 2005 and finished tied for fourth place. Before Rebowe arrived two seasons ago, Nicholls had finished last in the league for four consecutive seasons.

Despite going 0-2 out of the league in 2016, the Colonels made their presence known early on with impressive showings against FBS opponents. Nicholls shocked the country in the opening weekend by nearly knocking off No. 9 Georgia in a 26-24 decision. Just two weeks later, the Colonels lost a heartbreaker in overtime at South Alabama, 41-40.

Rebowe vowed to build the program by recruiting local talent, and his first three recruiting classes consisted of 58 Louisiana natives out of a total of 64 signees. In his first signing class, Rebowe welcomed 26 student-athletes, all from the Pelican State and the majority coming from within a 100-mile radius of Thibodaux.

Rebowe, a 53-year old native of Norco, La., was named head football coach on Nov. 21, 2014, becoming the 10th in the program's history. Rebowe, who coached at Louisiana-Lafayette as an assistant for 11 seasons and was a former assistant coach at Nicholls for six years and has strong ties to the state of Louisiana, having coached within the borders his entire career.

Rebowe helped lead the Ragin' Cajun program to four consecutive New Orleans Bowl victories and a conference championship under head coach Mark Hudspeth. During his tenure at ULL, Rebowe served as the safeties coach (2004-07, 2011-14) and linebackers coach (2008-10).

In 1995, Rebowe took his first collegiate job, joining Darren Barbier's staff at Nicholls. From '95-'99, he served as defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator before coaching the receivers in 2000. Rebowe was part of the biggest turnaround in FCS history as the Colonels went 0-11 in '95 before earning a playoff spot the very next season with an 8-4 mark. Rebowe began his coaching career in 1988 at his alma mater, Destrehan High School. While there, he coached Super Bowl

Destrehan High School. While there, he coached Super Bowl Champion and future NFL Hall of Famer Ed Reed. Following his stint with Nicholls, Rebowe coached the cor-

nerbacks at ULM from 2001-03.

Rebowe earned his bachelor of science in physical education

As he prepares for his fifth season as head football coach at Northwestern State, Jay Thomas isn't worried. He's excited.

That may seem odd considering the Demons didn't win a Southland Conference game last season and are picked 10th in an 11-team league in the Southland's official preseason poll.

Thomas is not one to worry. He knows last year wasn't the meltdown the record suggests. The Demons were very close to 4-5 conference wins, games settled in the fourth quarter, some in the final seconds. He likes what he saw in spring practice and what he knows will be added to the mix with new faces starting preseason camp.

After he produced the best back-to-back seasons in a decade, and much more, for Demon football during his first two years in charge, Thomas received a two-year contract extension. The third season in 2015, front-loaded with a brutal opening month, began unsuccessfully. But there was no panic, reflective of the steady leadership by Thomas, and success followed once again.

With very strong recruiting classes each of the last two years, Thomas believes the Demons are on the path to challenging for the Southland Conference title and FCS playoff berths.

Thomas has a deep knowledge of the Southland gained through 17 seasons in the league, including six (2004-09) as head coach at Nicholls. He was a finalist for national coach of the year honors in a 2005 playoff season with the Colonels.

The Demons have seen a significant surge in academic performance with a school-record 975 single-year APR for 2015-16 – a Southland-best - following a 969 in 2014-15 and a 960 for 2013-14. A combined 91 players graduated in NSU's last five commencement exercises going back to 2014.

The 2014 season included noteworthy wins over Conference USA runner-up Louisiana Tech and FCS semifinalist and Southland co-champion Sam Houston State. Three one-score losses in league play and another in the season opener denied the 2014 squad a breakthrough season against a schedule ranked 10th strongest in the country.

Thomas, 56, had been defensive coordinator and assistant head coach in 2012 at Division II Missouri Southern, following two seasons as the Demons' defensive line coach and assistant head coach in 2010 and 2011.

Among players he recruited and developed at Nicholls is star cornerback and kick returner Lardarius Webb of the Baltimore Ravens and three other NFL Draft picks, Kareem Moore (Washington, 2007), Jacob Bender (New York Jets, 2005) and Chris Thompson (Jacksonville, 2003). Three of his Demons are currently in the NFL: Ed Eagan (Buffalo), Pace Murphy and Shakeir Ryan (both with Los Angeles Rams).



- The Bearkats' high-powered offense will be adapting to new coordinator Tim Cramsey.
- Seniors Jeremiah Briscoe, Yedidiah Louis and P.J. Hall will be chasing respective career and conference records at their positions.
- Sam Houston State will look to their defense to back up their high-scoring offense after allowing 29.7 points per game in 2016.

OFFENSE

- The Kats lost just three starting offensive linemen from an offense that led the country in scoring with 49.5 points per game in 2016. Briscoe set a new FCS record with 57 touchdown passes a year
- Louis and Stewart broke the 1,000-yard mark in receiving last season. Fellow WR Davion Davis was just 40 yards short of the mark.
- Of Sam Houston's 89 touchdown drives in 2016, 54 lasted fewer than two minutes.

- The Kats return four of their top five tacklers from a year ago, including all-conference linebacker Justin Johnson.

- · Jaylen Harris set a new school record with 1,020 kickoff return yards in 2016, becoming the first Bearkat to have 1,000 kickoff return yards in a season.
- SHSU led the SLC in kickoff coverage in 2016 with Tre Honshtein booting a league-high 36 of his 106 kickoffs for touchbacks
- . Honshtein could be the frontrunner for taking over for graduated kicker Luc Swimberghe, who became the Southland's all-time leading scoring leader among kickers last year. Swimberghe made 35 field goals and 261 PATs in his career to set the mark.

CAREER HC RECORD 208-83-1 (23 SEASONS)

RECORD AT SCHOOL 34-10 (THREE SEASONS)

In three seasons as head coach at Sam Houston State University, K. C. Keeler directed the Bearkats to an 34-10 record that includes seven victories over top 10 ranked opponents and seven wins in NCAA post-season action.

His SHSU teams have made the playoffs in each of his three seasons at the helm, including back-to-back FCS semifinals appearances in 2014 and 2015 with a pair of Southland Conference championships.

In 2016 he led the Bearkats to their second conference title in three seasons and a national No. 1 ranking for the final six weeks of the regular season on their way to being the nation's lone unbeaten team entering the FCS playoffs.

That run helped him become the first Bearkat coach to claim the Eddie Robinson Award as the top head coach in the FCS in a season that also saw Sam Houston's quarterback, Jeremiah Briscoe, earn the Walter Payton Award as the nation's top offensive player.

During 23 years as a head football coach, Keeler has produced a record of 208 victories, only 83 losses and one tie. His teams at Rowan University, Delaware and Sam Houston State have combined for 14 NCAA post-season playoff appearances, nine conference championships and played in eight national championship games.

Keeler was a four-sport letterman at Emmaus High School in his native Emmaus, Pa. He earned all-league honors and was football team captain as a tight end and linebacker.

During his time at the helm of the Southeastern Louisiana football program, head coach Ron Roberts has helped the Lions reach new heights.

In his first five seasons, Roberts has led the Lions to a 36-24 overall record and a 29-11 Southland Conference mark. In 2013, Roberts was named the Southland Conference, AFCA Region 5 and Louisiana Coach of the Year and was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, given to the top coach in the FCS.

The 2016 Lions won six of their last seven games to finish 7-4 overall and 7-2 in league play. For the fourth time in Roberts' five years, Southeastern defeated all three in-state Southland Conference opponents — McNeese, Nicholls and Northwestern State. The Lions earned 14 spots on the 2016 All-Conference teams.

Named the 16th head coach in school history on December 19, 2011, Roberts brought a proven record of success to Hammond after a successful five-year tenure at Division II Delta State University.

At DSU, Roberts led the Statesmen to a 47-16 record, four 10-win seasons and two NCAA Super Region II titles that included an appearance in the 2010 NCAA Division II national championship game and the 2011 semifinals.

Prior to joining the DSU staff, Roberts served one season as head coach at Mount Whitney (Calif.) HS, and the 2003 season as defensive coordinator at Texas State.

While at Texas State, Roberts took over a defense ranked near the bottom in the Southland Conference. Within a year the seasoned coordinator improved the Bobcats' defense in virtually every statistical category and Texas State placed two defenders on the All-Southland Conference Team.

Before his appointment at Texas State, Roberts spent five seasons as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Tusculum College.

Prior to joining the Tusculum staff, Roberts served as an assistant coach at Greensboro College in 1998 and was head coach at Burroughs High School (1994-96) in California. He began his coaching career at Houston High School in Germantown, Tenn., as a defensive coordinator.

Roberts was a two-time All-Conference selection at line-backer at the College of Sequoias in his native Visalia, Calif. He transferred to the University of Tennessee at Martin, where he helped guide them to the 1988 Gulf South Conference Championship. He graduated in 1990 from UTM with a degree in Sociology and later earned his master's degree in Education from the University of Memphis in 1992.

Clint Conque enters his fourth season as the head coach at Stephen F. Austin, posting a 17-18 overall mark with the Lumberjacks and has a career record of 122-77 as a head coach. The longest tenured coach in the Southland Conference, Conque is entering his 12th season in the league, posting an overall conference record of 46-29, including a 13-13 mark at SFA.

During his first three seasons at SFA, Conque has helped produce nine All-Southland Conference first or second team selections, including 2014 SLC Player of the Year and first team All-American Gus Johnson. In his first season, Conque helped lead the Lumberjacks to an 8-5 overall record in 2014 and an FCS playoff appearance, being named the SLC's Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career.

In his first three years at the helm of the Lumberjacks, Conque has seen four of his former players sign NFL free agent contracts, the most recent being Zach Conque signing with the Houston Texans following the 2017 NFL Draft.

SFA has produced seven Academic All-SLC selections during his tenure, highlighted by Marlon Walls being named the Southland Student-Athlete of the Year and a first team CoSIDA Academic All-American in 2016 – the first in program history.

Conque came to SFA after spending 14 seasons at conference rival Central Arkansas, leading the Bears to a 105-59 record during his time in Conway. The Bears' all-time winningest coach, Conque ranks second all-time in collegiate coaching victories in Arkansas, second only to legendary Razorback coach Frank Broyles.

During his time in Conway, Conque led UCA to a pair of Southland titles in 2008 and 2012 and was a three-time Coach of the Year honoree. Conque guided the Bears through their Division I transition and led UCA to four postseason appearances and seven final top-25 rankings.

Conque has been named an Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year finalist four times, being named the 2008 NCAA FCS Regional Coach of the Year. He has coached 143 all-conference players and 44 All-Americans with 36 former players playing professionally in either the NFL or CFL.

Conque spent seven years at Louisiana Tech, ultimately as the Bulldogs offensive coordinator under current SFA O.C. Gary Crowton. He formerly had stints at Samford and McNeese while serving as a high school assistant at both St. Thomas More and Rayne High Schools in Louisiana.

Conque was an All-American linebacker at Nicholls, signing with the Los Angeles Raiders following his playing days. He was named to the Nicholls' Silver Anniversary Team in 1997 and was inducted to the Colonel's Hall of Fame in 2005.

Conque is married to the former Angelé Jackson and the couple has three sons: Chasse (wife Lisa), the Director of Athletics at Arkansas-Little Rock; Benton (wife Morgan), a captain in the U.S. Army stationed in Missouri; and Zach, a tight end for the Houston Texans. Conque is the grandfather of three girls born to Chasse and Lisa (twins Juliana and Sydney, followed by Adeline).

SAM HOUSTON STATE COMPLETES RECORD-BREAKING SEASON

Sam Houston State claimed the 2016 Southland Conference title behind an 11-0 regular season and 9-0 mark in league play. The Bearkats defeated Central Arkansas 59-23 in a battle of undefeated conference records during the last weekend of the regular season to earn the program's seventh Southland championship.

The Bears were selected as an at-large team in the FCS Playoffs and took a home victory in the opening round against Illinois State, 31-24. Central Arkansas fell 31-24 at Eastern Washington in the second round.

Receiving a first-round bye in the FCS Playoffs as the No. 5 seed, Sam Houston awaited the winner of Chattanooga and Weber State to begin its playoff run. Sam Houston edged Chattanooga at home 41-36 before falling to the eventual FCS champion, James Madison, 65-7.

Sam Houston State, with a final 2016 record of 12-1, finished the year at No. 5 in the in the STATS and FCS Coaches poll while Central Arkansas ranked No. 14 in the former poll and No. 16 in the latter with its 12-3 record. McNeese and Southeastern Louisiana received votes in the FCS Coaches and STATS poll.

Jeremiah Briscoe, the Bearkats' quarterback, saw a record-setting year score him the 2016 Walter Payton Award; the first Sam Houston player to win the award given to the top offensive player in FCS and just the second Southland player to take the honor. The Stratford High School product set the FCS single-season record for touchdown passes with 57, throwing six touchdowns or more four times in 11 games. Briscoe was also named the Southland Player of the Year.

Sam Houston State Head Coach K.C. Keeler received the Eddie Robinson Award, given to the top coach in FCS. He became the third Southland coach to win the distinction.

Briscoe and teammate P.J. Hall, defensive end, were named to the 2016 STATS FCS All-American First Team. Lamar's defensive back Brendan Langley, who was drafted by the Denver Broncos in the third round of the NFL Draft as the 101st pick, picked up second-team honors. Sam Houston's offensive lineman Bridge Blount, Houston Baptist's linebacker Garrett Dolan and Central Arkansas' defensive back Tyler Williams were named to the third team.

Stephen F. Austin senior safety Marlon Walls added another academic accolade to his 2016 season, being named Southland Conference Football Student-Athlete of the Year.

Walls, a two-time All-Academic selection, also earned CoSIDA Academic All-American, CoSIDA Academic All-District and FCS ADA Academic All-Star honors this season. He was also a finalist for the STATS FCS Doris Robinson Award presented to the scholar-athlete of the year. The Pearland, Texas native posted a perfect 4.00 grade point average with a major in engineering physics and minor in mathematics. He started in 10 of 11 games for the Lumberjacks while ranking third on the team with 61 total tackles and leading with 36 solo stops.

Central Arkansas led the way with five selections, including wide receivers Desmond Smith and Jatavious Wilson, tight end Cody Dauksch, and offensive linemen Stockton Mallett and John Cook. Smith was named to his third Southland All-Academic team.

UIW earned four spots on the 2016 All-Academic team, including the quarterback spot with graduate student Trent Brittain, a two-time selection with a 3.34 GPA and major in administration.

Nicholls and Stephen F. Austin each earned three spots while Abilene Christian, Lamar, Northwestern State and Sam Houston State earned a pair of selections each.



SOUTHLAND IN THE NFL

One of the premiere leagues in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision, the Southland Conference continues to emerge as a breeding ground for the future stars of the National Football League. From groundbreaking players such as Pro Football Hall of Famer Fred Dean to the league's newest crop of first-year hopefuls, the conference boasts a rich tradition of sending impact players to the NFL.

For each of the Southland's NFL-bound alumni, professional success starts in the classrooms and on the gridiron of the league's 11 active competing universities.

Lamar's Brenden Langley was a third-round pick drafted by the Denver Broncos in the 2017 NFL Draft as the 101st selection.

In 2016, three Southland players were selected in the NFL Draft, the most from the conference since four players were picked in 2009. Southeastern Louisiana's Harlan Miller was selected in the sixth round by the Arizona Cardinals followed by Central Arkansas' Jonathan Woodard and Sam Houston State's Lachlan Edwards, both of whom were taken in the seventh round.

In the 2013 NFL Draft, another Southland player joined the league as Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford was picked in the second round (60th overall) by the Atlanta Falcons. Alford became the first Lion player ever to be drafted in the NFL and the league's highest draft pick since Stephen F. Austin's Mikhael Ricks was selected 59th overall by the San Diego Chargers in 1998.

The Southland Conference led all FCS conferences with four selections in the 2009 draft and sent 11 players into preseason camps that summer. Only in 2002, when five players were among the more than 250 selections, were more Southland alumni drafted in the same season since 2000. The Southland is one of five FCS conferences with at least 200 selections (212) in the NFL draft.

Former Sam Houston State quarterback Josh McCown is the conference's most experienced alumnus in the NFL. Northwestern State's Terrance McGee completed 14 seasons in the NFL, with various teams. McCown enters the 2017 season as a member of the New York Jets. He has played

in every season since graduating from Sam Houston except 2010. Former Nicholls cornerback Lardarius Webb has played the last eight years in the NFL, all with the Baltimore Ravens.

Former Northwestern State cornerback Terrance McGee, an All-American kick returner during his tenure with the Demons, is one of 10 players from the Southland Conference to have taken part in the Pro Bowl. He was selected to the AFC squad as the league's special teams' representative in 2005. Only Stephen F. Austin alumnus Jeremiah Trotter has played in the Pro Bowl more recently than McGee.

The Lumberjacks' former pass-rushing star retired in 2007 having taken part in four Pro Bowls as a representative of the Philadelphia Eagles, the last of which came in 2006. Former Arkansas State star Bill Bergey, who played in a five Pro Bowls, including one with the Cincinnati Bengals, also represented the Eagles in four Pro Bowls.

The conference's other four-time Pro Bowler is Fred Dean, arguably the most successful professional football player in the history of the Southland Conference. Dean, a four-time Pro Bowler, was a two-time Southland Defensive Player of the Year and a first-team all-Southland selection all four years of his career at Louisiana Tech. He is one of only five Southland players to earn that distinction. In all, Dean played for 11 seasons in the NFL, recording 93 sacks in 141 games for the San Diego Chargers and San Francisco 49ers. He twice hoisted the Vince Lombardi Trophy as a Super Bowl Champion alongside Joe Montana and in 2009 became the first Southland football player to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio.

Like Dean, former Texas State standout Ricky Sanders won a pair of Super Bowl rings with the Washington Redskins during his seven-year career. The owner of multiple Super Bowl records, including most receiving yards (193), most total yards (235), most touchdowns in one quarter (2), most receiving yards in one quarter (168), and the longest touchdown reception (80, tie), Sanders joins Dean and 30 other former Southland players as members of at least one Super Bowl championship roster.

The Southland has seen former Nicholls players win Super Bowl rings in two of the last five seasons, as former Colonel Antonio Robinson was a member of the Green Bay Packers' Super Bowl XLVI champions. while Webb was a member of the Super Bowl XLVII champion Baltimore Ravens. A total of 50 former players from the Southland have 68 Super Bowl appearances. Former Northwestern State cornerback Jeremy Lane reached two Super Bowls with the Seattle Seahawks and winning one in 2013.

Most recently, Southeastern Louisiana's Robert Alford reached Super Bowl LI with the Atlanta Falcons, where he returned a Tom Brady interception for an 82-yard touchdown in the 34-28 overtime loss. His is the second-longest interception return in Super Bowl history.

More former NFL stars from the Southland include Stan Humphries, Fred Barnett, Roger Carr, Marvin Upshaw, Mike Barber, Bruce Collie, Tim McKyer, Pat Tilley, Jackie Harris, Eugene Seale, Bubby Brister, Leonard Smith, Billy Ryckman, Rafael Septien, Buford Jordan and Ray Brown, among many others.
