

# Media Services

The 2011-12 West Chester University men's basketball media guide is designed to assist media in its coverage of the Golden Rams during the upcoming season.

Below is a list of media services available to help members of the media in their coverage of the Golden Rams' program. We hope you will take full advantage of the services offered by the sports information department, as we are here to serve you. Please make note of the following services available throughout the 2011-12 season. Should additional information be required, please do not hesitate to contact us.

## **CREDENTIALS**

All requests for working press, photo and broadcast credentials for West Chester's 2011-12 home men's basketball games should be made in writing on company letterhead at least 24 hours prior to the game for which credentials will be requested. Please direct all requests to James Zuhlke, sports information director, Sturzebecker HSC, Rm 220, West Chester University, West Chester, PA 19383. Requests may also be faxed to (610) 436-1020. All credentials that cannot be mailed can be picked up at the will call table in the lobby of Hollinger Field House.

## **PRESS ROW**

Because of the limited space available along Hollinger Field House press row, media agencies covering the visiting team will be given priority, along with West Chester's media outlets that cover the Golden Rams' men's basketball program on a regular basis. Media seating is located at center court between the two lower level bleachers on the side opposite the team benches. Electronic media covering the game are given priority on the lower level in front. Print media may sit on the risers behind the electronic media to cover the game.

## **STATISTICAL SERVICES**

Prior to tipoff, media will be provided a game program with rosters and notified of any unusual lineup changes.

During the game, quickie stats will be distributed at each media timeout and a box score at the end of the half and the end of the game. A running play-by-play will be provided at the conclusion of the game only.

Following the game, a complete postgame statistical package will be distributed to media containing a box score with individual statistics and complete play-by-play. Postgame statistical packages will be available approximately 15 minutes after the conclusion of the game.

## **RADIO/TELEVISION**

### **BROADCASTS**

Internet, radio and television stations seeking permission to broadcast games from Hollinger Field House should contact West Chester University's sports information department at least one week prior to the game. Courtesy lines are available courtside in Hollinger Field House to accommodate visiting and home radio broadcasts. Internet, radio and TV stations using the courtesy line must call collect, or take an incoming call to broadcast. All broadcasters must be set up 40 minutes prior to tipoff. Electronic media covering the game are asked to set up on the lower level in front.

### **POSTGAME INTERVIEWS**

Postgame interviews featuring players and coaches from both teams will be conducted approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the contest inside the Reese Room, adjacent to the basketball court and next to the sports information office.

West Chester head coach and players will go first in an interview setting with the visiting team head coach and players to immediately follow.

### **PHOTOGRAPHY**

Credentials for sideline photographers are available by contacting James Zuhlke in West Chester University's sports information office at: (610) 436-3316 with priority given to those agencies covering the participating schools on a regular basis.

Photographers can pick up game programs at the entrance to the seating area or along press row prior to the contest.

### **SCOUTING**

Scouts must pay their own way into the contest and sit in the bleachers during games. There will be no special seating for professional scouts during men's and women's basketball contests.

### **Directions to Hollinger Field House**

#### **From Philadelphia**

Take I-95 South to Exit 3A to merge onto US-322 West (Conchester Hwy toward West Chester). Turn left at US-1 West (Baltimore Pike). Turn right at US-202 North (Wilmington Pike). Turn left onto PA-926 West (Street Rd). Take first right onto S. New St. Stadium is approx. 2 miles up on the right.

#### **From Western Pennsylvania (PA Turnpike)**

Take Pennsylvania Turnpike to Exit 312 (PA-100 and West Chester/Pottstown). Stay left after toll booth onto PA-100 South toward West Chester. Follow PA-100 to US-202 South. Exit onto US-202 S. Exit at Business District/West Chester University onto High St. Turn left at Rosedale Ave. Turn left at S. New St. Stadium is approximately 3/4 mile down on the left-hand side.

#### **From New Jersey Turnpike (North or South)**

Follow PA Turnpike West for approximately 35 miles and take Exit 326 for Valley Forge. Take Exit 328A for US-202 South (Swedesford Rd., West Chester/Pottstown). Keep left at the fork and merge onto US-202 S. Exit onto US-202 S. Exit at Business District/West Chester University onto High St. Turn left at Rosedale Ave. Turn left at S. New St. Stadium is approx. 3/4 mile away.

#### **From Delaware, Maryland, Washington, and Delaware Memorial Bridge**

Take I-95 North to Exit 8 onto US-202 North/Concord Pike toward West Chester. Continue to follow US-202 N. into Pennsylvania. Turn left onto PA-926 West (Street Rd). Take first right onto S. New St. Stadium is approximately 2 miles up on the right.

#### **From Commodore Barry Bridge (New Jersey)**

Take Exit 3A to merge onto US-322 West (Conchester Hwy toward West Chester). Turn left at US-1 West (Baltimore Pike). Turn right at US-202 North (Wilmington Pike). Turn left onto PA-926 West (Street Rd). Take first right onto S. New St. Stadium is approximately 2 miles up on the right.

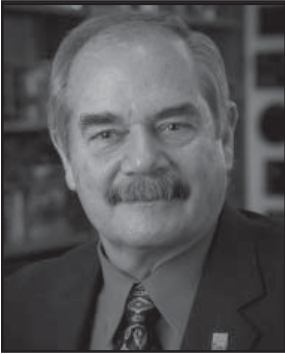

# University Administration and Athletics Director

## University President Dr. Greg R. Weisenstein



Greg R. Weisenstein began his third year as West Chester University's 14th president. Since 2005, he had served as provost and vice president for academic affairs at the University of North Dakota, where he collaborated with faculty and staff to enhance his institution's curricular strengths, promote shared governance, expand collaboration with the community, diversify and develop the university's resource base, increase undergraduate and graduate enrollments, and elevate the visibility of the University of North Dakota in the region, country, and world.

He also led a diversity strategic plan for the university, revised and strengthened the general education programs, and worked with student government to implement such initiatives as a leadership minor and the expanded community involvement that helped place UND among the first universities to receive the Carnegie Foundation's new Community Engagement Classification.

From 1999 until he joined the University of North Dakota administration, Dr. Weisenstein served Montana State University as dean of the College of Education, Health, and Human Development. Earlier, he was dean of the School of Education at the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs. During his tenure as an academic dean, he established strong regional partnerships, developed significant revenue sources for his college, strengthened participatory governance, expanded enrollment, and developed new degree and licensure programs to serve his state.

Among his other extensive experience, Dr. Weisenstein has been an associate dean for research at Clemson University; the coordinator of secondary special education, rehabilitation, and vocational education for the University of Washington; and an assistant professor of education at the University of Oregon.

On a regional level, Dr. Weisenstein has chaired and held positions on a variety of committees focusing on educational improvement, quality of life, and economic development, including a three-year term as a director of the Greater Colorado Springs Economic Development Corporation. Nationally, in addition to serving on presidential advisory committees under presidents Jimmy Carter, Ronald Reagan, and George H. W. Bush, he was among a small number of education deans selected to discuss national education policy with President George W. Bush and First Lady Laura Bush in the White House in 2002.

Dr. Weisenstein is also an experienced international negotiator and facilitator. Working for the U.S. Department of State, he was responsible for leading restructuring of higher education in the Republic of Moldova. He serves as chairperson of the World Bank Education Task Force for the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges and was the chief negotiator for international agreements in Brazil and in Western, Central, and Eastern Europe, including direct talks with former Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev.

Weisenstein received his bachelor's degree in history and geology and his master's degree in special education from the University of Washington and earned his doctorate in administration and special education from the University of Kansas. He is the author of more than 65 publications, including four books. His numerous honors include State Educator of the Year, Best Program of the Year, and the Teaching and Advising Excellence Award.

Sandra L. Weisenstein, the former Sandra DeBlasio, has headed philanthropic organizations and served on various boards promoting the arts and humanities in the communities where she and Dr. Weisenstein have lived.

The Weisensteins raised three children together and have four grandchildren.

## Director of Athletics Dr. Edward M. Matejkovic



Dr. Edward M. Matejkovic (matt-a-KO-vik) begins his 17th year as the director of athletics at West Chester University. A 1969 graduate of WCU, Matejkovic also spent 12 years at SUNY Brockport, a Division III school located in Western New York, where he served as the athletics director in addition to head coach of both the football team and the track & field squads during his time there.

Under his guidance, West Chester's athletic program has soared to unprecedented heights, accomplishing goals never before imagined. The Golden Rams have placed in the top five in the Dixon Trophy standings – awarded to the PSAC member institution whose athletic program earns the best overall finish in conference championships and/or regular-season play – in each of the past four seasons. West Chester University's athletic program placed a school-best 12th nationally in the NACDA Cup standings in 2007.

The past president of the Division II Athletic Director's Association, a chapter of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA), Matejkovic was named the Northeast Region Division II Athletic Director of the Year by NACDA in June 2009.

In the spring of 2008, West Chester's women's lacrosse squad won its second national championship, reaching the title game for the fifth consecutive year. The men's swimming squad also matched its highest finish at the 2008 NCAA Division II Swimming & Diving championships with a third-place showing. The Golden Rams' baseball team reached the Division II national finals for the second time in three years in May 2009.

Those performances were followed up by the women's swimming team's fourth-place finish at the 2010 NCAA Division II Championships and the women's lacrosse team's return to the NCAA DII Championship Game for the sixth time.

Scholarship allotments have grown, along with the number of full-time head coaches and assistant coaches across West Chester's 24 intercollegiate programs – the largest intercollegiate athletic program in all of Division II.

Additionally, Matejkovic has helped spearhead a facility upgrade movement at the university that has resulted in the newly dedicated Vonnie Gros Field behind Sturzebecker Health Science Center and a brand new state-of-the-art track surface at John A. Farrell Stadium. In conjunction with the new track surface, Farrell Stadium's football field received a brand new playing surface as the natural grass was replaced with Field-Turf.

Matejkovic is also a past president of the PSAC Executive Committee and continues to serve the PSAC on numerous other committees. He is also a member of the ECAC Board of Directors, the ECAC Finance Committee and the ECAC Membership Committee. He served as president of the ECAC during 2002-03.

An active member of the NCAA, Matejkovic served on the NCAA Student Athlete Reinstatement Committee, the NCAA Division II East Region men's basketball championship selection committee and the men's golf championship selection committee. He recently served on the NCAA to the Football Task Force – a committee reviewing scholarship allocations in the sport.

The Coatesville, Pa., native earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from WCU, and his doctorate in Sports Administration/Athletic Facility Management from Temple University. Matejkovic joined the staff of SUNY Brockport in 1984 where he first served as an assistant professor and coordinator of the sport management program.

Matejkovic resides in Exton, Pa. He has two daughters, Jennifer Fitzgerald and Leigh Martini (WCU '98) and one son, Jude. He is also the proud grandfather of two grandchildren: Max Edward Martini and Audrey Judith Fitzgerald, who were both born in 2008.

# Head Coach Damien Blair



Head coach Damien Blair enters his fourth season at West Chester University hoping to build upon his team's success over the past three years and turn the corner with his alma mater.

Last winter, West Chester finished 14-12 overall and 5-9 in conference play for the second straight campaign. Unfortunately, the Golden Rams were left out of the playoff picture. Blair has re-tooled his lineup for the coming season and should be in the hunt to return his alma mater to the postseason where he had them his first year on the sideline.

In 2009-10, Blair led the Golden Rams to a 16-11 overall record and a 5-9 conference mark during one of the most competitive league slates in quite some time. That season's Eastern Division champion suffered five losses in conference play.

It will be Blair's mission this winter to return his Golden Rams to the postseason after missing out a year ago with the team's sixth-place finish. Blair led West Chester to the PSAC postseason tournament in his first season on the sideline in 2008-09, after inheriting a squad that had not reached the playoffs the previous two campaigns.

One of the top point guards in school history, Blair made a big splash in his first season as head coach at his alma mater. The Golden Rams finished 18-10 overall and 9-5 in conference play, finishing third overall in the Eastern Division and leading the Rams to the quarter-finals of the PSAC postseason tournament. A loss to cross-town rival Cheyney ended Blair's inaugural season prematurely.

In just two short seasons on the bench, Blair has mentored three first-team All-PSAC players and four all-leaguers total. Last year's first team all-league selection, Ralph Hegamin, has continued his basketball career playing overseas in Portugal. Hegamin was also an All-ECAC pick and two-time Herb Good all-star selection under Blair's tutelage.

Additionally, one former Golden Ram was named to the PSAC academic honor roll both years with Blair while also being named a two-time recipient of the Arthur Ashe Scholar-Athlete Award.

The program's second all-time leading scorer during his playing days, Blair became the program's fifth head coach since 1960 and the first African-American mentor in program

history in July 2008.

He made the leap into the college game from the high school ranks where he led nearby Downingtown High School to the Ches-Mont League boys' basketball championship, the first title in school history, in 2007 and a spot in the PIAA state playoffs for the fourth time during his tenure. Overall, Blair compiled a high school career coaching record of 173-78 (.689).

Blair left Downingtown High as the school's all-time winningest boy's basketball coach. He was named the *Daily Local* coach of the year as well as Ches-mont League coach of the year his final season.

During his collegiate playing career, Blair set seven individual scoring records on the career, season and game levels. His 2,025 career points stands second all-time at West Chester University and ninth all-time in PSAC history.

The flashy guard was a two-time PSAC East player of the year (1994, 1995) and four-time all-league selection, including three first team nods, during his illustrious playing career. Blair was inducted into the Messikomer Men's Basketball Hall of Fame at West Chester University in 2001.

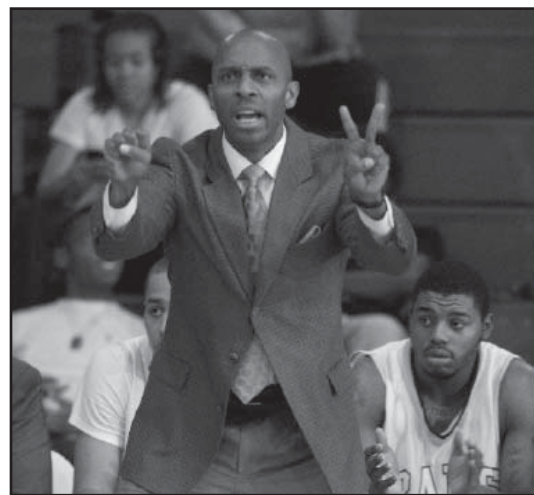
Blair played semi-professional basketball with the Delaware Blue Bombers of the United States Basketball League for a brief stint after his college career came to a close and was invited to the Philadelphia 76ers tryout camp in 1996.

Blair received his bachelor's of science degree in Education from WCU in May 2006 and is a certified Health & Physical Education instructor in the state

of Pennsylvania. He completed his master's in Athletic Administration from WCU in May 2007.

Blair resides in Downingtown, Pa., with his wife, Carolyn, a 1997 graduate of West Chester University and former women's basketball player under current head coach Deirdre Kane as well as a women's soccer player under current men's coach Kendall Walkes. The couple has four children: Hunter (9), Dylan (7), Autumn (5) and Hayden (3).

# WCU Assistant Coaching Staff

## Assistant Coach Roy Blumenthal



Roy Blumenthal, who earned his bachelor's degree in Sports Administration from West Chester University in 1983, enters his 12th season as top assistant coach for the men's basketball program and 24th overall.

He became the first full-time assistant basketball coach in school history in the spring of 2000. Blumenthal had spent the previous 12 years as a volunteer assistant at his alma mater.

In addition to his coaching duties, Blumenthal coordinates all summer camps

for the men's basketball program.

Prior to coaching basketball at West Chester University, Blumenthal, who attended graduate school at Temple, was an assistant football coach at WCU from 1979-83. He assisted with the running backs and served as the JV offensive coordinator.

After graduating from WCU, Blumenthal moved on to coach three sports at Great Valley High School (basketball, baseball and football). He then served as the head coach of the Bishop Shanahan High School boys' basketball team during the 1987-88 campaign. Blumenthal was later named head baseball coach at Coatesville High School in 1988.

An active member of area athletics, Blumenthal is president of Global Sports, a non-profit organization which deals in international sports exchanges. Blumenthal has also been the Head Coach of Select College all star teams to Belgium, Germany, Italy, France, Czech Republic and England.

Blumenthal was awarded the West Chester University Men's Hall of Fame Milt Blitz Award in 2007 for outstanding contribution to the game of basketball by a West Chester Alum.

Blumenthal was also a member of the West Chester University Golf Coaching Staff which won the PSAC Championship in 2006.

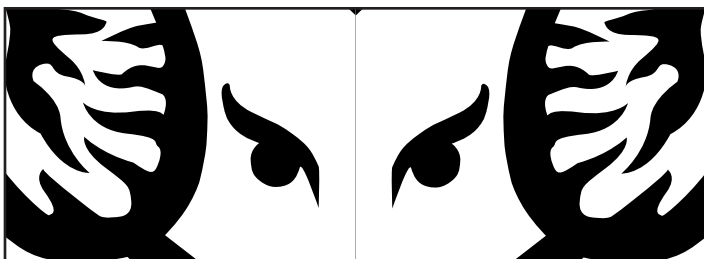
## Assistant Coach David Krakower
