### THE AMERICAN TODAY

#### START OF THE 2020-21 SEASON

For the first time since the American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship in March, teams from The American head back to the court this week to officially open the 2020-21 season. Six different American teams are in action on Nov. 25 in nonconference play, and nine of the conference's 11 teams are expected to kick off the season by the end of play on Nov. 29.

#### CHANGES TO THE CONFERENCE SCHEDULE FORMAT

The 2020-21 league slate will feature each of The American's 11 members competing in a 20-game, double round-robin schedule for the first time in conference history. Conference play begins for The American on Tuesday, Dec. 15, when Tulane travels to Orlando, Florida, to face UCF. League favorite USF is set to play in-state rival UCF on Feb. 7 and March 2, preseason third-place team Tulane on Jan. 13 and Feb. 20 and last season's conference runner-up Cincinnati on Dec. 22 and Jan. 30. Along with its games against USF and Tulane (Dec. 15 and Feb. 17), preseason conference runner-up UCF will tangle with Cincinnati on Jan. 17 and Feb. 14.

#### ALL ROADS LEAD TO TEXAS

Another first in The American will take place this season when the men's and women's basketball championship tournaments are contested in the same venue and the same city. The 2021 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship is scheduled for March 8-11 at Dickies Arena in Fort Worth, Texas. The men's tournament is set to follow on March 11-14 at Dickies Arena.

#### THOMAS, DAVIS NAMED PRESEASON CO-POTY

Cincinnati senior forward IImar'I Thomas and Temple senior forward Mia Davis were selected as American Preseason Players of the Year following standout junior campaigns in 2019-20. Thomas, a 2020 WBCA Honorable Mention All-America choice, averaged 18.6 points and 7.8 rebounds per game in 32 starts last season and led all American players with a .597 field goal percentage (236-of-395). Davis is the leading returning scorer and rebounder in the conference after tallying 18.8 points and 10.1 boards per game across 30 starts, earning 2020 USWBA Honorable Mention All-America honors. Davis also was included among 20 players nationally named to the preseason Cheryl Miller Award Watch List, recognizing the country's best small forward.

## TALKING POINTS

#### UCF (0-0, 0-0 American)



- Brittney Smith was named to the preseason all-conference first team after averaging 10.5 points and 5.3 rebounds per game last season.
- No. 2 seed UCF fell to No. 3 Cincinnati 57-51 in the semifinal round of the 2020 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship.
- The Knights finished at the top of The American in free-throw shooting, converting 73.4 percent last season.

#### HOUSTON (0-0, 0-0 American)

- Houston closed the 2019-20 season on an eight-game losing streak following a 72-64 loss at the hands of Wichita State in the opening round of the American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship.
- The loss to Wichita State was Houston's fourth straight defeat in the conference tournament dating back to the 2017 quarterfinal round.
- Julia Blackshell-Fair enjoyed a breakout junior season for the Cougars, starting all 31 games while scoring 10.1 points and pulling down 6.4 rebounds.

#### SMU (0-0, 0-0 American)

- SMU failed to advance past the opening round of the 2020 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship for the third straight season, losing to No. 11 seed Memphis 76-85
- Reagan Bradley set the SMU singleseason freshman assist mark in 2019-20, bettering the previous total of 95.
   Bradley finished the season ranked first in The American with 129 assists.
- SMU closed last year as The American's top offensive rebounding unit.
   The Mustangs averaged 15.9 offensive boards per game, good for ninth nationally.

#### TULSA (0-0, 0-0 American)

- Tulsa was ousted in the first round of the 2020 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship after losing to Tulane 67-61.
- KK Rodriguez led the Golden Hurricane with 17 points against Tulane, just the third time all season in which Rodriguez was the team's leading scorer.
- Graduated senior Kendrian Elliott owned the conference's highest single-game scoring total for the 2019-20 season, as she tallied 38 points against Arkansas State on Nov.
   9. Elliott ranked fourth in The American with nine double-doubles.

#### CINCINNATI (0-0, 0-0 American)



- IImar'I Thomas was named a preseason Co-Player of the Year and was a unanimous all-conference first-team choice after averaging 18.6 points and 7.8 rebounds per game last season.
- Cincinnati reached the final game of the 2020 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship for the first time, dropping an 87-53 decision to top-ranked UConn.
- Cincinnati was one of the nation's top teams in assist/turnover ratio last season, ranking second in The American and 16th nationally at 1.26.

#### MEMPHIS (0-0, 0-0 American)



- Dulcy Fankam Mendjadeu was named to the preseason all-conference second team after ranking fourth in The American with 8.6 rebounds per game.
- Memphis reached the quarterfinal round of the 2020 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship, losing to Cincinnati 94-52 on day two of the tournament.
- Madison Griggs closed her freshman campaign with 96 made 3-pointers, shattering the conference freshman record of 78 made 3-pointers set by UConn's Katie Lou Samuelson in 2015-16. Griggs was named to the allfreshman team in recognition of her stellar rookie season.

#### TEMPLE (0-0, 0-0 American)

- Mia Davis was named a preseason Co-Player of the Year and was a unanimous all-conference first-team choice after averaging 18.8 points and 10.1 rebounds per game last season.
- Temple reached the quarterfinals of the 2020 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship, bowing out after battling topseeded UConn gamely in a 94-61 loss.
- Davis was named to both the allconference first team and was honorable mention USBWA All-America last season. She added a top-10 showing in voting for the Cheryl Miller Award in 2019-20.

#### WICHITA STATE (0-0, 0-0 American)



- Mariah McCully was named to the allconference preseason second team after averaging 12.6 points and 2.2 steals per game in 2019-20.
- Wichita State advanced to the quarterfinal round of the 2020 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship before dropping an end of season rematch with UCF 65-32.
- Wichita State reached the quarterfinals of the American tournament for the first time. The Shockers had exited following the opening round of their first two tournament berths as conference members.

#### ECU (0-0, 0-0 American)

- Lashonda Monk earned a spot on the preseason all-conference team after averaging 14.9 points and a conference record 4.2 steals per contest last season.
- ECU fell in the opening round of the 2020 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship, dropping a 67-57 decision to Temple.
- The Pirates ranked second nationally last season in steals (407), steals per game (13.6) and turnovers forced (24.10). The only team ahead of ECU in all three categories was Alcorn State.

#### USF (0-0, 0-0 American)

- Elisa Pinzan (9.0 points, 4.5 assists per game last season) and Elena Tsineke (12.4 points per game last season) were each named to the preseason all-conference second team.
- The Bulls were selected as The American favorite in the preseason coaches' poll with 10 first-place votes and 98 total voting points. As a semifinalist last season, the 2020 American Women's Basketball Championship marked just the third time since joining The American that USF did not reach the final round of the conference tournament.
- Nationally, USF ranked seventh in rebounding margin last season at +10.0.
   That mark led The American by nearly one and a half rebounds per game.

#### TULANE (0-0, 0-0 American)



- Krystal Freeman was one of three unanimous selections on the preseason all-conference first team after averaging 15.0 points and 7.7 rebounds per game last season. Arsula Clark was tabbed to the all-conference second team entering the 2020-21 campaign after scoring 12.7 points per game last season.
- Tulane reached the quarterfinal round of the 2020 American Athletic Conference Women's Basketball Championship, falling to fourth-seeded USF 8/1-50
- Tulane ranked second in The American in 3-point field goal percentage defense. Opponents shot just 28.5 percent from beyond the arc against the Green Wave.
