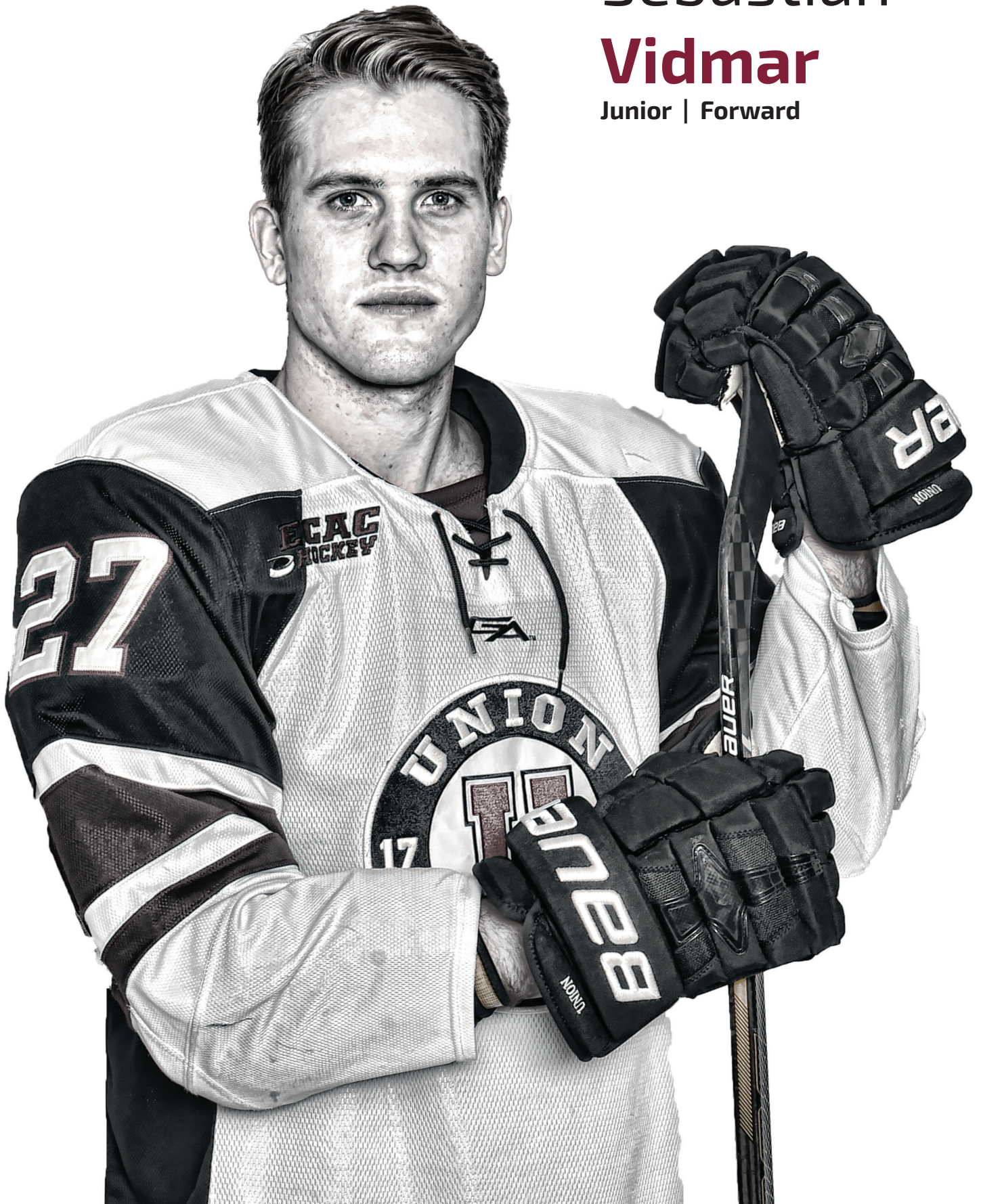

COVERING THE DUTCHMEN

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All requests for media credentials for Union College home games at Messa Rink must be submitted to Dan St-Jacques in the Union College Sports Information Office at least three days in advance the game. Priority for issuance of credentials will be given to daily newspapers and television stations which regularly cover the hockey program. Working press box credentials shall be issued to opponent sports information directors and accredited newspapers, magazines, radio and television reporters.

PRESS BOX

Union College's press box can be located at the north end of Messa Rink, and is accessible via the stairway located underneath the area. Working media personnel are assigned space in the press box; scouts and players are not permitted in the press box at any time as per Union College, ECAC Hockey and NCAA rules. Vulgarity, profanity and cheering are prohibited at all times. Any behavior deemed unprofessional by the Union College staff will result in removal from the game. Any abuse of working media credentials will be grounds for removal from the press box and could result in the rejection of future credential requests.

INTERVIEWS

All interviews may be arranged through the Sports Information office, and are most helpful if requests are made 24 hours in advance of the interview to ensure student-athlete and/or coach availability. Contact information for student-athletes will not be provided to the media under any circumstances.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Head coach Rick Bennett and Union College players are available for post-game interviews following a 10-minute cooling off period. Interviews with the visiting coach and players should be arranged through the visiting SID.

Union College traces its beginnings to 1779. Several hundred residents of northern New York, certain that Burgoyne's defeat at Saratoga two years before would mean a new nation, began the first popular demand for higher education in America. These residents pursued that dream for 16 years until, in 1795, Union became the first college chartered by the Regents of the State of New York. The first trustees consciously attempted to bring their new college into the mainstream of their world. The very name, Union, carried echoes of the new national union. More immediately and directly, it recognized the fact that the College was an outgrowth of a new sense of community among the several religious and national groups in the local population. Union's founders were determined to avoid the narrow sectarianism characteristic of earlier American colleges; today, Union is one of the oldest non-denominational colleges in the country.

Union did not share the heavily classical bias of most colleges of the day. Its motto ("Sous les lois de Minerve nous devenons tous freres," or "We all become brothers under the laws of Minerva") is significantly of French rather than Latin origin. Union was among the first to introduce French on an equal level with Greek and Latin. In the 1820s, when the classical curriculum was the most widely accepted field of study, Union introduced a bachelor's degree with greater emphasis on history, science, modern languages, and mathematics. This liberality of educational vision characterized Union during the early years of the term of Eliphalet Nott, president from 1804 to 1866. Science and technology became important concerns; chemistry was taught before 1809, a degree in scientific studies was added, and in 1845 Union became the first liberal arts college to offer engineering. The College was one of the first to offer work in American history and constitutional government and did pioneer work in the elective system of study.

By about 1830, Union was graduating as many students as any other college in America. Along

with Harvard, Yale, and Princeton, it was spoken of as one of the big four. Students came from the South and West as well as the East. Among them were the father of Franklin D. Roosevelt, the grandfather of Winston Churchill, a president of the United States (Chester A. Arthur, Class of 1848), seven cabinet secretaries, 15 United States senators, 91 members of the House of Representatives, 13 governors, 50 important diplomats, more than 200 judges, 40 missionaries, 16 generals, and 90 college presidents, including the first presidents of the Illinois, Iowa, Michigan, Vassar, Smith and Elmira.

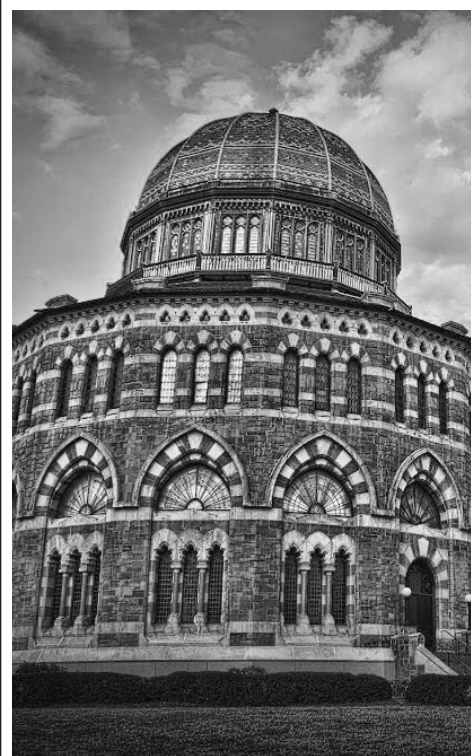
Nott's ingenious schemes for financing higher education, including a statewide lottery, also were instrumental in building Union's reputation. Innovations under the leadership of Andrew Van Vranken Raymond, president from 1894 to 1907 include the establishment of a Department of Electrical Engineering and Applied Physics, headed by the "electrical wizard" of the General Electric Company, Charles P. Steinmetz. The new department gave impetus to the development of strong programs in science and technology and attracted attention and applications to the College.

The 20th century brought other changes to Union. In 1970, the College adopted co-education and welcomed the first class of two dozen women transfer students. Today, roughly half of Union's students are women. More recently, the College has added programs in Asian Studies, Bioengineering, Film Studies, Nanotechnology, and Neuroscience.

In 2004, the Minervas were inaugurated to broaden the educational experience for students, faculty and staff. Every incoming student is assigned to one of seven Minerva Houses, joining upperclass students, faculty and staff in a house affiliation. Each Minerva, with its own budget and governing council, is a center for intellectual and social activity. Union's fraternities and sororities continue a proud tradition of service. Theme Houses are a popular option for students who seek residential affiliation with others who are committed to themes such as

community service, environmental awareness, art, music and language.

The College has done important experimental work in interdepartmental studies, which is reflected in a number of programs that cut across the lines of academic disciplines. Organized interdepartmental majors are offered in numerous areas, and the College has also developed programs that enable students to work toward both a bachelor's degree and an advanced degree. The Common Curriculum (General Education) has received national recognition, and the College has an innovative program of Writing Across the Curriculum. Efforts to renew and enhance the College's academic programs and curricula continue to be supported by major foundations.



MESSA RINK AT ACHILLES CENTER

Originally constructed in 1975 with a gift from Henry Laurence Achilles, Union College's ice hockey rink underwent major renovations during the summer of 2003 after a gift from alumnus Frank L. Messa '73.

Renamed Frank L. Messa Rink at Achilles Center, Union's new-look facility was officially unveiled for competition on October 18, 2003 as the men's hockey team hosted Merrimack.

With a seating capacity of 2,054, and standing room only areas that will allow sellout crowds to reach nearly 2,300, Messa Rink is one of the most intimidating venues for visiting teams in ECAC Hockey. The Dutchmen have won 61 percent of their home games over the past three seasons and compiled a 15-game winning streak on home ice from November 2013-October 2014.

The team's success has resulted in packed-houses at Messa. Since 2009-10, the Garnet and White have generated 51 sellouts.

The home of Dutchman Hockey has provided many highlights through the years:

- Seven straight seasons (2009-14) of hosting ECAC Hockey playoff action, including five consecutive quarterfinal series appearances.
- Cleary Cup-clinching victories in 2011 and 2014. Union won its first-ever regular season title on February 26, 2011 with a 5-0 win against Princeton. On February 21, 2014, Union captured the Cleary Cup with a 5-0 win over Clarkson.
- On March 12, 2010, Union and Quinnipiac played the second-longest game in NCAA history (150:22), a five overtime affair that lasted 5 hours 56 minutes and ended at 1:03 a.m.
- Messa hosted the ECAC Women's Hockey Championships in 2004 and 2005.

In 2014, a new LED lighting system was installed at Messa. The lighting system saves considerable energy, keeping in line with the College's commitment to sustainability. The brighter atmosphere eliminates dark areas in the stands and benefits the players as well, as the previous metal halide lights often raised temperatures at ice level.

In 2003 renovations enabled Union to provide a first class venue for Division I hockey, as well as numerous programming opportunities for the College and community at large. Phase I of the \$1.5 million renovation project included the installation of a high-tech chilling and dehumidification system. New spring-loaded boards and seamless glass provide a safer playing

environment on the ice, while better sight-lines were made for the fans, and a redesigned seating area improved the rink's traffic pattern.

Phase II of the project, completed during the 2003-04 academic year, included the construction of five locker rooms and the addition of restrooms and shower areas for use by the Union athletic teams and outside community groups. A multipurpose function room, a 2,000 square foot sports medicine area, a reconfigured lobby and improved ADA access and seating were all part of the project's second phase.

The lower level of Frank L. Messa Rink at Achilles Center contains locker room space for more than 175 athletes. The locker rooms, capable of handling up to five teams at one time, are used by Union's varsity teams and visiting teams for intercollegiate and interscholastic contests and tournaments. During the fall, Union's football team uses a 100-locker facility that can be separated for team meetings or for use by two smaller teams. During the spring, the men's and women's lacrosse teams have locker rooms in the lower level of Achilles Center.

The men and women's hockey teams have dedicated locker rooms that are located on the

main level of the rink. In addition to stalls for each player, both locker rooms contain a private coach's locker room. Also located on the main level of Achilles Center is the Travis J. Clark '00 Strength Training Facility, which is utilized by the men's and women's varsity squads.

The Garnet Blades Men's Hockey Locker Room and Hockey Training Center were dedicated on November 13, 2004. Hockey alumni, along with the help of the Athletic Department and College Relations, launched a campaign to raise \$125,000 for a new men's hockey locker room and weight training area.

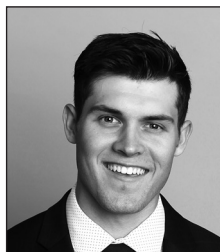

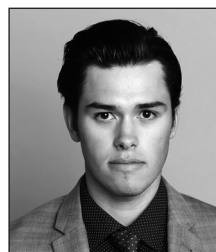

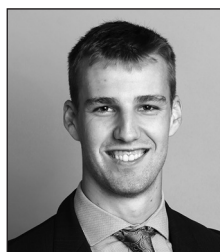

Rick Bennett completed his sixth season as Union College's men's hockey coach in 2016-17, having taken the program to new heights. His .644 winning percentage ranks fifth-best among active Division I coaches.

Bennett's accomplishments in six seasons are nothing short of amazing: a national championship, two Frozen Fours, four NCAA Tournament berths, three Whitelaw Cups and three Cleary Cups. He has also coached nine All-Americans: Mike Vecchione (2016-17), Spencer Foo (2016-17), Daniel Ciampini (2014-15), Shayne Gostisbehere (2012-13, 2013-14), Mat Bodie (2012-13, 2013-14), Daniel Carr (2013-14), Colin Stevens (2013-14), Jeremy Welsh (2011-12), and Troy Grosenick (2011-12).

Bennett owns a six-year record of 137-69-30 (.644). He became the third Union hockey coach to reach 100 career victories with the Dutchmen's 5-3 win against then #3 Boston University on Oct. 10, 2015, and currently ranks as the second winningest coach in program history.

He holds a 24-8 postseason record and is 17-5 in the ECAC Hockey Tournament. He has also won 61 percent of his league games in ECAC Hockey (72-42-18). Bennett's record against nationally-ranked teams stands at 46-28-12 (.605).

Under Bennett's guidance, the 2016-17 squad captured a share of its fourth Cleary Cup as ECAC Hockey regular season champions

in the last seven seasons. The Dutchmen finished fifth in Division I in win percentage (.697), producing their fourth 20-win campaign under Bennett, en route to an NCAA Tournament appearance. Union's accomplishments earned Bennett ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors for the second time in his career.

Additionally, senior forward Mike Vecchione (ECAC Hockey Player of the Year) and junior forward Spencer Foo were both selected as Hobey Baker Top-10 Finalists and CCM/AHCA First-Team All-Americans. Vecchione, who finished his career as the all-time leading scorer in program history, became Union's first ever Hobey Baker Hat Trick Finalist.

In just his third season behind the helm, Bennett led Union to its first-ever NCAA Division I Championship, as top-ranked Union defeated second-ranked Minnesota, 7-4, on April 12, 2014 before 18,742 at the Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia.

For his efforts, Bennett was named recipient of the 2014 Spencer Penrose Award as National Coach of the Year by the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA). Bennett completed the hat trick of major awards by also receiving Coach of the Year honors from College Hockey News and U.S. College Hockey Online (USCHO).

Bennett was named the fifth head coach in Union's Division I history on April 20, 2011. He has signed three extensions and is under contract for the next seven seasons through 2021-22.

In 2014-15, Bennett led the Dutchman program to its eighth-straight winning season, producing a 19-win campaign. Union also captured its first-ever road playoff series win (a sweep at Cornell), advancing to the ECAC Hockey Quarterfinals for the eighth consecutive year. The team also spent 10 weeks in the national polls and defeated five nationally-ranked opponents. Union defeated Rensselaer, 8-3, in the Capital District Mayor's Cup, improving Bennett's record against RPI to 11-3.

The 2013-14 season was unprecedented in

Union's 71 years of varsity hockey. In addition to capturing the national title, Union finished with the most wins (32) and top winning percentage (.810) in the country. Union reached the No. 1 position in both national polls for the first time in the school's 23-year Division I history and spent 16 weeks ranked in the top 10. Bennett's squad finished second in NCAA scoring offense (3.81) and fourth in scoring defense (2.14 gpg).

Union closed the season with a 17-game unbeaten streak (16-0-1), which also included a school-record 12-straight wins. The Dutchmen did not lose a game in February, March or April, going a perfect 8-0 in the postseason. Earlier in the season, Union strung together a 10-game unbeaten streak (9-0-1) and a nine-game win streak. The Garnet and White also won their last 12 games at Messa Rink.

In clinching its second ECAC Hockey regular season crown in three seasons, Union set school records for conference wins (18) and points (37), scoring a league-high 83 goals (3.77 gpg) while surrendering a league-low 42 goals (1.91 gpg). Over the course of the season, Union won 12 season series (eight against league opponents), and clinched the Capital Skates Trophy against Rensselaer.

Prior to being named head coach at Union, Bennett spent six seasons as an assistant on Nate Leaman's staff, starting with the 2005-06 campaign. Rick was promoted to associate



head coach in 2007-08.

Before arriving in Schenectady, Bennett served five seasons (2000-05) as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Providence.

A native of Springfield, Mass., Bennett was a four-year letterwinner (1986-90) and co-captain at Providence, where he was recognized as a Hobey Baker finalist (1990) and two-time winner of the Lou Lamoriello Trophy as team MVP. He was named an All-American during the 1988-89 season and earned All-Hockey East Second Team honors in 1990. A left-winger, Bennett finished with 134 points (50 goals, 84 assists) in 128 career games. Bennett skated on the famed B-B-G line, along with center Mike Boback and right wing Robbie Gaudreau. Rick, who graduated with a B.A. in general studies, was inducted into the Providence College Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012.

Bennett was a third-round draft pick (54th overall) of the Minnesota North Stars in the 1986 NHL Entry Draft. His draft rights were later traded to the New York Rangers.

Bennett appeared in 15 games with the Rangers over three seasons (1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-92). Bennett's 10-year professional career also included stints with the Binghamton Rangers (AHL), Springfield Indians (AHL), Hershey Bears (AHL), Springfield Falcons (AHL), Albany River Rats (AHL), Cincinnati Cyclones (IHL), Jacksonville Lizard Kings (ECHL) and Pee Dee Pride (ECHL). Bennett served as an assistant coach for the Lizard Kings and Pride.

Bennett is a member of the American Hockey Coaches Association and is in his third year on the Hobey Baker Selection Committee. He has also been involved with the United Way and the American Cancer Society's Coaches vs. Cancer campaign.

Rick is married to Karyn, and has five children: Dan Mooney, Hayley, Brooke, Race and Lakyn. The Bennetts reside in Clifton Park, N.Y.

JASON TAPP ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH NINTH SEASON

Jason Tapp enters his ninth season as on the Union College men's hockey coaching. Tapp, who was promoted to Associate Head Coach on August 29, 2016, joined the staff as a volunteer coach in 2009-10.

The team's defensive/goaltending coach, Tapp has developed five All-Americans and two Hobey Baker finalists in eight seasons at Union: defensemen Mat Bodie and Shayne Gostisbehere (Hobey Baker finalist), along with goaltenders Troy Grosenick (Hobey Baker finalist), Keith Kinkaid, and Colin Stevens.

In terms of ECAC Hockey award winners, Tapp has produced three Goaltenders of the Year (Stevens, Grosenick, Kinkaid), a Best Defensive Defenseman (Gostisbehere), 12 all-league selections and three all-rookie team members

Tapp has also sent several players to the National Hockey League with Grosenick landing in San Jose and Kinkaid in New Jersey. Jeff Taylor (PIT) and Gostisbehere (PHI) were both selected in the NHL Entry draft, while Mat Bodie (NYR) Colin Stevens (FLA) each signed NHL contracts after college.

Under Tapp's direction, Union has ranked first (2011-12), fourth (2013-14) and seventh (2012-13) nationally in scoring defense. The 2011-12 squad allowed only 1.83 goals per game. During his time in the Electric City, Tapp seen six goaltenders record a total 25 shutouts. The 2016-17 squad also seven short-handed goals.

In 2016-17 senior goaltender Alex Sakellaropoulos and senior defenseman Jeff Taylor were both named All-ECAC Hockey Second Team.

Sakellaropoulos went 14-2-2 in ECAC Hockey competition, while Taylor finished tied for first among the nation's defensemen in game-winning goals (4), tied for sixth in points (33), and tied for seventh in goals (9).

In 2014-15, Tapp worked with All-ECAC Third Team defenseman Jeff Taylor, and saw Colin Stevens finish as the school's career leader in

wins (53) and co-leader in shutouts (11).

In 2013-14, Tapp was a member of the NCAA Championship team. That season Union goaltenders won seven weekly conference awards and were twice named goaltenders of the month. On two occasions, Union had multiple goaltenders honored in the same week.

Tapp is also heavily involved in Union's recruiting efforts. Working in conjunction with Joe Dumais, Union produced the nation's eighth- and 12th-highest scoring freshmen classes the past three seasons. The Class of 2017 compiled 98 points while the Class of 2018 produced 80 points.

A native of Kelowna, British Columbia, Tapp played four seasons (1998-2002) in goal at Boston University. He graduated in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in United States history.

Tapp's pro career began in Europe with the Nijmegen Tigers of the Dutch Superliga. He moved back to the United States for a seven-year pro career that included stints with the Columbus Cottonmouths (ECHL), Quad City Mallards (UHL), Corpus Christi Rayz (CHL), Knoxville Ice Bears (SEHL/ACHL) and Kalamazoo Wings (IHL).

Tapp was twice named to the UHL All-Star Team as a member of the Quad City Mallards. He set Quad City records for minutes played in a season and consecutive starts (33). He also established a single-season record for games played with Corpus Christi and was named team MVP.

Jason is married to Nicol Lally, a news reporter at NEWS10. The couple has two daughters, Ella and Avery, and a son, Kellen. The Tapps reside in North Greenbush, N.Y.

John Ronan, who served as a volunteer assistant coach during Union's 2014 National Championship season, rejoined the Dutchmen's coaching staff in 2016 after spending one year as the assistant coach at Mercyhurst University and a one-year stint as an assistant coach with the Youngstown Phantoms of the United States Hockey League (USHL).

Under Ronan's guidance, the Dutchmen ranked fourth in Division I in goals per game (3.76) and 12th in power play percentage (21.1). Additionally, senior forward Mike Vecchione (29G-34A) and junior forward Spencer Foo (26G-36A) finished first and fourth in the nation in scoring, respectively. Vecchione and Foo were both named Hobey Baker Top-10 Finalists, and Vecchione became the program's first ever Hobey Baker Hat Trick Finalist.

In his one year at Mercyhurst, Ronan helped lead the Lakers to an overall record of 17-15-4 and a fourth-place finish in Atlantic Hockey. He worked primarily with the forwards and power play, helping produce the league's fourth-highest scoring offense (3.00 goals per game) and the third most efficient power play (18.5%).

Prior to his tenure with the Lakers, Ronan was as an assistant coach with Phantoms, winning the 2015 Anderson Cup Championship and helping develop the league's top scoring forward lines and fourth-best power play unit. Off the ice, Ronan handled player scouting, recruiting, drafting, travel planning, and community involvement among other duties.

During the 2013-14 season, Ronan was a volunteer assistant coach with the Dutchmen, helping the program to a Whitelaw Cup, a Cleary Cup and the program's first ever national title. While at Union, his primary responsibilities were the power play and forward lines, which finished second in the country in scoring offense.

A native of South Boston, Mass., Ronan skated four seasons (2001-05) at the University of Maine. As a forward for the Black Bears, Ronan compiled 25 goals, 22 assists and 47 points in 132 career games. He was named team captain as a senior and earned a Bachelor of University

Studies from Maine in 2013.

Ronan played seven full seasons in the professional ranks, spending time with the Alaska Aces (ECHL), Florida Everblades (ECHL), Rocky Mountain Rage (CHL), Austin Ice Bats (CHL), Evansville IceMen (CHL), Flint Generals (IHL) and Huntsville Havoc (SPHL). John also had a stint with the Netherlands-based Geleen Smoke Eaters.

John resides in Clifton Park with his wife Robin and daughter Camryn.

Matt Alvey enters his second season as a volunteer assistant coach. Alvey served as Hudson Valley Community College's ice hockey coach from 2002 to 2015, guiding the Vikings to five National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) national tournament appearances.

A Troy, NY native, Alvey was a second-round draft pick of the Boston Bruins in 1993. He played three seasons in the ECHL and two in the West Coast Hockey League (WCHL) before injuries forced him to retire in 2001.

Alvey won the 1994 NCAA Division I National Championship at Lake Superior State University, tallying the game-winning goal against Boston University in the championship game. A four-year player for the Lakers, Alvey appeared in 122 games, producing 34 goals and 31 assists for 65 points.

JIM MCLAUGHLIN DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Jim McLaughlin was named the Director of Athletics at Union in March 2005. He serves on the NCAA Division I Men's Ice Hockey Committee.

McLaughlin earned his bachelor's degree in history from Union in 1993. During his time at Union, he played on the offensive line for the football team and was named an Associated Press and Champion second-team All-American. Upon graduation, he served as an assistant football coach for Union from 1993 to 1996, and earned his master's in business administration from the college in 1997. As Union's assistant football coach, he coached the offensive line and assisted the offensive coordinator. The football team made the NCAA playoffs in 1993 and 1995.

Prior to returning to Union, McLaughlin was associate director of athletics for finance at Brown University, responsible for the development and management of the department's \$11 million annual budget. He was also responsible for external relations including marketing and corporate partnership, athletic communications, and ticket operations. He was a sport administrator for the women's lacrosse, women's soccer, and men's basketball teams.

Before joining Brown, McLaughlin spent four years at Princeton University with an eventual role as assistant director of athletics for business operations. Prior to that, in 1997, he was interim director of intramurals and physical education at Brown.

McLaughlin administers a department of 26 varsity programs, 24 at the Division III level within the Liberty League, and two – men's and women's ice hockey – at Division I within ECAC Hockey. He is responsible for long-term planning and development of athletic, recreation and intramural programs; hiring and supervising coaches and staff; and overseeing departmental budgets, facilities, fundraising and marketing.

He is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the College Athletic Business Managers Association.

BETH TIFFANY ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Beth Tiffany is in her eighth year as the associate director of athletics at Union College. In her position, she oversees seven varsity programs, sports information, fundraising, corporate sponsorships and promotions.

Tiffany arrived at Union College from the University of New Mexico, where she joined the Lobo Club in 2006. During her time with the Lobos, Tiffany's duties included directing the athletic department's Gift in Kind program, managing priority seating for football and men's and women's basketball, and developing relationships with the athletics department and area businesses and vendors. Since 2005, Joanne Little has been the Senior Associate Director of Athletics/Senior Woman Administrator and Compliance Coordinator for all 26 varsity sport programs. Little's responsibilities include sport programs and sports services oversight, and coordinator of special events. Little

serves as the academic liaison and admissions liaison for Athletics. She is also a Title IX Deputy Coordinator for the Campus.

Little has served Union College student-athletes in a variety of roles since she came to the college in 1990. She has been head coach of the women's volleyball, basketball, and tennis teams during her career on the campus.

Little's 1991 volleyball squad was rewarded for its 20-win season with an invitation to the NYSWCAA post-season tournament while her 1991-92 basketball team produced the most victories for Union since the 1978-79 campaign. Little's two years as the tennis coach produced an overall record of 16-5 and what was then a college-best sixth-place finish in the New York state post-season tournament. She took over as the college's head equipment manager in 1995-96.

In April 2001, Little was named director of varsity sports services and operations. She played a major role in the strategic planning for the athletics department, helping develop the student-athlete handbook, and also was named the team leader for the prevention of hazing task force. In Fall 2002, Little was named assistant director of athletics. Her responsibilities included serving as the department's NCAA compliance officer and event management coordinator for home events and post-season tournaments. In Spring 2005, Little was elevated to associate director of athletics, overseeing marketing and promotions.

Little was inducted into the Nanuet (N.Y.) High School Sports Hall of Fame in November 2005. During her one season as head women's basketball coach at SUNY Binghamton, 1989-90, she was SUNY Coach of the Year for leading her team to a fourth-place finish after they were picked 10th out of 11 teams in a pre-season poll.



ADAM BRINKER Assistant Athletic Director for Facilities

Adam Brinker became the Managing Director of Messa Rink at Achilles Center in 2004, and in 2008, was promoted to Assistant Athletic Director, Facilities. He is the event manager for all Union men's and women's ice hockey home contests, and also is in charge of scheduling, operations, and programming at the athletic facilities.

Brinker came to Union from the University of Findlay, where he served as the head women's ice hockey coach of Findlay's Division I program from the 1999-2000 season through the 2003-04 season. He served in Ice Arena Management at the University of Michigan for three years. Brinker was the head coach of the Dubuque Fighting Saints of the USHL for three seasons (1994-95 through 1996-97), and was the head coach of a minor pro hockey team in the Sunshine Hockey League for two years.

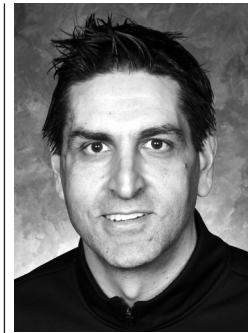
