3. We appreciate each other's unique attributes and embrace diversity.
4. We encourage people to connect and grow through volunteering and to share their strengths and interests.
5. We appreciate those who give to the community, including the Board, staff, and volunteers.
6. We experiment in new realms of understanding and expression.
7. We value and foster leadership from among our participants.
8. We encourage economic diversity by providing financial assistance.
9. We provide speakers and other high quality programs.
10. We explore religious, social and global concerns in small group discussion.
11. We share our stories, play together, and come together in worship.
12. We encourage truthful and respectful communication, and face conflict constructively and conscientiously.
13. We honor each other's worth and dignity through gracious words and actions.
14. We balance the need for a safe community with personal freedom.
15. We respect the facilities and property where we meet and support the people who host our conferences.
16. We renew our bodies and spirits in the shelter of Nature and quiet meditation.
