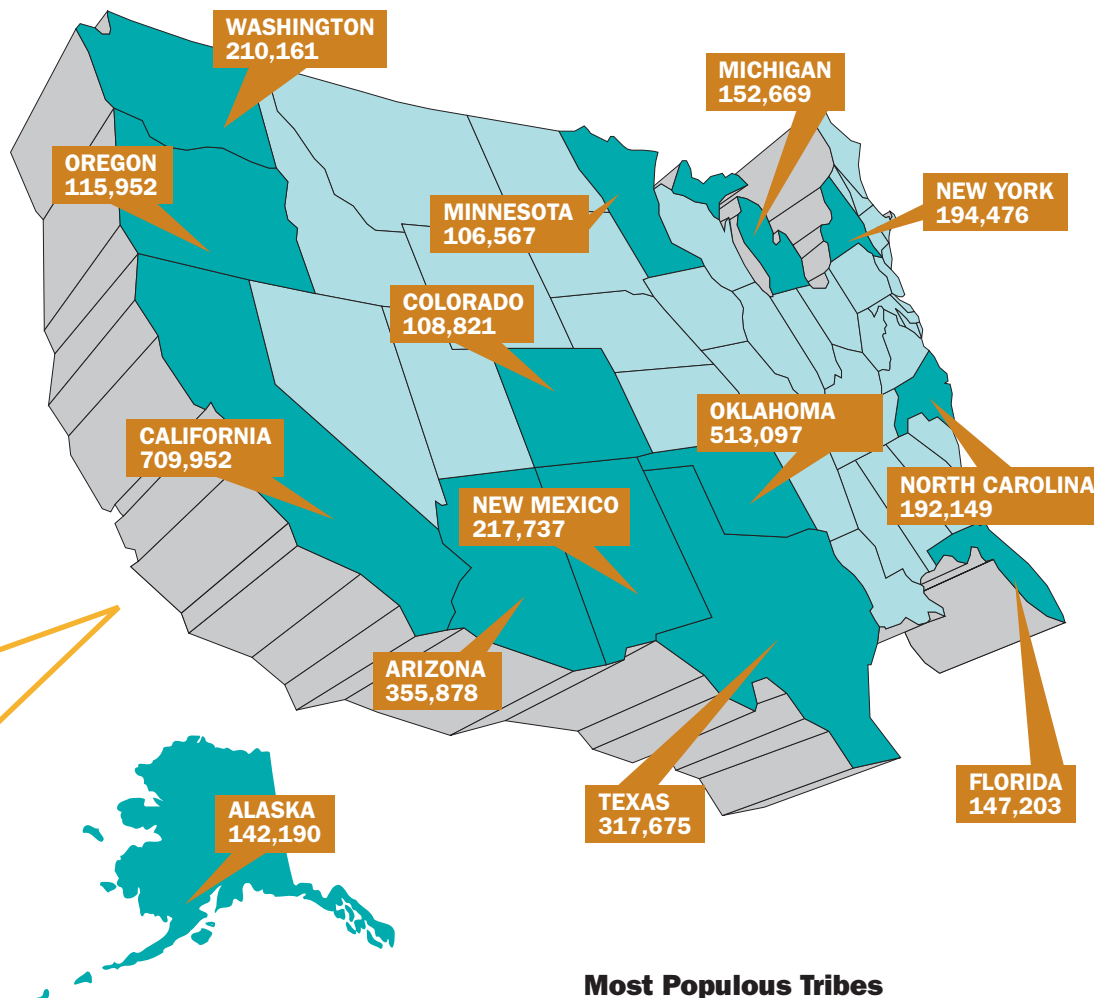

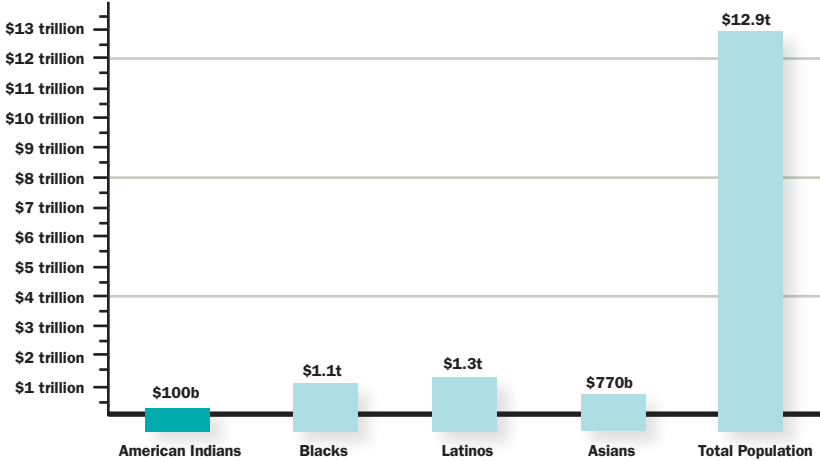

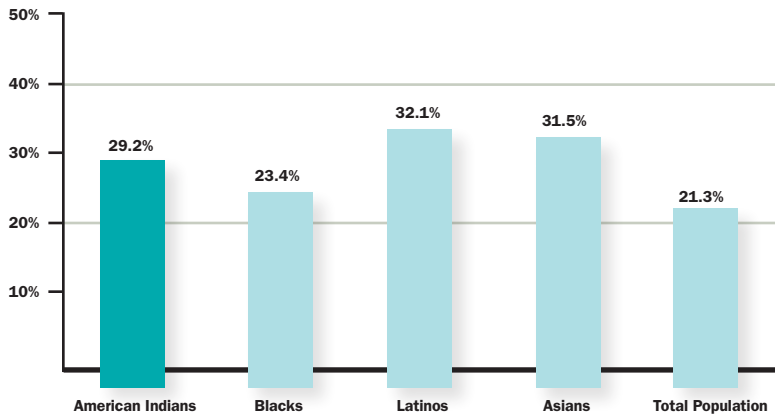

**Median Household Income**



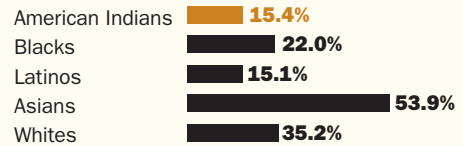

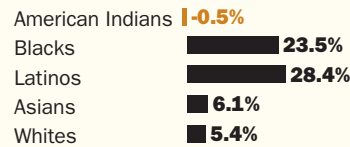
**Percentage of Population 25 and Older With at Least a High School Degree**
