Head Coach Jeff Walz Louisville

Opening Statement:

"I thought Houston played outstanding in yesterday's game—played with a lot of passion—a lot of energy. I thought they spent a lot in yesterday's win. I think the way that we came out and attacked them may have taken the energy they had instead of giving them excitement and some energy to go at us. I think we took the wind out of their sails some with the way we started the game. I'm really pleased with our defensive effort. We've got work to do—we have to do a better job of taking care of the basketball, but for the most part just really pleased with the overall effort of all the players."

On importance of getting a fast start:

"I thought it was really important because they are a very athletic team. They drive the ball extremely well. They made a bunch of shots in yesterday's game too. They started off four of six from the three-point line. We tried to limit any open looks that they got, and I thought we did a really good job of that in the first 10 minutes."

Opening Statement:
