## History of the WIAC

On July 1, 1997, the face of intercollegiate athletics in Wisconsin changed dramatically. At that time, the nine members of the former Wisconsin State University Conference (WSUC) and the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WWIAC) joined together to form a single conference -- The Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

The WIAC member institutions are:

UW-Eau Claire	UW-Stevens Point
UW-La Crosse	UW-Stout
UW-Oshkosh	UW-Superior
UW-Platteville	UW-Whitewater
UW-River Falls	

Each of the nine institutions is a part of the University of Wisconsin System, and each competes at the NCAA Division III level. For 26 years, the WSUC and WWIAC operated as separate men's and women's conferences. In 1996, the University of Wisconsin System determined that the two conferences should be merged into a single conference under the direction of one conference office and commissioner.

Gustavus Adolphus College (Minn.), Hamline University (Minn.) and Winona State University (Minn.) became members of the conference in the sport of women's gymnastics during the 2004-05 academic year. Effective with the 2009-10 academic year, Finlandia University (Mich.) joined the conference in men's soccer.

The conference office is located in Madison.

## Quick Facts about the WIAC

- The WIAC competes at the NCAA Division III level.
- WIAC student-athletes compete without the benefit of athletic aid or scholarships. They compete for the love of their game.
- Over 5,000 student-athletes participate in the WIAC each year.
- The WIAC is the ninth-oldest conference in the NCAA and is celebrating its 100th year during the 2012-13 academic year.
- The nine institutions of the WIAC have a total student enrollment of approximately 70,000.
- Over 300,000 WIAC alumni currently reside within the state of Wisconsin.
- In the last 10 years, 46 national championship team titles have been crowned by the WIAC.
- The WIAC has captured more NCAA national championships than any other Division III conference in history. Championships have been won in 14 different sports, including: baseball, men's basketball, women's basketball, men's cross country, women's cross country, football, men's golf, men's ice hockey, men's indoor track, women's indoor track, men's outdoor track, women's outdoor track, women's softball and women's volleyball. It is no wonder the WIAC is commonly referred to as the "Conference of Champions."
- Over 80 percent of all student-athletes competing in the WIAC are products of Wisconsin high schools. The WIAC is truly the "Conference of Wisconsin."
- WIAC student-athletes are students first and athletes second. Each year, dozens of our student-athletes are named to regional and national Academic All-America Teams. Nearly 50 percent of the student-athletes competing in the WIAC achieve a 3.0 grade point average or better.

■ Each year, the WIAC is selected to host a number of NCAA National Championships. These championships bring nationwide recognition to our institutions, as well as thousands of competitors and spectators to our State each year.

■ Year in and year out, WIAC institutions rank near the top of the Learfield Sports Directors' Cup final standings, symbolizing the finest all-around Division III collegiate programs in the country. The 2011-12 final standings found five of the nine WIAC institutions in the Top 31-- UW-Whitewater (5th), UW-Eau Claire (15th), UW-Oshkosh (17th), UW-La Crosse (28th) and UW-Stevens Point (31st). These rankings are even more remarkable when considering there are nearly 450 institutions in Division III.

■ In 2006, the WIAC became the first and only conference in the history of Division III to enter into its own television broadcast agreement resulting in dozens of WIAC regular-season and championship events appearing on Fox Sports North, Fox Sports Wisconsin and Charter OnDemand.

## **WIAC Corporate Partner Program**

The WIAC Corporate Partner Program was the first of its kind for a Division III conference. The program is intended to align the WIAC with reputable, high-profile corporations in a partnership based on a principle of "mutual benefit". The WIAC benefits from receiving revenue dollars that will permit the conference to continue, and in some instances, enhance its many programs and services. In turn, each participating corporation receives the benefit of being associated with the premier Division III conference in the country and the multitude of exposure opportunities such a relationship can provide.

# 2013 WIAC Championship Preview



University of Wisconsin-Whitewater will aim for a second consecutive crown at the 2013 Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) Wrestling Championship at UW-Eau Claire's McPhee Physical Education Center on Feb. 17.

The Warhawks captured the 13th first-place trophy in program listings a season ago with 108.50 points. UW-La Crosse placed second with 96 points, UW-Stevens Point third with 70.50, UW-Oshkosh fourth with 66, UW-Eau Claire fifth with 14 and UW-Platteville sixth with nine.

For the first time in the 58-year history of the event, this year's conference champion will be crowned using a dual-meet format. The six teams earned seeds based on their performances in the regular-season round robin WIAC schedule. UW-Whitewater secured the top seed after compiling a 5-0 mark, while UW-La Crosse is second (4-1), UW-Stevens Point third (3-2), UW-Oshkosh fourth (2-3), UW-Platteville fifth (1-4) and UW-Eau Claire sixth (0-5).

The Warhawks are ranked fourth nationally in the National Wrestling Coaches Association NCAA Division III poll distributed on Feb. 13, while UW-La Crosse is fifth and UW-Stevens Point ninth.

In individual weight class national rankings by D3wrestle.com released on Feb. 5, WIAC representatives include: UW-La Crosse's Izzy Balsiger (10th-125 pounds), Billy Mayer (5th-285 pounds), Kevin O'Brien (9th-174 pounds), and Adam Sheley (1st-141 pounds); UW-Oshkosh's Nazar Kulchytskyy (2nd-165 pounds) and Dan Schiferl (8th-174 pounds); UW-Stevens Point's Ryan Conat (6th-174 pounds), Jordan Kust (9th-141 pounds), Jordan Schulte (6th-165 pounds), and Dustin Wozniak (5th-197 pounds); and UW-Whitewater's Anthony Edgren (10th-285 pounds), Jake Fredricksen (5th-141 pounds), and Shane Siefert (8th-197 pounds).

D3wrestle.com also lists 10 contenders and 10 honorable mention selections in each weight class. The WIAC has six student-athletes who are contenders and three honorable mentions.

Qualification for the NCAA Division III Championship will be based on regional competition held March 2. UW-Eau Claire, UW-Oshkosh and UW-Platteville will compete in a regional hosted by Augsburg College (Minn.), while UW-La Crosse, UW-Stevens Point and UW-Whitewater will travel to Elmhurst College (Ill.). The national championship will be held March 15-16 in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

## WIAC Scholar-Athlete

The WIAC Scholar-Athlete Award is named after Max Sparger, who served as commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference for 22 years from 1971-93. He oversaw the transition of the conference from NAIA to full NCAA membership. Sparger arrived at UW-Stout in 1959 and served the institution in a variety of capacities, including as an assistant football and basketball coach, head wrestling coach and head football coach. He served as UW-Stout's athletics director from 1969-71.

In order to be nominated for the scholar-athlete award, a student-athlete must have a minimum 3.50 grade point average. In addition, he must be in his last year of competition, or on schedule to graduate this academic year, and have competed for a minimum of two years.







# 2012 Championship Recap



University of Wisconsin-Whitewater claimed the 2012 Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WIAC) wrestling title at UW-Whitewater's Williams Center on Feb. 26, 2012.

The Warhawks secured the 13th first-place trophy in program history with 108.50 points. Fourteen-time defending champion UW-La Crosse placed second with 96 points, UW-Stevens Point third with 70.50, UW-Oshkosh fourth with 66, UW-Eau Claire fifth with 14 and UW-Platteville sixth with nine.

UW-Whitewater's championship effort was led by five individuals who captured titles. Adam Latella successfully defended his crown at 197 pounds with a 3-2 decision over UW-La Crosse's Zach Strickland.

Grant Sutter was victorious at 125 pounds with a 9-0 major decision over UW-Oshkosh's Zachary Mueller. Cade Sarbacker earned a 14-6 major decision over UW-Oshkosh's Jose Quintana to win the 149-pound bracket.

The Warhawks' David Dwyer was triumphant at 184 pounds with a 3-1 overtime decision over UW-Oshkosh's Sam Engelland. Dwyer's title is the first in program history for UW-Whitewater. Corey Anderson became UW-Whitewater's first 285 pound champion since 1989 with a 8-0 major decision over UW-La Crosse's Billy Mayer.

UW-La Crosse secured four individual titles as Bebeto Yewah won the 141-pound title for the second straight year with a 24-9 technical fall over UW-Whitewater's Elroy Perkin. Yewah was selected the John Peterson Wrestler of the Meet for his efforts.

Mike Schmitz became the first individual in WIAC history to win four 174-pound titles after he beat U-Oshkosh's Dan Schiferl by a 7-5 margin. Adam Sheley secured his second straight championship at 133 pounds with a 8-0 major decision over UW-Stevens Point's Joe Mileski. Kevin O'Brien was victorious at 165 pounds with a 8-6 decision over UW-Whitewater's Cedric Gibson.

UW-Oshkosh's Nazar Kulchitskyy became the first individual in program listings to win the 157-pound crown with a 22-9 major decision over UW-Stevens Point's Ben Strobel.

UW-Oshkosh's Zachary Mueller received the Max Sparger Scholar-Athlete Award, while his coach, Chris Stratton was selected the Mertz Mortorelli Coach of the Year.

An All-Sportsmanship Team was chosen for individuals that displayed exemplary sportsmanship throughout the season. It included one member from each school. Named to the squad were: UW-Eau Claire's Joe Pitsch; UW-La Crosse's Zach Strickland; UW-Oshkosh's Alex Mueller; UW-Platteville's Austin Holland; UW-Stevens Point's Andy Borchardt; and UW-Whitewater's Jake Fredricksen.

All 10 WIAC champions, along with six wild card qualifiers, will participate in the NCAA Division III Championship in La Crosse, Wis. The national event will be hosted by UW-La Crosse at the La Crosse Center March 9-10. Individuals securing wild card spots included: UW-La Crosse's Billy Mayer (285 pounds); UW-Oshkosh's Sam Engelland (184 pounds); UW-Platteville's T.J. Wunnicke (133 pounds); UW-Stevens Point's Joe Mileski (133 pounds) and Ben Strobel (157 pounds); and UW-Whitewater's Jake Fredricksen (133 pounds).

# Happy 100th, WIAC

**D**on't be alarmed if there's an abundance of candlelit cheesecakes next year at Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference campuses. That's because the WIAC is celebrating its 100th birthday in 2012-13.

The nine-member league is among the 10 oldest conferences in the NCAA and the winningest in Division III. Its 92 NCAA championships in 15 sports – including 39 in the last 10 years – is tops among the division's 42 leagues (and that doesn't even include the many NAIA titles and National Collegiate Gymnastics Association crowns WIAC schools have captured).

But the WIAC's uniqueness doesn't stop there.

- The WIAC is one of only a few conferences whose members are from the same university system.

- Seven of the nine WIAC schools (Superior, River Falls, Stevens Point, La Crosse, Oshkosh, Whitewater and Platteville) are charter members. Stout joined the conference in 1914, followed by Eau Claire in 1917.

- The nine WIAC institutions have a total student enrollment of about 70,000.

- Eighty percent of WIAC student-athletes are products of Wisconsin high schools.

- More than 350,000 WIAC alumni reside within the state.

With a pedigree like that, the WIAC's 100th birthday will be a biggie.

The official "party" is a centennial celebration and hall of fame banquet Aug. 4 at the Alliant Energy Center in Madison. But there's also a documentary being produced, a two-year calendar, commissioned artwork (see more about the artist on page 14), the inaugural WIAC Hall of Fame class and selection of all-time WIAC teams to add to the festivities.

WIAC Commissioner Gary Karner, who was appointed in 1996 to oversee the merging of the WIAC's men's and women's subsets, has been beating a trail of speaking engagements at Kiwanis and Rotary Clubs across the state since August, even though the actual anniversary isn't for several months. Some people have approached him after his presentation to tell him in a polite way that he's nuts.

"Yes, I've had people say what we're doing appears overwhelming," Karner said interpretively. "And it's true that I don't know of any other conference – there may be some – to have gone to the extent that we are to celebrate a 100th anniversary. But what I say is that this is arguably the most accomplished Division III conference in the history of the NCAA. Our goal is to celebrate our centennial in a manner that is commensurate with that success."

The timing of such a celebration is challenging because of the slumping economy, but Karner dutifully pointed out that "delaying" a 100th anniversary would be, well, difficult. Despite the tough times, though, almost all of the extracurriculars are being funded through donations and sponsorships.

And people in the Badger State appear ready to party on behalf of their Division III colleagues. Karner said many of the Rotarians say they're inspired to pay more attention to the league this year because of what he's told them. That should be fairly easy to do, given that almost every city, town and burg in the state has a WIAC connection. With so many WIAC student-athletes coming from Wisconsin high schools, Karner said everyone knows one another, from Whitewater to Superior.

"Our kids played with and against each other in high school," Karner said. "Many of our coaches

came up through the high school ranks in the state. Many of our conference members are even on a first-name basis with our game officials – which is both good and bad. We have football teams on which every member of the roster is from Wisconsin. I don't think there's anything like it in college sports."

To be sure, the WIAC is a close-knit bunch, but will the folks at Oshkosh hang the WIAC calendar on months when Eau Claire is featured? Karner thinks so.

"We have this sense of togetherness that allows us to do things together as a conference that a lot of other conferences wouldn't even consider," he said. "Now that doesn't mean that Whitewater and Platteville aren't trying to beat each other in football – the competitive




