UConn Postgame Notes

- With a 72-42 victory over Cincinnati on Saturday at Mohegan Sun Arena, the top-seeded Huskies won their 26th consecutive conference tournament quarterfinal matchup. UConn meets fourth-seeded Rutgers in the semifinals tomorrow. The Huskies are 23-2 all-time in Conference semifinals.
- Senior Bria Hartley had 17 points Saturday, moving to ninth all-time with 1,878 career points. She passed Svetlana Abrosimova (1,865 points). Renee Montgomery is eighth with 1,990 points.
- Senior Stefanie Dolson made her 144th career start, tied for second all-time in program history with Maya Moore. She began the day tied with Tina Charles for third. Renee Montgomery is the all-time leader with 148 starts.
- UConn is pursuing its sixth conference tournament championship in seven years and its 19th in program history. Connecticut is 18-5 all-time in conference tournament finals. The Huskies have now won 57 of 61 games in conference tournament play.
- Breanna Stewart had 22 points to lead all scorers. It was her 17th 20-plus point game of the season and her 30th double-figure scoring game. It was also the most points she has scored in a conference tournament game.
- Hartley led the Huskies with five assists, the 13th game this season she has recorded five or more assists. She has 133 assists this year.

Cincinnati Postgame Notes

- Cincinnati guard Kayla Cook had nine points with three made threes in 34 minutes. She finishes fifth all-time in program history with 151 made threes.
- Cook also finishes her collegiate career ranked fifth all-time in program history in games played (122). She started every game of her career.
- Jeanise Randolph led the Bearcats with 14 points and seven rebounds, narrowly missing her 12th double-double of the season. Her total is the most since Debbie Merrill had 12 during the 2002-03 season.
- Cincinnati's defense, ranked 30th nationally, allowed 58.8 points per game during the regular season. Conference opponents scored 10.9 points below their average. The Huskies finished with 72 points in the win Saturday, 11.4 points below their average.
- Cincinnati had 23 turnovers Saturday, the most since it had 25 against Temple on January 18th.
