

# AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP POSTGAME NOTES

## Tulane 45, UCF 28

Saturday, December 3, 2022 Yulman Stadium New Orleans, Louisiana

- A This was the first American Athletic Conference Championship game appearance for Tulane.
- A UCF appeared in its third American Athletic Conference Championship game, but first on the road. The Knights were 2-0 in their previous appearances.
- A The attendance for the game was 30,118 setting a Yulman Stadium record.
- A UCF was scoreless after one quarter just the third time on the season the Knights failed to score in the opening frame. It is the ninth time Tulane has allowed zero points in the first quarter.
- A The 10-point deficit was the largest first quarter deficit UCF has faced all season.
- A fourth down stop by the Knights defense gave UCF a short field. The Knights capitalized with an 8-play, 32-yard touchdown drive capped with a five-yard touchdown run by Xavier Townsend to score their first points.
- Townsend's touchdown was the first of his career and came on just his second carry. He had one carry for five yards against Memphis on Nov. 5.
- A Davonte Brown snagged an interception late in the second quarter, tying the American Athletic Conference Championship game record for most in a game (13 others).
- A The 13-point halftime deficit was the largest of the season for UCF.
- A Pratt threw for 217 yards in the first half of the game the fourth most in an American Athletic Conference Championship Game (UCF's McKenzie Milton 306 yards; 2017; Memphis's Riley Ferguson 249 yards; 2017; UCF's Darriel Mack Jr. 220 yards; 2018).
- Tulane running back and American Offensive Player of the Year Tyjae Spears broke a 60-yard touchdown run to begin the third quarter. The run pushed him over the 100-yard mark for the seventh consecutive game.
- A Pratt hit Duece Watts in the fourth quarter for a 73-yard touchdown pass the longest pass in an American Athletic Conference Championship game.
- A Running back RJ Harvey threw his first career pass, throwing a 49-yard touchdown pass to Kobe Hudson.
- A Spears finished with 203 rushing yards, eight shy of the American Athletic Conference Championship game record.
- A Pratt won the Most Outstanding Player after throwing for 394 yards and three touchdowns. The 394 yards is the 3<sup>rd</sup>-most in an American Athletic Championship game (UCF's McKenzie Milton 494; 2018; Memphis's Riley Ferguson 471; 2018)
- A Prior to last week, Tulane had lost 61-straight games against ranked opponents. The Green Wave have won back-to-back games against ranked opponents, defeating #21 Cincinnati a week ago and #23 UCF in the championship.
