USF Postgame Notes

USF advanced to the American Athletic Conference championship semifinals at Mohegan Sun Arena for the second straight year. Last year, the Bulls were defeated by Louisville. In the history of the program, USF has never reached a conference tournament final.

USF junior forward Alisia Jenkins tied her career-high with 23 points, and also had 14 rebounds, posting her 22nd double-double of the season. She had 19 points and 11 rebounds in the first half on 6-of-8 shooting while making all seven free-throws.

Jenkins was a perfect 9-of-9 from the free-throw line. It was the eighth time she has been perfect from the line this year.

The Bulls have won 32 straight games when scoring at least 71 points. The last time they lost in that scenario was in the 2013 NCAA tournament, when they were defeated 82-78 by California.

Courtney Williams failed to score in double figures for just the second time in 40 games. The last time it happened was also against Memphis. With six points, Williams now has 1,462 for her career. She needs eight points to move into seventh place all-time on the USF career scoring list.

USF had an 18-1 edge in second-chance points during the first half and finished with a 20-6 final advantage. The Bulls had a 39-15 edge in bench points.

Memphis Postgame Notes

Memphis failed to advance to a conference semifinal for the third straight year. The last time the Tigers reached a semifinal was with Conference USA in 2012.

Junior guard Ariel Hearn led Memphis with 17 points, posting her 25th game in double figures.

Freshman forward Cheyenne Creighton tied a career-high with six rebounds.

Freshman guard Amber Holmes had career highs with two made 3-pointers and 10 points on 4-of-5 shooting.
