

Postgame Notes No. 4 UConn 72, No. 5 Memphis 53

Records: UConn 25-7, Memphis 23-9

UConn advances to the semifinals of the American Athletic Conference Championship, where they will face No. 1 Cincinnati. That game will be at 8 p.m. (CT) on Friday on ESPN2. During the regular season, the teams split two games, with the home team winning each matchup.

UConn beat Memphis for the third time this season, and dealt the Tigers two of their three losses this season at FedExForum.

The Huskies' Niels Giffey scored a career high 24 points, surpassing his previous high of 16. Giffey led the Huskies with a career high nine rebounds, the first time this season he was the solo rebounding leader for the Huskies. He made six three-pointers, also a career high mark.

UConn's Shabazz Napier moved into 6th place on UConn's all-time scoring list and fourth in UConn history in three-pointers made.

UConn shot 50 percent from 3-point distance, reaching that mark for the seventh time this season.

Four players scored in double digits for UConn.

The Huskies held Memphis to a season low .264 field goal percentage.

UConn's Amida Brimah recorded a career high three assists.
