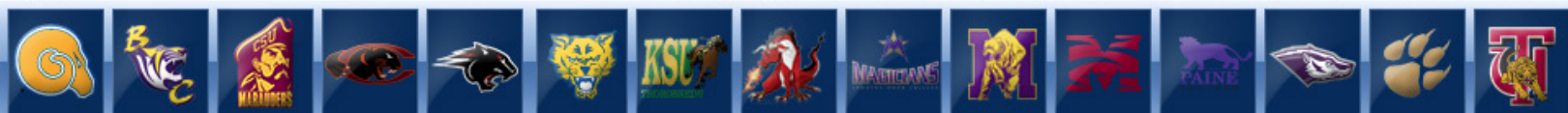

CONFERENCE NEWS AND NOTES

• Tuskegee and Morehouse will meet in the Tuskegee-Morehouse Classic. The game is the only HBCU Classic that is named after the teams featured and is the oldest running Classic in the state of Georgia and third longest among active HBCU Classics. The game is slated to be televised via Aspire Network

• As a result of Paine's schedule set a year after the league's conference-game rotation, Paine was required to identify a Division II opponent as a conference contest, selecting its first ever meeting against Limestone as the game to count towards the mandatory seven conference game slate

• Three student-athletes among the SIAC rank in the top 10 in individual single-game performances. BreNard Williams (CAU) holds the best performance for tackles for a loss with six against Lane. Josh Straughan (SC) tossed six touchdowns versus Lane for the third spot and Jacquise Lockett (KSU) posted 243 yards and is listed seventh in the category

• Tavarius Washington (Albany State) currently ranks second in the nation in solo tackles with 34 on the season and 8.8 per game

• SIAC Digital Network broadcast this week features Central State at Miles. Last season Central picked up its only SIAC win with a 25-21 victory over Miles. The loss, handed Miles its only conference defeat in 2013

• A pair of SIAC games were featured in two current NFL stadiums. Morehouse knocked off Central State at Soldier Field (Chicago Bears) and Kentucky State defeated CSU at Lucas Oil Stadium (Indianapolis, Colts)

• A field goal or extra point has determine the outcome of three games featuring SIAC teams. Benedict picked up a win over Elizabeth City State kicking an extra point as time expired. Clark Atlanta missed an extra point with seconds remaining to hand Fort Valley State a victory. FVSU then recorded a 40-yard field goal with 2.2 seconds remaining by Juan Serna to upend Benedict, 33-30

• Morehouse is currently riding the longest winning streak of the season having won three consecutive games

• Monqavious Johnson (Morehouse) was named BOXTOROW National Player of the Week. Johnson, a sophomore from Decatur, Ga., completed 16-of-24 passes for 403 yards and four touchdowns in the Maroon Tigers 43-9 victory over Central State in the Chicago Football Classic in week four

• Fort Valley State quarterbacks Otis Brown and Malcolm Eady rushed for more than 100 yards apiece. Brown gained 129 yards and Eady chipped in 102 in the Wildcats 19-18 conference win over Clark Atlanta

• The Chicago Football Classic between Central State and Morehouse drew more than 33,000 fans making it the largest attended SIAC game on the season

• Jonathan Clark (Miles) rushed for 212 yards to open the 2014 season against Shaw. Last week, Jacquise Lockett rushed for 243 yards against Central State giving the league two running backs surpassing the 200-yard mark

• Five teams are ranked in the top ten of the Heritage Sports Radio Network poll for week four. Tuskegee (3) Fort Valley State (4) Morehouse (5) Miles (8) and Stillman (9)

• Drelon Freeman (Fort Valley State) and Devon Mann (Morehouse) are the only receivers to eclipse the 200-yard mark in receiving yards, Freeman had five receptions for 204 yards and Mann hauled in seven receptions for 203 yards

• The Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference will host its football championship at the Cramton Bowl in Montgomery, Ala. The SIAC formally made the announcement during its football media day and is slated to hold the championship game at the venue for the next three seasons starting in 2014. The decision to move the championship was unanimously approved by the SIAC President's Council. It relocates after spending its first three years in Atlanta. The inaugural game was played at Panther Stadium on the campus of Clark Atlanta University in 2011 before moving to Lakewood Stadium the last two seasons

• SIAC finished its slate against NCAA Division II HBCU conference counterpart, CIAA, at 3-3 with Benedict, Stillman, and Miles picking up victories

2014 SIAC FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP

The SIAC Football Championship Game began in 2011, with conference teams separated and paired play in an Eastern-Western divisional format. It was decided division winners will play for a championship.

The Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference gave birth to the first championship game at Panther Stadium (Atlanta, Ga.) on the campus of Clark Atlanta University.

On Saturday, November 12, 2011, Albany State University (East Champion) and Miles College (West Champion) sparked the inaugural Southwestern Athletic Conference Football Championship game.

In a nail biter, Miles won the game with a 29-yard field goal with nine seconds on the clock to capture the win.

In the three-year existence of the SIAC Championship Game, four of the 12 conference

teams have earned a berth to play for the title, with the last two champions winning its first-time championship game crown.



From the Western Division, Miles has appeared in the game twice with Tuskegee making its only appearance in 2012.

Albany State represented the Eastern Division twice with Fort Valley making one appearance.

After 2011, the game's venue moved from Panther Stadium to Lakewood Stadium in Atlanta, Ga.

In May of 2014, The decision to move the championship to the Cramton Bowl in Montgomery, Ala. was unanimously approved by the SIAC President's Council. It relocates after spending its first three years in Atlanta. The SIAC formally made the announcement during its football media day and is slated to hold the championship game at the venue for the next three seasons starting in 2014.
