NOW IT'S TIME FOR THE BREAKDOWN

After a pair of away games, Coastal Carolina football returns home to Brooks Stadium for the first time since playing ECU on Sept. 13. They'll kickoff on Saturday, Oct. 11, 2025 against ULM in Conway, South Carolina at 7 p.m. Coverage will air on ESPN+, the Chanticleer Radio Network and Chanticleer Mobile App.

THE SERIES

Saturday will be the sixth meeting all-time between Coastal Carolina and ULM. The Warhawks lead the series 3-2, with the Chanticleers winning the past two matchups. The most recent showdown came in 2022, which saw Coastal win 28-21 in Louisiana. This will mark the first time that Chants head coach Tim Beck and ULM head coach Bryant Vincent will be facing each other.

THE COACHES

TIM BECK – The fourth football head coach in Coastal Carolina's 23-year history – joined the Chanticleers in Dec. 2022 and is in his third season leading the program. An experienced leader with 36 years of coaching experience, Beck brought with him 18 years of Power 5 coaching experience to CCU, including spending the 12 years as an offensive coordinator at Nebraska, Ohio State, Texas and NC State. He has led Coastal to a pair of bowl game appearances, including a win in the 2023 Hawai'i Bowl. As a collegiate coach, he has totaled 18 postseason bowl games.

ULM Head Coach **BRYANT VINCENT** is in his third season overall as a college head football coach. Prior to arriving at ULM, Vincent served as the Interim Head Coach at UAB in 2022. There, he helped guide the Blazers to a 7-6 record an appearance in the 2022 Bahamas Bowl.

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEARS

- Coastal Carolina is playing its 23rd season of football with an all-time record of 174-98 (.644).
- CCU is a debutante in the college football world – playing its first football in 2003 and transitioning to the FBS in 2016. The Chants joined the Sun Belt Conference in 2017 and have since played in five-straight bowl games from 2020-24, spanning the globe from Hawai'i to Myrtle Beach.
- The Chanticleers are 16-15 under Head Coach Tim Beck with a pair of bowl appearances.
- Since 2003, its first year of football, Coastal Carolina is 20-4 in home openers. With the win at South Alabama, CCU is 6-3 all time in Sun Belt Conference lid lifters.
- The Chants have a different look in 2025 with new coordinators on both sides of the ball and seven new coaches overall. Drew Hollingshead is in his first season calling offensive plays for Coastal while Jeremiah Johnson is in his first year running defensive for the Chants. Hollingshead is a Mike Leach disciple who coached at Western Kentucky last season while Johnson has found success at every spot he's been, most recently at Louisiana Tech.
- Coastal welcomed 61 new players in this offseason – 31 on defense and 30 on offense.
- Coastal will be looking to find the same type of offensive success it had during their Sun Belt opener in Week 4. That week, the Chants scored 38 points at South Alabama after scoring only 20 points over the first three games.
- Shane Bruce has a pair of takeaways on defense and leads the squad with 36 tackles. Myles Mooyoung is on



BROOKS STADIUM

- Brooks Stadium opened on Sept. 6, 2003, for the inaugural home game of the Chanticleer football program. Scoring a touchdown with just seconds left on the clock, the Chanticleers defeated Newberry College 21-14.
- With a gift from the late businessman Bob Brooks, the stadium was named in honor of Brooks' children Coby Garrett and Boni Belle.
- Brooks, who grew up on a farm in Loris, S.C., was the CEO and founder of Eastern Foods, Inc., creators of the Naturally Fresh line of products, and chairman of Hooters of America, Inc.
- Brooks Stadium was designed and built with the capability to expand from its inception. That original design came to fruition as Coastal embarked on another two-phase expansion in the spring of 2017 that brought the capacity to approximately 20,000.
- The first phase boosted the seating capacity to 15,000 and included adding seats to both corners of the end zone nearest the field house, expanding the sections closest to the field on both sides toward the scoreboard, and expanded the upper deck on the east side.
- The infamous Surf Turf was added in the Spring of 2015 marking the transition from natural grass to artificial teal turf.
- Prior to the 2019 season, a second level and premium suites were completed on the west side to increase the capacity to 20,000. The cost of the two-phase project was \$31.8 million.

A credential does not guarantee a seat and access to the team bench area is prohibited at all times. Press credentials will **NOT** be issued to spouses, friends, or children.

All practices are closed to the public and members of the media. Only the first 15-20 minutes of selected workouts may be open for members of accredited media outlets. Contact the athletics communications staff for details and access.

MEDIA WILL CALL

Media members can claim credentials 90 minutes before each game at the Media/Staff Entrance Gate next to Gate 1 (next to the entrance of the Marrio & Josh Norman Field House). A photo ID is required.

PRESS BOX

The main area for working press and photographers is now located inside the football team room on the third floor of Norman Field House. Game operations, TV and radio are still housed on the fourth floor of the east side of the stadium. In accordance with the working code of the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), the press box is a working area and cheering will be grounds for removal.

To access Norman Field House, exit Gate 1 in the northeast corner of the stadium, follow the path to the weight room entrance to the building. Take the elevator on your right to the third floor, exit left and the team room will be on your left at the end of the hallway. Signage will be placed to assist in your travels.

SIDELINES

Photographers and videographers are NOT permitted to use tripods, but monopods may be used. Photographers must shoot solely for the affiliation for which they are credentialed. All media on the sidelines MUST have their credential in full display, stay within the designated dotted lines, and are restricted from the team bench areas.

POSTGAME

At home games, post game interviews with Coastal Carolina players and Head Coach Tim Beck are conducted in the third floor football team room of Norman Field House located in the northeast corner of the stadium. Both locker rooms are closed to the media before, during and following the game.

CLIMBING THE RANKS

- With his seven tackles last week against ODU, Coastal LB Shane Bruce has moved up to No.8 on the all-time tackle list in program history with 232.

RED ZONE WINS

- Coastal Carolina ranks 38th in FBS in red zone defense. Of the 25 times opponents have been in the red zone, Coastal has allowed just 13 touchdowns and seven field goals.

DEFENSIVE IDENTITY

- Despite being outgained overall, the Chants have produced six takeaways in five games. That's tied for the 52nd most in FBS.

LIVING IN THE BACKFIELD

- Two of the sun Belt's top pass rusher's will be on display Saturday in Conway. Coastal DE Zeke Campbell ranks second in the conference with three sacks while ULM's Dylan Howell leads the conference with four sacks.

CHANTS FANS DELIVERING

- The 22,217 fans in attendance against CSU broke the 2024 mark set against Virginia (22,104).
- The 21,634 fans vs. ECU was the third-largest home crowd in history. Combined with the stadium-record 22,217, Coastal has hosted two Top-3 attendances in back-to-back games.

ARINZE BEST IN THE BELT

- Earlier this season, DE Noah Arinze earned Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Week honors following the win at South Alabama.
- The St. Louis, Missouri, native recorded four total tackles, including a career-high two sacks. On his second sack of the night, the 6-foot-6, 253-pound defender forced a fumble that was scooped up by linebacker Tray Brown and returned 13 yards for a touchdown. It marked Coastal's first defensive touchdown since Tobias Fletcher's 39-yard interception return against Georgia State on Nov. 30 of last season.
- Through five games, Arinze is second of the teams in tackles for loss (3.5). He also ranks second in sacks (2.0) for the Chants.

GROUND GAME KEY

- Coastal is 2-0 when rushing for 180+ yards and 0-3 when under 100 yards.
- The Chants rushing game is led by Ja'Vin Simpkins, Dominic Knicely, and Jevon Edwards. The trio is averaging 5.7 yards per carry.

STOP THE RUN

- ULM will enter Saturday's game ranked 42nd in FBS in rush offense.
- RB Braylon McReynolds averages 6.39 yards per carry, the 23rd best in FBS.

LOOKING FOR A SPARK

- Both Coastal and ULM enter Saturday's game ranked towards the bottom in FBS in total offense
- The Chants are just one of eight teams in the country averaging under 300 yards of offense per game this season.

REVERSAL OF FORTUNE

- In 2024, CCU scored nearly a third of its points (27%/100 of 373) in the first quarter while this year, the Chants have yet to score in the first 15.

SOMETIMES, A CHANGE OF SCENERY ...

- CB Ja'Marion Wayne came to Conway in the offseason after playing three seasons at Missouri, where he registered eight tackles, two PBUs and one fumble recovery.
- In five 2025 games, Wayne has posted 24 tackles, a team-best five PBUs and a blocked kick.

POSTING A SHUTOUT

- Coastal Carolina leaned on its defense and a grinding rushing attack to blank Charleston Southern 13-0 before a Brooks Stadium-record crowd of 22,217 on Sept. 6.
- Coastal posted its first shutout since a 51-0 blanking of Georgia State on October 31, 2020.
- It was the first home shutout since 2015 and sixth overall shutout in program history.

DRONE-ING ON

- The halftime show vs. CSU doubled as a showcase event for Coastal. A drone show lit up the sky with teal-and-black imagery ranging from the Chanticleer logo to nods to Conway and Myrtle Beach landmarks, drawing raucous cheers from the sellout crowd.

FREE IS FOR REAL!

- Fans also experienced the debut of the school's new free concessions initiative, with select items available at no charge throughout the stadium. Lines were steady but moved quickly as the initiative was rolled out for the first time.

ROCKING THE SHIP

- The 22,217 fans in attendance against CSU broke the 2024 mark set against Virginia (22,104).
- Coastal improved to 6-2 all-time against Charleston Southern at Brooks Stadium.

TURN UP THE RADIO

- The Chanticleer Sports Network, in association with Van Wagner, is growing thanks to a new partnership with iHeart Media.
- WRXZ, Rock 107.1 in Myrtle Beach, will serve as the flagship station. Additionally, CSN broadcasts will air on WWRK, 970 AM out of Florence and WRZE FM, Rock 94.1 and 97.9 out of Kingstree.
- All live broadcasts will simulcast to the Chanticleer Mobile App and online via iHeartMedia.
- The partnership features live game coverage of football, men's and women's basketball and baseball with more than 100 broadcasts planned for the 2025-26 campaign.

- The CCU Kickoff Meal Deal — Every Football Game, Every Fan, Always Free.
- Coastal Carolina Athletics and Aramark partnered to allow fans to eat free at Chanticleers Football games inside Brooks Stadium.
- Ticket-purchasing patrons visiting the concession stands will be able to acquire four items per concession stand visit from a selection of hot dogs, nachos, popcorn and fountain drinks.
- There is no limit to the number of in-game visits, but fans must scan each trip through the line with the Chanticleer Mobile App.
- Specialty items, food from outside vendors and alcoholic beverages are available for purchase.

WHAT IS A CHANTICLEER?

- A Chanticleer (SHON-tuh-cleer) gives Coastal Carolina one of the most unique nicknames in all of sports. Chanticleer comes from Chaucer's Canterbury Tales and came to the University when it was a member of the USC system. A Chanticleer is a rooster who rules the barnyard with cunning and wit. His competitiveness never wanes as he battles to the end, using his brains to come out on top every time.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- Head Coach Tim Beck named four permanent captains — LB Shane Bruce, OL Nick Del Grande, OL Zac Elam and S Dre Pinckney.

ELAM IS BACK

- Center Zac Elam returned to action in the opener at Virginia after missing the entire 2024 season due to injury. He started eight games and played in 12 during the 2023 campaign.

BREAKING DOWN THE LINEUP

- Despite welcoming 61 new players during the offseason, only six transfers broke into the starting lineup at Virginia, 2 on offense and 4 on defense.
- WR Malcolm Gillie (Ball State) and QB MJ Morris (Maryland) were among the starting 11 on offense while Zeke Campbell (Louisiana Tech), Ja'Marion Wayne (Missouri), Luke Murphy (Eastern Michigan) and Noah Arinze (New Mexico State) joined the defense.
- Overall, 29 newcomers saw playing time in Charlottesville as the Chants played 63 student-athletes in the opener.

CFL ON NOTICE

- DL Aamarii Notice is among the Top-20 prospects for the 2026 Canadian Football League draft, the league announced in late Aug.
- A transfer from Idaho, the Toronto native played in 34 career games, racking up 60 tackles, four for a loss and a pair of sacks.

BERRONG OUT FOR THE SEASON

- TE Cane Berrong will miss the season after being injured in training camp. He caught 12 balls for 145 yards and a TD last year.

BACK FOR THE FUTURE

- QB Emmett Brown, a transfer from San Jose State, suffered a lower body injury in training camp and will miss the 2025 season.

A LOOK BACK AND AHEAD

- The Chanticleers were picked fourth in the Sun Belt East Division, while earning 1-of-14 first-place votes in last month's 2025 Sun Belt Conference Football Preseason Coaches Poll.
- Third-year head coach Tim Beck will guide a roster that returns a pair of All-Sun Belt honorees from 2024 and had three players named to the 2025 Preseason All-Sun Belt teams.
- Coastal Carolina went 6-7 in 2024, its first losing season since 2019. The Chanticleers were part of the Sun Belt's eight-team Bowl Season contingent that paced the non-autonomy conferences for the third-straight year, making their fifth-straight bowl appearance.

THUNDER FROM DOWN UNDER

- P Emile Sebafundi averaged 41.2 yards per punt on 54 boots last season, dropping 20 inside the 20 with five sailing 50 yards or more.
- He was part of a group of players who hosted NASCAR driver Shane Van Gisbergen on campus this summer as part of a dual promotion with Coastal Football and Darlington Speedway.

THERE'S A NEW GM IN TOWN

- Scott Aligo joined the program in the off season and serves as its first-ever general manager.
- Aligo, who brings both college and NFL experience, joins Teal Nation after a four-year stint as director of scouting for Kansas.
- He will oversee roster management, personnel and scouting for the Chanticleers, helping lead the way into a new era of college football.

YOU LOOK FAMILIAR

- A pair of Coastal Carolina legends joined the staff this season as analysts, former OL Trey Carter and QB Grayson McCall.
- Carter, a five-time All-Sun Belt honoree, closed out his career going 22-3 from 2020-21 with two bowl games and a No. 12 final College Football Playoff ranking in 2020.
- McCall threw for 10,523 yards and 91 TDs as a collegian. He is the only player to earn Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year honors three times and still holds CCU school records with 106 total touchdowns responsible, 88 touchdown passes and 10,005 passing yards.

COASTAL CAROLINA (2-3, 1-1)

While winning is an important part of that, it also means that you never, ever, ever take a play off. You always give 100 percent of everything you have. This is not just football. We expect that in every endeavor our players undertake.

TIM BECK
 THIRD SEASON – UCF '88



Tim Beck – the fourth football head coach in Coastal Carolina's 20-year history – joined the Chanticleers in Dec. 2022 and is in his third season leading the program.

An experienced leader with 36 years of coaching experience, Beck brought with him 18 years of Power 5 coaching experience to CCU, including spending the 12 years as an offensive coordinator at Nebraska, Ohio State, Texas and NC State.

He has led Coastal to a pair of bowl game appearances, including a win in the 2023 Hawai'i Bowl. As a collegiate coach, he has helped guide teams to 18 postseason bowl games, including this season. Beck has also coached in a postseason bowl game in every year since 2007, including helping Ohio State compete in the College Football Playoff in 2016.

Coastal finished 6-7 in 2024, playing in the Myrtle Beach Bowl. The team battled late in the season to pick up a pair of wins to earn bowl eligibility. The Chants' offense averaged near five yards per carry a year ago (4.6) while covering 2,242 yards on the ground, 2,616 yards through the air with 41 scores. Six players earned all-league honors including first teamers Clev Lubin and Matthew McDoom.

In his first season in Conway, Beck led the Chanticleers to an 8-5 record and the second bowl victory in program history. Coastal reeled off five consecutive wins, including the program's first win ever at Appalachian State, while starting three different quarterbacks. The Chanticleers won five consecutive Sun Belt Conference games for the first time since 2020 and notched eight wins for the fourth consecutive season.

Wide receiver Sam Pinckney became the Sun Belt's all-time leader in receiving yards while also setting an NCAA record with 58 consecutive games.

The offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at NC State from 2020-22, Beck helped lead the Wolfpack to three-consecutive eight-plus win seasons, three-straight bowl appearances, and a combined record of 25-11.

Recognized as the nation's eighth-best recruiter by 247Sports.com in 2020, Beck has been a three-time nominee for the Broyles Award, an award given to the nation's top assistant coach in all of FBS.

Beck's NC State offense ranked in the top half of the highly-touted Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) in scoring offense, total offense, and passing offense, while continuing to set program records along the way.

Under Beck's tutelage, Leary set a new NC State school record for most touchdown passes in a single season in 2021 with 35. He became one of just three quarterbacks in ACC history to post a 3,400-yard and 35-touchdown regular season. He also passed for 27 touchdowns in ACC play, a mark that led the conference, and he became the first Pack quarterback to throw for four or more touchdowns against five ACC opponents.

Prior to joining the Wolfpack in 2020, Beck coached for three years as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Texas from 2017-19.

Before joining the Longhorns, Beck was at the offensive coordinator at Ohio State from 2015-16 where his offenses helped lead the Buckeyes to back-to-back double-digit win seasons, going 12-1 in 2015 and 11-2 in 2016.

Between 2011-14, Beck's Nebraska offenses ranked among the best in the Big Ten Conference and his passing attack amassed more than 10,000 yards during that time with 86 touchdowns. In his four seasons as coordinator, the Huskers averaged 33.5 points per game. The Huskers broke more than 50 individual records, including career marks for passing yards, completions, passing touchdowns, yards from scrimmage, and total offense.

Prior to Nebraska, Beck was at Kansas where he was the Jayhawks' receivers coach in each of his three seasons (2005-07). He was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2007.

Beck came to KU as one of the most respected high school coaches in the state of Texas, serving three seasons at Summit High in Mansfield. He was the 2003 District Coach of the Year, and a season later, Summit High advanced to the quarterfinals of the state playoffs with a 9-4 record.

Beck was head coach at R.L. Turner High in Carrollton, Texas, from 1999-2001, leading the school to back-to-back playoff appearances and consecutive winning seasons for the first time in 25 years. Beck was named the district coach of the year in 2000.

Prior to coaching in the Texas prep ranks, Beck worked at Missouri State for three seasons from 1996-98, including one season as the offensive coordinator.

Beck started his coaching career as an assistant at Miramar (Fla.) High School in 1988-89 and then moved to Illinois State as outside linebackers and punters coach in 1990. He spent two seasons on Bill Snyder's Kansas State staff (1991-92) as a graduate assistant.

An Ohio native, Beck played one year of football at Central Florida (1985), and he graduated from there in 1988 with a degree in liberal studies. He also has a master's in counseling and guidance from Kansas State University (1992).

Beck and his wife, Tamara, have two children – a son, Jordan, and a daughter, Haylie Marie. Haylie is a 2021 graduate of Coastal Carolina and was a member of the volleyball team from 2017-19 and the beach volleyball team from 2018-19.
