## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

## **OUR PLACE**

Three Sun Belt teams—Texas State, Old Dominion and Georgia State—will welcome autonomy five programs to their respective stadiums this weekend. The Bobcats—fresh off their first-ever win in the I-35 Showdown against UTSA—will host Arizona State at UFCU Stadium at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 12, on ESPN. The Monarchs will welcome in-state foe Virginia Tech to S.B. Ballard Stadium at 5 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 14, on ESPN+. The Panthers will play host to Vanderbilt at Center Parc Stadium at 6 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 14, on ESPN+. Texas State defeated in-state rival Baylor, 42-31, as 1-of-4 Sun Belt victories over autonomy five opponents in 2023, while Old Dominion bested Virginia Tech, 20-17, in its last trip to Norfolk as 1-of-4 Sun Belt victories over autonomy five foes in 2022. Georgia State's last victory over an autonomy five opponent was a 38-30 win over Tennessee in 2019.





## STORIED TRADITION

When Arkansas State visits Michigan Stadium and Troy travels to Kinnick Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 14, Sun Belt programs will compete in two of the 30 oldest on-campus college football venues in the country. Michigan Stadium has been home to Michigan football since 1927 and Kinnick Stadium has hosted Iowa football since 1929. The Red Wolves will take on reigning national champion No. 17/16 Michigan at 11 a.m. on Big Ten Network, while the Trojans will face the Hawkeyes at 3 p.m. on FSI. With capacities of 107,601 and 69,250, respectively, Michigan Stadium and Kinnick Stadium also rank among the top 30 largest college football stadiums in the country.

## **LEAD PACK**

The Sun Belt leads all non-autonomy conference with six remaining undefeated teams—Arkansas State, Coastal Carolina, James Madison, Louisiana, ULM and Texas State. The total outpaces that of the American Athletic Conference (5), Mid-American Conference (3), Conference USA (2) and Mountain West Conference (2). Three of the Sun Belt's six unbeaten programs are in action this weekend—Arkansas State, Coastal Carolina and Texas State.

## **COLLISION COURSE**

For the third-straight week to open the 2024 campaign, multiple Sun Belt programs will clash with American Athletic Conference foes. The Sun Belt will look to maintain its 4-3 edge in this year's head-to-head series, with three matchups on Saturday, Sept. 14. Coastal Carolina will visit Temple at 1 p.m. on ESPN+, App State will travel to East Carolina at 3 p.m. on ESPNU and Southern Miss will host South Florida at 6 p.m. on ESPN+. After meeting 10 times over the first three weeks of the 2024 regular-season, the Sun Belt and American have just one additional date on the calendar—when Tulane visits in-state foe Louisiana at 11 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 21, on ESPNU.

## LOOKING AHEAD, NOT PAST

South Alabama and Georgia Southern round out the Sun Belt Week 3 slate with dates with FCS opponents—ahead of major clashes in Week 4. The Jaguars host Northwestern State for the first time at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 12, on ESPN+, ahead of a mid-week conference-opening clash with Sun Belt East Division favorite App State at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, Sept. 19, on ESPN. The Eagles welcome back South Carolina State for a ninth all-time meeting at 5 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 14, on ESPN+. Georgia Southern will look for a ninth-straight victory in the series, ahead of a matchup with nationally-ranked Ole Miss at 6:45 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 21, on SEC Network.

## SUN BELT IN THE NFL

Coastal Carolina alum and Baltimore Ravens tight end Isaiah Likely had his most productive game as a pro to headline Sun Belt Conference alumni performances in Week 1 of the 2024 National Football League (NFL) season. Likely hauled in a career-high nine catches and recorded a personal best 111 receiving yards with a touchdown in the Ravens' 27-20 road loss at the reigning Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs on Thursday evening. The former Chanticleer cleared 100 receiving yards in a game for the second time in his career and first since Week 18 of his rookie campaign in 2022. The touchdown was the ninth of his career

Former Sun Belt kickers converted with 100 percent accuracy during opening week action, as former Arkansas State standout Blake Grupe registered 17 points while making all four field goal attempts and five extra points in the New Orleans Saints' 47-10 home win over the Carolina Panthers. Grupe connected on kicks from 57, 52, 44 and 39 yards out in the victory. A pair of Georgia Southern kicking alumni went perfect on scoring chances, as Buffalo Bills kicker Tyler Bass went 2-for-2 on field goals and 4-for-4 on extra points in a 34-28 home win over the Arizona Cardinals. Younghoe Koo of the Atlanta Falcons made on field goal and one extra point in an 18-10 setback to the Pittsburgh Steelers. Georgia State alum Will Lutz also made all three of his field goal attempts from 30, 35 and 45 yards out in the Denver Broncos' 26-20 defeat at the Seattle Seahawks.

Eighty-two Sun Belt football alumni earned NFL roster spots entering the 2024 season with 51 on active rosters, 24 on practice squads and seven on injured or other reserve lists. In Week 1 action, 34 played snaps with 13 earning the start for their respective teams. Sun Belt alumni currently hold spots on 31-of-32 NFL rosters.
