
Fig. 6-1, 2-1 Southla	nd

- Fordham's average fell by 0.7 points, and the gap between the two now stands at 0.8 points per game. Fordham is off this week and next plays nationally-ranked Holy Cross.
- The Southland record book notes the most total points scored in a season, with Sam Houston scoring 616 points in 15 games in 2015 an average of 41.1 points per game.
