WELCOME!

Welcome everyone to the 2014 Upper Midwest Athletic Conference Baseball Tournament, which for the first time since the 2005 season will not be played at Wade Stadium in Duluth, Minnesota and will not be hosted by The College of St. Scholastica.

This year's participants include The College of St. Scholastica, Northland College, the University of Northwestern and Bethany Lutheran College. St. Scholastica, Northwestern and Bethany Lutheran have been in the tournament in each of the past six seasons.

The College of St. Scholastica won its 18th consecutive UMAC regular season championship with a record of 19-1. Northland College, who picked to finish sixth in the preseason poll, finished solidly in second place. The LumberJacks were defeated last year in the first-ever UMAC Tournament play-in game. The University of Northwestern, who has advanced to the conference championship game in each of the last two postseason tournaments, enters as the No. 3 seed. Bethany Lutheran College clinched the fourth and final spot in the postseason tournament on Tuesday by sweeping a tripleheader from Martin Luther. The Vikings won tripleheaders in consecutive days to clinch the final spot.

The Saints have won the UMAC Tournament title every year of its existence since 1998. Northland nor Bethany Lutheran has ever won a UMAC Championship in baseball. Bethany Lutheran came close to winning the tournament in 2010 when it was one strike away from capturing the title.

2011 marked the first year the tournament champion received an automatic qualifier into the NCAA Tournament.

TEAM NOTES

- The Saints are coming their 18th consecutive UMAC Regular Season Championship. The Saints dropped one conference game this season, which was the first conference loss in 52 straight regular season contest.
- CSS enters the UMAC Tournament riding a 17-game winning streak, all against conference competition. The program record for the longest winning streak is 24 games set during the 2010 season.
- The Saints have been very aggressive on the base paths this season as they are 125-of-136 in stolen base attempts. That is currently the third-most in a season in program history. The single-season program record for stolen bases is 142 set during the 2001 season.
- Sophomore transfer Tyler Duex has been a pleasant surprise at the plate this season for the Saints. He led the UMAC during the regular season with a .465 batting average and was second in the league with 39 RBIs. His on-base percentage of .567 is among the best in NCAA Division III baseball. Duex has reached base in 26 straight games.
- St. Scholastica out-scored UMAC teams 231-31 during the regular season. The next fewest runs allowed by a UMAC team was 107 by Bethany Lutheran.
- CSS is 14-0 this season when it scores in the first inning and 24-1 when it scores first. The Saints are 20-3 when they commit one error or less and are just 7-7 when they commit two or more errors.

- Dan Kollauf leads the offense for Northland with team highs in hits (50), batting average (.391), slugging percentage (.602), and runs batted in (45).
- Kyle Strom and Colin Moberly have led the pitching staff this season as Strom leads the team in innings pitched with 70.2, and Moberly in earned run average with 2.20.
- The Jacks saw much better productivity on defense as Northland saw their fielding percentage jump up 18 points from a season ago to .944 as a team.
- This is the second season in a row the LumberJacks will have a winning record.

TEAM NOTES

- The Eagles lead the UMAC in doubles and home runs, while entering this weekend's tournament ranked second in total bases, walks, sacrifice hits and stolen bases.
- Tyler Osborn enters the UMAC Tournament on a 14-game hitting streak, the longest of any Northwestern player this season. Osborn, who transferred to UNW prior to the 2013-2014 academic year, has the fourth-best slugging percentage among UMAC players (.570) and has 11 extra base hits in league play.
- Senior pitcher Andy Peterson ranks among the UMAC's top 10 in strikeouts per game (9.66) while leading the league in ERA throughout conference contests (0.81). Peterson has also been successful with a bat in his hands, leading Northwestern with eight multiple-RBI games in 2014.
- Four different Eagles have tallied 10 or more multiple-hit games this season. Osborn, Peterson and Ryan Sutterer have all had four hits in a single game, while Mike Studer recorded a five-hit game on May 3 against Martin Luther.
- UNW head coach Dave Hieb is on the tail end of his 19th year at the helm of the Eagles program. Hieb leads all Northwestern coaches (all sports) with 335 career victories. Hieb was recognized by the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) in December for his 25 years of contributions to the game of college baseball as both an assistant and head coach.

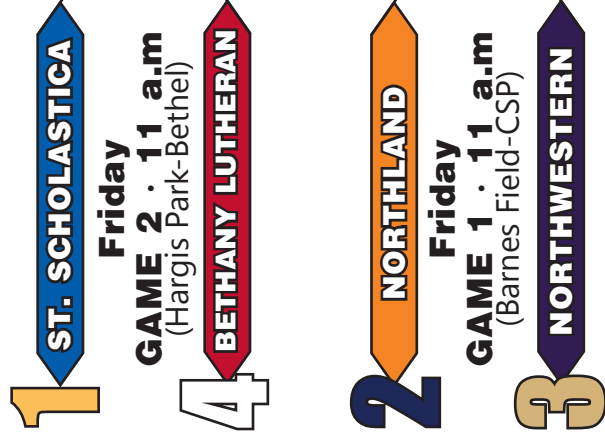
