### Game Overview

Unbeaten in American Southwest Conference play through three games, the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs host McMurry University at 1 p.m. Saturday in Seguin's Matador Stadium.

The Bulldogs have not lost since a Sept. 10 road game at Trinity University. The Bulldogs are 4-1 overall and off to the university's best start to a season since the 1984 squad started 5-0-1.

The Bulldogs are 3-0 in the ASC for the first time in school history.

TLU is one of two unbeatens remaining in the ASC. The Bulldogs trail Mary Hardin-Baylor (5-0 overall, 4-0 ASC) by a half game in the conference standings. McMurry, a 28-27 loser to UMHB in Belton, Texas

on Sept. 17, is a half game behind TLU in the conference standings.

The Bulldogs have won three consecutive games for the first time since 2004. TLU has scored more than 40 points for three straight games for the first time in school history.

TLU will face the high-scoring, high-flying aerial attack of McMurry's War Hawks, coached by Hal Mumme and led by All-America candidate and senior quarterback Jake Mullin. McMurry is fourth in all of NCAA Division III in passing yards per game. McMurry also leads the ASC in passing efficiency.

The War Hawks have scored 63, 50, and 41 points in their last three games against East Texas Baptist, Howard Payne, and Sul Ross State, respectively. TLU scored 44, 51 and 43 against those same three opponents.

Mumme, Mullin and McMurry delivered a 63-14 blowout victory against TLU in 2010. The War Hawks jumped out to a 28-0 lead and led 35-14 at the half.

The American Southwest Conference match-up between the Bulldogs and the War Hawks will be the 28<sup>th</sup> all-time meeting between the two universities. TLU holds a 15-12 lead in the series. McMurry has won the last two meetings.

Mumme is 2-0 against TLU, and Bulldog Head Coach Danny Padron is 0-1 against McMurry.

Saturday's meeting will be the last time (for the foreseeable future) that the two teams will meet on the football field. McMurry is in transition to NCAA Division II. The two teams are not scheduled to play each other as non-conference opponents in 2012.

## **BULLDOG BITS**

### **TLU LEADING ASC IN SCORING**

After five games in the 2011 season, the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs are the leaders in scoring per game in the American Southwest Conference. After the 43-26 win over Sul Ross State on Oct. 1, the Bulldogs now have a scoring average of 36.6 points per game.

Since bringing back football in 1998, the Bulldogs averaged more than 30 points per game for a season only once – the 2004 season. The Bulldogs scored 375 points in a 10-game season – for an average of 37.5 points per game.

### **KICKING GAME LEADS SCORING**

TLU junior place-kicker Allen Cain leads the Bulldogs and is second in the American Southwest Conference in scoring. The San Antonio native and product of Stevens High School averages 8.6 points per game. Cain has kicked seven field goals, and he is a perfect 22-for-22 on point-after attempts.

Cain has captured the ASC's Special Teams Player of the Week award three times this season. He has also appeared on D3football.com's Team of the Week twice.

In consecutive games, Cain has kicked three field goals in a contest. Against Howard Payne on Sept. 24, Cain kicked field goals of 27, 27 and 23 to tie the school record for most field goals in a game.

He tied the record again during the road win over Sul Ross State on Oct. 1. Cain made field goals from 44, 29, and 23 against the Lobos.

Cain shares the single-game field goals record with six former Bulldogs who combined to kick three field goals in a game on nine different occasions.

Cain is 16-for-24 on career field goal attempts and 64-for-65 on career point-after attempts. He was 4-for-4 on PATs against Sul Ross State. Cain also handles kickoff duties and averages 66.1 yards per kickoff with nine touchbacks.

### **HARDAWAY ACCUSTOMED TO ENDZONE**

Sophomore running back Dominique Hardaway came within a touchdown of tying the school record for TDs in a game when he scored three against Sul Ross State two weeks ago.

The Lockhart, Texas product rushed for a season-best 101 yards and had TD runs of two and 20 yards against the Lobos. He also snared a 13-yard touchdown pass from Mitchell Bunger.

Hardaway has scored three touchdowns rushing and three touchdowns receiving this season. He is tied for sixth in the conference in scoring per game, at 7.2 points per contest.

Hardaway has 298 rushing yards through five games of 2011. He had 298 rushing yards for all of 2010 (when he played in nine games). His six touchdowns this season eclipsed the five he scored in 2010.

This season, Hardaway leads the team in rushing (298), in yards per carry (4.9), and in non-kick scoring (36 points). The sophomore is second on the team in rushing TDs (3) and receiving TDs (3).

### **BUNGER STAYS STEADY AT QB**

TLU junior quarterback Mitchell Bunger matched his career-high in single game passing touchdowns with three Oct. 1 against Sul Ross State. Bunger threw for a season-best 223 yards, the third-best single-day yardage day of his career.

Bunger continues to do a good job of avoiding the big mistake. He has thrown 10 touchdowns and just two interceptions. His two interceptions have come with 120 passing attempts this season.

Bunger is third in the American Southwest Conference in passing efficiency. He has completed 66 of 120 passes (55.0 percent). His efficiency rating of 135.4 trails only Jake Mullin of McMurry (139.2) and Taylor Byrd of Hardin-Simmons (140.2).

### **TLU AT TOP OF TURNOVER GAME**

Texas Lutheran's won-loss record and its scoring production have a lot to do with the team's ability to protect the football on offense and take advantage of turnovers on defense. TLU leads the ASC in turnover margin with a plus-1.20 turnover margin per game.

The Bulldogs have gained 10 fumbles and five interceptions (15 total turnovers gained) and lost seven fumbles and two interceptions (nine turnovers lost) for a current margin of plus-six.

Through six games of its season, McMurry brings up the conference rear in turnover margin. The War Hawks are minus-seven for the season and minus-1.17 per game. The War Hawks have fumbled eight times and thrown 20 interceptions. The War Hawks have gained six fumbles and seven interceptions.

### **RED ZONE SCORING ANOTHER STRENGTH**

The Bulldogs rank second in the American Southwest Conference in red zone offense. The Bulldogs have been inside the opponents' 20-yard line 25 times and have scored points 21 times.

TLU has scored 16 touchdowns and five field goals in red zone scoring chances. The Bulldogs are 5-for-7 on field goals and have been stopped on downs once. TLU also lost a red zone scoring opportunity with a fumble.

Hardin-Simmons leads the ASC in red zone scoring. The Cowboys have scored 22 out of 25 times, but TLU has the most red zone TDs (16) in the conference.

### **TLU OFFENSE**

The Texas Lutheran offense shows multiple formations and looks to opposing defenses. The Bulldogs have used a three-receiver, one-back set for some games and a two-back formation with a tight end in others. Saturday's two-deep for the McMurry game has the Bulldogs returning (at least for the start of the game) to an offense that utilizes a backfield with a tailback and fullback and features a tight end. Sophomore Michael Kauffman and freshman Chisolm Ibeh are the tight ends, and Chris Chudej and Quinnten Cleveland are the listed fullbacks.

Cameron Peavy and Lewis Williams II will start at the wide receiver spots with Sherome Miller and Brian Box listed as back-ups.

Mitchell Bunger will start for the 16<sup>th</sup> consecutive game of his TLU career. Bunger started all 10 games in 2010 and the first five games of this 2011 campaign. Bunger is 8-7 in his 15 games as a starter. At home, in Seguin's Matador Stadium, Bunger is 6-1. The junior from McAllen has thrown 10 touchdowns and only two interceptions through five games. Bunger is also a threat as a runner. He is second on the team in rushing, with 176 yards, and he has a rushing touchdown. Bunger is completing 55 percent of his passes (66-for-120). He has thrown for 803 yards.

Bunger's top receiving target is the freshman Williams, who has 19 catches for 199 yards with a touchdown. He has a long reception of 51 yards. Peavy and Box each have 10 receptions. Ryan Jones, a transfer from Riverside Community College (Calif.), leads the Bulldogs with four TD grabs. He

caught a pair of touchdowns in the last TLU contest – the win at Sul Ross State. Two-thirds of Jones's catches have gone for touchdowns. Half of Dominique Hardaway's receptions have gone for touchdowns. The sophomore running back has six receptions for 85 yards.

TLU's rushing attack features four primary ball carriers – quarterback Bunger and running backs Hardaway, Charles Cooper and Patrick Johnson. Hardaway has 298 yards rushing on 61 attempts (4.9 average) with a long of 53 and three scores. Cooper has rushed 40 times for 175 yards, and he has scored twice. Johnson has been used as a red zone specialist. He leads the team with four rushing TDs. He has rushed 37 times for 145 yards.

The offensive line lost a key piece in Alpine on Oct. 1 when starting left guard Rogelio Cantu went down to injury. Cantu, a senior captain and a former U.S. Marine, had made 14 consecutive starts on the TLU offensive line. Sophomore Dylan Alexander replaced Cantu after the injury and played the remainder of the

Sul Ross game. Alexander started the final nine games of 2010 and started the first three games of 2011. Alexander will start at left guard against McMurry, and freshman Kendall Wilkerson will start a third straight game at right guard. The tackles – senior right tackle Josh Goodlow and junior left tackle Jacob Laubach – remain entrenched in their duties. Goodlow is slated to start his 30<sup>th</sup> consecutive game for the Bulldogs. Laubach will start his 24<sup>th</sup> game as a Bulldog. Junior center Matt Cannata will make his 18<sup>th</sup> consecutive start at center.

### **TLU DEFENSE**

The Bulldogs have battled injury after injury throughout the defense. A week off has given some of the Bulldogs a chance to heal. Notably, sophomore defensive tackle Walter Barreda and freshman defensive tackle Justin Rice are scheduled to return to the defensive line rotation. In the last game Barreda saw action, he set a school record for forced fumbles with three against Howard Payne. He also had four tackles for loss in that contest. Senior Chad Ellis and freshman James Fowler III are the starting defensive ends, and sophomores Rodrick Sparks and Delas Lancelin start at the tackles. Sparks started for the first time this season in the win over Sul Ross State and produced seven tackles, two tackles for loss and

a sack. Senior Emmanuel Asahene and freshman Nick Waters are the scheduled back-ups at defensive end.

At linebacker, Bradley Snowden moves from strong safety to linebacker this week. Snowden, a sophomore and TLU's leading tackler, will start alongside freshman Brian DuBose Jr. Snowden leads TLU with 39 tackles, and he has two tackles for loss and a forced fumble. DuBose Jr. has 17 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, a sack, an interception, and a fumble recovery. Marcus Ferree and Benjamin Munster are the No. 2s at linebacker this week.

In the TLU secondary, senior Zack Weathersby, freshman Jonathan Horton and sophomore Darnell Bohannon-Bey have provided outstanding coverage as cornerbacks. Horton and Weathersby have split time at one corner, while Bohannon-Bey has started the first five games at the other corner. Bohannon-Bey is third on the team in tackles, with 27, and he has a touchdown on a fumble recovery of 47 yards. Weathersby has collected 18 tackles, and Horton has an interception and a fumble recovery.

At the safety positions for TLU, only sophomore free safety Kyle McNally will return as a starter this week as compared to the last time the Bulldogs played a

game. Against the high-powered “Air Raid” attack of McMurry, TLU will send out true freshman Jordan Vines at weak safety and true freshman Adam McGuire at strong safety. Vines has been active for TLU in his four games played. He has recorded 16 tackles with two fumble recoveries. McGuire has seen limited action in three games played. He has three total tackles this season. True freshmen Cedric Whitaker Jr. and Zachary Sauers will serve as back-ups at strong and weak safety, respectively.

#### **TLU SPECIAL TEAMS**

The Bulldogs’ special teams unit continues to be a bright spot in 2011. Place-kicker Allen Cain has been named the ASC Special Teams Player of the Week three times already this year. Cain has made three field goals in each of the last two games. He has made six consecutive field goals, and he is 7-for-9 overall with a long of 52. Cain is a perfect 22-for-22 on point-after attempts. The junior from San Antonio also excels in kickoffs, with an average kickoff of 66.1 yards and nine touchbacks.

Junior punter Dillon Koop averages just under 40 yards per punt (39.7). He has three punts of more than 50 yards, and he has placed seven punts inside

the opponent’s 20-yard line. Koop also has forced nine fair catches.

Punt returner Tyler Denman averages 11.2 yards per punt return, and he has a long of 47. Denman has returned 12 punts for 135 yards. Lewis Williams II has fielded a team-high 17 kickoffs and averages 18.6 per return, with a long of 30. Fellow receiver Ryan Jones has taken three kickoffs for an average of 25.7, with a long of 29. Offensive lineman Kendall Wilkerson handles the deep-snapping duties, and back-up quarterback Bryan Hill is the team’s holder.

#### **SCOUTING THE WAR HAWKS**

##### **McMURRY OFFENSE**

McMurry’s “Air Raid” offense enters Matador Stadium on quite a roll. The War Hawks have averaged 404.3 yards passing and 507.6 yards of total offense in their three-game winning streak. The War Hawks put up a whopping 753 yards of total offense in a 63-31 home win over East Texas Baptist and posted 600 yards of total offense in a 50-3 road victory over Howard Payne. In the oft-delayed, weather-shortened game against Sul Ross State, the

War Hawks put up 41 points with about a quarter left to play.

The trigger man for the War Hawks' offense is senior Jake Mullin, who already has thrown for 1,729 yards and 16 touchdowns. He completes 63.3 percent of his passes. He has tossed eight interceptions. Before his 2010 season ended due to injury, Mullin put up one of the greatest statistical seasons in conference history. He tossed 35 touchdowns in eight games and managed just two interceptions. He threw for 2,859 yards and completed 61.2 percent of his passes.

In the abbreviated win over Sul Ross State last week, Mullin completed just 12 passes on 21 attempts, but four of the passes went for touchdowns.

Wide receiver R.J. Long and tight end Delfonte Diamond are the top two targets for Mullin. Long has 36 grabs for 402 yards and five touchdowns, including two last week against the Lobos. Diamond has 31 catches for 386 yards and also has five touchdowns. Diamond caught the game-winning pass from Mullin in the Alamodome win over University of Texas at San Antonio. Diamond's catch came with 19 seconds remaining in regulation. He finished that game with seven catches for 142 yards. Running back Justin Johnson is also a receiving threat. Johnson has 19 catches for 187 yards and three touchdowns.

Johnson leads the War Hawks in rushing, with 58 attempts for 288 yards. He has scored three rushing touchdowns and has a long rush of 53.

The McMurry starting offensive linemen all stand over 6-feet tall and weigh more than 245 pounds. Sophomore left tackle Nolan Hankins goes 6-7 and 315 pounds, and left guard John Duplichan goes 6-1 and 275. The War Hawks' offensive line averages 6-3 and 266 pounds.

### **McMURRY DEFENSE**

Despite allowing 82 points in its season-opener at Stephen F. Austin, McMurry's scoring defense is now below 30 points per game. The War Hawks rank sixth in the ASC in opponent scoring average with 29.7 points per game. The War Hawks also rank sixth in total defense (371.8 ypg). The War Hawks have allowed just 16 points in their last two contests.

McMurry's two-deep shows a 3-3-5 base defense. The three starting down linemen – Markell Rice, Kevin Stewart, and Corey Hall – average 6-1 and 223 pounds. The linebackers – Kyle Wayne Kelley, Nick Hernandez, and Kerry Gamble – average 6-1 and 207 pounds.

Gamble is second on the team in total tackles with 33. He has four tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. Hernandez is fourth on the squad in tackles. He is third on the team in tackles for loss, with seven for 29, and he also has 1.5 sacks. Kelley leads the team in sacks, with two for 13 yards. Reserve linebacker Chris Williams, a freshman, has a team-best nine tackles for 22 yards in losses. He has forced a team-high three fumbles.

McMurry free safety Will Morris is the team's tackle leader. Morris has 36 total tackles and a tackle for loss. Morris has picked off three passes and has 117 interception return yards. Morris has taken two interceptions back for touchdowns, with a long INT return of 88. He has broken up three passes, defended six, recovered a fumble, and forced two.

The War Hawks have intercepted seven passes and recovered six fumbles.

### **McMURRY SPECIAL TEAMS**

When not throwing TD passes or running for scores, Mullin moonlights as the team's punter. He has punted 17 times for 816 yards, and he has a long punt of 70. He averages 48 yards per punt and leads the conference in that category. The two-deep lists John Kowalski as the starting punter, but he has punted just one time this season.

Place-kicker Jesse Garcia, a senior, is just 1-for-2 on field goal attempts this season. He made a 31-yarder in the win over UTSA. Garcia has missed from 22. Garcia is 16-for-20 on point-after attempts. Last week against Sul Ross State, back-up quarterback Stephen Warren completed a two-point conversion pass for Diamond after the first score. Garcia also rushed for two points after the third McMurry TD. Warren also had a rush and a pass fail on two-point scoring attempts in the third quarter.

Greg Livingston concluded the scoring in the win over Sul Ross State with a 92-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. Livingston has returned 16 kicks for 378 yards and averages 23.6 per return. Free safety Will Morris has four punt returns this year with an average of 9.8 per return. Markel Rice returned a blocked punt eight yards for a touchdown against UTSA.

The McMurry special teams have blocked four punts and two kicks in 2011. D.J. Baiza and Chris Williams each have two blocks.

**LAST GAME – TLU (Oct. 1)  
Texas Lutheran 43, Sul Ross State 26**

ALPINE, Texas – The Texas Lutheran Bulldogs rolled up 500 yards of total offense and stormed to a 43-26 road victory over Sul Ross State on Saturday evening.

At Alpine's Jackson Field, the Bulldogs remained unbeaten in the American Southwest Conference. TLU is now 3-0 in the ASC and 4-1 overall. TLU is 3-0 in the ASC for the first time.

The Bulldogs have won three straight for the first time since 2004. TLU has scored more than 40 points for three consecutive games for the first time in school history.

TLU is off to its best start to a season since the 1984 team started 5-0-1.

Sul Ross dropped to 1-3 overall and to 0-2 in the ASC.

TLU led 26-20 at the half and out-scored the Lobos 17-6 in the second half.

The Bulldogs scored 17 points in the third quarter. Ryan Jones scored on a 47-yard pass from Mitchell Bunger, and Dominique Hardaway closed the quarter with a 20-yard scoring run. Allen Cain added a 23-yard field goal in the middle of the quarter.

Hardaway scored three touchdowns (two rushing, one receiving), and Bunger tossed three TDs, two to Jones. Bunger was 14-for-27 with an interception and 223 yards passing.

Hardaway went over the 100-yard mark for the second time in his career. Hardaway carried the ball 15 times for 101 yards. His three total touchdowns in a game is one away from the school record.

“The o-line did a good job of blocking,” said Danny Padron, TLU's second-year head coach. “Sul Ross does so much stunting that we felt we could do some good things, if we just took care of the ball.”

TLU rushed 58 times for 277 yards. Charles Cooper added 15 rushes for 70 yards, and Patrick Johnson added 50 yards on 12 rushes.

The Lobos' Dominique Carson rushed 18 times for 139 yards, and Sul Ross quarterback Scotty Walden threw for 244 yards and two scores.

Rodrick Sparks and Dakota Sebesta each collected seven tackles for the Bulldogs. Sparks recorded two

tackles for loss for 12 yards. He had a sack for six yards.

Brian DuBose Jr. recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass.

**LAST WEEK - MCMURRY  
McMurry 41, Sul Ross State 13**

ABILENE, Texas – In perhaps the strangest football experience for a McMurry University Homecoming, the War Hawks took an abbreviated 41-13 victory over Sul Ross State Saturday at Wilford Moore Stadium. The game was postponed five hours and 48 minutes from its original 2 p.m. kickoff, there was a 1 hour and 10-minute rain delay in the second quarter, and McMurry needed only 170 yards of offense to put 41 points on the board in the victory.

Needing to get the game in Saturday due to American Southwest Conference rules, both teams waited through several lightning delays and eventually were cleared for a window that allowed clear enough weather to get a full quarter in. The delay came early in the second quarter; when play resumed both coaches had agreed to a running clock for the remainder of the contest.

The War Hawks used a fumbled snap on a punt, a Sul Ross fumble and two blocked punts on the Lobos' first four possessions to build a 23-0 lead 11 minutes into the first quarter.

After starting drives from the Lobo 9, 24, 25 and 9 yard lines on the first four offensive possessions respectively, McMurry drove 80 yards in eight plays capped by Jake Mullin's touchdown pass to Justin Johnson from seven yards out to extend the lead to 29-0.

Sul Ross got on the board when a 51-yard punt from Norberto Contreras set up a War Hawks drive from their own 6-yard line. After three consecutive incomplete passes, McMurry dropped the punt attempt in the end zone and Trevor Priest recovered for the Lobos for six points with 4:02 remaining in the half.

Jeret Smith returned a kickoff 89 yards to begin the second half for McMurry to the Lobo 5-yard line setting up another Mullin touchdown pass to Johnson from two yards out three plays later.

The Lobos used a 67-yard pass from Scotty Walden to Thomas Sanders to set up Dominique Carson's 1-yard touchdown run with 8:20 left in the third quarter. On the ensuing kickoff, McMurry's Greg Livingston took back a kick 92 yards for a score for

the final points of the contest.

After a three-and-out by the Sul Ross offense, McMurry completed one pass to start the fourth quarter before lightning struck again, and the game was called as complete.

McMurry improved to 4-2 overall and 3-1 in ASC competition while the Lobos fell to 1-4 overall and 0-4 in league play.

Mullin tossed four touchdown passes despite only 112 yards of offense on 12 of 21 passing. Johnson and R.J. Long caught two touchdowns apiece. Chris Simpson recorded a rushing touchdown for the War Hawks.

Defensively, Kyle Kelley led with five tackles and blocked one punt; Chris Williams blocked the other punt for McMurry. Jimmy Terrell had four tackles and two for a loss.

Sul Ross had 90 yards of total offense mostly by Carson who had 43 yards rushing a touchdown.

### **TLU HEAD COACH DANNY PADRON**

Turning around a football program is never an easy task, and certainly the first year for Head Coach Danny Padron and the Texas Lutheran Bulldogs had its ups and downs. But for Bulldogs fans, who suffered through the 0-10 season in 2009, the strides made by Padron and the team during the 2010 campaign far outshined any setbacks during the season.

The Bulldogs won four games overall, went 4-1 at home, dominated area rival Trinity 42-14, and won three conference contests. All of those achievements came just one year into the Padron era at TLU. The Bulldogs are now on the rise in the American Southwest Conference, returning 60 lettermen and 23 starters.

Before he took on the challenge of resurrecting the Bulldog football program, Padron thought long and hard about being the next head football coach at TLU. After receiving three separate inquiries from TLU about his interest in the job, including one marathon lunch meeting at a San Antonio-area restaurant, Padron took the determined encouragement and applied.

Padron, 58, officially accepted the job at TLU on Jan. 8, 2010, and became the 20th head coach in TLU football history.

“(Through the interview process), I discovered a sense of community within the TLU staff, one that really appealed to me,” said Padron. “And I share their common vision and embrace their mission of making a difference in the lives of young people. Their supportive and nurturing ways reflect the family values that are so important to me.”

Padron brought to the Bulldogs a proven track record of molding young men to succeed not only on the football field but also in the game of life. Before arriving at TLU, he completed his eighth season as the head football coach and athletic coordinator at San Antonio’s Sandra Day O’Connor High School, where he produced a 65-30 overall record. He was the 2003 San Antonio Express-News “San Antonio Area Coach of the Year.”

In 2003, Padron led O’Connor to the Class 5A state quarterfinal round. He coached O’Connor to the 2004 and 2005 regional finals and to the 2006 and 2007 area finals.

## **MCMURRY HEAD COACH HAL MUMME**

McMurry University Director of Athletics Ron Holmes hired Hal Mumme in April of 2009 to be the defibrillator to a football program that went 0-10 in 2008 and tallied only a 16-63 since the 2001 campaign.

Mumme helped McMurry to a 4-6 season in his first year in 2009 with all four wins coming in conference play. But 2010 showed true signs of McMurry's potential to be a force as the team posted its first winning season since 2000 and boasted its first all-Americans in a decade with Will Morris and Dez Baker earning honors in 2010 by D3football.com.

Last season, Mumme's innovative Air Raid Offense ranked No. 2 in the nation in passing while the defense improved from fifth in the ASC to first from 2009 to 2010. The team finished fourth in the ASC with a 4-4 record.

McMurry set or tied four ASC records, and 33 school records in the 2010 campaign on the way to a 6-4 season, which matched the record of the last winning McMurry team in 2000.

In his first season, after a 0-4 start in the 2009 season, McMurry shocked East Texas Baptist Oct. 3, 2009 with a 45-21 win at Wilford Moore Stadium snapping a 17-game losing skid. Mumme and the team used that momentum to win four-straight contests and finished fifth in the 9-team American Southwest Conference after a projected last-place finish in the Preseason Coaches and Media Poll.

As a player, his collegiate playing days began just 100 miles southeast of Abilene. However, Mumme's

brief time at Tarleton State in Stephenville was the unfolding of a coaching career that began in 1976 in Moody High School just off Interstate 35.

When Holmes elected Mumme as the school's 20th head football coach in school history April 15, it ended a 21-year absence from Texas.

After stops at West Texas A&M and UT-El Paso as an assistant coach, he was the head football coach at Copperas Cove High School. He left Copperas Cove and Texas in 1988 and was named head coach at Iowa Wesleyan College. Since then, Mumme has slowly been inching his way back to the Lone Star State. He stayed three seasons at IWC before taking control of his first NCAA program at Valdosta State (Division II) in Valdosta, Ga. from 1992-1996.

Then, Mumme broke into the division I ranks in 1997 when he coached the Kentucky Wildcats in the Southeastern Conference from 1997 to 2000 and made back-to-back bowl appearances in 1999 (Outback Bowl) and 2000 (Music City Bowl).

After a brief break in coaching as he battled prostate cancer, he began the trek home with three years in Hammond, La. at Southeastern Louisiana where he started a program from scratch and led the team to a winning season in his second year. Then, in his last stop before McMurry, he spent four years re-writing the offensive record book at New Mexico State in Las Cruces, N.M.
