Deaver and Brewer headline NCAA Division II Conference Commissioners Association All-America baseball team

MARSHALL, Minn. - Sophomore right-handed pitcher Colby Deaver from Emporia State University (Kan.) and senior outfielder Dagen Brewer from Pittsburg State University (Kan.) headline the 2026 NCAA Division II Conference Commissioners Association All-America baseball team, earning the Ron Lenz Pitcher and Player of the Year awards, respectively. A total of 48 student-athletes were named to either the first, second or third team All-America squad while 16 were named honorable mention.

The CCA All-America and All-Region baseball teams, which are selected by College Sports Communicators (CSC) from schools playing Division II baseball, were first established in 2007. This is the 11th year in which the program is solely sponsored by the Division II Conference Commissioners Association.

Deaver, a native of Blue Springs, Mo., finished 11-2 on the season in leading the Hornets to a 37-16 record. In 15 starts, Deaver compiled a 1.50 ERA in 96 innings with 102 strikeouts and 12 walks. In the latest NCAA statistics (May 22), he ranked among the top 10 in the nation in numerous categories, including first in WHIP (0.82), ERA (1.50) and in strikeout-to-walk ratio (8.50), third in walks per nine innings (1.13), and seventh in total strikeouts, victories and hits allowed per nine innings (6.2).

Brewer, a native of Topeka, Kan., finished the season setting a Division II single-season record with 107 RBIs, while batting .442 with 25 home runs and 24 doubles in helping lead the Gorillas to a school record 45 victories and an NCAA Super Regional appearance. He racked up 191 total bases, including 58 walks and 12 hit by pitches, while finishing with a .573 on-base pct. and a .970 slugging pct. In the latest NCAA statistics (May 22), Brewer ranks first in RBIs and slugging pct., second in home runs and total bases, third in on-base pct., third in doubles and fourth in runs scored (87).

Joining Deaver and Brewer on the CCA All-America first team include Jack Enrico (C, Young Harris), Mitch Bonczkowski (1B, Missouri-St. Louis), Bryce Peterson (2B, UC Colorado Springs), Landon Lucas (3B, UNC Pembroke), Trevor Dale (SS, UC Colorado Springs), Charlie Bussey III (OF, Francis Marion), Kolby Felix (OF, Colorado Mesa), Ethan McAnally (DH, Francis Marion), Jovan Gill (utility non-pitcher, Grand Valle State), Chase Fleming (utility pitcher, Wilmington), B.J. Bailey (SP, Tampa), Collin Bradley (SP, Grand Valley State), Adrian Byrd (SP, Delta State) and Micky Scheetz (RP, West Florida).
