

Media Services

The 2008-09 West Chester University men's basketball media guide is designed to assist media in its coverage of the Golden Rams during the upcoming season.

Below is a list of media services available to help members of the media in their coverage of the Golden Rams' program. We hope you will take full advantage of the services offered by the sports information department, as we are here to serve you. Please make note of the following services available throughout the 2008-09 season. Should additional information be required, please do not hesitate to contact us.

CREDENTIALS

All requests for working press, photo and broadcast credentials for West Chester's 2008-09 home men's basketball games should be made in writing on company letterhead at least 24 hours prior to the game for which credentials will be requested. Please direct all requests to James Zuhlke, sports information director, Sturzebecker HSC, Rm 220, West Chester University, West Chester, PA 19383. Requests may also be faxed to (610) 436-1020. All credentials that cannot be mailed can be picked up at the will call table in the lobby of Hollinger Field House.

PRESS ROW

Because of the limited space available along Hollinger Field House press row, media agencies covering the visiting team will be given priority, along with West Chester's media outlets that cover the Golden Rams' men's basketball program on a regular basis. Media seating is located at center court between the two lower level bleachers on the side opposite the team benches. Electronic media covering the game are given priority on the lower level in front. Print media may sit on the risers behind the electronic media to cover the game.

STATISTICAL SERVICES

Prior to tipoff, media will be provided with a game program with rosters and notified of any unusual lineup changes.

During the game, quickie stats will be distributed at each media timeout and a box score at the end of the half and the end of the game. A running play-by-play will be provided at the conclusion of the game only.

Following the game, a complete postgame statistical package will be distributed to media containing a box score with individual statistics and complete play-by-play. Postgame statistical packages will be available approximately 15 minutes after the conclusion of the game.

RADIO/TELEVISION

BROADCASTS

Internet, radio and television stations seeking permission to broadcast games from Hollinger Field House should contact West Chester University's sports information department at least one week prior to the game. Courtesy lines are available courtside in Hollinger Field House to accommodate visiting and home radio broadcasts. Internet, radio and TV stations using the courtesy line must call collect, or take an incoming call to broadcast. All broadcasters must be set up 40 minutes prior to tipoff. Electronic media covering the game are asked to set up on the lower level in front.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Postgame interviews featuring players and coaches from both teams will be conducted approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the contest inside the Reese Room adjacent to the basketball court and next to the sports information office.

West Chester head coach and players will go first in an interview setting with the visiting team head coach and players to immediately follow.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Credentials for sideline photographers are available by contacting James Zuhlke in West Chester University's sports information office at: (610) 436-3316 with priority given to those agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis.

Photographers can pick up game programs at the entrance to the seating area or along press row prior to the contest.

SCOUTING

Scouts must pay their own way into the contest and sit in the bleachers during games. There will be no special seating for professional scouts during men's and women's basketball contests.

Directions to Hollinger Field House

From Philadelphia
Take Schuylkill Expressway (Rt. 76 West) to Exit 26B. Follow Rt. 202 South for approximately 20 minutes. Take High Street exit to second traffic light at Rosedale Ave. and turn left. Or take West Chester Pike (Rt. 3 West) to Rt. 202 S. by-pass. Follow Rt. 202 S. to High Street exit. Go to second traffic light at Rosedale Ave. and turn right. About 100 yards, make a right onto North Campus Dr.

From Western Pennsylvania (PA Turnpike)
Take Pennsylvania Turnpike to Exit 23 Downingtown. Follow signs for Rt. 100 South. Route 100 S. will become High St. in the Borough of West Chester. Stay on High St. until you come to Rosedale Ave. where the cornerstone of the University is located. Make a right and continue to the first traffic light. Make a right. About 100 yards, make a right onto North Campus Dr.

From New Jersey Turnpike (North or South)
Take Exit 6 for Pennsylvania Turnpike. Follow Pennsylvania Turnpike West for approximately 35 miles and take Exit 24, Valley Forge. Go about 1/4 mile to second exit, 26A, to Rt. 202 south. Merge left twice on Rt. 202 S. and continue for approximately 20 minutes. Go to second traffic light at Rosedale Ave. and turn left. Continue to the first traffic light. Make a right. About 100 yards, make a right onto North Campus Dr.

From Delaware, Maryland, Washington, and Delaware Memorial Bridge
Take Rt. 95 North through Wilmington to the exit for Rt. 202 N. (Concord Pike). Continue north on 202, following the signs for Business District, Rt. 322. Continue north on High St. to the second traffic light at Rosedale Ave. and turn left. Continue to the first traffic light. Make a right. About 100 yards, make a right onto North Campus Dr.

From Commodore Barry Bridge (New Jersey)
Coming from either north or south on New Jersey Rt. 295, follow signs for Rt. 322 West. Cross Commodore Barry Bridge and continue on 322 W. to Rt. 1. Turn left on Rt. 1 to Rt. 202 North. Follow directions above from Delaware, Maryland and Washington.

University Adm. and Athletics Director

University President Dr. Madeleine Wing Adler



Beginning July 1, 2008, Dr. Linda L. Lamwers, West Chester University's provost and vice president for academic affairs, assumed the duties of interim president. She will serve in that position while the University conducts a search for a new president.

Dr. Lamwers came to West Chester University as provost and vice president for academic affairs in 1995. Her responsibilities have included oversight of an \$80 million budget and five colleges (Arts and Sciences, Visual and Perform-

ing Arts, Education, Health Sciences, and Business and Public Affairs), the Honors College, the Office of Graduate Studies and Extended Education, the University's library, international studies, admissions, financial aid, the registrar, and student support services.

During her tenure at West Chester, she has co-chaired the University's strategic planning process, supported the development of several new academic programs in response to local and regional needs, and facilitated regional and global partnerships with a variety of educational institutions and businesses. As a result of her leadership, the University has also strengthened its academic programs through accreditation initiatives and the assessment of student learning outcomes. In addition, she helped to establish a summer minority teaching program, oversaw expansion of the University's Frederick Douglass Institute to the other 13 schools in the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, and has worked with faculty to enhance teaching, research, service, and outreach.

Dr. Lamwers completed her undergraduate studies in psychology at Douglass College and earned her master of science and doctorate in Cognitive and Developmental Psychology from Rutgers University. Her research has been in the areas of cognitive psychology, educational outcomes, pedagogy, planning for diversity, and minority student leadership development. Most recently, she has focused on broad higher education issues. She has published numerous articles and given more than 100 presentations at regional, national, and international professional meetings.

On the regional and national level, Dr. Lamwers is a member of the Finance and Development Committee of the American Council on Education Fellows Board, reviews periodic review reports for the Middle States Commission on Higher Education, and serves on the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education Tuition Equity Task Force. In the community, she has long been active in the Chester County March of Dimes and is a founding member of the Chester County Futures Board, which oversees scholarship and academic programs for talented high-risk, low-income high school students.

Director of Athletics Dr. Edward M. Matejkovic



Dr. Edward Matejkovic begins his 14th year as the director of athletics at West Chester University.

Under his guidance, West Chester's athletic program has soared to unprecedented heights, accomplishing goals never before imagined. The Golden Rams captured five Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) team titles during both the 2006-07 and 2007-08 campaigns. As a result, West Chester has claimed runner-up plaudits in the Dixon Trophy standings and placed a school-best 12th nationally in the U.S. Sports Academy Director's Cup Division II standings.

In the spring of 2008, West Chester's women's lacrosse squad won its second national championship in the last seven seasons, reaching the title game for the fifth consecutive year. The men's swimming squad also matched its highest finish at the 2008 NCAA Division II Swimming & Diving championships with a third-place showing.

Scholarship allotments have grown, along with the number of full-time coaching positions across West Chester's 24 intercollegiate programs. All of these changes have helped the university achieve its unparalleled success on the field.

Additionally, Matejkovic has helped spearhead a facility upgrade movement at the university that has resulted major upgrades to the newly dedicated Vonnie Gros Field behind Sturzebecker Health Science Center and a brand new state-of-the-art track surface at John A. Farrell Stadium. In conjunction with the new track surface, Farrell Stadium's football field received a brand new playing surface as the natural grass was replaced with FieldTurf.

Matejkovic's experience and success as an athletic administrator have earned him involvement in several conference and regional committees. Most recently, he was elected president of the D2 Athletic Director's Association by his peers. Matejkovic is a past president of the PSAC Executive Committee and continues to serve the PSAC on numerous other committees. He is also a member of the ECAC Board of Directors and the ECAC Finance Committee. He served as president of the ECAC during 2002-03.

An active member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA), Matejkovic served on the NCAA Student Athlete Reinstatement Committee, the NCAA Division II East Region men's basketball championship selection committee. He also served on the NCAA Football Task Force – a committee reviewing scholarship allocations in the sport.

The Coatesville, Pa., native earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from WCU, and his doctorate in Sports Administration/Athletic Facility Management from Temple University. Matejkovic joined the staff of SUNY Brockport in 1984 where he first served as an assistant professor and coordinator of the sport management program.

As head football coach from 1986-94, he racked up more wins in a single season, and in a career, than any coach in the school's history.

In 1990, he was named Brockport's athletic director and promptly turned the program around in just four years. Along with the successful Golden Eagles football team, Brockport's wrestling program won a national title and its volleyball team captured four straight SUNYAC crowns.

On September 22, 2001, Matejkovic was inducted into the Brockport Athletics Hall of Fame. In June of 2003, he was selected to the Temple University "Gallery of Success."

Matejkovic resides in Exton, Pa. He has two daughters, Jennifer Fitzgerald and Leigh Martini (WCU '98) and one son, Jude. He is also the proud grandfather of two grandchildren: Max Edward Martini and Audrey Judith Fitzgerald, who were both born in 2008.

Head Coach Damien Blair



Damien Blair was introduced as West Chester University's 26th men's basketball head coach July 10, replacing former head coach Dick DeLaney, who retired in May after 21 seasons along the

Golden Rams' sideline as the school's all-time winningest coach with 370 victories.

The program's second all-time leading scorer during his playing days, Blair becomes the program's fifth head coach since 1960 and the first African-American mentor in program history.

Blair led Downingtown High to the Ches-Mont League boys' basketball championship, the first title in school history, this past winter and a spot in the PIAA state playoffs for the fourth time during his tenure. Overall, Blair compiled a career record of 173-78 (.689) in his high school coaching career. This is Blair's first head coaching position on the collegiate level.

The rookie college mentor inherits a squad that finished 12-15 a year ago and missed the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) playoffs for the second straight campaign. The Golden Rams graduated just one player off that team while welcoming back team captain and second team All-PSAC East performer Kenneth St. George.

Blair leaves Downingtown High as the school's all-time winningest boy's basketball coach. He was named the West Chester Daily Local coach of the year as well as Ches-mont League coach of the year this past season.

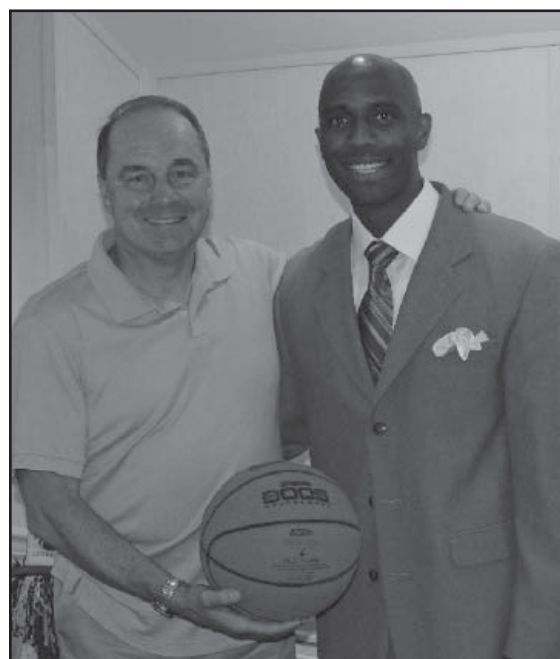
During his collegiate playing career, Blair set seven individual scoring records on the career, season and game levels. His 2,025 career points stands second all-time at West Chester University and seventh all-time in PSAC history. Only Kevin Givens (1980-84) scored more points (2,054) in a Golden Rams' uniform than Blair.

The flashy guard was a two-time PSAC East player of the year (1994, 1995) and four-time all-league selection, including three first team nods, during his illustrious playing career. Blair was inducted into the Messikomer Men's Basketball Hall of Fame at West Chester University in 2001.

Blair played semi-professional basketball with the Delaware Blue Bombers of the United States Basketball League for a brief stint after his college career came to a close and was invited to the Philadelphia 76ers tryout camp in 1996.

Blair received his bachelor's of science degree in Education from WCU in May 2006 and is a certified Health & Physical Education instructor in the state of Pennsylvania. He completed his master's in Athletic Administration from WCU in May 2007 and is currently working on his doctoral degree in Educational Leadership at Immaculata University.

Blair resides in Downingtown, Pa., with his wife, Carolyn, a 1997 graduate of West Chester University and former women's basketball player under current head coach Deirdre Kane as well as a women's soccer player under current men's coach Kendall Walkes. The couple has three children: Hunter (6), Dylan (4) and Autumn (2).

WCU Assistant Coaching Staff

Assistant Coach Roy Blumenthal



Roy Blumenthal, who earned his bachelor's degree in Sports Administration from West Chester University in 1983, enters his eighth season as top assistant coach for the men's basketball program.

He became the first full-time assistant basketball coach in school history in the spring of 2000. Blumenthal had spent the previous 11 years as a volunteer assistant at his alma mater.

In addition to his coaching duties, Blumenthal is the coordinator of all advertising sales for the Rams' Horn football

game day program. He also coordinates all summer camps for the men's basketball program.

Prior to coaching basketball at West Chester University, Blumenthal, who attended graduate school at Temple, was an assistant football coach at WCU from 1979-83. He assisted with the running backs and served as the JV offensive coordinator.

After graduating from WCU, Blumenthal moved on to coach three sports at Great Valley High School (basketball, baseball and football). He then served as the head coach of the Bishop Shanahan High School boys' basketball team during the 1987-88 campaign. Blumenthal was later named head baseball coach at Coatesville High School in 1988.

An active member of area athletics, Blumenthal is president of Global Sports, a group which deals in international sports exchanges.

Blumenthal and his wife, Barbara, reside in West Chester, Pa. Their oldest son Bob Kuehn (WCU '89) is an officer for the West Chester Police Department. He and his wife Liz (WCU '91) have three children, Bobby, Erin and Alex.

Blumenthal's daughter Debi Sheridan is a 1996 WCU graduate, along with her husband Scott ('91), who is the head trainer for the Philadelphia Phillies. They are proud parents of a son, Scott and daughter, Emilee.

Blumenthal's youngest son, Stephen ('01), played soccer at West Chester and currently serves as the men's soccer team's top assistant coach.

Assistant Coach Dane Watts



Dane Watts enters his first season as a volunteer assistant coach at West Chester University on the staff of first-year mentor Damien Blair.

Watts comes to West Chester from nearby Immaculata University where he served in a similar capacity with the Mighty Macs' men's basketball program.

Watts will be responsible for recruiting and in-game coaching while assisting the coaching staff in a plethora of roles this winter.

Last season, Watts helped lead the Mighty Macs to a record of 18-10 overall, with a mark of 11-5 in Pennsylvania Athletic Conference (PAC) and a second-place finish in the regular-season standings. Immaculata won the PAC postseason tournament and earned its first berth in the NCAA Division III Men's Basketball Tournament.

The Mighty Macs reached the PAC championship game in each of Watts' two seasons on the sideline, along with winning the title in 2007-08.

Upon his arrival to Immaculata, Watts had been an assistant coach at Conestoga High School. In his nine years at Conestoga, Watts helped lead the Pioneers to two Central League titles and a berth in the PIAA State Tournament.

Watts graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 1992 after playing three years of basketball for the Quakers. He played one season under Tom Snyder and two under current Temple University head coach Fran Dunphy. Before his arrival at Penn, he was a three-year starter at Conestoga and finished his prep career as the second all-time leading scorer. The two-time captain and two-time All-Central League honoree was inducted into the Conestoga High School Hall of Fame on Friday, November 3, 2006.

Assistant Coach David Krakower



David Krakower begins his first season on the West Chester University sideline as a volunteer assistant on the staff of first-year mentor Damien Blair.

Krakower returns to his alma mater after assisting Blair at Downingtown West High School for the past 10 years.

Krakower, in his first season of coaching at the collegiate level, will assist Blair and fellow assistant coaches Roy Blumenthal and Dane Watts with recruiting and in-game bench coaching.

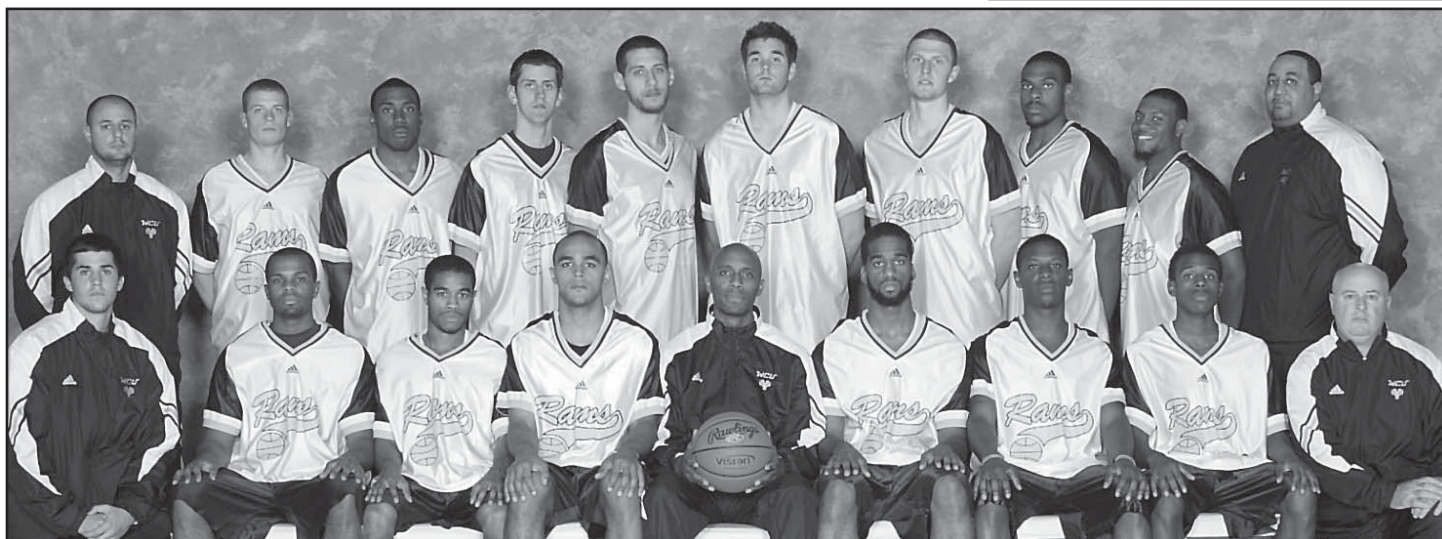

Youth Is How You Spell Golden Rams in 2008-09

There is a new sheriff in Hollinger Field House this winter and he is hard at work laying the foundation for his style of basketball and expectations of performance.

For the first time in 21 years, West Chester University will have a new face on its sideline guiding the fortunes of its men's basketball team. Former Golden Rams point guard and Messikomer Hall of Famer, Damien Blair, was introduced as the school's 26th head coach this past July.

Blair inherits a squad that finished 12-15 a year ago and missed the postseason for the second straight season. However, the first-year mentor who is in his first season as a college basketball head coach, likes what he has to build on for the 2008-09 campaign. The cornerstone of that foundation is junior guard Kenneth St. George, a returning second team all-leaguer.

"There are a lot of points in that number," Blair said, referring to St. George's familiar No. 12 that Blair donned during his playing days in the mid 1990s. "We will use him in a variety of ways. (St. George) is comfortable playing the point, but he can also be a scoring option."

Blair realizes that his reputation as an offensive-minded player conflicts with his defense-first coaching strategy. But he wants his Golden Rams to pick up the intensity defensively and rebound the basketball.

"I want to put the players in the best situ-

ation defensively that I can. Limit teams to one shot by being aggressive for 35 seconds. If we get on the defensive boards, keep people in front of us, and help each other out, than hopefully we will be in a lot of games.

"I like to play several different defenses. We will play a sagging man-to-man, an aggressive man-to-man full-court and a matchup man-to-man. The foundation is there in these players, and that has made the transition much easier.

West Chester, who was picked to finish seventh in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Eastern Division in the preseason coaches' poll, is coming off a 3-9 season in league play and a sixth-place showing. If Blair can avoid the injury bug that plagued the Golden Rams last winter, then West Chester can begin its long climb back into contention in the conference.

St. George has been the vocal leader of this team in the preseason and has done a wonderful job helping the other players pick up the new systems implemented by Blair and his coaching staff.

BACK COURT

"Defensively, (St. George) is our leader. He is our communicator and he gets everybody playing their role. Offensively, he is versatile too. He can play (shooting guard or small forward) because of his size and strength. We are going to use him in a variety of different situations."

St. George is the star in the backcourt, but his supporting cast will also bring a little something to the table.

Playing time will depend heavily upon who eventually develops. One newcomer making waves in the old gym on North Campus Drive is Sandy Tanner. Blair likes how this youngster has made the transition to the college game. Blair describes Tanner as somebody who could develop that same versatility that St. George covets.

"He is athletic," Blair explains. "He can guard anybody, and if you leave him, he can hurt you too."

Tanner is an example of that youth that permeates every spore of the Golden Rams' roster. He is also an example of the type of energy and effort that

West Chester will have to showcase night-in and night-out to be successful this winter.

Sophomore Isaiah McGhee returns after a freshman campaign that saw him receive playing time in a limited role. He will fight for a starting spot in the backcourt right away with St. George and Tanner when the Rams want to go with a small lineup.

Senior Kevin Stokes and junior Anthony Haley both return from one-year hiatus' from the program. How well they respond after having a year off will also play a role in their time on the hardwood this winter.

Chris VonTanhausen and Zack Harrison are both excellent shooters from the outside that will provide quality minutes in their roles. If defenses leave them alone, both can hurt you from the perimeter.

Roger White is a guard that saw plenty of playing time last season for former head coach Dick DeLaney. He returns with a lot of game experience, something many of the Golden Rams lack. Newcomer Kevon Davis will have to show what he has, if he is to contribute significantly in a very crowded backcourt

FRONT COURT

Center Ralph Hegamin will be the go-to guy in the middle for West Chester. How he handles the pressure of defenses collapsing on him will tell just how much he has matured over the summer and grown as a basketball player.

Hegs can take the ball outside as well. He is a very versatile player down low for Coach Blair. The Golden Rams need to benefit from that versatility and Hegamin's outside game to create match-up problems.

Kehinde Roberts is another versatile athlete, who can play many different roles on the court. Roberts is as adept outside as he is inside and can fill that swingman role offensively in a halfcourt offense.

Newcomer Greg Maugle and sophomore Kevin Gallagher provide a great deal of height in the frontcourt. Both are intimidating figures alongside Hegamin.

Thiel Benn should fight for a starting role up front as well after sitting out last season as a redshirt. Benn is imposing with the ability to penetrate off the dribble. He will be a much-needed addition to the equation for the Golden Rams.

Sam Scott's transition from football season to basketball can help, if it is a quick one. Jeremiah Runkle provides depth at forward as well.

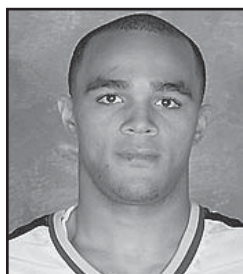
