

 DC's state plan is focused on continuing progress for all students, and accelerating growth for the students who are furthest behind.

Engagement Focus:

What information parents need to make informed decisions about their child's school options and how to deepen their engagement with their child's current school.

Engagement Focus:

How should data be organized and visualized on the report card for parents to find what's most important to them quickly and understand what they are reading?

Engagement Focus:

Get the community excited about the report card, build momentum for our uses cases, and educate people on how best to use it and provide ongoing feedback.

- 70+ engagement sessions
- 110+ organizations provided feedback
- 250+ pieces of written feedback
- Over 4,000 responses from parents and community members received
- Representation from all 8 wards in the city
- Mix of DCPS and charter parent voices
- Majority of feedback from parents

Timeline: DC School Report Card Engagement and Launch – Phase

Sept. 29: OSSE kicks off "phase 3" engagement at the OSSE Parent Summit

Nov. 1: All LEAs certify their data on the STAR Framework and DC School Report Card

Nov. 16: LEA leaders get access to embargoed data for their campuses

Meetings held or scheduled in Wards 1, 4, 6, 7 and 8, and with educators and parent leaders across the city

Nov. 26: Principals receive access to embargoed data for their school; webinar training available

Late Sept. through mid-Nov: With DCPS Community Engagement Team, OSSE holds nearly 20 sessions with ANCs, other community and education leaders

Items include two overview videos, brochures, and translated user guide

Early Dec.: With the website launch, release of additional materials

Mid-Nov.: Additional materials available on the OSSE website

New items include translated one-pagers, family and educator FAQs, and templates for school leaders

Late Nov.-Early Dec.: OSSE offers outreach calls and technical assistance to support LEA and school leaders

Early Dec.: DC School Report Card is live at DCSchoolReportCard.org! Families can access at EdFEST on Dec. 8 at the DC Armory

Mid-December and early January: Kickoff community engagement after the report card is live



Report Card Engagement Phase 4

Phase 4: Implementation and Refinement

Training

December - February

Engagement Focus:

Through targeted meetings, communications, and tool kits, educate people on what is included on the report card and how it can be used.

Feedback

January - April

Engagement Focus:

Through survey, in person, and small group feedback tools, OSSE will gather feedback on the usability, design, structure, and content on the DC School Report Card.

Integration

March - July

Engagement Focus:

 Utilize feedback and further engagement to set up a system for continuous improvements to the report card and STAR Framework system.



Report Card: Continued Engagement

- OSSE will hold "office hours" and training sessions throughout the city to help further develop effective and efficient use
- OSSE is scheduling in-person follow-up sessions and presentations with community organizations that hosted us in the fall (several sessions have been held already and others are scheduled)
- OSSE released a public survey to gain deeper feedback data regarding usability, design, accessibility, and content on the report card.
 - Sent the survey to the thousands of stakeholders that signed up for report card updates and our community-based partners, the ESSA task force, and through social media



- Re-engage LEAs and stakeholders regarding revisions to the existing report card and STAR Framework
- Continue our data analysis, research, and development of best practices regarding metrics and methodologies for continuous improvements to our system
- Meet with LEA data leads to review data and collection techniques for potential pilot items and enhancements
- Engage and review information with DC State Board of Education (SBOE) and ESSA Task Force as available
