• **AN OLD FOE ON A FAMILIAR DAY:** Long-time opponent Union College heads for the opposing sideline this Saturday. The Yellowjackets and Dutchmen have played 107 times heading into this game and it has a special twist this time. It's Meliora Weekend on the River Campus. This is Rochester's annual celebration of Homecoming. 'Meliora' is the school's motto, signifying 'ever better'.

• **ANOTHER LEAGUE UNBEATEN:** For the second week in a row, Rochester is playing an opponent that is unbeaten in the Liberty League. Last Saturday, it was Ithaca College (Bombers were 2-0 coming into Fauver). This week, Union stands at 1-0 in the league after defeating St. Lawrence University last Saturday.

• **SEEMS LIKE EVERYBODY'S HERE:** Six of Rochester's seven traditional fall sports are at home this weekend. Men's and women's soccer host Brandeis on Friday, NYU on Sunday. Men's and women's cross country have 15 senior colleges and two community colleges attending their Yellowjacket Cross Country Invitational at nearby Genesee Valley Park on Saturday. Field hockey hosts Union on Sunday and football is home Saturday against the Dutchmen. The only fall sport not at home is volleyball. Rochester is in Chicago for the University Athletic Association Round Robin #2 - four matches in two days.

• **HOW 'YA DOIN' THIS YEAR?** Rochester heads onto Fauver's surface with a 2-3 record. The Yellowjackets have traded victories and losses this season. UR lost at Carnegie Mellon, 42-14, on September 9, defeated Alfred State, 14-7, on September 16, lost at Alfred, 45-7, on September 23, defeated Becker College, 28-10, on September 30, and lost at home to Ithaca, 46-6, last Saturday.

• **THIRD TIME IN FOUR WEEKS:** For the third time in four weeks, Rochester is playing in a Homecoming Game. The Yellowjackets were the guest of honor at Homecoming three weeks ago at Alfred (Saxons won, 45-7) and two weeks ago at Becker (28-0 Yellowjackets).

• **THERE'S ONLY A COUPLE OF YOU OUT THERE:** Union is one of only two schools that has played more than 100 football games against Rochester. This will be game number 108 in the rivalry. Rochester has 48 wins, Union has 54, and they have been tied five times. UR's most oft-played football opponent is Hobart College. The Yellowjackets and Statesmen have played 109 games through 2016 (UR 48 wins, Hobart 54 wins, 7 ties).

• **WON'T SEE 'EM FOR A MONTH:** After today, Rochester plays two straight on the road, split by a break weekend. UR plays at St. Lawrence next Saturday, has October 28 off, then goes to RPI on November 4. The Yellowjackets return to Fauver Stadium on November 11 to face Hobart on Senior Day.

## HEAD COACH SCOTT GREENE:

- Now in his 12th season on the Yellowjacket sidelines. Only two men have coached longer than him: Elmer Burnham for 17 years (1944-60) and Pat Stark for 15 years (1969-83). On Tuesday, he announced that the 2017 season will be his last on the sidelines.

- Career record entering Union game: 50-60, third in career victories. Saturday's game will be his 111th as Rochester's head football coach. It will also be his 75th Liberty League game. Only Burnham and Stark have coached more overall games. Each man coached 136 games.

- Liberty League Coaching Record: 34-40.

- Head coaching debut at Rochester: 2006 when his team finished 7-4. In his second year Greene's team finished 6-5.

- When the Yellowjackets defeated Johns Hopkins, 20-10, on the road to open the 2006 campaign, Greene became only the second man in more than 70 years to win his debut as Rochester's head football coach. Rich Parrinello defeated Chicago, 40-8, at Fauver Stadium in 1989. Before that, the last man to win his debut was Dick Larkins, a 7-0 win at Oberlin College on Oct. 5, 1935.

- Greene is the first Rochester football coach to take the Yellowjackets to back-to-back post-season appearances. Rochester played in the ECAC playoffs in 2006 and 2007. His teams put together win streaks of five games (in 2006) and six games (in 2007).

## LAST YEAR:

- Rochester was 1-8 in 2016. Before that, Rochester posted three straight winning seasons (5-4 in 2013, 2014, and 2015).

## HE GOT THE 50th:

Scott Greene earned his 50th head coaching victory with the 28-10 win over Becker on September 30. He earned #49 four weeks ago with the 14-7 win over Alfred State College. Of the 30 men who have served as Rochester's head coach (Greene is the 30th), just two others (in addition to Greene) have 50 or more wins - Elmer Burnham won 82 (1944-60, 17 years) and Pat Stark won 69 (1969-83, 15 years).

## THE SERIES:

This is the 108th edition of the series dating back to the 1889 season - Rochester's first on the gridiron. (That game, played in Elmira, NY, ended 0-0). Union took the lead in the series at 46-45-5 by winning 41-28 at Fauver Stadium in 2005. The Dutchmen won in Schenectady, 27-24, in 2006, and at Fauver Stadium, 13-7 in 2007. Rochester won at Union, 29-25, in 2008 to snap a 10-game losing streak at Frank Bailey Field. Union won at Fauver, 28-21, in 2009, took a 16-14 win in Schenectady in 2010, and won a shootout, 41-34, at Fauver five years ago. The Dutchmen won, 20-7, on Homecoming in 2012 in Schenectady in a game delayed over an hour by a thunderstorm midway through. Rochester won, 21-7, in 2013 at Fauver Stadium, Union won, 16-14, in 2014, while Rochester rallied for a 33-30 win over Union in 2015 at Fauver. The Dutchmen won, 31-15, last year. Union leads the series, 54-48-5.

## TRIVIA IN THE SERIES VS. UNION:

\* On September 25, 2004, Rochester returner Nate Gibbons returned two kickoffs for touchdowns - which tied an NCAA Division III record. Union won the game, 50-36.

\* Strange 1: Weird things happen in this rivalry in the first year a coach is there. In 1992, John Audino's first year at Union, the Dutchmen came to Fauver and defeated Rochester, 14-10, in the last game of the regular season. It knocked Rochester out of NCAA playoff contention (Yellowjackets finished 8-1).

\* Strange 2: In 1998, Union rolled into Fauver on a five-game winning streak that catapulted the Dutchmen into the thick of the East Region rankings and under heavy consideration for an NCAA bid. Rochester won, 26-21, and knocked the Dutchmen out of the race. It was Mark Kreydt's first season as Rochester's head coach - and it was Rochester's last game of the year. It was also Kreydt's first career win.

## HERE'S EVEN MORE TRIVIA:

• Since Rochester and Union began play in the Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association (which eventually became the Liberty League), Union sports a 18-4 record in the series (1995-2015).

• Union's total of seven points in 2013 is the lowest figure for the Dutchmen against Rochester since 1988 when Rochester won, 38-3, at Fauver Stadium - 29 years ago.

• The losing team in the series has scored seven points in two of the last five games:

2012 - Union 20, Rochester 7 (Bailey Field)  
2013 - Rochester 21, Union 7 (Fauver Stadium)

• Eight of the last 11 games have been decided by a touchdown or less. The exceptions are the 2012, 2013, and 2016 games.

## WHAT'CHA DOING NEXT, MR. PRESIDENT?

In Rochester's last nine victories over Union, the sitting President of the United States did not get elected in the next presidential election:

### 1975 - Rochester 30, Union 14 (at Union)

Jimmy Carter defeated Gerald Ford in 1976 election.

### 1980 - Rochester 38, Union 20 (at Fauver)\*\*

Ronald Reagan defeated Jimmy Carter in 1980 election.

(\*\* - which happened 11 days after the election)

### 1987 - Rochester 24, Union 20 (at Union)

### 1988 - Rochester 38, Union 3 (at Fauver)

Ronald Reagan's term was expiring. George H. Bush elected.

### 1990 - Rochester 27, Union 20 (at Fauver)

Bill Clinton defeated George H. Bush in 1992 election.

### 1998 - Rochester 26, Union 21 (at Fauver)

Bill Clinton's term was expiring. George W. Bush elected in 2000

### 2008 - Rochester 29, Union 25 (in Schenectady)

George W. Bush's term was expiring. Barack Obama elected in 2008.

### 2013 - Rochester 21, Union 7 (at Fauver)

### 2015 - Rochester 33, Union 30 (at Fauver)

Barack Obama's second term expired. Donald J. Trump elected in 2016.

## COACHES AND HOME GAMES:

Scott Greene will try to even his home coaching record this afternoon. He has a 25-26 record at Fauver Stadium. There has been scattered success among the last four head football coaches. Here's the breakdown:

Rochester's previous victory in a Homecoming game came on October 10, 2015 when UR defeated Merchant Marine, 24-17, in UR's Meliora Weekend Game (Rochester's identification of Homecoming).

## BY THE WAY, THIS IS MELIORA WEEKEND:

This is Meliora Weekend on the River Campus, the University's annual Homecoming celebration (Meliora is the University's motto - signifying 'ever better').

Rochester is 11-7 in its 18 Homecoming games in the last 19 years. Since 2000, when the celebration became known as Meliora Weekend, the Yellowjackets are 10-6. There was no game played in 2003. The Yellowjackets were on the road (beating Hobart, 17-13). The soccer teams played at home (and swept NYU).

## YOU CAN CALL THIS PECULIAR...

In the 1942 movie *Casablanca*, Rik Blaine (Humphrey Bogart) is complaining about the arrival of his former lover, Ilsa Lund (Ingrid Bergman). "Of all the gin joints, in all the towns, in all the world, she walks into mine..."

To put it in a sports perspective and paraphrase: "Of all the

homecoming celebrations, in all the years, Union has not walked into Fauver...". Since at least the 1988 season, the Dutchmen have never been Rochester's Homecoming (now Meliora Weekend) opponent in football.

### **ON THE OTHER CLEATED FOOT....:**

Rochester has been Union's Homecoming guest the last three times they've gone to Schenectady - 2012, 2014, 2016. Union won all three of those games.

### **TALK ABOUT A PINCH-HITTER:**

The 2013 Meliora Weekend opponent was supposed to be the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy. The federal government shutdown (due to budget arguments in Congress) temporarily shuttered a number of locations, including the Academy. Alfred State College was available to play on October 12 and came to Rochester. The Yellowjackets won, 38-13. UR opened the season at Alfred State in 2014, hosted the Pioneers in 2015, and played at Alfred State on September 17 this year.

### **RANDOM HOMECOMING FACTS AND STORIES:**

1990/91 - Washington & Jefferson defeats Rochester, 33-6, in a hard, driving rainstorm in 1990. A year later, the Yellowjackets (who lost their own Homecoming a week earlier) go to Washington, PA and spoil W&J's Homecoming with a 20-14 victory. It hands W&J its first regular-season home loss since 1982. The Presidents were ranked No. 2 in the South Region heading into the game.

1992 - Rochester inducts 24 people into its first Hall of Fame class. One night later, the Yellowjackets defeat Washington University, 42-14.

1993 - Senior running back Jeremy Hurd runs four times for TDs against St. Lawrence (43-0 win) and becomes the all-time scoring leader, surpassing his head coach, Rich Parrinello.

1996 - Kickoff against Washington University is delayed six hours because the Bear uniforms were inadvertently bussed to Atlantic City, NJ after Washington flew into town. A chartered plane flew the uniforms back to Rochester (landing at 3 pm). Bears take out their frustration on the Yellowjackets, winning, 41-0.

1997 - Rochester snaps a 17-game losing streak with a 28-18 victory over Chicago.

2000 - The University's Sesquicentennial Celebration draws more than 6,000 alumni back to campus. It is declared Meliora Weekend. Ceremonies include dedication of the Robert Goergen Athletic Center. A crowd of 4,631 comes to the football game and is rewarded with a 34-28 triple overtime victory over Canisius College. The crowd is the largest to see a Rochester home game in 13 years - since 5,607 saw a Homecoming game victory over St. Lawrence in 1987.

2002 - The 1952 unbeaten football team (the first in Rochester's history) is honored with a brunch and a brief pre-game ceremony to celebrate the 50th anniversary of its success. Hobart plays the role of rude guest, rolling to a 59-21 victory.

2003 - Payback, though. Rochester plays on the road on Meliora Weekend and the Yellowjackets take advantage of five INTs to beat Hobart, 17-13. The men's and women's soccer teams take center stage in Fauver Stadium and sweep NYU.

2005 - On a rainy day, WPI escapes with a 19-17 victory when

Mike Butler catches a long desperation pass from Rob Pantalone and runs in for a 61-yard TD with 33 seconds left.

2008 - The game is marked by three fumbles and a punt in the first six-plus minutes (one on the opening kickoff) before the Yellowjackets return a fumble 85 yards for a TD to spark a 30-14 win over Merchant Marine.

2010 - Rochester turns the ball over five times and Merchant Marine takes complete advantage for a 48-19 victory over the Yellowjackets.

2013 - Alfred State is a late fill-in (announced four days before the game would be played). Rochester wins, 38-13.

2014 - In final minute with Rochester ahead, 27-20, RPI has the ball second-and-goal on the Rochester 3. Colin Woods sacked the quarterback at the eight and the ball popped free. Matt Pisano picked it up at the 13 and raced 87 yards for the clinching touchdown with 0:06 left in a 34-20 victory.

2015 - Myles Allen ran for two second half touchdowns to spark Rochester to a 24-17 victory over Merchant Marine. At the start of the second half (down, 10-7), the UR defense stopped Merchant Marine inside the UR 1, then drove 80 yards to set up a tying field goal.

2016 - WR Kyle Allegrini ran 53 yards on a jet sweep for a touchdown just one minute into the game vs. nationally-ranked St. Lawrence. The Saints scored first quarter touchdowns on a pass play, a fumble return, and a punt return, built a 24-7 lead after one, and finished with a 48-13 victory over UR.

### **SPEAKING OF PLAYING IN THE STADIUM...**

Rochester's 38-13 victory over Alfred State here in 2013 was Rochester's 203rd win at Edwin Fauver Stadium since the facility was dedicated on October 18, 1930. Edwin Fauver planned the construction of the athletic facilities at the River Campus. He was instrumental in the formation of the New York State Conference of Small Colleges and the Western New York Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. He was the Director of Physical Education at Rochester. His brother, Edgar, held an identical role at Wesleyan (CT) University. Wesleyan won the game, 13-0.

Counting the 14-10 victory over Alfred State this season, Rochester has 212 wins since dedication day in the 1930 season.

### **COUNTING 'EM UP AT FAUVER:**

Today's game against Union is the 410th football game Rochester will play in Fauver Stadium. The first two games of the 1980 season (two losses) were played at Towers Field, adjacent to Fauver Stadium.

The first artificial surface in Fauver was installed that year. The initial game on the new surface ended in a 17-17 tie against Alfred University on November 8, 1980. If the rug had been installed sooner, the 2015 season opener against Alfred State would have been number 400.

### **THE ALL-TIME MARK HERE IS...**

Rochester's record for 409 games in Fauver Stadium (since the dedication in 1930) is 212 wins, 186 losses, 11 ties. That's a winning percentage of 53.2%.

### **FOR THE SIDEWALK SUPERINTENDENTS:**

The University completed construction of a new dormitory for

first-year students in time for the arrival of the Class of 2021. The building is known as Genesee Hall. It was built into what was a hill to the right of the Fauver stands.

It provides housing for 150 students. The bottom two floors are reserved for the Athletics Department with new locker rooms, a new athletic training room, and a new equipment room. The bottom floors have been named the Boehning Varsity House in recognition of contributions from Chris Boehning '87, '88M, a men's soccer team alumnus. The Varsity House was officially dedicated less than 48 hours ago - on Thursday evening. With the completion of Genesee Hall and the Boehning Varsity House, the locker rooms in Fauver Stadium are being used by visiting teams.

A new press box was constructed for Fauver Stadium and opened last season. The former structure was built in the early 1930s and renovated during the early 80s.

### **LAST WEEK VS. ITHACA:**

#### **Ithaca 46, Rochester 6 (10/7/17)**

**FAUVER STADIUM** - The first game of the Liberty League football season did not go as well as the Yellowjackets might have hoped. Ithaca College won its third straight game in league play by controlling both sides of the ball.

The Bombers (3-2 overall, 3-0 Liberty) ran for five touchdowns, passed for one, and recovered a blocked punt in the end zone for a seventh score in a 46-6 win on Saturday afternoon. Rochester is 2-3 overall, 0-1 in the Liberty League.

Isaiah D'Haiti rushed eight times for 102 yards and two touchdowns. He scored on a three-yard run late in the third quarter and then broke free for an 80-yard touchdown midway through the fourth.

Tristan Brown, Nick Carvone, and Anthony Capozzi rushed for touchdowns. Quarterback Wahid Nabi completed 17 of 21 passes for 206 yards and one score - an 18-yarder to Will Gladney to open the scoring in the first quarter. Gladney and JR Zazzara caught five passes apiece.

Ithaca totaled 455 yards in offense - 221 on the ground and 234 through the air. Rochester had 228 yards in offense. The Yellowjackets rushed for 145 yards and passed for 83 more. Josh Brown led Rochester with 67 yards on 14 carries. He scored on a 15-yard run five minutes into the fourth quarter. Brown completed 11 of 19 passes for 80 yards with one interception.

Rochester drove 68 yards in 10 plays to score its TD in the fourth quarter. Brown completed two key passes to David Angie to keep the drive going. He found Angie for 17 yards on 2nd-and-4 from the Ithaca 44. Three plays later, he hit Angie with a 13-yard pass, moving the ball down to the 15. Brown scored around left end on a keeper from the 15. The PAT snap was low and Brown tried to pass it but the ball was picked off in the end zone by Mekai Gandy.

For Rochester, Matt Woodarek was the tackle leader with 11 (seven solo). He had 1.5 tackles for loss, totaling four yards. Ricky Simcic had 10 tackles. Christian Marini had 1.5 tackles for loss. The Yellowjackets broke up two passes and blocked two kicks.

This was the first time Rochester and Ithaca ever played in football. Ithaca played 759 games before this. The program began in 1930 (with a three-year gap because of World War II). Rochester started football in 1889 and played 1,106 games heading into Saturday. That's 1,865 years covering 214 years of football.

### **A NEW LOOK FOR THE LIBERTY LEAGUE:**

The Liberty League added Ithaca College as a full-time member. That gives Rochester five Liberty League games this year (Ithaca, Union, St. Lawrence, RPI, Hobart).

On Thursday morning (two days ago), the league office announced that Buffalo State College would be joining the league in 2019 as a football-affiliated member. (Release included in this packet.)

Three Liberty League members - all were associate members for football - withdrew to join the New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) which is initiating football as a league sport this year: Merchant Marine, WPI, and Springfield. A fourth Rochester opponent from 2016 also joined the NEWMAC: Catholic University of America, which was associated with the Old Dominion Athletic Conference in football.

### **ALL-TIME:**

Rochester has an all-time record of 534 wins, 533 losses, and 40 ties heading into this afternoon (winning pct. of .500). This is the 129th season of football at Rochester.

### **STAT LEADERS THROUGH FIVE GAMES:**

#### **RUNNING BACKS:**

Emanuel Calmar has gotten the lion's share of the carries - 114 in five games. He's run for a net of 528 yards and scored three touchdowns. Calmar's net rushing after three games this season - 254 - was more than he had all of last season. In 2016, he finished second in rushing with 237 yards on 59 carries (4.0 average, 26.3 ypg.) and five TDs.

Quarterback Josh Brown has 26 carries for 84 yards net and one TD. Jason Cunningham has 13 carries for 55 yards.

#### **PASSING:**

Before suffering an injury in practice last week, Matt Gallagher completed 70 of 1207 passes (58.3%) for 721 yards, four TDs, and three interceptions. He averages 180.2 ypg. and has a pass efficiency rating of 114.8. Josh Brown has completed 18 of 35 passes (51.4%) for 167 yards with two TDs and two INTs. His efficiency rating is 98.9 and he averages 41.8 ypg.

Brown appeared in six games last year. For the season, he completed 35 of 62 passes for 378 yards with three TDs and three INTs. His career high for yardage was 175 yards (12 of 25, one TD, one INT) vs. St. Lawrence.

Gallagher played in three games, seeing the most time in the season finale vs. Hobart. He completed 10 of 19 passes for 153 yards, one TD and one INT.

First-year Joshua Liao saw some fourth quarter action vs. Ithaca last week (1-3, 3 yards passing; 3 rushes, 7 yards).

#### **RECEIVERS:**

Eleven men have caught passes this year. David Angie, fueled by seven catches vs. Becker, leads the way with 19 catches (9.5 avg., one TD). Dan Bronson has 14 catches for a 12.3 avg. and two TDs. He did not play in the past two games. Emanuel Calmar has 18 catches for an 7.7 avg. Dan DiLoreto and Tyler Tanen have eight catches apiece - DiLoreto for an 11.4 average and one TD, Tanen for an 11.8 average.

#### **ON DEFENSE:**

LB Josh Churchin is off to a strong start this year with 41 tackles (20 primary, 21 assists). In 2016, Churchin and Ricky Sparks

led Rochester in total tackles (Sparks - 47 primary, 13 assists, 60 total). He had two interceptions and two pass breakups. Churchin had 40 primary and 20 assists. He also had a team-leading 4.5 tackles behind the line for nine yards in losses.

The next men on the tackle chart are: Ricky Simcic 28 (20-8), Ryan Bell 25 (20-5), Tim Mascari 19 (12-7), Justin Warner 19 (15-4), Ricky Sparks 19 (13-6), Austin Carr 19 (11-8), Christian Marini 18 (7-11), Matt Woodarek 12 (8-4), Jimmy D'Iorio (11 (8-3), Tristan Yates 10 (7-3).

#### **SPECIALISTS:**

**Punting:** Paul Mokrzycki (moke-SHISS-key) has punted 24 times for a 41.6-yard average. He put seven balls inside the 20, had four fair catches, four touchbacks, and five kicks of 50 yards or longer. He is ranked 12th in Division III with that 41.6 average. The NCAA Statistics Service ranks 179 punters. He is also the Liberty League leader in punting average.

**Placekicking:** Paul Tricarico was 6-9 on PATs this season and 1-3 on field goal attempts. In 2016, he made eight of nine PATs as four men tried at least one PAT. Rochester did not make a field goal attempt last year (0-5). The Yellowjackets were 5 of 7 on FGAs in 2015. Tricarico was 1-2 on field goal attempts vs. Becker (hit from 25, missed from 38).

#### **LAST GUY TO RUN ONE BACK AT THE START:**

Brian Ferris is the last Rochester player to begin a game by returning the opening kickoff for a touchdown. Ferris ran back the opening kick 97 yards for a TD to open the scoring against RPI at Fauver Stadium on October 5, 2002. RPI rallied to win, 31-19.

That was 147 games ago (through last Saturday).

#### **IN THE EVENT OF OVERTIME:**

Rochester has played four games under the NCAA's current overtime structure. The Yellowjackets defeated Canisius College, 34-28, in triple OT on October 14, 2000. That was the University's Sesquicentennial Celebration and the dedication of the Robert Goergen Athletic Center. The Yellowjackets lost at Alfred University, 40-34, in overtime in the ECAC Northwest Championship Game in 2006.

The Yellowjackets ended the 2010 season with a 35-34 double-overtime victory at Hobart College. That gave Rochester possession of the Centennial Cup for the first time. The trophy was inaugurated in 2007 when the teams met for the 100th time.

In 2014, Rochester defeated WPI, 24-21, in OT on Senior Day. That clinched a winning season in the penultimate game of the year.

Rochester's last tied game came on October 25, 1986 in Canton when the Yellowjackets and Saints dueled to a 20-20 finish. The final play was a long incomplete pass intended for a junior receiver - former Rochester head coach Mark Kreydt.

#### **OVERTIME RULES:**

If the score is tied after four quarters, the referee will hold a coin toss for the captains. Winning team has the choice to be on offense first, or on defense. After the choice is made, the ball is placed on the 25 yard line, 1st&10 (going towards the short end of the field). This is treated exactly as a game condition - i.e. the offense (Team A) can gain a first down, and then get another 1st&10. Team A has the opportunity to kick a field goal if it does not score a touchdown.

When the Team A possession ends, Team B goes on offense, 1st&10 at the 25 (still going towards the short end of the field). If Team A has scored, Team B must either equal that score (FG, TD) to force another overtime period, or better it (Team A kicks a FG, Team B scores a TD).

If Team A scores a TD and adds a one-point PAT, Team B can try for two points if it scores a TD (to win), or it can try the one-point PAT to force a tie and another OT.

In the second OT period, the teams switch their order. Team B now goes on offense first and Team A is on defense. Should a third OT be required, the teams go through another coin toss.

**NOTE:** If a team turns the ball over during its possession, the possession ends (and possibly the game, depending on what has happened). Example: Team A fumbles at the 12 and Team B recovers in the first period. Team B goes on offense, 1st&10 at the 25. If Team A scores and then Team B fumbles with A recovering, the game is over.

If a team scores a defensive touchdown, the game could be over. A number of years ago, Carnegie Mellon and Chicago went into overtime at Chicago. CMU was on defense first. The Tartans intercepted a Chicago pass and returned it for a TD. The game ended with a CMU victory.

#### **HITTING THE CENTURY MARK:**

Since 2013, there have been 12 games when a player rushed for 100 yards or more in a game. The 12th game was two weeks ago when Emanuel Calmar ran for 233 yards on 36 carries vs. Becker.

#### **A CHANGE BEHIND CENTER:**

An injury to Matt Gallagher during midweek practice sessions last week forced a change at quarterback. Josh Brown was the starter with first-year Joshua Liao (LEE-ow) as the backup.

**TID-BITS:**

• **Won't Always Tell the Tale:** Time of possession (TOP) isn't always the factor that determines the outcome. Last season, Rochester had the ball for 28 minutes and Alfred State had it for 32. Rochester won. This year, four of five opponents - Carnegie Mellon (42-14 win for the Tartans), Alfred (45-7 win for the Saxons), Becker (28-10 win for Rochester), and Ithaca (46-6 win over the Bombers) - had the ball fewer minutes than Rochester. Only Alfred State had the ball more than Rochester - and the Yellow-jackets won that game (14-7).

• **Carrying the Load:** Emanuel Calmar carried the ball 29 times for a net of 120 yards four weeks ago against Alfred State. That was the highest rushing attempts total for a Rochester player in four-plus years covering 32 games. Myles Allen rushed 29 times for 135 yards at RPI on October 19, 2013 in a 37-31 Rochester win on the road.

• **And Before That...:** You have to go back to October 21, 2011 - 53 games ago - to find a back who carried it more. Clarence Onyiriuka (ahn-yah-ROOK-ah) had 31 carries for 158 net yards in a 28-21 home win over WPI.

• **Now, There's a New High-Water Mark:** Emanuel Calmar carried it 36 times for a net of 233 yards on September 30. That is the most rushing attempts by a Rochester football player since September 26, 2009 when Clarence Onyiriuka carried it 41 times for 184 yards and one TD in a 28-21 loss to Union at Fauver. That was 74 games earlier.

• **Protecting the Scoreboard:** Before the 14-7 win over Alfred State here four weeks ago, the last time Rochester held an opponent to less than 10 points in a game was 16 games earlier - September 26, 2015 against Springfield College (29-3).

• **Tough Job on the Road:** The last time Rochester held a road opponent to less than 10 points was September 10, 2011 in a 17-7 victory at Case Western Reserve (season opener). It was 66 games ago - and 31 road games ago (counting the 42-14 loss at Carnegie Mellon and the 45-7 loss at Alfred on September 23).

**TRACK SEASON'S PAYING OFF:**

In the first three games this year, Emanuel Calmar rushed for more net yardage than he did in all of 2016. He had 254 yards

on 67 carries. In 2016, he carried the ball in all nine games. He rushed 59 times for a net of 237 yards and scored five TDs. He caught 10 passes for 126 yards and one TD.

During the spring 2017 semester, he was a sprinter for the indoor and outdoor track and field teams. His season best time in the 60 meters indoors was 0:07.33 seconds at the MIT Gordon Kelly meet. He produced a long jump of 6.08 meters (19' 11.5") at the RIT February Invitational. That was the third longest jump by a UR indoor jumper last year.

**AND OUR SPECIAL GUESTS THIS WEEKEND:**

This marks the 50th anniversary celebration of the Class of 1967. As seniors, they played for the 1966 football team which finished 3-5. It was coached by Rochester Hall of Famer Donald Smith. In five seasons (1963-68), Smith finished with a record of 26 win, 21 losses, and one tie. He is seventh in career victories and 10th in winning percentage.

Eight members of that team will be on the sidelines to take part in the pre-game coin toss. Those members are Richard Bellows, Eric Childs, Richard Deerhake, Thomas Flowers, Robert Liberto, Lucien Lombardo, Daniel Record, and Robert Smith, the captain.

Donald Smith coached a number of sports at Rochester including football, baseball (1960-64), and served as an assistant in basketball (1955-60). He coached the Rochester golf team for 27 years, including 14 straight NCAA Division III playoff appearances. The University holds an endowment golf tournament in his name every fall.

# Four Women and Two Men Inducted into University's Athletic Hall of Fame

Six individuals who helped to shape Rochester's athletic legacy in a variety of sports were inducted into the University's Athletic Hall of Fame on Friday, October 13. The induction ceremony is part of the Meliora Weekend festivities on campus. Meliora is the University's motto signifying 'ever better'.

The Class of 2017 is comprised of four women and two men – graduates as recently as 2005 and dating back to 1979. The inductees represented the university in the sports of football, women's basketball, women's soccer, women's swimming & diving, and women's volleyball.

All four women's inductees competed in the NCAA Division III National Championships. The Hall of Fame Class of 2017 includes three All-Americans, one Player of the Year in the University Athletic Association, and one member of the UAA's Silver Anniversary Team.

Away from the field of competition, they have distinguished themselves in the areas of theatre, film, education, athletic administration, engineering, business, and medicine.

## **Kirsten Clark '97 (Nashua, NH)**

**At UR:** Earned nine All-American honors as a swimmer... Three-time UAA Champion in the 1,650 yard freestyle... Held four school records for more than 10 years (200 freestyle, 500 freestyle, 1,000 freestyle, 1,650 freestyle)... Swam on two Rochester teams that finished in the top 20 at the NCAA Division III National Championships (1994, 1995)... Team MVP in 1994-95 and 1995-96... Graduated Cum Laude with a double major of economics and political science. **Post-Graduate:** Head women's swimming and diving coach at Canisius College where she received her master's in Sports Administration... ## **Rochester Football Coach Scott Greene Announces 2017 Will Be His Final Year on Sideline**

ROCHESTER, N.Y. – (October 10, 2017) – University of Rochester head football coach Scott Greene has announced that the 2017 season will be his final year on the sideline.

Greene has served as Rochester's head coach since 2006. His career record heading into this Saturday's Liberty League game against Union College is 50-60. He is third in career coaching wins behind Elmer Burnham (17 years, 1944-60, 82 wins) and Peter 'Pat' Stark (15 years, 1969-83, 69 wins).

"The University of Rochester has been home for me and my family for the past 12 years," Greene said. "I am fortunate to have experienced such an outstanding university that put the students' needs and priorities for success before all else."

Since 2006, Rochester football players have earned a total of seven Academic All-America honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America. "To have such smart players to coach with their passion and love for the game is what I admired about being the head coach at U of R," Greene continued.

From the spring of 2011 through the spring of 2017, 38 Rochester players have been named to the Hampshire Honor Society as announced by the National Football Foundation. Honorees must achieve a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 or higher through their four years. In 2014, Rochester had 13 honorees, the most of any college in the nation. The HHS team that year totaled 838 athletes from 267 schools on all levels of football.

He took over as head coach in May, 2006. He immediately led Rochester to back to back post-season appearances in 2006 and 2007.

"We are deeply grateful to Scott for the 12 years that he has led our football program. He cares deeply about his players, and has earned their respect and support," said Executive Director of Athletics George VanderZwaag. "He has also been a great colleague in our department. We will miss having him part of our daily lives, but wish him well as he pursues new professional opportunities. We will be conducting a search for a new head coach at the end of the season, and look forward to a bright future for Rochester football."

"The personal support that George VanderZwaag provided to me since my first year as an assistant under Mark Kreydt was immeasurable," Greene said. "The facilities that have been created are the best in the country at many levels."

Rochester is 2-3 this year, 0-1 in the Liberty League. The Yellowjackets host Union College this Saturday on Meliora Weekend. On October 21, they play at St. Lawrence University. On November 4, they play at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. Greene will complete his tenure as the Yellowjackets finish the season on November 11 against Hobart College, a 12 p.m. start on Senior Day.

Greene is the 30th head coach to serve in the 129 seasons of football at Rochester. "I feel honored to have been a part of the strong history of football at the University of Rochester," Greene stated.

### **Liberty League, Buffalo State reach agreement on Football Associate Membership**

TROY, N.Y. – Commissioner Tracy King announced that the Liberty League has reached an agreement with SUNY Buffalo State College to join the league as an associate member in football beginning with the 2019 football season. Buffalo State will become the Liberty League’s seventh football member, assuring that the league will retain its automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Football Championship.

“I am pleased to announce that Buffalo State has agreed to join the Liberty League as a football associate member,” said King. “This move is being made with the support and cooperation of the Empire 8 Athletic Conference and ensures that both conferences will continue to maintain access to the Division III football playoffs. I would like to thank Buffalo State athletics director Jerry Boyes and Empire 8 commissioner Chuck Mitrano for their support and foresight in making this partnership happen. This is a win for New York football student-athletes.”

In addition to Buffalo State joining the league in 2019, the Liberty League and Empire 8 have reached a scheduling agreement that includes crossover games between the two conferences during a four-year period from 2019 to 2022. The conferences earlier announced a postseason bowl game in which the top team from each conference not selected for the NCAA playoffs will participate. The inaugural game will be held at the conclusion of the current season.

“For a number of years, the Liberty League and the Empire 8 have both relied on associate members from outside the region in order to satisfy the requirements for an NCAA football bid. In the previous 14 years, the Liberty League has had five different associate members participate in football,” said King. “The geography has proven to be challenging for those institutions, but with the Liberty League and Empire 8 now consisting entirely of New York football teams, I believe we have a greater chance at achieving long-term stability.”

In April 2015, associate members Springfield College and WPI announced that they would be departing the Liberty League after the 2016 season in order to participate in football in their primary conference, the NEWMAC, which was adding football as a conference sport. The U.S. Merchant Marine Academy, another Liberty League associate member, announced it would also be joining the NEWMAC as an associate member. The loss of the three institutions left the Liberty League with just five football playing members – Hobart, RPI, Rochester, St. Lawrence and Union – with seven members needed in order to receive an NCAA bid.

The addition of Ithaca College as a full member for the 2017-18 academic year gave the Liberty League six full-member institutions that sponsor football. For conferences that fall below the seven required teams, NCAA Division III rules provide conferences with a two-year grace period in which they will retain their automatic bid. At the end of two years, a conference must be back up to seven members or it will lose its NCAA bid. The Liberty League will have six teams in 2017 and 2018. Buffalo State will move from the Empire 8 to the Liberty League in 2019, giving each conference seven teams.

Empire 8 football also includes Alfred, Hartwick, St. John Fisher and Utica along with associate members Brockport, Cortland and Morrisville State.
