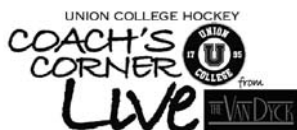

## 25TH ANNIVERSARY

The 2015-16 season marks the 25th anniversary of Division I hockey at Union. The Dutchmen began Division I play in 1991-92 after spending six seasons (1985-91) at the Division III level and 10 years (1975-85) as a Division II program.

Union joined the ECAC on January 28, 1991 (replacing Army) and made its Division I debut on November 1, 1991, losing to Merrimack, 9-6, at Messa Rink.

The Dutchmen will celebrate their silver anniversary with a commemorative logo, designed by Gemini Athletic Wear, Inc. of Edina, Minn. Gemini also produced "throw-back" uniforms (similar to those worn in 1991-92) that will be worn for the home opener and later auctioned to fans.



## AMONG COLLEGE HOCKEY'S ELITE

Union's record speaks for itself in comparison to other notable programs over the past five seasons. Since 2010, Union has posted the third-most wins (125) and winning percentage (.673) among the NCAA's 59 Division I teams. During this same period, the Dutchmen have won six league titles (regular season championships and postseason tournaments combined), the most of any team.

## HOBEBY BAKER CANDIDATES

Schenectady has become home to some of the top players in college hockey, evident by the presence of three Hobey Baker Finalists in four seasons: Daniel Ciampini (2015), Shayne Gostisbehere (2014) and Troy Grosenick (2012). This year's squad features two Hobey Baker candidates in Mike Vecchione and Jeff Taylor. Vecchione, who has compiled 84 points in 77 career games, finished in the top 10 in NCAA scoring last season. Taylor, a draft pick of the Pittsburgh Penguins, ranked fifth in defenseman scoring nationally last season, racking up 27 assists and 31 points in 34 contests.

## BENNETT APPROACHES MILESTONE

Rick Bennett enters his fifth season behind the bench needing just one win to reach the century mark. He currently stands third all-time in Union coaching victories, behind only Nate Leaman (138) and Charlie Morrison (122). Bennett's .667 career winning percentage is second-best in school annals. Bennett owns an impressive 22-4 record in the postseason, including a 15-2 mark in ECAC Hockey Tournament action.

## MESSA MADNESS

Union enjoys one of the best home ice advantages in college hockey, consistently drawing capacity crowds to the 2,054-seat facility. Over the past six seasons, the Dutchmen have generated 45 sellouts. Last season, Union played to 102 percent capacity at Messa after skating in front of 95 percent capacity the year before. The full houses at Messa have not come away disappointed as the Garnet have produced a 56-19-10 record for a .717 winning percentage.

## 2016 NCAA REGIONAL

Union College joins Rensselaer and ECAC Hockey in hosting the 2016 NCAA East Regional, to be held March



25-27 at the Times Union Center in Albany, N.Y. It will mark the first time Union has hosted a regional as the event returns to the Capital District for the first time in six years. The Times Union Center has hosted eight NCAA regionals (2010, 2008, 2006, 2004, 2000, 1998, 1996, 1994) and a pair of NCAA Frozen Fours (2001, 1992). Union owns a 5-6-1 record all-time at the Times Union Center.

## ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

The Garnet placed 18 student-athletes on the 2015 ECAC Hockey All-Academic Team with Theo Di Pauli von Treuheim named to the inaugural Commissioner's List with the team's highest cumulative grade-point average. Di Pauli von Treuheim also received a 2015 Barry Goldwater Scholarship, becoming one of 260 Scholars selected on the basis of academic merit from a field of 1,206 applicants nationwide.

## DUTCHMEN IN PRO RANKS

No fewer than 14 former Dutchmen are expected to be skating in North American professional leagues this winter.

Four Union products saw NHL action last year – Shayne Gostisbehere, Troy Grosenick, Josh Jooris and Keith Kinkaid. Eight other players appeared in the American Hockey League, highlighted by Daniel Carr's 24-goal season with Hamilton, which led all AHL rookies. Five members of the Class of 2015 have signed professional contracts. Colin Stevens inked an entry-level contract with the Florida Panthers, Daniel Ciampini signed with Rockford and Max Novak with Albany in the AHL; Charlie Vasaturo joined the ECHL Kalamazoo Wings while Sam Cotta signed with the Memphis River Kings of the Southern Professional Hockey League.

## RANKED OPPONENTS

Union has performed remarkably well against ranked teams the past four seasons. During that time, Rick Bennet's squad has compiled a 35-16-7 record versus teams in the national polls, equating to a .664 winning percentage.

In 2014-15, the Garnet and White defeated five ranked opponents and beat four teams (St. Cloud, Yale, Harvard, Quinnipiac) that advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

SCHENECTADY, N.Y. – The Union College men's ice hockey program will have nine freshmen joining the team for the 2015-16 season. The Dutchmen's recruiting class was announced by Head Coach Rick Bennett. The Class of 2019 features six forwards, two goaltenders and a defenseman.

Campbell is known for his competitiveness and offensive flair. He scored 25 goals in three seasons with his hometown Oakville Blades of the Ontario Junior Hockey League (OJHL). He is also a durable performer, appearing in 145 games during that period. Campbell finished as his team's top defenseman scorer last season, compiling nine goals and a team-best 30 assists for 39 points in 49 games. Campbell's stellar play earned him a spot on the Team Canada East team at the World Junior A Hockey Challenge and an invite to the 2014 Central Canada Cup All-Star Challenge.

Dufour is a hard-working forward who brings good size to his position. He spent the past two seasons with Islanders Hockey Club of the U.S. Premier Hockey League (USPHL). Last year Dufour accumulated 14 goals and 16 assists for 30 points in 38 games. Dufour previously spent three seasons at the Kents Hill prep in Maine, recording back-to-back 20-goal campaigns. He finished with 96 points in 83 career games at Kents.

Kupsky is a big, athletic goaltender who handles the puck well. He spent the 2014-15 season with the Lone Star Brahmas of the North American Hockey League (NAHL), compiling a 19-4-4 record along with a 2.16 goals-against average and .911 save percentage. He was named to the USHL South Division All-Rookie Team, finishing sixth in the USHL in goals against average and 12th in save percentage. Prior to joining the Brahmas, Kupsky played four seasons at Waukesha (WI) High School. He is joined by Brahmas teammate Sebastian Vidmar in this recruiting class.

Maier is a solid two-way player who will help the Dutchmen in the faceoff circle. This past season with the Nanaimo Clippers of the British Columbia Hockey League (BCHL), Maier turned in a 25-goal campaign and added 29 assists for 54 points in 58 games. He finished second in team scoring and was named the team award for best two-way player. As a two-year starter at the Taft School, Maier scored 22 goals and served as team captain his final season at the Connecticut prep school. Maier is joined by his Clipper teammate Brendan Taylor in this freshman class.

Supinski is a highly-skilled offensive player with good hands. He finished second in the BCHL in scoring, amassing 98 points on 48 goals and 50 assists in 58 games for the Coquitlam Express in 2014-15. Supinski was named to the All-BCHL First Team and to the BCHL All-Rookie Team. He also played two seasons of prep hockey at Millbrook (N.Y.) School, averaging 1.51 points a game.

Taylor is a solid playmaker with good hockey sense. Taylor led his hometown Nanaimo Clippers in scoring the past two seasons, guiding the team to the Fred Page Cup BCHL Finals last year as team captain. In 58 games, he stockpiled 22 goals and 37 assists for 59 points, finishing 20th in league scoring in his fourth and final season with the Clippers.

Swedish native Vidmar brings size and strength to Union's front line. Vidmar spent this past season with the Lone Star Brahmas, collecting 35 goals and 45 assists for 80 points in 58 games. He was named the NAHL's Most Valuable Player after leading the league in goals and points. Vidmar also notched a league-best 11 game-winning goals and paced all forwards with a +37 plus/minus rating. He finished with 105 career points in 100 games with the Brahmas.

Walker is a talented forward with excellent ice vision. In 2014-15, he competed for the Sioux City Musketeers of the United State Hockey League (USHL), registering 10 goals and 24 assists for 34 points in 60 games. ## Rick Bennett

Head Coach  
Fifth Season  
Providence (1990)

Rick Bennett embarks on his fifth season as Union College's men's hockey coach in 2015-16, having taken the program to new heights. His .667 career winning percentage ranks third-best among active coaches in the nation.

Bennett owns a four-year record of 99-45-18 (.667) and is a win shy of becoming the third Union hockey coach to reach 100 victories. Bennett owns a 22-4 postseason record and is 15-2 in the ECAC Hockey Tournament. He has also won 62 percent of his league games in ECAC Hockey (50-28-10). Bennett's record against nationally-ranked teams stands at 35-16-7 (.664).

In just his third season behind the helm, Bennett led Union to its first-ever NCAA Division I Championship, as top-ranked Union defeated second-ranked Minnesota, 7-4, on April 12, 2014 before 18,742 at the Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia.

For his efforts, Bennett was named recipient of the 2014 Spencer Penrose Award as National Coach of the Year by the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA). Bennett completed the hat trick of major awards by also receiving Coach of the Year honors from College Hockey News and U.S. College Hockey Online (USCHO).

Bennett was named the fifth head coach in Union's Division I history on April 20, 2011. He has signed three extensions and is under contract for the next seven seasons through 2021-22.

Bennett's accomplishments in four seasons are nothing short of amazing: a national championship, two Frozen Fours, three NCAA Tournament berths, three Whitelaw Cups and two Cleary Cups.

In 2014-15, Bennett led the Dutchman program to its eighth-straight winning season, producing a 19-win campaign. Union also captured its first-ever road playoff series win (a sweep at Cornell), advancing to the ECAC Hockey Quarterfinals for the eighth consecutive year. The team also spent 10 weeks in the national polls and defeated five nationally-ranked opponents. Union defeated Rensselaer, 8-3, in the Capital District Mayor's Cup, improving Bennett's record against RPI to 11-3.

The 2013-14 season was unprecedented in Union's 63 years of

varsity hockey. In addition to capturing the national title, Union finished with the most wins (32) and top winning percentage (.810) in the country. Union reached the No. 1 position in both national polls for the first time in the school's 23-year Division I history and spent 16 weeks ranked in the top 10. Bennett's squad finished second in NCAA scoring offense (3.81) and fourth in scoring defense (2.14 gpg).

Union closed the season with a 17-game unbeaten streak (16-0-1), which also included a school-record 12-straight wins. The Dutchmen did not lose a game in February, March or April, going a perfect 8-0 in the postseason. Earlier in the season, Union strung together a 10-game unbeaten streak (9-0-1) and a nine-game win streak. The Garnet and White also won their last 12 games at Messa Rink.

In clinching its second ECAC Hockey regular season crown in three seasons, Union set school records for conference wins (18) and points (37), scoring a league-high 83 goals (3.77 gpg) while surrendering a league-low 42 goals (1.91 gpg). Over the course of the season, Union won 12 season series (eight against league opponents), and clinched the Capital Skates Trophy against Rensselaer.

Bennett also coached four All-Americans in Shayne Gostisbehere, Mat Bodie, Daniel Carr and Colin Stevens.

Prior to being named head coach at Union, Bennett spent six seasons as an assistant on Nate Leaman's staff, starting with the 2005-06 campaign. Rick was promoted to associate head coach in 2007-08.

Before arriving in Schenectady, Bennett served five seasons (2000-05) as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Providence.

A native of Springfield, Mass., Bennett was a four-year letterwinner (1986-90) and co-captain at Providence, where he was recognized as a Hobey Baker finalist (1990) and two-time winner of the Lou Lamoriello Trophy as team MVP. He was named an All-American during the 1988-89 season and earned All-Hockey East Second Team honors in 1990. A left-winger, Bennett finished with 134 points (50 goals, 84 assists) in 128 career games. Bennett skated on the famed B-B-G line, along with center Mike Boback and right wing Robbie Gaudreau. Rick, who graduated with a B.A. in general studies, was inducted into the Providence College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012.

Bennett was a third-round draft pick (54th overall) of the Minnesota North Stars in the 1986 NHL Entry Draft. His draft rights were later traded to the New York Rangers.

Bennett appeared in 15 games with the Rangers over three seasons (1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-92). Bennett's 10-year professional career also included stints with the Binghamton Rangers (AHL), Springfield Indians (AHL), Hershey Bears (AHL), Springfield Falcons (AHL), Albany River Rats (AHL), Cincinnati Cyclones (IHL), Jacksonville Lizard Kings (ECHL) and Pee Dee Pride (ECHL). Bennett served as an assistant coach for the Lizard Kings and Pride.

Bennett is a member of the American Hockey Coaches Association and is in his third year on the Hobey Baker Selection Committee. He has also been involved with the United Way and the American Cancer Society's Coaches vs. Cancer campaign.

Rick is married to Karyn, and has five children: Dan Mooney (25), Hayley (21), Brooke (19), Race (17) and Lakyn (12). The Bennetts reside in Clifton Park, N.Y.

Associate Head Coach  
Fifth Season  
Quinnipiac (2006)

Joe Dumais begins his fifth season on the Union College men's hockey coaching staff. He was named associate head coach on July 1, 2015 after spending four years as an assistant coach.

During his time at Union, Dumais has worked with the forwards and helped develop three All-Americans (Daniel Ciampini, Daniel Carr and Jeremy Welsh), six All-ECAC Hockey selections and a pair of ECAC All-Rookie picks. Last season, Dumais oversaw an offense that generated 50-point scorers in Hobey Baker finalist Daniel Ciampini and teammate Mike Vecchione. Both players finished in the top 10 in NCAA scoring.

Dumais has also guided the highest scoring offense in ECAC Hockey two of the past three seasons. In 2014-15, the Dutchmen averaged 3.13 goals per game, second-best in the league. During the 2013-14 campaign, Dumais instructed the nation's second-highest scoring offense (3.81 goals per game), which also produced a school-record 160 goals in 42 games. In the past two years alone, Union has scored six-or-more goals in a game on eight occasions.

In 2013-14, Dumais helped the Dutchmen reach the pinnacle of college hockey, capturing the NCAA national championship. On the road to the championship, Dumais served four games as acting head coach, leading the team to a 3-1 record, including wins against 13th-ranked Yale and 15th-ranked Clarkson.

Overseeing special teams, Dumais' power play units have ranked in the top 20 nationally the last four seasons. Union also set a school record last year with eight short-handed goals.

Working alongside Jason Tapp, Dumais has also earned a reputation as a top-notch recruiter. Union has produced the nation's eighth- and 12th-highest scoring freshmen classes the past two seasons. The Class of 2017 compiled 98 points while the Class of 2018 produced 80 points. In 2012-13, Union brought in its most geographically diverse freshman class with nine players from seven different states and provinces.

Dumais came to Union in the summer of 2011 after spending three seasons (2008-11) as the assistant coach at the University of Connecticut.

Dumais also coached at the Tier II Junior A level, working with the Mahoning Valley Phantoms of the North American Hockey League (NAHL). In 2007-08, he coached the Phantom Fireworks Midget AAA to Ohio and Mid-American championships and a berth in the national tournament.

Joe and his wife, Theresa, have a son, Colin, and a daughter, Katelyn. The Dumais family resides in Clifton Park, N.Y.



## Jason Tapp

Assistant Coach

Jason Tapp enters his seventh season as assistant coach for the Union College men's hockey team. Tapp joined the staff as a volunteer coach in 2009-10.

The team's defensive/goaltending coach, Tapp has developed five All-Americans and two Hobey Baker finalists in six seasons at Union: defensemen Mat Bodie and Shayne Gostisbehere (Hobey Baker finalist), along with goaltenders Troy Grosenick (Hobey Baker finalist), Keith Kinkaid, and Colin Stevens.

In terms of ECAC Hockey award winners, Tapp has produced three Goaltenders of the Year (Stevens, Grosenick, Kinkaid), a Best Defensive Defenseman (Gostisbehere), 10 all-league selections and three all-rookie team members.

Tapp has also sent several players to the National Hockey League with Grosenick landing in San Jose and Kinkaid in New Jersey. Mat Bodie (NYR) and Colin Stevens (FLA) signed NHL contracts while Gostisbehere is a top prospect for Philadelphia and Jeff Taylor has been drafted by Pittsburgh.

Under Tapp's direction, Union has ranked first (2011-12), fourth (2013-14) and seventh (2012-13) nationally in scoring defense. The 2011-12 squad allowed only 1.83 goals per game. During his time in the Electric City, Tapp has seen six goaltenders record a total 25 shutouts. Last year's team also scored a school-record eight short-handed goals.

In 2014-15, Tapp worked with All-ECAC Third Team defenseman Jeff Taylor, and saw Colin Stevens finish as the school's career leader in wins (53) and co-leader in shutouts (11).

In 2013-14, Tapp was a member of the NCAA Championship team. That season Union goaltenders won seven weekly conference awards and were twice named goaltenders of the month. On two occasions, Union had multiple goaltenders honored in the same week.

Tapp is also heavily involved in Union's recruiting efforts. Working in conjunction with Joe Dumais, Union produced the nation's eighth- and 12th-highest scoring freshmen classes the past two seasons. The Class of 2017 compiled 98 points while the Class of 2018 produced 80 points.

Little's responsibilities include sport programs and sports services oversight, and coordinator of special events. Little serves as the academic liaison and admissions liaison for Athletics. She is also a Title IX Deputy Coordinator for the Campus.

Little has served Union College student-athletes in a variety of roles since she came to the college in 1990. She has been head coach of the women's volleyball, basketball, and tennis teams during her career on the campus.

Little's 1991 volleyball squad was rewarded for its 20-win season with an invitation to the NYSWCAA post-season tournament while her 1991-92 basketball team produced the most victories for Union since the 1978-79 campaign. Little's two years as the tennis coach produced an overall record of 16-5 and what was then a college-best sixth-place finish in the New York state post-season tournament. She took over as the college's head equipment manager in 1995-96.

In April 2001, Little was named director of varsity sports services and operations. She played a major role in the strategic planning for the athletics department, helping develop the student-athlete handbook, and also was named the team leader for the prevention of hazing task force. In Fall 2002, Little was named assistant director of athletics. Her responsibilities included serving as the department's NCAA compliance officer and event management coordinator for home events and post-season tournaments. In Spring 2005, Little was elevated to associate director of athletics, overseeing marketing and promotions.

Eric McDowell joined the Union staff in March 2005, and became the assistant athletic director for sports information in 2008. A veteran of more than 30 years in collegiate and professional sports information and media relations, he began his career as the SID at the University of New Haven in 1980. 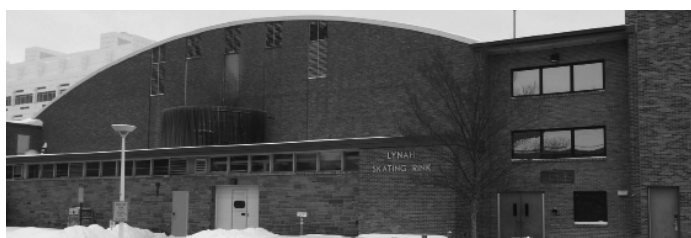

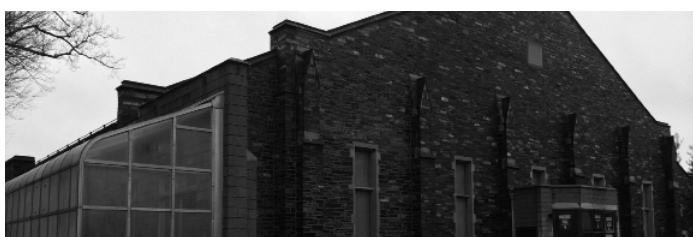

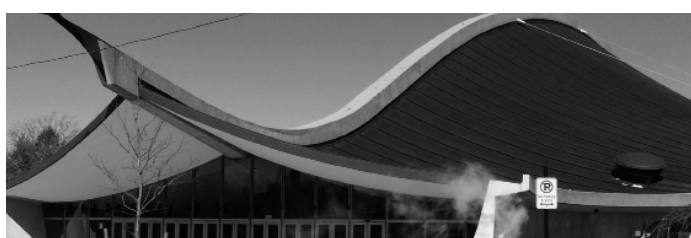

Incoming freshman goaltender Justin Mrazek is drafted in the eighth round by the Washington Capitals.

**October 18, 2003**

A newly renovated Frank L. Messa Rink is dedicated prior to Union's home-opener against Merrimack.

**July 29, 2003**

Union hires former Harvard assistant Nate Leaman as its 15th head coach. Leaman replaces Kevin Sneddon, who accepted the head coaching position at Vermont.

**October 26, 2002**

Goaltender Kris Mayotte makes 58 saves at Bemidji State to set a new program single-game record.

**June 24, 2000**

Union goaltender Brandon Snee is drafted in the fifth round by the New York Rangers.

**December 4, 1998**

The Dutchmen set team records for penalties (27) and penalty minutes (116) in a league loss at Cornell.

**August 13, 1998**

Kevin Sneddon is announced as the 14th head coach of the men's hockey program. Sneddon replaces Stan Moore, who went to Colgate.

**February 27-28, 1998**

Trevor Koenig blanks both Colgate (6-0) and Cornell (1-0) on the road to post back-to-back shutouts for the second time in his career. Koenig ends his career with nine shutouts and 11 one-goal games.

**April 3, 1997**

Trevor Koenig, who led the nation in both save percentage (.913) and goals against average (2.03), becomes the first Dutchman to be named a Division I All-American.

**March 19, 1997**

Trevor Koenig becomes the first Dutchman to receive a top ECAC honor as he captures the Ken Dryden Award as the league's top goaltender. The Dutchmen post their first win as a Division I team with a 10-3 victory over Canadian opponent Concordia.

**November 15, 1991**

Achilles Rink has its first sellout of the new era (2,504) as Harvard records a 7-5 victory.

**November 9, 1991**

Union visits Vermont for its first ECAC Division I league game. The Catamounts capture a 3-1 decision in front of a sellout crowd of 4,035. Craig Ferrero scores Union's first ECAC goal at 4:36 of the third period (assisted by Dalton Menhall and Bill Railton).

**November 1, 1991**

The Dutchmen play their first Division I game, dropping a 9-6 decision to Merrimack at Achilles Rink. Craig Ferrero scores Union's first Division I goal, a power play tally at 1:02 of the first period (assisted by Scott Whitney and Chris Albert).

**January 28, 1991**

After more than a month of detailed discussions with faculty, students, and alumni, President Roger Hull accepts the ECAC invitation.

**December 17, 1990**

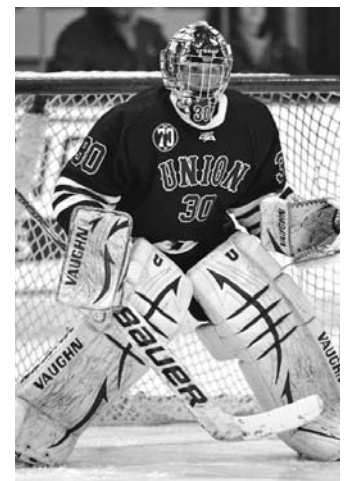

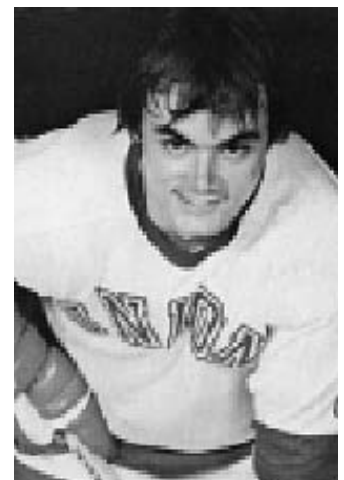

Union College traces its beginnings to 1779. Several hundred residents of northern New York, certain that Burgoyne's defeat at Saratoga two years before would mean a new nation, began the first popular demand for higher education in America. These residents pursued that dream for 16 years until, in 1795, Union became the first college chartered by the Regents of the State of New York. The first trustees consciously

attempted to bring their new college into the mainstream of their world. The very name, Union, carried echoes of the new national union. More immediately and directly, it recognized the fact that the College was

an outgrowth of a new sense of community among the several religious and national groups in the local population. Union's founders were determined to avoid the narrow sectarianism characteristic of earlier American colleges; today, Union is one of the oldest nondenominational colleges in the country.

Union did not share the heavily classical bias of most colleges of the day. Its motto ("Sous les lois de Minerve nous devenons tous freres," or "We all become brothers under the laws of Minerva") is significantly of French rather than Latin origin. Union was among the first to introduce French on an equal level with Greek and Latin. In the 1820s, when the classical curriculum was the most widely accepted field of study, Union introduced a bachelor's degree with greater emphasis on history, science, modern languages, and mathematics. This liberality of educational vision characterized Union during the early years of the term of Eliphalet Nott, president from 1804 to 1866. Science and technology became important concerns; chemistry was taught before 1809, a degree in scientific studies was added, and in 1845 Union became the first liberal arts college to offer engineering. The College was one of the first to offer work in American history and constitutional government and did pioneer work in the elective system of study.

By about 1830, Union was graduating as many students as any other college in America. Along with Harvard, Yale, and Princeton, it was spoken of as one of the big four. Students came from the South and West as well as the East. Among them were the father of Franklin D. Roosevelt, the grandfather of Winston Churchill, a president of the United States (Chester A. Arthur, Class of 1848), seven cabinet secretaries, 15 United States senators, 91 members of the House of Representatives, 13 governors, 50 important diplomats, more than 200 judges, 40 missionaries, 16 generals, and 90 college presidents, including the first presidents of the Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, Vassar, Smith and Elmira.

Nott's ingenious schemes for financing higher education, including a statewide lottery, also were instrumental in building Union's reputation. Innovations under the leadership of Andrew Van Vranken Raymond, president from 1894 to 1907 include the establishment of a Department of Electrical Engineering and Applied Physics, headed by the "electrical wizard" of the General Electric Company, Charles P. Steinmetz. The new department gave impetus to the development of strong programs in science and technology and attracted attention and applications to the College.

The 20th century brought other changes to Union. In 1970, the College adopted co-education and welcomed the first class of two dozen women transfer students. Today, roughly half of Union's students are

women. More recently, the College has added programs in Asian Studies, Bioengineering, Film Studies, Nanotechnology, and Neuroscience.

In 2004, the Minervas were inaugurated to broaden the educational experience for students, faculty and staff. Every incoming student is assigned to one of seven Minerva Houses, joining upperclass students, faculty and staff in a house affiliation. Each Minerva, with its own budget and governing council, is a center for intellectual and social activity. Union's fraternities and sororities continue a proud tradition of service. Theme Houses are a popular option for students who seek residential affiliation with others who are committed to themes such as community service, environmental awareness, art, music and language.

The College has done important experimental work in interdepartmental studies, which is reflected in a number of programs that cut across the lines of academic disciplines. Organized interdepartmental majors are offered in numerous areas, and the College has also developed programs that enable students to work toward both a bachelor's degree and an advanced degree. The Common Curriculum (General Education) has received national recognition, and the College has an innovative program of Writing Across the Curriculum. Efforts to renew and enhance the College's academic programs and curricula continue to be supported by major foundations.



## MESSA RINK AT ACHILLES CENTER

Originally constructed in 1975 with a gift from Henry Laurence Achilles, Union College's ice hockey rink underwent major renovations during the summer of 2003 after a gift from alumnus Frank L. Messa '73.

Renamed Frank L. Messa Rink at Achilles Center, Union's new-look facility was officially unveiled for competition on October 18, 2003 as the men's hockey team hosted Merrimack.

With a seating capacity of 2,054, and standing room only areas that will allow sellout crowds to reach nearly 2,300, Messa Rink is one of the most intimidating venues for visiting teams in ECAC Hockey. The Dutchmen have won 68 percent of their home games over the past three seasons and compiled a 15-game winning streak on home ice from November 2013-October 2014.

The team's success has resulted in packed-houses at Messa. Last year, Union recorded eight sellouts, playing to 102 percent capacity in the Electric City. Since 2009-10, the Garnet and White have generated 45 sellouts.

The home of Dutchman Hockey has provided many highlights through the years:

- Seven straight seasons (2009-14) of hosting ECAC Hockey playoff action, including five consecutive quarterfinal series appearances.
- Cleary Cup-clinching victories in 2014 and 2011. Union won its first-ever regular season title on February 26, 2011 with a 5-0 win against Princeton. On February 21, 2014, Union captured the Cleary Cup with a 5-0 win over Clarkson.
- On March 12, 2010, Union and Quinnipiac played the second-longest game in NCAA history (150:22), a five overtime affair that lasted 5 hours 56 minutes and ended at 1:03 a.m.
- Messa hosted the ECAC Women's Hockey Championships in 2004 and 2005.

In 2014, a new LED lighting system was installed at Messa. The lighting system saves considerable energy, keeping in line with the College's commitment to sustainability. The brighter atmosphere eliminates dark areas in the stands and benefits the players as well, as the previous metal halide lights often raised temperatures at ice level.

In 2003 renovations enable Union to provide a first class venue for Division I hockey, as well as numerous programming

opportunities for the College and community at large. Phase I of the \$1.5 million renovation project included the installation of a high-tech chilling and dehumidification system. New spring-loaded boards and seamless glass provide a safer playing environment on the ice, while better sight-lines were made for the fans, and a redesigned seating area improved the rink's traffic pattern.

Phase II of the project, completed during the 2003-04 academic year, included the construction of five locker rooms and the addition of restrooms and shower areas for use by the Union athletic teams and outside community groups. A multipurpose function room, a 2,000 square foot sports medicine area, a reconfigured lobby and improved ADA access and seating were all part of the project's second phase.

The lower level of Frank L. Messa Rink at Achilles Center contains locker room space for more than 175 athletes. The locker rooms, capable of handling up to five teams at one time, are used by Union's varsity teams and visiting teams for intercollegiate and interscholastic contests and tournaments. During the fall, Union's football team uses a 100-locker facility that can be separated for team meetings or for use by two smaller teams. During the spring, the men's and women's lacrosse teams have locker rooms in the lower level of Achilles Center.

The men and women's hockey teams have dedicated locker rooms that are located on the main level of the rink. In addition to stalls for each player, both locker rooms contain a private coach's locker room. Also located on the main level of Achilles Center is the Travis J. Clark '00 Strength Training Facility, which is utilized by the men's and women's varsity squads.

The Garnet Blades Men's Hockey Locker Room and Hockey Training Center were dedicated on November 13, 2004. Hockey alumni, along with the help of the Athletic Department and College Relations, launched a campaign to raise \$125,000 for a new men's hockey locker room and weight training area.

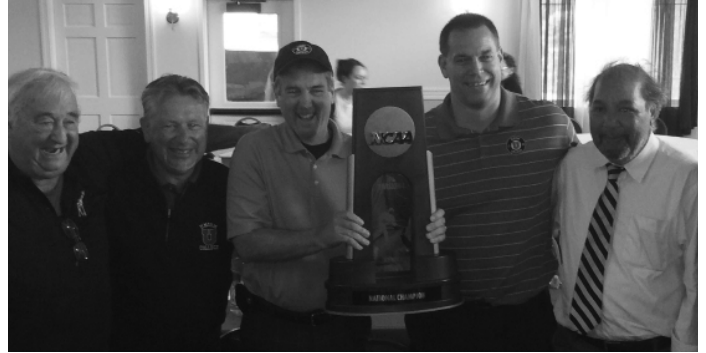
