#### TWO TEAMS EARN MIDWEEK WINS

Two different American programs picked up wins in the midweek slate. East Carolina won its first home game of the season, defeating VCU 58-55 on Dec. 9. Tulane added an impressive come from behind effort the same night at Middle Tennessee, downing the Blue Raiders 81-78.

#### **UCF REMAINS UNBEATEN HEADING INTO WEEKEND**

UCF enters weekend play as one of the remaining unbeaten teams nationally in women's Division I basketball. The Knights, at 2-0, were one of 55 teams as of Dec. 10 who had yet to suffer a loss on the new season. UCF is expected to host Florida Gulf Coast on

#### A SIGNATURE WIN FOR THE BULLS

USF earned perhaps the biggest win in program history in its second straight game of a challenging slate last week. After falling to No. 4 Baylor 67-62 on Dec. 1, the Bulls responded with a 67-63 win over No. 6/7 Mississippi State in overtime on Dec. 5. USF entered overtime tied 60-60 with the Bulldogs and hit four free throws late to pull ahead, notching a pair of steals on Mississippi State possessions to preserve the victory. It was the first win over a top-10 team for USF in program history. Elisa Pinzan was named to the NCAA Starting Five after scoring 14 points, pulling down a career-high 11 rebounds and dishing out nine assists against Mississippi State.

#### THOMAS, DAVIS LIGHT UP THE SCOREBOARD

Through two weeks of the 2020-21 season, preseason co-American Player of the Year selections IImar'I Thomas and Mia Davis have lived up to their billing among the top scorers in Division İ women's basketball. Thomas opened her season account for Cincinnati with a 34-point outing against Northern Kentucky on Nov. 25, chipped in 23 points at Florida on Dec. 5 and scored 32 points on 9-of-11 shooting (14-of-16 from the free-throw line) in a setback versus Marquette on Dec. 10. Davis scored 22 points for Temple against Villanova on Dec. 4 and then erupted for a career-high 34 points at Florida Gulf Coast on Dec. 6. As of Dec. 11, Thomas ranked third nationally with 29.7 points per game. Davis was narrowly behind in sixth place with an even 28.0 points per contest.

Jordan repeated as the conference freshman of the week after averaging 19.0 points and 5.5 rebounds in a 1-1 Tulane week. She scored a career-



high 20 points at South Alabama on Dec. 1, chipping in five rebounds, three assists, two blocks and a pair of steals. Jordan added 18 points, six boards and three assists in

a narrow loss at Georgia Tech on Dec. 3.

Jordan was The American leader with a .923 free-throw percentage and ranked third in the league with 18.3 points per game as of Dec. 7. Her points per game total is sixth among all NCAA Division I freshmen.


