SEC PRESEASON POLL

Louisiana was picked to win its fourth-straight Sun Belt West Division title in the Preseason Coaches Poll, while capturing 9-of-10 first-place votes. Coastal Carolina and App State were tied atop the Sun Belt East Division ledger, though the Chanticleers claimed an edge with 6-of-10 first-place nods. Coastal Carolina and Louisiana were Sun Belt co-champions in 2020, while App State won four-straight titles from 2016-19.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

RIVALRY RENEWED

For the first time in 25 years, App State will host Marshall at Kidd Brewer Stadium at 6:30 p.m. Thursday on ESPN. The Mountaineers lead the all-time series, 14-9, though the Thundering Herd won last season's meeting 17-7, handing App State its lone non-conference loss of the 2020 season. This will be the 20th national television appearance in the last 31 games for the Mountaineers, who are 37-12 all-time in games on ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU.

NONE IF BY AIR

No. 17/17 Coastal Carolina will host UMass at 12 p.m. Saturday on ESPN+ to conclude its 2021 non-conference slate. The Chanticleer's 38-28 win over the Minutemen on Sept. 2, 2017, was Coastal Carolina's first victory as a member of the Sun Belt Conference and the FBS. Coastal Carolina is one of just six FBS teams that has not allowed a single passing touchdown this season, joining No. 9/7 Clemson, No. 6/8 Penn State, Rutgers, No. 7/5 Texas A&M and Washington. A win would give the Chanticleers back-to-back unblemished non-conference marks and would run the team's record to 4-0 for the second-straight campaign and the fifth time in program history (2013, 2014, 2015 and 2020).





PLAYING SPOILER

Fresh off its first victory of the 2021 season—a 20-9 win over previously unbeaten Charlotte—Georgia State will travel to No. 23/23 Auburn at 3 p.m. Saturday on SEC Network. The first-ever meeting between the two programs is Georgia State's first date with an SEC foe since it upset Tennessee, 38-30, in the 2019 season opener. The Panthers will attempt to spoil homecoming for the Tigers, who own an 82-8-4 homecoming record including 29-straight wins.

GRAND OPENING

The 2021 Sun Belt Conference season will kick off at 5 p.m. Saturday on ESPN+ when Louisiana visits Georgia Southern. This is the third-straight year that the Eagles will face the Ragin' Cajuns in their conference opener. Louisiana leads the all-time series 3-1, including a 20-18 victory in 2020 via a walk-off 53-yard field goal from Nate Snyder. The kick was just the seventh of 53 yards or more in program history.

BALL HAWKS

ULM hosts Troy in the conference opener for both programs at 7 p.m. Saturday on ESPN+. The Trojans lead the all-time series 10-7-1, though the Warhawks are 5-3-1 at home and 6-5 since Troy joined the Sun Belt Conference in 2005. ULM, which is coming off its first victory since Nov. 23, 2019, is one of four FBS teams that has not lost a turnover in 2021, joining Liberty, No. 19/19 Michigan and Rutgers. The Warhawks rank second in the nation with a 3.00 average turnover margin, trailing only Boise State. ULM has four fumble recoveries and two interceptions in two games played this season.

Johnson is one of just six players in the nation with four rushing scores in a single game this season.

The Tallahassee, Fla., native's tackles-for-loss and sack totals are the second-most nationally this season. Troy's 16 tackles-for-loss against Southern Miss are the second-most in a game in the program's Division I history, while its nine sacks are tied for the most in the program's FBS history.

Warhawks senior kicker Calum Sutherland accounted for all 12 points in ULM's 12-7 victory over Jackson State—the Warhawks first win since Nov. 23, 2019. The Keller, Texas, product converted from 29, 45, 42 and a career-long 49 yards out to snap ULM's 12-game losing streak. Sutherland's 12 points tied his career high, as he became the first Warhawk kicker to make four field goals in a single game since Cole Wilson at Louisiana on Dec. 3, 2006.

SUN BELT IN THE NFL

Twenty-six Sun Belt alumni competed in Week 2 of the 2021 National Football League (NFL) season, with 12 earning starts for their respective teams.

The Arkansas State alumni duo of New Orleans Saints linebacker Demario Davis and Washington Football Team running back J.D. McKissic headlined the Sun Belt performances in Week 2 play. Davis registered 12 tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass defended, while McKissic found the end zone for the third touchdown of his professional career. The running back had 10 yards on four rushing attempts and 83 yards on five catches.

Louisiana product Elijah Mitchell followed up his standout debut with 42 yards on 17 rushes and 11 yards on two receptions for the San Francisco 49ers. Kansas City Chiefs running back Jerick McKinnon out of Georgia Southern (1 Reception, 14 Yards), Miami Dolphins wide receiver Albert Wilson out of Georgia State (4 Receptions, 20 Yards) and Seattle Seahawks tight end Gerald Everett out of South Alabama (1 Reception, 3 Yards) also contributed offensively.

On the defensive side of the ball, 10 Sun Belt alumni combined for 30 tackles, two passes defended, one tackle for loss and one quarterback hurry. Georgia Southern alum Kindle Vildor—a defensive back for the Chicago Bears—and Louisiana product Tracy Walker III—a safety for the Detroit Lions—turned in four tackle efforts.

Akeem Davis-Gaither (App State, Cincinnati Bengals), Josh Norman (Coastal Carolina, San Francisco 49ers), Chandon Sullivan (Georgia State, Green Bay Packers), Christian Ringo (Louisiana, New Orleans Saints), David Mayo (Texas State, Washington Football Team), Mario Addison (Troy, Buffalo Bills) and Steve McLendon (Troy, Tampa Bay Buccaneers) added to the Sun Belt tackle total.

App State alumnus punter Sam Martin accumulated 180 yards on four punts for the Denver Broncos. Former Georgia Southern kickers Tyler Bass and Younghoe Koe were 7-for-7 on extra points and 1-for-2 on field goals. Bass missed a 53-yard attempt for the Buffalo Bills, while Koe converted on a 36-yard field goal for the Atlanta Falcons.
