OUR SANCTUARY

LITURGICAL CALENDAR In the seasons of the church calendar we now find ourselves in the season of Lent. Lent is the season where we as the Church for 40 days reflect and prepare our hearts for Easter. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Christians across the world often deny themselves of something, and in turn take on an additional practice to allow space for God to shape and mold us further to reflect His heart.

PURPLE CLOTH You may have noticed the purple cloth swooped between each of our wooden beams that arch over our Sanctuary. In the church, the color purple represents a time of preparation and repentance. Purple is associated with mourning and anticipates the pain and suffering of the crucifixion of Jesus, and secondly because purple is the color associated with royalty which celebrates Christ's resurrection and sovereignty.

CHRIST CANDLE At the front of the Sanctuary you may notice a white candle. This is the Christ Candle. The Christ Candle represents the Light that Jesus brought into the world with His life. Surrounding the candle during this season is a wreath to represent the crown of thorns placed on Jesus during His crucifixion.

BURLAP The burlap you see on the Communion Table represents the sack cloth often worn by the ancient Hebrew people indicating humility before God in a time of repentance or mourning.
