GAME TWO POSTGAME NOTES

No. 1 seed UConn

- The Huskies have reached the national championship game in five of the past seven seasons. UConn has won a national championship in each of its first nine trips to the title game.
- The Huskies improved to 10-6 all-time in NCAA national semifinal games.
- UConn seeks its third straight national championship, a feat it accomplished in 2002-04.
- UConn is 4-0 all-time against Maryland in a series that dates back to 2012-13.
- UConn is 77-7 in NCAA Tournament games since 2000. During that span, the Huskies have advanced to 13 Final Fours and won eight NCAA national championships.
- Head coach Geno Auriemma ranks second all-time among women's basketball coaches with 102 NCAA tournament victories. Pat Summitt is the all-time leader with 114.
- Geno Auriemma extended his NCAA record to eight-consecutive Final Four appearances.
- Geno Auriemma made his 16th Women's Final Four appearance and needs two more trips to tie the record set by Pat Summitt.
- Geno Auriemma is looking to extend his NCAA record for national championship wins to 10.
- Geno Auriemma is 19-5 all-time in the Women's Final Four.
- The Huskies are on the program's fourth-longest winning streak of 36 games. The program record winning streak is 90 games from 11/16/08-12/30/10.
- The Huskies are 36-1 this season when leading at halftime. UConn headed into the break with a 44-33 advantage against Maryland.
- UConn held a lead for 17:42 in the first half and connected on eight of its final 10 shots from the field. The Huskies led for 37:42 overall.
- UConn is 102-11 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.
- The Huskies have won 23 of their past 31 games against opponents ranked in the top-five of the Associated Press poll. UConn is 55-28 all-time against opponents in the AP top five.
- UConn appeared in the Women's Final Four for the eighth-consecutive season.
- UConn has made it to the Women's Final Four 16 times and won the national title in 1995, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2009, 2010, 2013 and 2014.
- UConn's 23-point win over Maryland marked the sixth-largest margin of victory in NCAA national semifinal games.
- With one 3-pointer, senior Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis extended her NCAA record with 396 in the category.
- Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis passed the 100-assist mark. This marks the second time in UConn history five Huskies have recorded at least 100 assists in a season.

- With 25 points, junior Breanna Stewart has scored at least 20 points in three of five NCAA Tournament games this season. Stewart has scored 20-plus points in eight NCAA Tournament games overall.
- Sophomore Morgan Tuck reached the 20-point mark for the seventh time in her career – all this season. Tuck fell just shy of a double-double with 24 points and nine rebounds.
- UConn's starting five included Morgan Tuck, Kia Nurse, Moriah Jefferson, Breanna Stewart and Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis. The Huskies have used this particular starting lineup 34 times this season.
- With a 35-28 edge on the glass against Maryland, UConn has outrebounded opponents 34 times this season.
