## **UConn Postgame Notes**

With the victory over Cincinnati, UConn secured its 10<sup>th</sup> straight 30-win season, extending its NCAA-record streak. The previous mark was set by Duke, which had seven straight 30-win seasons from 2001-07. UConn has 20 seasons with at least 30 wins.

UConn won its 27<sup>th</sup> consecutive conference tournament quarterfinal game. The Huskies moved within one victory of its 25<sup>th</sup> trip to a conference tournament final in 27 years.

The Huskies are the No. 1 seed in a conference championship tournament for the 20<sup>th</sup> time. UConn is now 53-4 in conference tournament play as a top seed.

UConn won for the 55<sup>th</sup> time in its last 57 games played in March.

Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis had a game-high 18 points, including four 3-pointers. It is the fifth straight game she has had four treys. She has 55 in the last 16 games on 104 attempts (52.8-percent). She has 375 career 3-pointers, and needs one more to enter into the NCAA Top 10 list.

Breanna Stewart had 12 points and 13 rebounds, recording her seventh double-double of the season. Stewart now has 1,810 career points, good for 12<sup>th</sup> all-time on the UConn scoring list. She broke a tie with Stefanie Dolson and also moved past Tiffany Hayes. Next up is Svetlana Abrosimova, who had 1,865 points from 1998-01.

Kiah Stokes had three blocks, giving her 306 for her career. She moved past Tina Charles (304), into third place all-time on UConn's career list.

Morgan Tuck was 5-of-6 from the field for 12 points with eight rebounds and four assists. In three previous conference tournament games, Tuck had 11 points, four rebounds and one assist.

## **Cincinnati Postgame Notes**

Makenzie Cann had two 3-pointers in the loss to UConn, recording her 15<sup>th</sup> game with multiple trifectas. She has had at least two made threes in each of the last four games.

The Bearcats fell to 0-14 all-time against UConn.

Cincinnati guards Cann and Chelsea Jamison combined for 10 of Cincinnati's 25 rebounds.
