ALL-SPORTS COMPETITION

1990-91 NAIA-Sports Information Directors Association All-Sports Competition

Lubbock Christian University TX and Simon Fraser University BC won the men's and women's divisions, respectively, of the 1990-91 NAIA-Sports Information Directors Association (NAIA-SIDA) All-Sports Contest.

The contest was established in 1969. The contest measures the success of an institution's overall athletics program by the accumulation of points in post-season competition on the district, area and national levels. The two institutions will receive trophies symbolic of their championships.

Lubbock Christian claimed its first men's All-Sports championship with national championships in men's cross country and indoor track and field. The Chaparrals also tied for second in outdoor track and field to outdistance second place finisher Simon Fraser BC, 160-125. Central State University OH finished third with 120 points.

Simon Fraser gained the women's title with a national championship in swimming and diving and top five finishes in indoor and outdoor track and field. The Lady Clan also picked up points in basketball.

In the men's program, 177 institutions scored points while 146 institutions scored in the women's program. Three institutions, Simon Fraser BC, Adams State CO and Central State OH, finished in the top 10 in both the men's and women's programs.

35th ANNUAL NAIA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT

May 24-31, 1991

Lewis-Clark State College, Lewiston, Idaho

Senior pitcher Joe Misa allowed five hits and Greg Umfleet had three hits, including a two-run single in the fifth inning, as Lewis-Clark State College, Lewiston, Idaho, shut out Oral Roberts University, Tulsa, Oklahoma, 7-0, to capture the 1991 NAIA World Series at Harris Field. It was the fifth straight and seventh NAIA baseball national championship in eight years for the Warriors, who finished the season with a 48-7 record. Lewis-Clark State, which completed its season with a perfect 32-0 home record, scored five runs in the second inning to put the game away. The Warriors went unbeaten for the third time in the national tournament while Oral Roberts, 60-15, ended up 3-2 in the series. Umfleet, who batted .476 in the series, was named the Most Valuable Player. Lewis-Clark State's Brandy Bengoechea was the recipient of the Golden Glove Award while Allen Gum of Southern Arkansas won the Charles Berry Hustle Award. North Florida's Sid Roberson was named the Rawlings/NAIA Player of the Year.

Senior forward Annette Wiles scored 28 points, including 20 in the first half, to help Fort Hays State University, Hays, Kansas, capture its first NAIA women's basketball national championship by defeating Southwestern Oklahoma State University, Weatherford, Oklahoma, 57-54, in the championship game. Southwestern Oklahoma's defeat was its first in an NAIA women's basketball championship contest in six title games. Wiles, the tournament's Most Valuable Player, scored 150 points and grabbed 79 rebounds in five games. Lady Tigers' guard Petrece Faulkner was the recipient of the Hustle Award while Fort Hays State Head Coach John Klein was named NAIA National Coach of the Year. The tournament was the first NAIA women's basketball championship to have a 32-team field.

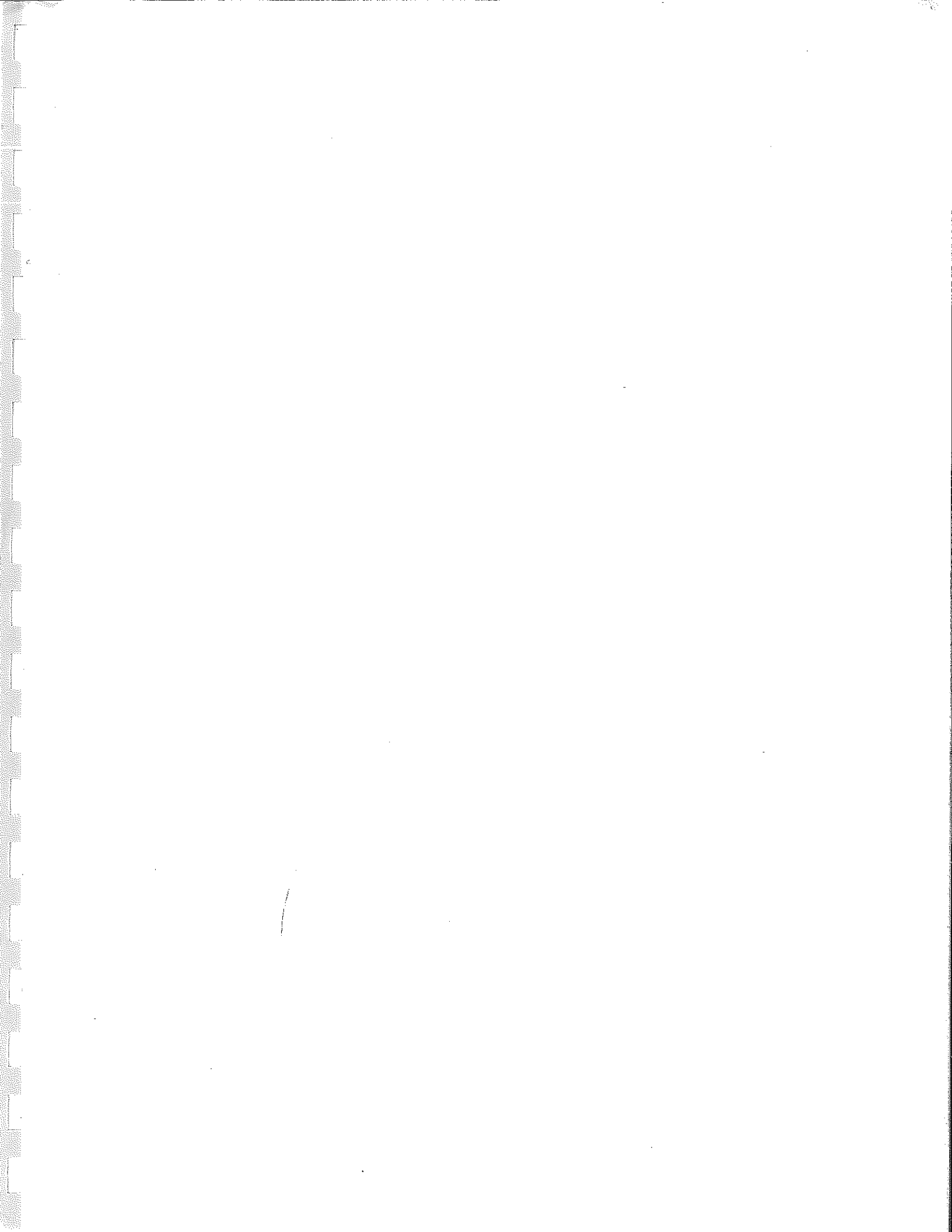

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS

Never before in the history of intercollegiate athletics has the spotlight shone so brightly on the athletics programs and championships involving the nation's institutions of higher learning. The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) accepts the challenge of integrating competitive athletics participation with the overall educational experience.

The NAIA is a completely autonomous association currently administering intercollegiate athletics programs to nearly 500 fully-accredited colleges and universities throughout the United States and in Canada. The Association is organized into 32 geographic districts.

Approximately 80,000 student-athletes participate annually in NAIA-sanctioned varsity athletics programs. Comprising of approximately 40 percent of all four-year collegiate athletics programs offered in the United States, the Association administers 23 separate championships covering 13 sports.

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB), the Association emanated from the "National Small College Basketball Tournament" inaugurated in 1937 in Kansas City, Missouri.

The conversion of the NAIB to the NAIA came in 1952 when the Association added

national championships in golf, tennis and outdoor track and field. Baseball, cross country, football, and swimming and diving were added to the championship calendar in 1956. More recent additions include indoor track and field, soccer, softball, volleyball and wrestling.

In keeping with the philosophy of the NAIA, the registrars, faculty athletics representatives, and chief executive officers of NAIA member institutions participate in the governance of the

Association alongside athletics directors, coaches, and district and affiliated conference officials.

Eligibility rules within the NAIA govern play in all sports recognized by the Association, not just postseason competition. Eligibility guidelines must be adhered to by all member institutions, including those holding dual affiliations.

Current NAIA academic eligibility requirements mandate that all student-athletes exhibit demonstrated progress toward an academic degree throughout their collegiate careers for the duration of their athletics eligibility.

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics stands prepared to administer programs and championships which provide "education through athletics" for each and every NAIA student-athlete.

NAIA STATEMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

The purpose of the NAIA is to promote the education and development of students through intercollegiate athletics participation. Our institutions, although varied and diverse, share a common commitment to high standards and the principle that athletics serve as an integral part of education.



HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE/ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

The NAIA was the first intercollegiate organization to conduct a national basketball tournament, the first to admit into full membership historically black institutions, the first to hold national championship events for both men and women, and the first to establish high academic standards and normal progress rules.

NAIA ALL-AMERICA SCHOLAR-ATHLETE PROGRAM

The NAIA All-America Scholar-Athlete program, a long-standing Association tradition, recognizes varsity student-athletes of Junior or Senior standing with a grade point average of 3.5 or better. In 1990-91, 587 NAIA student-athletes representing 220 institutions and each of the 13 NAIA-sanctioned sports, were so honored.

EQUAL VOICE/PRESIDENTIAL LEADERSHIP

The NAIA is built on the democratic process with each institution having an equal voice in all governance matters. Meaningful involvement of college and university presidents in the governance process was a significant step taken by the NAIA and is carried on today through the Association's 32-member Council of Presidents.
