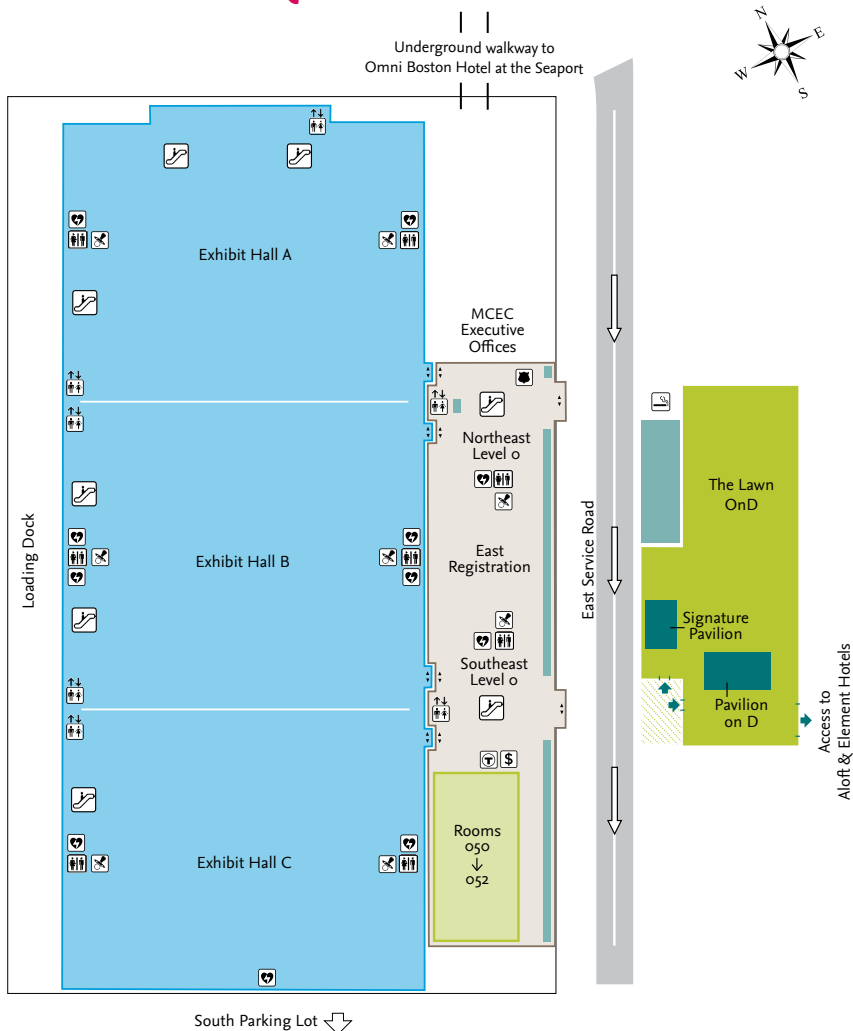
Seaport District Map

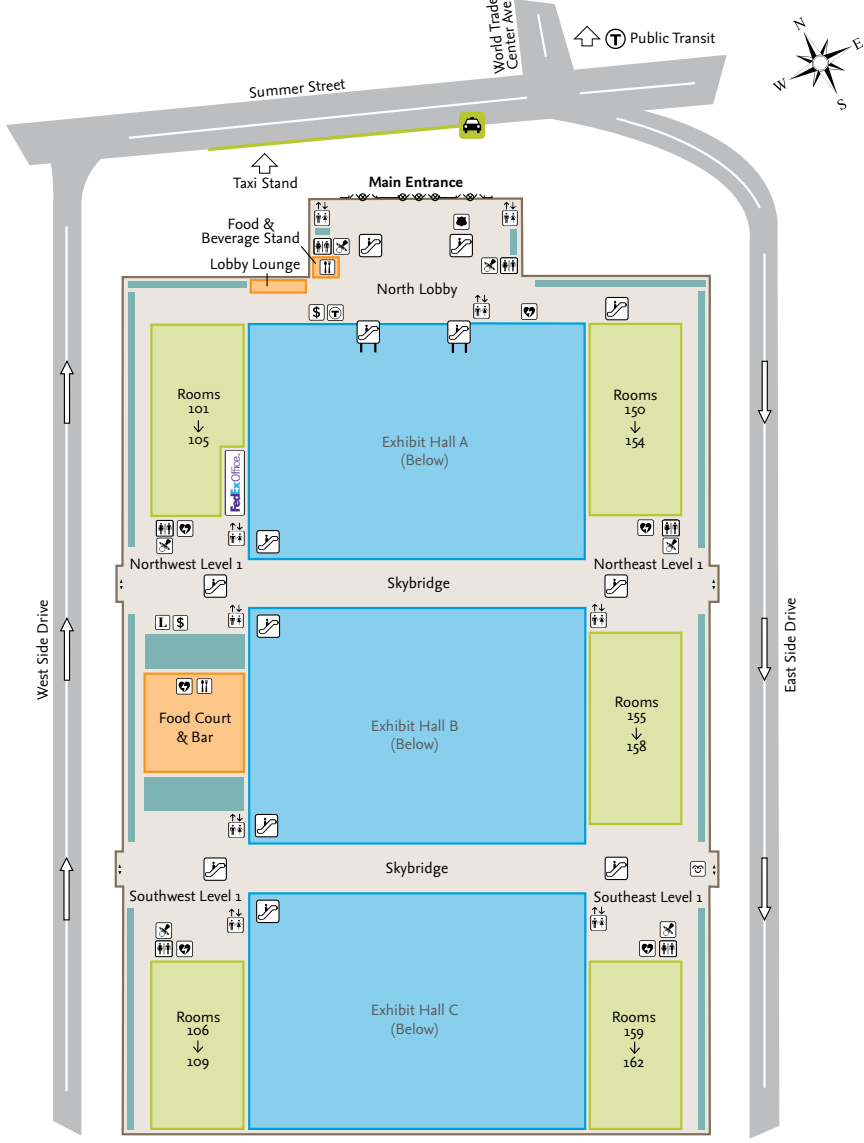

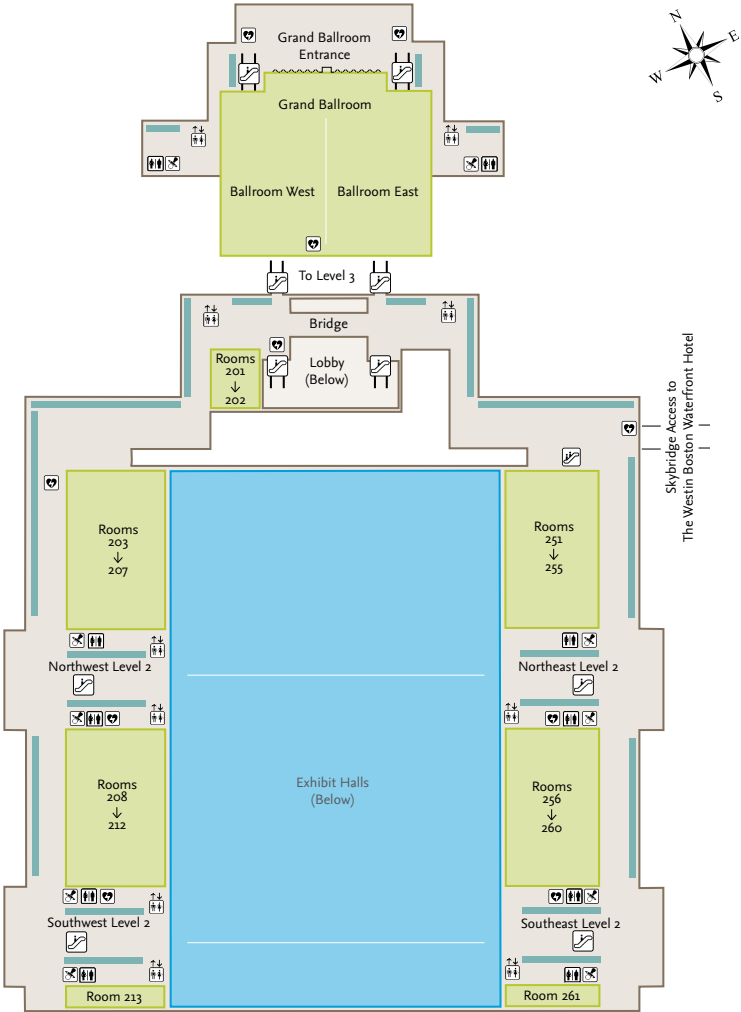

MEETING LEVEL TWO & BALLROOM LEVEL



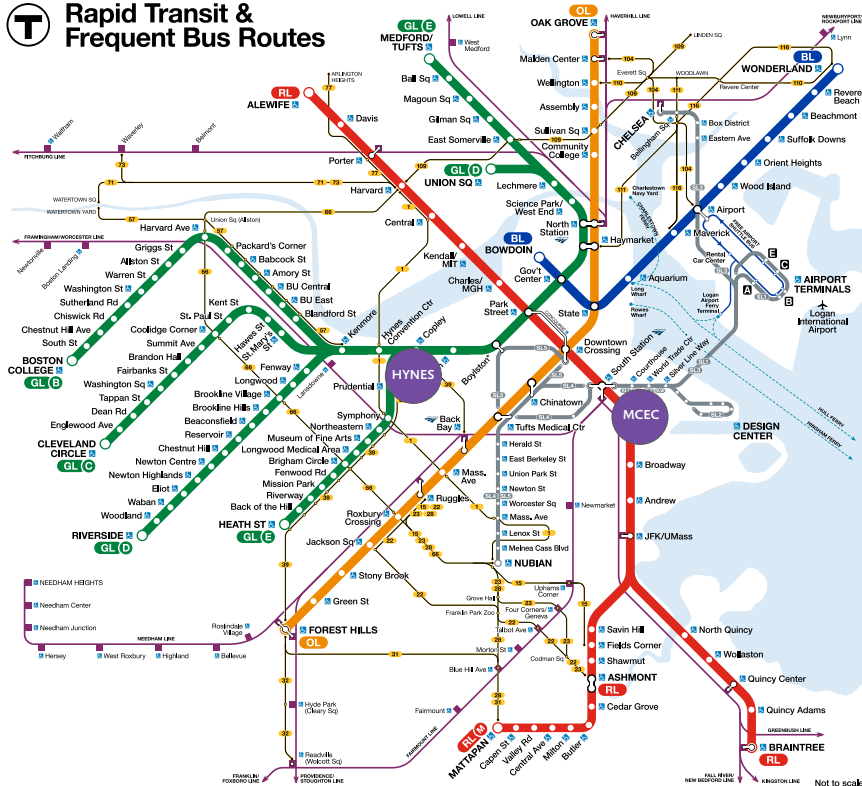
