Game 9: GEORGIA STATE (2-6) at JMU (6-2)

Saturday, Nov. 9 | 3:30 p.m. ET | Harrisonburg, Va. | Bridgeforth Stadium

THE KICKOFF: Georgia State looks to secure its first road win of the season under the new leadership of head coach Dell McGee at James Madison on Friday, Nov. 1 at 7:00 p.m. at Zane Showker Field at Bridgeforth Stadium.

> Following the road contest at James Madison, the Panthers return to Center Parc Credit Union Stadium for the first time in over a month of road contests on Nov. 11 to host Arkansas State for Homecoming.

SERIES NOTES: Georgia State and James Madison are meeting for the fourth time in program history.

> The Panthers are looking for their first win in program history over the Dukes.

PANTHERS VS. THE SUN BELT: Despite a slow start to conference play, the Panthers continue to stand in Sun Belt rankings, on both sides of the ball.

> The Panthers rank third in the Sun Belt and top 50 in the nation for fewest penalties (46).

> Offensively, the Panthers rank top 10 in the Sun Belt in completion percentage (5th with 0.62) and passing offense (5th with 249.9).

> Defensively, GSU ranks third in the conference and 26th in the nation for fumbles recovered with six. Henry Bryant leads the Panthers and the Sun Belt with two fumble recoveries, ranking fifth in the nation. KD McDaniel, Izaiah Guy, Anthony Blume and Rykem Laney all have one to tie for eighth in the conference for fumbles recovered.

> Senior Kevin Swint leads the Panthers with three forced fumbles to rank second in the conference and seventh in the nation. D-Icey Hopkins, Josiah Robinson and Henry Bryant have one forced fumbles.

TRACKING THE RECORD:

> Ted Hurst's seven touchdowns put him two scores away from breaking the single-season touchdown record (8).

> Senior linebacker Kevin Swint currently has four sacks on the season, which is two away from tying the second place spot for single-season sacks (6) and seven away from breaking the record (10.5).

> Swint is also on track to beat the career record for forced fumbles. Standing at four in his career, he is four forced fumbles away from breaking the record of seven.

> Henry Bryant stands at three career fumble recoveries, which is tied for fifth in program history. Bryant needs two more to tie the career record for fumbles recovered.

> Gavin Pringle and Jeremiah Johnson both have six pass breakups on the season, which is on track to break the program record for single-season pass breakups (11).

> Liam Rickman stands with 11 field goals made, which is on track to break the single-season FG-made record of 15.

NEW STARTING QB: After a GSU-record 36 consecutive games with Darren Grainger as the starting quarterback, Christian Veilleux and Zach Gibson continue the battle for the Panthers' starting quarterback position.

> After starting Christian Veilleux at quarterback for the first six games, **Zach Gibson** earned the starting position for game seven at App State (Oct. 26), and has started for the Panthers in the last two games.

> Gibson is 69-for-100 with five touchdowns and one interception this season.

> In his first start at GSU, at App State, Gibson went 16-for-22 for a career-high 192 yards and one touchdown against the Mountaineers.

> Gibson stepped in as the Panthers' quarterback early in the first half of play at Marshall (Oct. 17), and finished the contest going 19-of-32 for 192 yards and two touchdowns.

> Gibson saw his season debut in the final minutes against Old Dominion (Oct. 12), when he went 6-for-6 for 49 yards with one touchdown against the Monarchs.

> The redshirt senior joined the Panthers for the 2024 season as a transfer from Georgia Tech.

> Quarterback **Christian Veillue** started in six games for the Panthers, leading the team with nine touchdowns and 1312 yards on 119 completions.

> Only three games into the season, Veilleux matched his single-season record for touchdowns with seven (six passing, one rushing), which he previously set at Pitt

during the 2023 season.

> In his first season with the Panthers, Veilleux quickly made a name for himself in the Sun Belt, ranking sixth in the conference for completions per game (19.67). The starting quarterback is eighth in the conference for passing yards per game with 216.8.

> The senior transfer also ranks top 10 in the Sun Belt for passing touchdowns (7th with 9) and passing yards per completion (7th with 11.03 per completion).

> Veilleux threw a season high 26 completions in two of the three games played so far (Chattanooga and Vanderbilt). His 58.6 completion percentage ranks seventh in the conference and top 100 nationally.

> After setting a career high 269 passing yards in the Panthers' upset over Vanderbilt, Veilleux set a new career-high 356 passing yards against Georgia Southern (Sept. 28).

> Leading the Panthers through an upset over Vanderbilt, the transfer quarterback posted a career-high three passing touchdowns and one rushing touchdown in the Panthers' 36-32 victory. Veilleux's 18-yard rushing touchdown also marked a career-high for longest rush. His rushing touchdown was the first of his career.

> Previously, the starting quarterback went 12-for-34 and recorded a season-long 238 yards and two touchdowns in the Panthers' home opener against Chattanooga to record his first GSU career win (Sept. 7).

> Despite joining the Panthers late in the off-season, after McGee's hire, Veilleux quickly became the leading contender for the starting quarterback.

> The junior transfer from Pitt joins the GSU program for the 2024 season after spending one season at Pittsburgh and two at Penn State. Last season, Veilleux appeared in seven games (five starts) for Pitt, and completed 94-of-184 passes for 1,179 yards and seven touchdowns.

MORE ON THE QB ROOM: While Christian Veilleux and Zach Gibson have both seen starts this season, the Panthers have seen three quarterbacks in action so far, including Kyle Lowe.

> Gibson, Veilleux and Lowe have all recorded rushing touchdowns this season. Veilleux's came in the Vanderbilt game (Sept. 14), while Lowe's came on a quarterback rush against App State (Oct. 26). Gibson ran in his first-ever rushing touchdown at UConn (Nov. 1).

KEY RETURNERS: Despite the large influx of newcomers to the 2024 squad, head coach McGee retained multiple key returners to the 2024 squad.

> Veterans **Gavin Pringle** and **Kevin Swint** were named to the 2024 Preseason All-Sun Belt First Team after leading the Panthers on defense through the 2023 season. Senior linebacker **Justin Abraham** was named to the 2024 Athlon Sports Pre-Season All-Sun Belt Second-Team Defense.

> Running back **Freddie Brock** is the Panthers' leading running back, totaling 575 yards on 99 attempts. Brock's. He also leads the Panthers in total all-purpose yards with 699. Brock's 71.9 yards-per-game ranks fifth in the Sun Belt and 59th in the nation.

> The junior running back is one of two running backs to record a rushing touchdown this season. He has two touchdowns on the season.

>The redshirt junior has recorded four touchdowns (three rushing, one receiving) this season, the second-most on the team. He has scored once in four games, including Chattanooga (Sept. 7), Georgia Southern (Sept. 28), Old Dominion (Oct. 12) and UConn (Nov. 1).

> At Marshall, Brock set a season-high 124 rushing yards, including a new season and team-long 56-yard rush. Previously, he set a season-long 23 yard rush at Georgia Tech (Aug. 31), which he matched in the Panther's home opener against Chattanooga (Sept. 7).

> The Rochester, N.Y., native recorded the receiving touchdown of his GSU career with a career-long 24-yard catch against Old Dominion (Oct. 12).

> Brock scored the game-winning touchdown against Chattanooga (Sept. 7), marking his first touchdown of the season (second of his GSU career).

> Sophomore **Dorian Fleming** is second on the Panthers' receiving leaderboard with 351 yards on 35 receptions and two touchdowns.

> The sophomore tight end ranks top 10 in the Sun Belt for receptions per game with 4.4.

> Fleming marked a career-long 58 yard reception against Georgia Southern (Sept. 28).

> Fleming set a new career-high six receptions against Vanderbilt (Sept. 14), which he previously set in the 2023 season.

> After starting in only four games in 2023, the sophomore tight end had a breakout game against Georgia Tech, scoring the first

touchdown of the season for the Panthers.

> Senior linebacker **Kevin Swint** has become a key defender for Panthers, leading the defense with four sacks, 6.5 tackles for loss and three forced fumbles on the season.

> Swint is second in the Sun Belt and ranks seventh in the nation for forced fumbles after recording three so far this season, including one in games against Vanderbilt (Sept. 14), Georgia Southern (Sept. 28) and UConn (Nov. 1).

> His four sacks rank top 10 in the Sun Belt.

> After an impact performance against SEC competitors Vanderbilt, Swint earned Sun Belt Player of the Week honors after leading the Panthers with eight tackles.

> Swint opened the contest with a forced fumble in the first drive of the game to set the pace for the Panthers upset over Vanderbilt. His forced fumble for 7 yards set Georgia State up on the Vanderbilt 20-yard line and allow the Panthers to put the first points on the board. He recorded his second sack of the game (8 yards) in the first drive of the fourth quarter to set the defensive momentum for the final minutes of the game. In addition to his two sacks and forced fumble, Swint recorded eight tackles (five solo) and two pass breakups. One of his pass breakups happened on a 4th-and-3 in the fourth quarter to ultimately set the Panthers to up for a 29-17 advantage over Vanderbilt.

> Senior linebacker **Justin Abraham** has become a pivotal leader on the Panthers defense, leading the team in tackles with 39 (29 solo), including two tackles for a loss of seven yards.

>The veteran linebacker registered his first sack of the season for a loss of six yards in the Panthers' home opener win over Chattanooga (Sept.. 7).

> The Hartsville, S.C., native recorded team single-game high 11 tackles against Georgia Tech (Aug. 31). This also marked a career-high for the senior linebacker.

> Redshirt senior **Gavin Pringle** leads the Panthers' defense and is tied for the most pass breakups on the team with six.

> Pringle is one of four Panthers to record an interception this season, after snagging his first of the season (fourth at GSU) in the home opener against Chattanooga (Sept. 7).

> Junior tackle **Henry Bryant** is tied for the most sacks on the team (4 for 20 yards), and is second on the Panthers' leaderboard for tackles for loss (4.5 for 20 yards).

> Bryant leads the team with two fumble recoveries, which leads the conference and ranks fifth in the nation. He snagged his first recovery of the season against Georgia Southern (Spet. 28) and his second came at UConn (Nov. 1).

> Henry recorded a season-high four tackles in the Panthers' season-opener at Georgia Tech (Aug. 31).

> After redshirting his freshman year in 2023, **D-Icey Hopkins** started his sophomore campaign with the first forced fumble for the Panthers this season in the home opener against Chattanooga (Sept. 7).

> Hopkins has 17 tackles (12 solo) and two pass breakups on the season.

NEWCOMERS LEADING THE PACK: With the leadership change for the Panthers during the off season, Georgia State retained 65 returners and added 54 newcomers to the 2024 roster.

> Georgia State saw its largest influx of transfers in the offseason, with 48 transfer additions to the roster.

> Junior wide receiver **Ted Hurst** is the Panthers' leading receiver with 597 total receiving yards on the season, which ranks sixth in the conference and top 100 in the nation.

> Hurst ranks second in the Sun Belt and top 20 in the nation after completing seven touchdowns this season. He recorded a career-high two receiving touchdowns in the Panthers' upset over Vanderbilt.

> The Valdosta State transfer holds the team season-long reception for 78 yards, which he caught against rivals Georgia Southern (Sept. 28).

> Hurst was an instrumental factor in the Panthers 36-32 win over Vanderbilt, totaling two of the Panthers' four touchdowns against the Commodores. One of Hurst's touchdown catches included the game-winning catch with 0:15 on the clock to secure the win. Hurst totaled 128 yards on 7 receptions, including a game-long 33 yarder.

> The Valdosta State transfer led the team with 83 yards and one touchdown on 7 receptions against Chattanooga (Sept. 7).

> Graduate transfer **Michael Dukes** has become an impact running back for the Panthers' offense, standing second on the leaderboard for rushing yards with 249 on 37 carries.

> Dukes recorded his first GSU career touchdown with a 9-yarder at App State (Oct.

26). He also recorded a career-long 35-yard rush against the Mountaineers.

> The Charleston, S.C. native put up a career-long 73 reception yards, including a 20-yarder, against Old Dominion (Oct. 12).

> Dukes put up a career-high seven receptions for two touchdowns in the Panthers contest at Marshall (Oct. 17), accounting for two of Georgia State's four touchdowns against the Herd.

> Tulsa transfer **Jordan Ford** is the Panthers' starting kick returner, averaging 20.5 yards-per-carry on kickoffs.

> At running back, Ford totals 45 yards on 15 carries.

>Ford opened the season with a 30-yard kick return to start the game against Georgia Tech (Aug. 31).

> Ford recorded the first touchdown of his GSU career in the Panthers' home opener against Chattanooga (Sept. 7).

> Senior transfer **Xavier Robinson** is the Panthers second-leading defender, totaling 38 tackles (22 solo) over seven games.

> Robinson put up a season-high nine tackles against Georgia Southern, beating out his previous season-high eight tackles against Chattanooga (Sept. 7). He also recorded one sack against the Mocs.

> Redshirt senior **Kenyatta Watson** leads the Panthers with two interceptions.

> Watson has 31 tackles (14 solo) on the season. He recorded a season-high seven tackles against Georgia Southern (Sept. 28).

THE DELL MCGEE ERA: Dell McGee, a Columbus, Ga., native with 22 years of coaching experience, including back-to-back national titles as the run game coordinator and running backs coach for the Georgia Bulldogs, was named the fourth head football coach in Georgia State history on Feb. 23, 2024.

> Although this is Dell McGee's first full-time head coaching position, he was already 1-0 coming in to his head coaching position at Georgia State. He led Georgia Southern to a 58-27 win over Bowling Green in the 2015 GoDaddy Bowl while serving as interim head coach.

> Playing just its 15th season of football and 11th at the FBS level, Georgia State has already played in six bowl games (4-2 record) and five in the last seven years, including last year's 45-22 win over Utah State in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. The Panthers have won three straight bowls over the last four years.

THE PANTHERS STAFF: With the start of the McGee era, the Panthers also added an entirely new coaching staff to the 2024 squad, totaling 15 newcomers to lead the team.

> Three of the newcomers followed head coach McGee, including offensive coordinator Jim Chaney, offensive lines coach Manrey Saint-Amour and quarterbacks coach Ryan Williams.

> Cornerbacks coach Antreal Allen, who was named to the 2024 30-Under-30 list, is the only member of the coaching staff who was retained from previous leadership.

PANTHER PROS: Two Georgia State football alumni have been on NFL rosters this season:

PANTHERS VS. POWER 5: Georgia State is facing its 18th game against an opponent from the Power Four or Five conference and its second of the season.

>The matchup against Vanderbilt gives the Panthers two games against Power 5 opponents for the third time in the last four years and the fifth time overall:

- 2013:** West Virginia, Alabama
- 2014:** Washington, Clemson
- 2021:** North Carolina, Auburn
- 2022:** South Carolina, North Carolina (home)
- 2024:** Georgia Tech, Vanderbilt (home)

> The Panthers have also faced foes from the SEC, Big Ten, Big 12 and Pac 12.

> Most recently, Georgia State completed a 36-32 upset over Vanderbilt in 2024, marking only the second program win over a Power 5 school.

> Most notably, the Panthers' 38-30 victory at Tennessee in the 2019 season opener is the program's only win over a Power Five team. In that game, Georgia State trailed 17-14 at the half but outscored the Vols

CENTER PARC CREDIT UNION STADIUM

is the home of Georgia State football. The Panthers took over this iconic property, formerly Centennial Olympic Stadium and then Turner Field, for the 2017 season.

The facility was renamed Center Parc Credit Union Stadium as part of a 15-year, \$21 million agreement between Center Parc Credit Union, a division of Atlanta Postal Credit Union (APCU), and Georgia State Athletics, announced on Aug. 11, 2020.

Center Parc Stadium features 25,000 seats for football, a FieldTurf playing surface on "Pete" Petit Field and dramatic views of the Atlanta skyline. The conversion process incorporated the existing seating areas on the north, west and south sides of the stadium with a new grandstand constructed on the east side, formerly the outfield.

The Panthers are in their fifth season in this impressive venue, which also houses the Football Operations Suite, completed in 2019. All of the program's day-to-day operations are at Center Parc Stadium, including practice, weight room, meetings rooms, coaches' offices, athletic training room and equipment room.

Center Parc Stadium was originally constructed as the 85,000-seat Centennial Olympic Stadium and used for the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games. Following the Olympic Games, much of the north end of the stadium was removed in order to convert it to the 49,000-seat baseball park that served as the home of the Atlanta Braves from 1997 through 2016.

The Braves played their final game at Turner Field on Oct. 2, 2016. In November 2016, the Board of Regents approved Georgia State University's purchase of 38 acres of the 68-acre site for \$22.8 million, and the conversion process began in early 2017.

The redevelopment of this iconic property also includes the Georgia State University Convocation Center, which opened in 2022 at the north end of the property, and new Georgia State baseball and softball facilities to be constructed on the footprint of the former Atlanta-Fulton County stadium. Residential, retail and corporate facilities are being developed by Carter and Associates.

24-13 in the second half, sealing the win on a 22-yard touchdown run by QB Dan Ellington with five minutes left.

> GSU has also held second-half leads vs. North Carolina in 2022 (scored 25 straight points to take a 28-21 lead late in third quarter), at Auburn in 2021 (led 24-19 until the Tigers scored the go-ahead touchdown on a fourth-down play with 45 seconds left) and at No. 9 Wisconsin in 2016 (led 17-13 with under eight minutes left).

> In addition to the return games with Georgia Tech (2026 at GSU) and Vandy (2025 at VU), the Panthers have upcoming P4 games scheduled vs. Ole Miss (away in 2025) and Wake Forest (Away 2029/Home 2030).

SEASON OPENERS: Georgia State is 6-9 in season openers, including a 42-35 win vs. Rhode Island in last year's opener.

> Georgia State fell 35-12 at Georgia Tech in this season's opener on Aug. 31.

> The Panthers are opened on the road for just the third time in 15 seasons of existence. GSU also opened on the road in 2019 (38-30 win at Tennessee) and in 2022 (35-14 loss at South Carolina).

> Georgia State is opened the 2024 season on a Saturday for the fifth time in the last six years. The team opened on a weeknight for its first nine years of existence and then again last season, including five Thursday games, four Fridays and one Wednesday.

GSU IN HOME OPENERS: Georgia State is 6-9 in home openers since the start of the football program in 2010 (4-7 since joining the Sun Belt in 2013) after defeating Chattanooga 24-12 on Sept. 7, 2024.

HEAD COACH DELL MCGEE

In his 11 seasons as a Division I coach, Dell McGee has been part of winning seasons every year, including four conference titles, seven bowl appearances and five bowl games and two national championship titles.

Dell McGee, a Georgia native with 22 years of coaching experience, including back-to-back national titles as the run game coordinator and running backs coach for the Georgia Bulldogs, was named the fourth head football coach in Georgia State history by GSU President Dr. M. Brian Blake and Director of Athletics Charlie Cobb on Feb. 23, 2024.

“We are proud to announce Coach Dell McGee as our head football coach,” Cobb said upon McGee’s hiring. “Coach McGee is an outstanding and authentic man with a strong passion for developing young men. His track record of competitive success at the high school and college levels makes me confident that he will lead our football program to its greatest achievements. We welcome Linda and Dell to Georgia State University!”

McGee takes over a Georgia State program that began play 2010 and has appeared in six bowl games in the last nine years, winning four, including three in the last four seasons.

The Columbus, Ga., native has spent almost his entire coaching career in his home state. He served the last eight seasons at Georgia, where his abilities as a coach and recruiter have contributed to the Bulldogs’ remarkable run of success under Kirby Smart. McGee has been a key part of a Georgia program that has amassed 94 victories in eight seasons, highlighted by back-to-back College Football Playoff national championships in 2021 and 2022 as well as a berth in the 2017 CFP title game, eight bowl victories, two Southeastern Conference titles and six SEC Eastern Division crowns.

Rivals.com named McGee the 2018 National Recruiter of the Year after the Bulldogs signed the consensus No. 1-rated recruiting class, and

he helped recruit and develop Georgia’s 56 NFL draft picks from 2017-23, including 15 first-rounders and an NFL-record 25 players drafted over the last two years.

McGee joined Smart’s original Georgia staff in 2016 as running backs coach, the position he worked with throughout his tenure in Athens. He also served as assistant head coach in 2018, and then in 2019, he was named run game coordinator.

In his eight seasons at UGA, McGee coached four 1,000-yard rushers: Nick Chubb in 2016-17; Sony Michel in 2017; D’Andre Swift in 2018-19; and Elijah Holyfield in 2018. Chubb and Michel amassed over 8,400 combined yards and 87 touchdowns. Chubb, Michel, and Swift, as well as James Cook and Zamir White, were all taken in the first four rounds of the NFL Draft.

Before going to Georgia, McGee worked two seasons as the running backs coach at Georgia Southern (2014-15). In December 2015, he served as the interim head coach and led the Eagles to a victory in the GoDaddy Bowl.

He spent the 2013 season as an analyst at Auburn, his alma mater, and was part of the staff that led the Tigers to a berth in the 2013-14 BCS national championship game, one of McGee’s four appearances coaching in the national championship game. He was also part of an undefeated team as a player at Auburn, where he helped preserve the Tigers’ undefeated 1993 season with a critical interception against Alabama.

He began his coaching career in the prep ranks as an assistant coach at Georgia high schools Harris County (2002) and Greenville (2003-04) and then earned his first head coaching position at

Carver-Columbus High School in 2005. He built that program into a perennial powerhouse that recorded seven straight seasons with 10 or more wins from 2006-2012, highlighted by the 2007 Class AAA state title.

McGee attended Kendrick High School in Columbus, Ga., and then was a two-year starter and four-year letterwinner at Auburn from 1992-95.

He was drafted in the fifth round of the 1996 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals and spent time with the Cardinals and Detroit Lions over three NFL seasons. He also played in NFL Europe, the XFL and the Arena Football League in a seven-year professional career.

GEORGIA STATE 27, UCONN 34

Game 8: Friday, Nov. 1, 2024 • 7:00 p.m. (CBS Sports) Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field • East Hartford, Conn.

Georgia State fell 34-27 to UConn on the road Friday night.

“It’s not the result that we wanted, but still very proud of our team,” head coach Dell McGee said. “But it’s time to wash this game and focus on the next one.”

Zach Gibson led Georgia State’s passing attack with 257 yards through the air, tossing one touchdown and one interception. The starting quarterback also tacked on 16 yards and one touchdown on the ground late in the fourth quarter to lessen the Huskies’ advantage to one touchdown.

Ted Hurst was the first to score for the Panthers, with a 7-yard reception to start the Panthers off. Hurst totaled seven catches for 91 yards and one score against the Huskies.

Freddie Brock totaled 78 yards to lead the Panthers’ ground attack and added one touchdown in the game, picking up 7.8 yards per carry along the way. Brock’s performance was highlighted by a 55-yard rushing touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Henry Bryant showed out for the Georgia State defense, recording 1.0 TFL, one sack and one recovered fumble.

The Panthers forced one turnover in Friday’s contest, with Georgia State turning that takeaway into three points. The Georgia State offense converted on 47.1 percent of third-down attempts and went 3-for-3 on fourth down conversions.

Defensively, Georgia State held the Huskies to 346 total yards.

How It Happened

Georgia State responded to an early 10-0 UConn lead with a second quarter touchdown to narrow the deficit to 10-7. The Panthers kept UConn off the scoreboard and followed with a field goal to tie it up at 10-10.

UConn fought back to take a 20-10 lead before Georgia State put a field goal on the board to close the gap with 4:36 left in the third quarter and make it a 20-13 game. UConn scored to expand its lead to 34-13 before the Panthers got on the scoreboard again to cut into the lead and make it a 34-20 game.

Georgia State scored again, a touchdown with 1:47 remaining in the fourth quarter, but remained behind 34-27. The Panthers tied for an on-side kick, but the Huskies recovered to ultimately end the game.

Game Notes

- » Georgia State outgained UConn 374-346, including a 265-75 advantage through the air.
- » Georgia State had their highest scoring quarter in the fourth period, when they put up 14 points.
- » Georgia State converted 8 of 17 third downs while UConn was successful on 5 of 11.
- » The Panthers had two players with more than eight tackles in the ballgame led by Josiah Robinson, who

- had 12.

After a close game through three-and-a-half quarters, Georgia State fell 33-26 in heartbreaking fashion to the Mountaineers on Saturday afternoon at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

“Always proud of our guys for battling and staying the course,” head coach Dell McGee said. “It all comes down to stopping the run, getting off the field on third down and limiting the big plays.”

Michel Dukes totaled 81 yards to lead the Panthers’ ground attack and added one touchdown in the game, picking up 13.5 yards per carry along the way. Freddie Brock also tacked on 67 yards on the ground, picking up 6.7 yards per carry, as well as 31 receiving yards.

Zach Gibson’s most prolific target in the ballgame was Ted Hurst, who caught three passes for 57 yards and one score.

Georgia State’s defense held up fairly well against the run, limiting Appalachian State to 180 yards on the ground and out-rushing Appalachian State by 14 yards.

“ [Vanderbilt] was in man-to-man coverage and I felt like my quarterback would give me a chance,” wide receiver Ted Hurst said, reflecting on the game-winning touchdown. “Coach put us in the right position and made the right calls tonight. Tonight's win marks the first time the Panthers have defeated an SEC team since the 2019 upset at Tennessee. The win improved Georgia State's record to 2-1 on the season while the Commodores fell to 2-1.

Freddie Brock totaled 96 yards to lead the Panthers' ground attack in the game, picking up 6.4 yards per carry along the way. Jordan Ford also tacked on 35 yards on the ground, picking up 5.8 yards per carry.

Kevin Swint showed out for the Georgia State defense, collecting eight tackles, 2.0 TFL, two sacks, two pass breakups, and one forced fumble. Izaiah Guy added one recovered fumble and Ted Hurst had in the win.

Georgia State converted on 56.2 percent of third-down attempts on the day.

“I have to commend our defense,” Head coach McGee said. “That offense is a really hard offense to defend.”

Defensively, Georgia State held up fairly well against the Vanderbilt rushing attack, holding the Commodores to 110 yards on the ground. In part because of that stellar defense, Georgia State runners out-gained their Vanderbilt counterparts 157-110.
