SOUTHLAND SLATE FEATURES FOUR GAMES THIS WEEK

• Action around the Southland is featured by a key contest in the conference title race, with three other intriguing contests.

NORTHWESTERN STATE at A&M-COMMERCE • 2 p.m. • ESPN+

- Saturday's key game in league action will have major implications on the Southland title race, as 3-0 Northwestern State visit 3-1 A&M-Commerce.
- These teams are meeting for the 30th time, with the Demons holding a 17-10-2 record in the series. The series in Commerce is tied at 4-4-2, dating back to 1926.
- NSU has won the last four meetings and 10 of the last 11, and will visit Commerce for the first time since 1999.

HCU at UIW • 2 p.m. • ESPN+

- Two teams with opposite trends will meet in the Alamo City, as UIW has won five straight and HCU has lost four straight.
- UIW is 7-0 all-time against HCU, including 4-0 in games at Benson Stadium
- This is UIW's Homecoming contest.

SOUTHEASTERN at LAMAR • 3 p.m. • ESPN3

- The Cardinals will play in Beaumont for the final time this season when they welcome the Lions in from Hammond, America.
- Field position will be key in this game, as these teams both rank highly nationally in punting and can flip the field when pinned.
- Southeastern has a 9-4 lead in the all-time series and a 3-2 lead in Beaumont.
- The Lions have won the last four straight in the series and 8 of the last 9.

EASTERN ILLINOIS at McNEESE • 7 p.m. • ESPN+

- A Southland/Ohio Valley matchup will be the conference nightcap, with McNeese hosting Eastern Illinois.
- The Cowboys and Panthers are meeting for the first time in 29 years.
- McNeese has won both previous meetings against EIU, at home in 1993 and on the road in 1990.
- The Panthers are 2-6 overall and 1-2 in the OVC this season.

- The Southland Conference will host the game in Frisco for the 13th consecutive season.
- FCS Championship tickets will go on sale to the public Friday, Sept. 16, at 11 a.m. ET at NCAA.com/FCS.

UIW CARDINALS' SOARING OFFENSE



- The UIW Cardinals' scoring average still ranks second in the nation after their 35-7 win over A&M-Commerce last week.
- This puts the Cardinals at 443 total points through nine games for an average of 49.2

points, and are still the only FCS team to score over 400 points this season.

• The Southland record book notes the most total points scored in a season, with Sam Houston scoring 616 points in 15 games in 2015 - an average of 41.1 points per game.



- Nicholls freshman linebacker Kaiden Jones was named to the Jerry Rice Award Watch List for top freshman in the nation. He has 40 tackles in seven games played in his first season.

• UIW return man Kole Wilson took two punt returns for touchdowns in the win over Faulkner, as part of a 7 return for 179-yard game. Both touchdowns came on 48-yard

· His total punt return yardage is the secondhighest single game total in Southland history, the highest single-game total in FCS this season, and most in an FCS game since 2018.

- He is the first Southland player to return two punts for touchdowns in the same game since Sam Houston's Tony Jones vs. Ouachita Baptist in 2004.
- The season record for the league is three, which has happened five times.
- The career record is held by McNeese's Richard Ellender,

who housed four punts from 1975-78, with three coming in his final season.
