






Natural Evolution



Why OER?

- Personalize learning
 - Accommodations
 - Special Education
 - EL
 - Connections to life experiences
- Customize experiences
- Flexible, not static
- Streamline content delivery
- Free to use, minimal costs

- Student and educator engagement
 - Teachers have more freedom to design learning experiences
- Students can create OER while learning
- Provide <u>equitable</u> resources
- Savings can be diverted into teaching and learning





The Good

- Ownership from staff and students
- Student voice and choice (student conversation and engagement)
- Deeper focus on standards
- Teacher motivation
- Investment in teachers
- Teachers as designers of learning



Good, Bad, and Ugly Good, Bad and Unexpected



The Bad

- "You get what you pay for" mentality
- Not a package (book, assessment, consumables, intervention/enrichment)
- Abundance of OER (overwhelming, vetting)



The Unexpected

- Lack of Teacher Confidence
- Materials ≠ Curriculum
- Huge time requirement
- Teacher empowerment



District Policies

- Ownership
- Creative Commons Licensing
- Board Approval for Curriculum



HS Example Math Menu


A classroom full of students accomplishing the same benchmarks, but working in different ways...ways they choose.











Students are thinking outside of the box! (Literally!)








Data

- All subjects, all grade levels for M-STEP above state average.
- 11th Grade SS: 60.7% proficient, jumped from just below state average to 12.2% above state average in spring 2018




