

# A History of U.S. Intervention in Central America and the Sanctuary Movement in Los Angeles.



Professor Mario T. Garcia

**Our Program:** UCSB Professor Mario Garcia will review the history of U.S. imperialism in Central America since the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. American military, economic, and political interventions produced client states ("Banana Republics") dependent on U.S. support. Peasants were heavily exploited in support of corporate interests; their small properties were often stolen. Such inequities led to civil wars in which many were displaced from the countryside to become both political and economic refugees, many of whom sought refuge in the United States.

Professor Garcia will also discuss the U.S. Sanctuary Movement of the 1980s which was a people's response to the Reagan administration's refusal to accept refugees (particularly from El Salvador and Guatemala) who were fleeing persecution and civil wars. The Reagan administration did not acknowledge that these authoritarian governments were engaged in political persecution. Many good Americans especially in religious communities came to the support of the refugees and provided shelter, food, medical, and legal assistance in whatever way possible.

Los Angeles received many of these refugees. The sanctuary movement was centered at La Placita Church in downtown L.A. headed by its pastor, Fr. Luis Olivares. Professor Garcia will discuss the many ways that La Placita provided sanctuary and how this was motivated by Fr. Olivares' embrace of Liberation Theology which called for Catholic communities to have a preferential option for the poor. The story of Fr. Olivares and that of others in the sanctuary movement resonate with our present moment when thousands of Central American refugees are still seeking refuge in our country and many others refuse to embrace them as humans in need.

**Our Speaker:** Professor Mario T. Garcia is a Distinguished Above Scale Professor of Chicano Studies & History at UC-Santa Barbara. He is the author and editor of numerous award-winning books, and a past Teacher of the Year at UCSB. His lecture will include content from his 2018 book, Father Luis Olivares- A Biography: Faith Politics and the Origin of the Sanctuary Movement in Los Angeles. Professor Garcia received his Ph.D. in History from UC San Diego.

## July 4<sup>th</sup> Editorial By HSSB Member, Professor Joe White, Emeritus, SBCC Philosophy Chair, SBCC

Greetings SB Humanists.

As I've grown increasingly irritated with the information coming out of the Jan. 6 Committee on the insurrection, I decided I should write an editorial for this July 4 holiday. Here goes:

This July 4th marks the 246th year since our declaration of independence from the authoritarian. arrogant. madness of King George III. (The formal vote for independence actually occurred on July

2, 1776, but history is complicated.) As a lifetime citizen of the United States, I am proud to be a part of our great American experiment in political freedom. I always vote and celebrate the July 4th holiday. Our history has demonstrated repeatedly how a few have sacrificed so much that so many can live in freedom, a freedom under the rule of laws which citizens have self-legislated through our democratic process. I haven't always agreed with those laws but that's democracy!

While Thomas Jefferson and George Washington are oft cited on July 4th holidays, I'd also like to mention here Abraham Lincoln for his role in saving our Union some four score and seven years after the Declaration of Independence. Founding Fathers, George Washington and Thomas Jefferson, faced death repeatedly and courageously as both struggled mightily in our war for independence, a war that left some

70,000 American patriots dead from their military service.

President Abraham Lincoln, 16th President, and the first Republican President, paid the ultimate price with his life. As Lincoln described eloquently in his Gettysburg Address at the Gettysburg's battlefield, a battle fought, July 1-3, 1863 with over 50,000 causalities, during a civil war fought ironically to extend freedom,

"May our nation experience a new birth of freedom and may government of the People, by the People and for the People not perish from this earth."

Today, we are, to paraphrase Lincoln, engaged in a great culture war testing whether this nation, or any democratic nation, so conceived and dedicated [to freedom], can long endure. There are three individuals today which history has cast into the long shadows of Washington, Jefferson and Lincoln. These individuals, if they have the courage and integrity, could decisively begin the end of our present, violent culture war: Vice President Mike Pence, Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell, and Trump Chief of Staff Mark Meadows.

Pence, McConnell and Meadows: we, the People, now know that you each knew early on that the 2020 Presidential election was not stolen. You knew that President Joe Biden was legitimately elected. Now, after a parade of prominent Trump Republican officials have testified before the January 6th Committee, you knew for months prior to the January 6th coup attempt, that not only was the 2020 election fair and free but you also were informed that the multiple baseless Trump "Stop the Steal" Federal, State and individual level schemes to secure Trump's authoritarianism were unconstitutional, and likely criminal. You knew then. You know now.

Nearly a year and a half since the Trump failed coup, you, Mike Pence, Mitch McConnell, and Mark Meadows, have been virtually silent, MIA! Your collective silence has and continues to perpetuate this toxic Trump deceit now endangering our democracy and numerous individual lives. Pence, McConnell, Meadows you are culpable. Your forthright voices this July 4th can change the course of our present political upheaval. Your enabling silence, your repeated acts of omission, place you squarely in the 18th century British Tory camp, the 19th century Confederate camp. Is this your idea of Making America Great Again by restoring the madness of monarchical authoritarianism?

As Georgia Deputy Secretary of State, Gabriel (Gabe) Sterling, stated in December 2021, "You, who have not condemned this (Trump) lie, are complicit!" Do you Pence, McConnell, Meadows stand with the mad King or with our American experiment in democracy this July 4th? It is becoming apparent that your Republican legacy is to create a government of a few people, by even fewer people and for one person. Take a walk through Arlington Cemetery, read the ages of the fallen, then muster the courage to fulfill your oath of office by protecting us from foreign and domestic threats. Clearly, forcefully inform the American People of the whole truth that is now self-evident. You three Republican leaders can undermine this "Stop the steal" bullshi.., to quote your Republican Attorney General William Bar's view of Trump's schemes. Speak out this July 4th or let history record your reputations alongside those of Benedict Arnold and John Wilkes Booth.
