SOUTHLAND TITLE SCENARIOS

- The two games that have implications on the conference championship and the NCAA Playoff automatic qualifier are Thursday night's River Bell Classic between Southeastern and Nicholls, and the Saturday matinee between UIW and Northwestern State.
- If Southeastern beats Nicholls, there will be a two-way tie for the Southland championship for the first time since 2019, when Nicholls and Central Arkansas tied for the title. In this scenario, Southeastern receives the AQ to the playoffs, having wins over both UIW and Northwestern State.
- The winner of the UIW/Northwestern State game will be a Southland champion. If SLU wins, they will be co-champions. If SLU loses, the winner of this game is outright champion and the AQ to the playoffs.
- Southeastern has qualified for the playoffs four times (3-4 record), Northwestern State has qualified six times (3-6 record), and UIW has qualified for the playoffs twice (1-2 record).

He averaged 11.3 yards per carry and had five rushes of 10 yards or more, with four of those going for 20 yards or more. His long run of 30 yards came on his first carry of the game and he scored on runs of 16 and 11

Ennis earns defensive player of the week honors for the second time this season after recording eight tackles, one pass break up, four quarterback hurries and the game-winning sack for a safety in the victory over A&M-Commerce. With the game tied in the fourth quarter, Ennis blitzed and forced the Lion quarterback to run out of the back of the end zone for a 12-10 Colonel lead. Nicholls held on to the victory as Ennis and the defense allowed less than 300 yards of total offense.

NEWS & NOTES

SOUTHEASTERN at NICHOLLS • 6 p.m. Thursday • ESPN+

- The River Bell Classic will help decide the title race this season. If SLU wins, the Lions are conference champions. If Nicholls wins, there's a three-way tie for second.
- This series will play its 33rd game, with the record tied at 16 wins apiece. Nicholls won last year's meeting, 45-42.
- SLU has won the last two meetings in Thibodaux, where the series is tied 7-7.
- This game will have the eyes of the FCS nation, as it's the only game on the Thursday calendar in the entire nation.

HCU at TARLETON • 2 p.m. • ESPN+

- The Huskies head to Stephenville for an out-of-conference game to end the season.
- This is HCU's first-ever meeting with the Texans.
- Tarleton is 5-5 on the season (I-3 in conference) and is on a three-game losing skid.

TENNESSEE STATE at A&M-COMMERCE • 2 p.m. • ESPN+

- The Lions and Tigers will tangle for the first time in 36 years as A&M-Commerce looks to snap a three-game skid and finish over .500 in its first season in Division I.
- TSU was a 15-6 winner in the only prior meeting in 1986 when TSU was ranked No. 5 in I-AA and TAMUC had just moved to Division II.
- Tennessee State is 3-7 on the year and 2-3 in the OVC, having lost its last three games.

LAMAR at McNEESE • 7 p.m. • ESPN+

- The regular season closes out under the lights in Lake Charles for the 40th playing of the Battle of the Border.



- Two SLC teams are near the top of the charts in fewest penalties.
- Nicholls only accrues 30.3 penalty yards per game on 36 total penalties, which are the second-fewest in the nation.
- McNeese has only committed 41 penalties this year, which ranks 11th in the nation.

TOP TACKLERS

- HCU linebacker Rodney Dansby leads the nation in total tackles, averaging 12.2 tackles per contest.
- McNeese linebacker Kordell Williams ranks fifth in total tackles with 10.7 tackles per game.

THREE PLAYERS ADDED TO NATIONAL WATCH LISTS

- Three Southland football players were named as midseason additions to national award watch lists.
- A&M-Commerce wide receiver Andrew Armstrong was named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List.
- McNeese linebacker Kordell Williams was named to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. Williams ranks fourth nationally in total tackles per game at 11.0 per game.
- Nicholls freshman linebacker Kaiden Jones was named to the Jerry Rice Award Watch List for top freshman in the nation. He has 40 tackles in seven games played in his first season.

- UIW return man Kole Wilson took two punt returns for touchdowns in the win over Faulkner, as part of a 7 return for 179-yard game. Both touchdowns came on 48-yard
- His total punt return yardage is the secondhighest single game total in Southland history, the highest single-game total in FCS this season, and most in an FCS game since 2018.
- He is the first Southland player to return two punts for touchdowns in the same game since Sam Houston's Tony Jones vs. Ouachita Baptist in 2004.
- The season record for the league is three, which has happened five times.
- The career record is held by McNeese's Richard Ellender, who housed four punts from 1975-78, with three coming in his final season.
