Retirement News October 2023

Greetings, fellow retirees. I hope this note finds you in good spirits, savoring today and looking forward to the upcoming holidays. It seems that technology is moving at a breakneck pace, with AI leading the way. Maybe soon it will help us to accurately predict the best mix of investments for maximum returns. And on the word front, we have Chat GPT, which will compose a letter for us in seconds with minimal instructions. As for phones, mine offers so many optionswhich remain mere possibilities - just out of reach. Truly, I want my flip phone back, fitting snugly in the palm of my hand or tucked in a pocket, with no confusing array of apps. But I digress....here are a few items of interest from recent SBCERS Board meetings.

Financial status of the Fund:

At August 31, 2023, the Fund stood at \$4.13 billion. The Fund had a 0.69% return for the first two months of this fiscal year. Long term returns spanning January 1987 to August 2023, remain around 8.16%, with 10 year and 5 year returns at 7.26% and 7.36% respectively, exceeding the assumed rate of return of 7%.

Investments:

Private Credit, a growing part of the fixed income portfolio, now stands at \$210 million of commitments to 10 funds managed by 6 companies. Private credit offers higher returns than traditional fixed income instruments (bonds, high yield) and SBCERS Private Credit portfolio's net return is 9% since its inception in 2018. At the September 27, 2023 meeting, the Board approved a \$25 million commitment to Marathon Dislocated Credit Fund II, focusing on corporate borrowers in the US and Europe. At the October 25, 2023 meeting, the general investment consultant will recommend a \$25 million commitment

to KKR's U.S. Direct Lending Evergreen Fund, making this the third commitment to an evergreen fund. Evergreen funds



are open-ended, where most of the profits from maturing investments are reinvested automatically unless the client requests a redemption. In the past year, the portfolio added commitments of \$20 million each to Angelo Gordon Direct Lending Evergreen Fund and Ares Pathfinder Core, both evergreen funds.

Topic of interest:

From time to time, various investment concerns come under scrutiny and are discussed at the SBCERS' Board meeting. For example, the use of Environmental Social and Governance (ESG) strategies in the portfolio was questioned, discussed earlier this year, and continues to be a topic of interest. At the September 27, 2023 Board meeting, SBCERS investments in China was discussed following a requested report and presentation from the general investment consultant. At June 30, 2023, SBCERS portfolio included a 1.78% exposure to China, approximately \$671 million, all in actively managed funds. Representatives from some of these funds were on hand to answer questions. The consultant recommends that the Fund remain broadly invested. Nonetheless, the issue of divestment will be discussed on October 25, 2023.

EASY HOLIDAY GIFTS YOU CAN MAKE

ROSEMARY FLAVORED OLIVE OIL: Tie together several sprigs of fresh rosemary. Hang upside down in a warm, dry place for 2 days. Pour olive oil into a pot, add dried rosemary sprigs. Heat gently for 5-7 minutes. Cool oil. Remove sprigs. Pour oil into small glass bottles. Add 1 dried sprig to the bottle – cap or cork tightly. Decorate with label, yarn, raffia, etc. Store in fridge. Use within 1 month, refrigerated.





BEADED BRACELETS: Buy a selection of glass, wood, plastic and semi-precious stone beads – from any craft store or online and a roll of elastic beading string. Cut a 10" length of the elastic. Select a mix of beads. Thread the elastic through the hole in each bead. The beaded portion of the elastic should measure 7½" in length. Tie the ends of the elastic several times. Cut excess off tied ends. Hide cut ends between beads or inside larger beads. Give away as gifts or keep for you! Enjoy!







LEMONCELLO: Peel 8 or 9 Meyer Lemons. Try to peel just the yellow part of the skin avoiding the bitter, white pith. Pour a 750ml bottle of unflavored Vodka into a large glass jar. Add the lemon peel. Seal the jar. Store in a dark place for about 3 weeks. Then strain the mixture to get out all the lemon peel. Heat 1 cup of water and 1 cup sugar till the sugar is melted. Cool mixture. Pour sugar mixture into the alcohol. Pour lemoncello into small bottles. Add a cute label. Store in the freezer. Give to friends or drink it yourself – you are worth it!

TRADER JOES CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES: This is the easiest baking miracle in the world – no one can fail to produce a fabulous batch of everyone's favorite cookie: Buy a package of Trader Joes frozen chocolate chip cookie dough. Open the package. Separate the individual cookies. Place on cookie sheet. Bake at 350° for 12-14 minutes depending on whether you prefer chewy or crisp cookies. Place in a decorative holiday container. Deliver to friends before you gobble them up yourself.




