TLU HEAD COACH: Danny Padron, 1st Season

Danny Padron is the 20th head football coach in school history. Padron came to TLU after eight seasons as the head football coach and athletic coordinator at San Antonio's Sandra Day O'Connor High School. Padron was 65-30 overall as the head coach at O'Connor. He was the 2003 San Antonio Express-News "San Antonio Area Coach of the Year." In 2003, Padron led O'Connor to the Class 5A state quarterfinal round. He coached O'Connor to the 2004 and 2005 regional finals and to the 2006 and 2007 area finals. The Panthers were district champions in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007.

Padron has coached for 39 years, all in the San Antonio area. He and his fellow coaches have been in the state high school playoffs almost every year since 1982. Padron has been on coaching staffs that have combined to produce two state champions, a state finalist, two state semifinalists, two state quarterfinalists, five regional finalists, seven area finalists, and 17 district champions. The combined overall record of those teams since 1981 is 253-81-3.

In 1981, Padron became the offensive coordinator at San Antonio's Clark High School and served in that capacity for a total of 16 years (1981-1987 and 1993-2002). Clark was a Class 5A state quarterfinalist in 1994 and a regional finalist in 1995, 1996 and 2001. Padron was the assistant head coach at Converse Judson High School for the 1992 season and a first assistant/QB coach at Converse Judson from 1988 to 1991.

In 1988 and 1992, Converse Judson won Class 5A State Championships. The Rockets were the 1990 Class 5A state runner-up and Class 5A state semifinalists in 1989 and 1991.

TRINITY HEAD COACH: Steve Mohr, 21st Season
Record at Trinity: 162-61
Record vs. TLU: 9-1

Coach Steve Mohr took the Tigers to the 2002 Amos Alonzo Stagg Bowl, the NCAA Division III National Championship game, in Salem, Va. The Tigers have also played in the national semifinals three times (1998, 1999, and 2002). His Trinity teams have captured 14 Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Championships, and advanced to the NCAA playoffs 11 times since 1994.

Over the past 20 years, Coach Mohr's squads have posted a record of 160-59. Coach Mohr's teams have a winning percentage of .731. Among active Division III coaches, Coach Mohr is ranked ninth in victories (160) and 17th in winning percentage (.731). He is the 21st winningest all-time Division III coach in percentage, and 30th in victories.

Trinity Coach Steve Mohr (continued)

Under Coach Mohr's leadership, the Tigers have produced a 150-29 record over the past 16 seasons, for a winning percentage of .838. In the SCAC, the Tigers have amassed a record of 82-23 (.781) since 1990.

Respected by his peers, Coach Mohr has been named the SCAC Coach of the Year on 10 occasions, with the most recent in 2007. He has received four GTE Regional Coach of the Year awards, as selected by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA).

Coach Mohr has been named Division III National Coach of the Year by three organizations, including the Football Gazette in 2002. He was selected as the 1998 Division III National Coach of the Year by the American Football Gazette, as well as by CBSsportsline.com.

Twenty-five players have earned All-America honors under Coach Mohr's tutelage. He has also coached a National Player of the Year, along with 15 SCAC Offensive, Defensive, Special Teams Players of the Year, and Newcomer of the Year.

Trinity also garnered national attention in 2007, executing a 15-lateral play - the "Trinity Miracle Play" - to beat Millsaps College and earn the Pontiac Game Changing Performance of the Year award. The award earned the school over \$100,000 towards the general scholarship fund, and also secured an ESPY Award nomination for the Tigers from ESPN.

TLU Game Notes

Let It Ring, Let It Ring, Let It Ring

With last Saturday's 28-11 Homecoming victory over Sul Ross State, the Bulldogs won for the second straight time at home. The Bulldogs are growing accustomed to proceeding to the TLU Victory Bell on campus after returning from Matador Stadium. The Bulldogs are now 2-2 overall and 2-1 in the American Southwest Conference. TLU is tied for second (with Hardin-Simmons) in the ASC race and just a game behind the University of Mary Hardin-Baylor for the conference lead.

Mini-Streak Of Home Victories For Bulldogs

The Bulldogs have won two games in a row at home for the first time since the 2007 season. In that year, TLU defeated Howard Payne 55-48 in the TLU Homecoming game on Oct. 6, 2007. Two weeks later, on Oct. 27, 2007, the Bulldogs defeated McMurry 20-9.

A win Saturday over Trinity would give TLU three home victories in a row for the first time since Sept. 9, 2006, when the Bulldogs last defeated Trinity. TLU's 14-9 win over Trinity on that day was the third straight home victory for the Bulldogs. TLU defeated Austin College 45-0 in the 2006 season-opener on Sept. 2. The season finale of 2005, a 32-27 Bulldog win on Nov. 12, 2005 over No. 9 Hardin-Simmons, started the three-game home win streak.

Running Game Comes Alive Against Lobos

After rushing 25 times for a net 43 yards in the Sept. 25 game against Howard Payne in Brownwood, the Bulldogs erupted for 245 yards on 40 carries, an average of 6.1 yards per carry. TLU entered last Saturday's contest against Sul Ross State with a rushing average of only 2.8 yards and a team rushing yards per game of only 86.0.

After the dominant performance against Sul Ross State, the Bulldogs now average 3.8 yards per rush and 125.8 yards per game.

TLU's Anthony Smith was the last 100-yard rusher for the Bulldogs, prior to Dominique Hardaway running for 106 last Saturday against the Lobos. Smith rushed 27 times for 103 yards on Oct. 4, 2008 against Howard Payne. Against Sul Ross State, the freshman Hardaway carried the ball only nine times and amassed 106, for an average of 11.8 yards per carry. He had a long carry of 28, and he added a 24-yard catch for a touchdown from Mitchell Bunger.

In addition to Hardaway's rushing exploits, Bunger carried the ball eight times and rushed for 51 yards (averaging 6.4 yards per carry), and freshman tailback Charles Cooper rushed for 45 yards on six carries (a 7.5 yards-per-carry average). Cooper scored on a 26-yard run against the Lobos.

Bulldogs Reach The 28-point Mark For First Time Since '08

Before scoring 28 points in the Homecoming win over the Lobos, TLU last scored 28 points in a game on Oct. 4, 2008, a 28-21 victory over Howard Payne. The Bulldogs last scored more than 28 points in a game on Sept. 6, 2008, in a 34-27 OT win over Sul Ross State.

Bunger, Hardaway Combine For Rare Feat

When Bulldog sophomore quarterback Mitchell Bunger and freshman tailback Dominique Hardaway combined to throw for three touchdowns (Bunger) and rush for more than 100 yards (Hardaway), the pair did something the Bulldogs had not done since Oct. 4, 2008. TLU last had a 100-yard rusher and a passer throw for three TDs in the same game in that Oct. 4, 2008 game against Howard Payne, a 28-21 win for TLU. Joel Waldon tossed the three scores against the Yellow Jackets, and Anthony Smith gained 103 yards on 27 carries. Rocky Huff was the last TLU QB to throw for three TD passes in a game. Huff tossed three against Hardin-Simmons on Oct. 31, 2009.

Thrash Is Back After Injury Forced Him To Sideline

Steven Thrash watched the Bulldogs' Sept. 25 loss to Howard Payne (in Brownwood) in street clothes on the sideline. The senior starter missed the game due to injury, snapping a 23-game streak in which he had played in a TLU football game. Thrash returned to action last Saturday against Sul Ross State and caught just one pass. But that one pass made a huge difference. Thrash's 48-yard TD reception (from Mitchell Bunger) gave TLU a 21-3 lead midway through the third quarter. The pass play of 48 yards is the second-longest play from scrimmage for TLU this season. Thrash Resumes Climb Up TLU DIII Receiving Charts

Senior receiver Steven Thrash's 48-yard TD catch last Saturday against Sul Ross State was the 14th career receiving touchdown for the native of Hubbard, Texas. Thrash moved into sixth-place on the Bulldogs' NCAA DIII-era list for total points scored. With 84 career points scored, Thrash is now tied with Rollie Casas and Sean Salinas for sixth place on the DIII-era scoring list.

Thrash is now tied with Casas for the second-most TDs scored by a receiver in the Bulldogs' DIII era. Thrash and Casas trail Jason Trahan, who scored 31 in a career that spanned from 2003 to 2006.

Among the TLU DIII-era players, Thrash currently has 112 career catches (fourth all-time) and 1,558 yards (third all-time). Thrash is six catches from passing Casas for third on the receptions list. Thrash is 31 yards from passing Darrell White (1,588) for second on the DIII-era yards receiving yard. Trahan is the DIII-era and overall school record holder with 3,017 yards receiving.

Moses Tops The Team In Tackles For 4th Straight Game

Jack Moses led TLU in tackles for a fourth straight game, and he returned to the double-digit tackle tally that he had collected in each of the first two games of 2010. Saturday against Sul Ross State, Moses registered 11 total tackles (four solo, seven assisted).

For the season, Moses leads the Bulldogs with 45 total tackles (18 solo, 27 assisted). He currently ranks third in the league in tackles per game, at 11.2. Moses trails the ASC leader, Louisiana College's Nate Janzen, by four tackles per game. LC's Taylor Cottano is second in the ASC, with 12.0 tackles per game.

Moses now has 223 career tackles. Moses still sits fourth on the TLU DIII-era tackle list. Jake Dearing (294), Andy Puryear (279), and Jake Robbins (233) hold down the top three spots. Moses needs 11 tackles to pass Robbins for third place.

Weathersby Rises Up To Defend

Zack Weathersby, all 5-foot-7 and 155 pounds, has stood tall and played big for TLU in the early stages of 2010. Last week against Sul Ross State, Weathersby did an outstanding job on 6-1 and 195-pound Lee Carothers, who entered Saturday's game as the NCAA DIII's leading receiver, in terms of yards per game (172.5). Carothers averaged 18.2 yards per catch and had scored four

touchdowns. But against Weathersby and the Bulldog secondary, Carothers finished a long day at Matador Stadium with six catches for only 34 yards. He had a long reception of nine yards. Weathersby now ranks second in the conference in passes defended, with a total of six. All six have come in the form of pass break-ups.

Koop Ranks 9th Nationally In Punting

TLU's Dillon Koop (Vanderbilt/Industrial) continues to lead the American Southwest Conference in punting with a 42.96 yards per punt average. Koop also ranks high in the NCAA DIII national rankings. He currently stands ninth nationally in average yards per punt. Koop has punted 24 times for 1,031 yards. Three of the American Southwest Conference punters are in the Top 15 nationally. Koop is at No. 9, and Chad Peevey of Mary Hardin-Baylor and Josh Babineaux of Louisiana College are 11th and 14th, respectively. Kyle Trella of Trinity is 19th nationally, with a 40.58 per punt average. Koop has a long punt of 57, three forced fair catches, eight punts pinned inside the opponent's 20, and four punts of over 50 yards.

TLU Defense Near Top Of Major Categories

The Texas Lutheran defense is third in the American Southwest Conference in scoring defense, allowing only 21 points per game. McMurry and Hardin-Simmons lead the ASC with 18.2 and 19.6 points per game surrendered, respectively. The Bulldogs are fourth in total defense (364.8 yards allowed per game), third in rushing defense (105.5 yards allowed per game), fifth in pass defense (259.2 yards allowed per game), fourth in pass defense efficiency (124.5 rating), and second in red zone defense (opponents scoring at least some points 61.5 percent of the time inside the 25).

Scouting The Bulldogs

TLU Offense

Sophomore quarterback Mitchell Bunger (McAllen/Memorial/Texas A&M-Kingsville) will start his fifth game as a Bulldog when TLU faces Trinity on Saturday. Bunger is seventh in the ASC in passing (171.0 yards per game) and 10th in the league in rushing (46.0 yards per game). Bunger is seventh in the ASC in total offense per game (217.0).

Bunger operates primarily out of the shotgun and often has three receivers and a single back at his disposal. Bunger's primary receiving targets are senior Steven Thrash (Hubbard/Hubbard), junior Robert Salinas (McAllen/Memorial/UT-San Antonio), freshman Ckody Burton (Gonzales/Gonzales), sophomore Sherome Miller (Copperas Cove/Copperas Cove), and freshman Emmanuel Alexander (Houston/Katy). Burton and Thrash each caught TD passes last week against Sul Ross State. Burton had a team-high three catches for 51 yards against the Lobos. For the season, Salinas has a team-best 15 grabs for 214 yards. Thrash has a team-high two receiving TDs.

Charles Cooper (Houston/Washington), Dominique Hardaway (Lockhart/Lockhart) and Richard Allen (Orlando, Flor./North Shore) have each had bright spots in the early part of this season. Last week, Hardaway rushed for 106 yards on only nine carries, and Cooper added a 26-yard TD run and 45 yards rushing on only six carries. Bunger, the quarterback, is the team's leading rusher. Bunger has 40 carries for 184 yards (a 4.6 average), and he has the long rush of the season – a 29-yarder that went for a touchdown in the 17-14 home win over East Texas Baptist.

The offensive line of freshman Dylan Alexander

(Dickinson/Dickinson) at left guard, junior Rogelio Cantu (McAllen/Memorial) at right guard, Jacob Laubach (San Antonio/Smithson Valley) at left tackle, Matt Cannata (Richmond/Travis) at center, and Josh Goodlow (Austin/McCallum) at right tackle had its finest game of the young season in last week's 28-11 victory. The offensive line propelled a rushing attack that carried the ball 40 times for 245 yards. The offensive line also protected QB Mitchell Bunger as he threw for three touchdowns. The line did not allow a sack of a Bulldog QB against the Lobos.

TLU Defense

TLU shows multiple formations on defense, but the Bulldogs' base defense is a 4-2-5, with four down lineman, two linebackers, and five players in the secondary (two corners, a weak safety, a strong safety, and a free safety).

The Bulldogs overall are young on defense and not very big. The TLU front four averages 6-foot-1, 236 pounds. The defensive line again will start two freshmen, a sophomore transfer and a junior transfer on Saturday against Trinity. The linebacking corps, anchored by senior Jack Moses (San Antonio/Churchill), is primarily populated with first-year players. Freshman Delas Lancelin (Missouri City/Willowridge) is the other starter at linebacker. Lancelin has 24 total tackles. Fellow freshman Bradley Snowden (Houston/Seven Lakes) has 10 tackles.

The secondary is TLU's most experienced unit, with junior cornerback Zack Weathersby (Jackson, Miss./Forest/Mississippi College) and senior free safety Vernon Hughes leading the group. Freshman Kyle McNally (Cocoa Beach, Flor./Randolph (Texas)) starts at the other cornerback position, and freshman Brandon Thomas (Houston/Sterling) is the starter at weak safety. McNally and Thomas are tied for second on the team in tackles. Each player has 25. McNally has three pass break-ups and an interception.

Sophomore Kevin Cossey (Trinity/Trinity) is the starter at strong safety. Cossey had seven tackles, a tackle for loss and a fumble recovery last week against Sul Ross State. First-year player Michael Kauffmann is also seeing significant time as a safety. He had eight tackles (second on the team) last week against the Lobos.

TLU Special Teams

Allen Cain (San Antonio/Stevens) is the starting place kicker. Cain is 2-for-5 on field goal attempts. He connected on a 34-yarder against HPU for his long of the season. Cain is 2-for-4 from 30-39 yards and 0-for-1 from 50-59 yards.

Sophomore Dillon Koop (Vanderbilt/Industrial) is the starting punter. He leads the ASC in punt average and ranks ninth nationally. He has had two punts blocked.

Ckody Burton (Gonzales/Gonzales) and Robert Salinas (McAllen/Memorial/UT-San Antonio) handle the kickoff and punt return duties, respectively. Burton averages 25.3 per kickoff return, and Salinas averages 5.2 yards per punt return.

Scouting The Tigers

Trinity Offense

The Trinity offense through the years has been a passing offense to fear. In 2010, at least through the first four games, the Tigers'

rushing offense has been the team's top threat. Trinity ranks 39th in NCAA DIII in rushing yards per game. The Tigers average 201.50 yards per contest and are the top rushing attack in the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference.

Senior running back Kyle Lewis rushed for a career-high 160 yards last week in the road win over Birmingham-Southern. Lewis carries the ball 25 times and scored twice. Lewis nearly went over 100 yards in two other contests. He had 91 yards on 15 carries in the overtime win versus Howard Payne, and he had 97 yards on 14 carries in the home loss to Rhodes. Lewis, a native of Kingston, Jamaica, was named the SCAC Offensive Player of the Week after his performance last Saturday. He currently has 365 yards rushing on 59 carries, an average of 6.2 yards per carry.

At quarterback, the Tigers have used junior Patrick Dickinson and senior Robert Davidson. Each Tiger has played in three games. Dickinson has completed 57.9 percent of his passes and thrown for 351 yards with two TD passes and an INT. Davidson has thrown for 314 yards with a 46.3 completion percentage. Davidson has tossed four TDs and four INTs.

Caleb Urban and Daniel South have a combined five TD receptions between them. Urban leads the Tigers with 17 grabs, and he has two TD receptions. South has collected 14 catches with a team-high 206 yards and three TDs.

The Trinity starting offensive line averages 6-foot and 280 pounds. Offensive tackle Yustino Hong stands 6-3 and weighs 317. Opposite tackle Tory Dawson goes 6-1, 285. The line is comprised of two sophomores, two juniors, and a senior (Dawson).

Trinity Defense

The Tigers rank in the NCAA DIII Top 100 in total defense, allowing only 320.75 yards per game. Opponents average just 136.5 yards per game on the ground and only 184.25 yards through the air. The Tigers do surrender about 28 points per game, but some of those points can be attributed to the Tigers ranking last in the SCAC in turnover margin, at -1.25 per game.

The Tigers sack opposing quarterbacks on average twice per contest and record an average of seven tackles for loss in a game.

Trinity shows a base 4-3 defense, with four down linemen, three linebackers, and four secondary players (two corners and two safeties). Defensive end Philip Hiner Leamon, a sophomore, leads the team in sacks, with two. Linebacker Jarrod Burns, linebacker Thomas Puskarich, and linebacker Ben Robinson are the top three tackles for the Tigers. Burns, a senior, has a team-high 37 tackles with 2.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Puskarich brings in 34 tackles with 4.0 tackles for loss, and Robinson has 28 tackles this year with a team-best six tackles for loss. The Tigers have two interceptions this season, one of which was recorded by wide receiver Caleb Urban and returned 42 yards.

Trinity Special Teams

The Tigers have two of the outstanding special teams performers in the country in place-kicker Garret Biel and punter Kyle Trella. Last season both players were elected to the D3football.com All-America Third Team.

Biel, a kicker from Clayton, Calif. (De La Salle), led the NCAA Division III in field goals made, connecting on 17 of 19. His longest field goal was 48 yards. Biel's 17 field goals set a new school record for a single season. He also broke the mark for most field goals in a single game, making four against Rhodes College.

Biel was named to this week's D3football.com Team of the Week after hitting a career-best 49-yard field goal late in the first quarter against Birmingham-Southern. He then hit all five PATs in the game. The 49-yard kick is the third-longest in Trinity (Texas) history. Biel earlier was selected as the SCAC Special Teams Player of the Week.

Trella, a punter from Chandler, Ariz. (Chandler), led the nation in punting during the regular season (No. 2 after the playoffs), averaging 44 yards per attempt. He broke a 46-year-old Trinity record with his 48.8 yards per punt average against Sewanee.

LAST WEEK FOR TEXAS LUTHERAN Texas Lutheran 28, Sul Ross State 11

SEGUIN, Texas -- The Texas Lutheran Bulldogs scored their second consecutive home victory and thrilled a large TLU Homecoming crowd Saturday with a 28-11 win over Sul Ross State.

At Seguin's Matador Stadium, sophomore quarterback Mitchell Bunger (McAllen/Memorial/Texas A&M-Kingsville) threw for three touchdowns, and freshman running back Dominique Hardaway (Lockhart/Lockhart) rushed for 106 yards and caught a 24-yard TD pass.

Bunger threw TD passes to Hardaway, senior Steven Thrash (Hubbard/Hubbard), and freshman Ckody Burton (Gonzales/Gonzales). The Thrash and Burton scores went for 48 and 36 yards, respectively, and came as TLU increased its lead from 14-3 to 28-3 in the second half.

TLU (2-2, 2-1 American Southwest Conference) rushed 40 times for 245 yards. In addition to Hardaway's 106 yards, Bunger rushed for 51, and freshman tailback Charles Cooper (Houston/Washington) added 45. The Bulldogs averaged 6.1 yards per carry against the Lobos.

"It's about making big plays," said Danny Padron, TLU's first-year head football coach. "Play-action is important, and that's why you run the football, so you can do play action."

TLU held Sul Ross State to 11 points, 23.5 points below its scoring average. The Bulldogs recovered three Lobo fumbles and intercepted one pass.

Sul Ross (1-2, 1-1 ASC) entered Saturday's contest as the NCAA Division III leader in total offense, averaging 497.5 yards per game. Sul Ross State finished the loss to TLU with 408 yards of total offense. Ninety-six of those yards came on one play - a TD reception for B.J. Vickers from back-up quarterback Terrance Young.

Young and Kyle DeMoss played in relief of injured starter Monty Morales, the NCAA DIII leader in individual total offense. Morales exited the game late in the second quarter with a leg injury.

Klayton Smith (Cuero/Cuero/Incarnate Word) and Dominic Ziegler (Copperas Cove/Copperas Cove) forced fumbles for TLU. Ziegler, Chad Ellis (Petoskey, Mich./Petoskey/Michigan Tech) and Kevin Cossey (Trinity/Trinity) each recovered fumbles.

TLU senior linebacker Jack Moses (San Antonio/Churchill) led the Bulldogs with 11 tackles. Freshman safety Michael Kauffmann (Buda/Hays) added eight tackles and two pass break-ups.

Weathersby led the TLU secondary with four pass break-ups, and freshman cornerback Kyle McNally (Cocoa Beach, Flor./Randolph (Texas)) intercepted a pass in the endzone.

"Our coaches do a great job as far as scheming for the defense, and our kids executed, that's the deal," said Padron. "This week they stayed with a man. Last week (in a loss to Howard Payne) we tried to help other people, and we paid for it."

"We are very happy with our players, but we are not satisfied. We know we have a long way to go. It's going to be a long journey, and next week will be a different deal."

TLU takes a break next Saturday from conference play. The Bulldogs host area rival Trinity University for a non-conference game at Seguin's Matador Stadium. Kickoff is set for 1 p.m. TLU will have live video, audio, stats and chat from www.tlubulldogs.com for the home game.

Trinity 38, Birmingham-Southern 28

The Trinity football team broke its two-game losing streak with a strong 38-28 victory over previously unbeaten Birmingham-Southern College on Saturday afternoon.

Trinity (2-2, 0-2 SCAC) used a 21-point second quarter to pull ahead for good in the game, which was the first road game of the season for the Tigers.

Preseason All-American Garrett Biel kicked the third-longest field goal in Trinity history to put the Tigers up 3-0 late in the first quarter. It is his third field goal of 40 or more yards this season.

After the Panthers took the lead on a 14-play drive early in the second quarter, Trinity answered less than 90 seconds later with a touchdown from senior running back Kyle Lewis.

Lewis enjoyed a career day on the ground for Trinity, racking up 160 rushing yards and two touchdowns on just 25 carries.

Later in the quarter, quarterback Robert Davidson plunged across the goal line from a yard out to make it 17-7 in favor of Trinity, but Birmingham-Southern answered back with a 59-yard catch-and-run that put the home team right back in the game just 2:34 before halftime. That would prove to be 25 seconds more than Trinity would need for another score, as Tiger first-year running back Desmond King caught a 47-yard touchdown pass from Davidson to make it 24-14.

Neither team was able to do much until late in the third quarter when Lewis scored his second touchdown of the day to put the Tigers in control.

Birmingham-Southern did make a late push, scoring early in the fourth quarter, but King scored his second touchdown of the day - this on a 30-yard run - with 3:20 remaining to put the Tigers up 38-21. The Panthers added a score with 35 seconds left, and also got the onside kick, but the Tigers had already sealed the win.

Three first half turnovers plagued Birmingham-Southern, leading directly to 10 of Trinity's 24 points in the first two quarters. The Tiger offense piled up 412 yards of offense, including 248 on the ground. Birmingham-Southern was held to just 297 yards of offense and only 176 passing on 16-24 attempts.

Ben Robinson and Jarrod Burns finished with 12 tackles each to lead Trinity's defensive effort, and both Burns and Greg Kerr recorded sacks in the game. Robinson finished with 3.0 tackles for loss to lead the Tigers.



King finished with 66 yards rushing on 11 carries, as well as catching two passes for 52 yards. He scored both a rushing and receiving touchdown in his first game with the Tigers.

Davidson finished 5-10 passing for 75 yards and a touchdown, and both Caleb Urban and Daniel South caught three passes each. One of South's receptions came on a 41-yard connection with Urban, who finished with 30 yards receiving, 41 yards passing, and 17 yards rushing in the game.

SEGUIN, Texas – Freshman kicker Garrett Biel booted a game-winning 34-yard field goal with no time remaining on the clock to lift the Trinity Tigers to a 22-21 road victory over Texas Lutheran.

Saturday at a soggy Matador Stadium in Seguin, the Tigers (2-0) rallied to erase a 21-12 fourth-quarter deficit.

TLU dropped to 0-1 with the loss in its home and season-opener.

After TLU freshman quarterback Rocky Huff hit Vernon Hughes for an 11-yard score at the 13:23 mark of the final quarter, the Bulldogs held the nine-point edge.

But Trinity, behind junior quarterback Robert Davidson, responded to the Bulldog challenge over the final minutes of the game.

Trinity recovered a fumble in TLU territory midway through the fourth quarter and turned the turnover into seven points. Davidson hit wide receiver Cory Scherr in the back of the endzone at the 5:45 mark to cut the TLU lead to 21-19.

After a defensive stop against the Bulldogs, Davidson drove the Tigers 49 yards in 14 plays for the game-winning field goal. Davidson finished with 30 completions on 47 attempts for 287 yards, a touchdown and no interceptions.

Biel nailed the field goal to end the game and was mobbed by his teammates, who rushed the field. Biel was a perfect 3-for-3 after connecting on field goals of 25, 28, and 34 yards.

The game was largely a defensive stand-off between the two clubs. Neither team was able to establish a running attack. Trinity rushed 31 times for 21 yards, and TLU rushed 26 times for 26 yards.

TLU took the lead in the second quarter on a fake field goal. Frank Vera, the Bulldogs' senior punter and holder, took the snap on what appeared to be a 26-yard field goal attempt by Allen Cain.

But Vera rose up out of his stance and tossed a perfect strike to senior Steven Thrash, who was uncovered on the far right sideline.

Trinity lost track of Thrash on the field of play, and Thrash scored untouched after the perfect pass from Vera. For Vera, the TD pass was the third of his career. All the TD passes for Vera have come on trick plays.

TLU led 14-3 in the second quarter on a one-yard plunge from Anthony Smith. The Smith TD capped a six-play, 40-yard drive.

The Bulldogs enjoyed excellent field position for most of the evening thanks to Vera, who pinned five punts inside the Trinity 20, and thanks to punt and kick returner Brian Box, who accumulated 172 of total return yardage.

Huff, TLU's true freshman quarterback, received the start due to injury to projected starter Jarret Buchholtz. Huff was 16 for 24 for 114 yards with a TD and an interception. He was sacked twice.

Of TLU's six sacks on Davidson, seniors James Villarreal and Eric Walker combined for four of them. Villarreal had two sacks along with three total tackles and two quarterback hurries. Walker collected eight total tackles with three tackles for loss and two sacks for 15 yards.

Junior linebacker Jack Moses and freshman defensive lineman Chris Kyle led TLU with nine total tackles apiece. Moses had two tackles for loss, and Kyle also had two tackles for loss.
