USF Postgame Notes

- Third-seeded USF advanced to the semifinals of a postseason conference tournament for the first time Saturday
 with its victory over sixth-seeded Temple in the quarterfinals of the American Athletic Conference Championship
 tournament at Mohegan Sun Arena.
- USF won its sixth straight, and is 11-4 in its last 15 games. The Bulls (19-11) have only lost to UConn and Louisville in that stretch. The Cardinals (29-3) held an opponent under 50 points for the fifth time this year.
- Inga Orekhova made all four free throw attempts against Temple. She has made 36 straight free throws since January 12th. The senior guard from the Ukraine had a team-high 22 points, the 14th time she has scored in double figures this season.
- Akila McDonald had one block Saturday, and now has 57 for the season. That ties the total she had last year, which is the fourth highest single-season mark in program history.
- Alisia Jenkins had eight rebounds, giving her 308 for the season. She needs four more to move past Wanda Guyton (311) for the third highest single-season total in program history. She narrowly missed her 13th double-double of the season.
- USF completed a three-game season sweep of the Owls.

Temple Postgame Notes

- This game got away from Temple with 4:36 remaining in the first half and the Owls trailing 21-17. At that point, USF used a 15-2 run to open a 36-19 halftime lead. Temple never got closer than 15 the rest of the way.
- The Owls (14-16) finished with just one assist (second half) and were 0-14 from three-point range.
- Freshman guard Feyonda Fitzgerald had 20 points, recording her 20th double-figure scoring game of the season. Temple's leading scorer scored at last 20 points for the sixth time this season.
