## L.A. County officials extend stay at home order to May 15

Six new coronavirus cases were confirmed in Santa Monica Friday for a total of 88 cases in the city, or about 9.5 per 10,000 residents.

The uptick in cases marked the beginning of the fourth week of the outbreak in Santa Monica.

Cases rose 32% in the third week after quintupling in the first week and tripling in the second, leading local officials to suggest that Santa Monica has started to flatten the curve of infections. Although Friday saw a significant increase in confirmed cases, the total increase over the last seven days stands at a modest 35%.

On Friday, Barbara Ferrer, director of the L.A. County Department of Public Health, extended the county stay at home order to May 15 after announcing 475 new cases across the county, bringing the total to 8,430. In Santa Monica, nonessential businesses,

## Charity aids parents with essential childcare items

Since its founding in 2014 by Venice local and Los Angeles Police Department Officer Ken Lew, Badge to Heart has sought to assist families and children in need by providing diapers, food and other essential items. But the recent pandemic has caused an uptick in demand, so much so, that the local nonprofit is now looking for some assistance itself — in the form of donations.

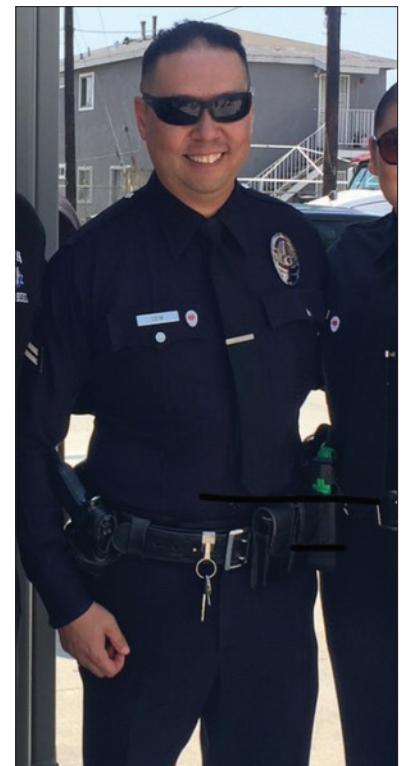
Having grown up in Inglewood, South Los Angeles and Westchester, Lew said in an interview Wednesday he has seen individuals and families struggle with the realities of life first-hand.

“The reason why I started this nonprofit, Badge of Heart, is because growing up, we didn’t have a whole lot,” Lew said, detailing how his father worked two or three jobs to make ends meet. “So working as a police officer, especially with families in South L.A., I’d see a lot of families that would take me back to when I was a kid, which reminded me of a lot of things that I was going through back then; (the) tough times, lack of food, hand me down clothes and stuff like that.”

After 25-years in the police department, Lew felt he could be doing more than his daily duties as a policeman, so he began the nonprofit Badge of Heart.

The sole purpose was to help families and kids in need. “But I was by myself, so the first year was very tough,” Lew said. “I had to raise money on my own and use a lot of my own to help fund it.”

But Lew stayed in the fight and soon started reaching out to

businesses. “I have a grass roots connection to the community, so I thought I’d use that,” he said, adding: “They were fascinated and they started slowly making donations .... every cent went to families,” Lew said.

Word soon spread and other officers would approach Lew to ask how they can help. Some would tell him about families in need while others provided the funding that would allow Badge of Heart to continue providing food, clothes,

## Daily Press wins awards

The Santa Monica Daily Press (SMDP) earned three awards from the California Newspaper Publishers Association (CNPA) during the annual California Journalism Awards.

SMDP earned a first place award for a news photo of police officers preventing a suicide, a fourth place award for coverage of homelessness and a fifth place for coverage of a local business.

The photo was taken by SMDP Editor Matthew Hall and published in the paper of Nov. 23, 2019. The image shows a group of police officers pulling a man to safety after he threatened to jump onto the freeway from the 4th Street overpass.

“The emotion captured in this photo is well-done. It brings awareness to a grim subject,” said the judging panel. “The photographer caught a life-and-death situation that most readers

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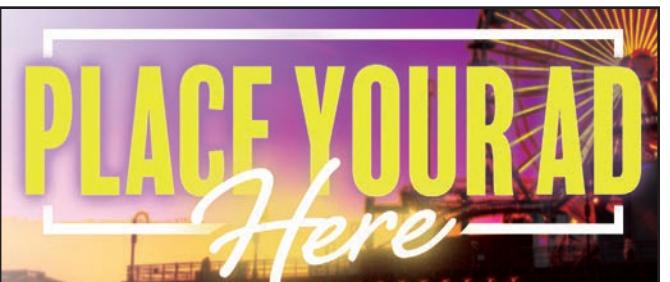
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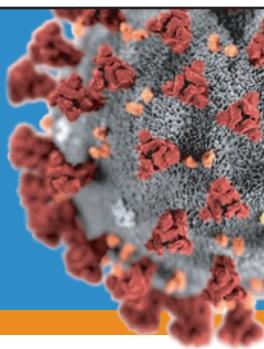

## BASIC PROTECTIVE MEASURES AGAINST THE NEW CORONAVIRUS

### WASH YOUR HANDS FREQUENTLY

Regularly and thoroughly clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand rub or wash them with soap and water.

**Why?** Washing your hands with soap and water or using alcohol-based hand rub kills viruses that may be on your hands.

### MAINTAIN SOCIAL DISTANCING

Maintain at least 1 metre (3 feet) distance between yourself and anyone who is coughing or sneezing.

**Why?** When someone coughs or sneezes they spray small liquid droplets from their nose or mouth which may contain virus. If you are too close, you can breathe in the droplets, including the COVID-19 virus if the person coughing has the disease.

### AVOID TOUCHING EYES, NOSE AND MOUTH

**Why?** Hands touch many surfaces and can pick up viruses. Once contaminated, hands can transfer the virus to your eyes, nose or mouth. From there, the virus can enter your body and can make you sick.

### PRACTICE RESPIRATORY HYGIENE

Make sure you, and the people around you, follow good respiratory hygiene. This means covering your mouth and nose with your bent elbow or tissue when you cough or sneeze. Then dispose of the used tissue immediately.

**Why?** Droplets spread virus. By following good respiratory hygiene you protect the people around you from viruses such as cold, flu and COVID-19.

### IF YOU HAVE FEVER, COUGH AND DIFFICULTY BREATHING, SEEK MEDICAL CARE EARLY

Stay home if you feel unwell. If you have a fever, cough and difficulty breathing, seek medical attention and call in advance. Follow the directions of your local health authority.

**Why?** National and local authorities will have the most up to date information on the situation in your area. Calling in advance will allow your health care provider to quickly direct you to the right health facility. This will also protect you and help prevent spread of viruses and other infections.

### STAY INFORMED AND FOLLOW ADVICE GIVEN BY YOUR HEALTHCARE PROVIDER

Stay informed on the latest developments about COVID-19. Follow advice given by your healthcare provider, your national and local public health authority or your employer on how to protect yourself and others from COVID-19.

**Why?** National and local authorities will have the most up to date information on whether COVID-19 is spreading in your area. They are best placed to advise on what people in your area should be doing to protect themselves.

#### Annual Water Main Replacement Project

**Citywide SoCalGas CAREs**

Southern California Gas Co. (SoCalGas) has launched a campaign titled, "SoCalGas CAREs" for customers whose income may have recently changed due to COVID-19 or other reasons. The campaign aims to let customers know of their eligibility to qualify for SoCalGas' assistance program, California Alternate Rates for Energy or CARE, saving them 20 percent on their monthly natural gas bills. Over the next several weeks, SoCalGas will begin running both social media and television ads promoting the "SoCalGas CAREs" campaign.

"SoCalGas is committed to assisting the communities we serve during this challenging period," said Jeff Walker, Vice President of Customer Solutions at SoCalGas. "We recognize that many families are facing unexpected hardships such as job and income loss right now and we want to remind them that SoCalGas' assistance programs like CARE can help."

The CARE program aids people in paying their utility bills by providing a 20 percent discount on monthly natural gas bills.

Customers who have become recently unemployed or who are currently facing financial hardship due to the coronavirus pandemic or for other reasons are encouraged to visit [socialgas.com/care](http://socialgas.com/care), complete the quick online application and find out instantly if they qualify. The CARE online application is available in English, Spanish, Chinese, Korean and Vietnamese.

Other customer assistance programs SoCalGas offers include:

Gas Assistance Fund

- If you or someone you know is having difficulty paying your gas bill, the Gas Assistance Fund (GAF) may be able to provide you with a one-time grant for the amount of the gas bill, not to exceed \$100.00.

- The Gas Assistance Fund is a joint effort of SoCalGas and United Way of Greater Los Angeles. They work with non-profit partner organizations throughout our service territory to administer the program.

- You may qualify for the Gas Assistance Fund based on your yearly household income.

Medical Baseline Allowance

- The Medical Baseline Allowance program provides additional natural gas at the lowest base-line rate for individuals with a serious health condition.

- You may qualify for the Medical Baseline Allowance if a full-time member of your household:

- o Has a life-threatening illness or a compromised immune system
- o Is seriously disabled
- o Requires more heat in winter due to a serious health condition or to prevent deterioration of the individual's medical condition

- Eligibility is based on medical condition only, not household income.

Please visit [socialgas.com/assistance](http://socialgas.com/assistance) for more information on how to know if you qualify for these programs as well as how to apply.

SoCalGas understands this is a challenging time for all and wants to assure customers natural gas service will be there for their communities. SoCalGas will continue to make safety and emergency service appointments, including reports of suspected natural gas leaks, carbon monoxide checks, gas meter turn-ons, natural gas outage and pilot re-lights. And we will continue to perform work needed to safely and reliably maintain infrastructure so we can continue to provide customers with safe and essential energy services.

Service disconnections have been suspended until further notice. This means no customer will have their natural gas turned off due to non-payment. SoCalGas has also temporarily waived late fees for small business customers. As a reminder, SoCalGas never charges late fees for residential customers.

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Coronavirus and pets

DEAR EARTHTALK: CAN OUR PETS GET SICK FROM THE CORONAVIRUS TOO, AND CAN THEY PASS IT ALONG TO PEOPLE? – J.M., BRIDGEPORT, CT

Given that Covid-19 probably originated in bats means that it's no surprise that the dreaded virus can pass between animals and humans. But when a four-year-old Malayan tiger at the Bronx Zoo tested positive for Coronavirus recently (and six of his peers showed similar symptoms), it sent shock waves across the United States, especially in the two-thirds of American households with pets.

Zoo officials report that the tiger started getting sick on March 27 after exposure to a human handler who later tested positive for Covid-19. (The zoo has been closed to the public since March 16.) While the sick tigers are expected to recover fully, the spread of the infection beyond humans is worrisome to not only pet owners but also to those of us concerned about the health of the planet's wildlife and biodiversity, which is already teetering on the ropes given the one-two punch of habitat loss and climate change.

And if tigers can get it, what about house cats? What about dogs? "There have been reports outside the U.S. of pet dogs or cats becoming infected after close contact with contagious people, including a Hong Kong dog that tested positive for a low level of the pathogen in February and early March," reports Jennifer Peltz for the Associated Press. "Hong Kong agriculture authorities concluded that pet dogs and cats couldn't pass the virus to human beings but could test positive if exposed by their owner."

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) concurs that it's not

our pets we should be worrying about, as the pandemic is spreading as a result of human-to-human transmission thanks to our coughing, sneezing and even just talking. "There is no reason to think that any animals or pets in the United States might be a source of infection with this novel coronavirus."

But CDC nevertheless recommends staying out of contact with pets if you have contracted the virus (or if you suspect you have it). "Although there have been no reports of pets becoming sick with COVID-19 in the United States, it is still recommended that people sick with COVID-19 limit contact with animals until more information is known about the virus," warns CDC. "This can help ensure both you and your animals stay healthy."

If you are sick, CDC recommends trying to get other people to take care of your animals until you're all better. And if that's not possible, minimize contact with your pets (especially petting, snuggling, kissing or licking, and sharing food) and wash your hands before and after your interactions.

"If pets go out and have contact with an infected person, they have the chance to get infected," reports Li Lanjuan, an epidemiologist with China's National Health Commission, adding that a pet who has been exposed to Covid-19 should be isolated just like any human who has shown symptoms or tested positive. "In addition to people, we should be careful with other mammals especially pets."

spin on dealing with homelessness on the various affected parties," said the judges. "The main source provided candid, revealing and relatable quotes that engaged me as a reader and a fellow human being. This was an extremely well-rounded and engaging piece."

The final award was for a profile of O'Brien's Irish pub written by former reporter Angel Carreras.

The CNPA contest divides entries into divisions based on publication frequency (weekly/daily) and circulation size. Six categories in this year's contest compared winners from multiple divisions to award a "Best Of" designation. SMDP's news photo

won the Best Of award beating out entries from several large papers.

The contest received 2,911 entries across all categories this year.

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# Sean Penn wants to 'save lives' with free COVID-19 testing

After nearly a decade of helping communities in distress abroad, Sean Penn is joining the fight against the coronavirus much closer to home.

The Oscar winner's disaster relief organization CORE has teamed up with Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti's office and the city's fire department to safely distribute free drive-thru COVID-19 test sites for those with qualifying symptoms. He along with his staff wearing hazard suits also are administering tests in his home city of Malibu.

Penn hopes the program can "save lives and alleviate depletion of resources" through the efforts of CORE, which stands for Community Organized Relief Effort. His non-profit organization stepped in to help rebuild Haiti after the 2010 earthquake and the devastating Hurricane Matthew.

The actor said he and his staff decided to "pull the trigger" very quickly to help run the test sites.

"We have an infrastructure in place to respond, and so we decided that we would if we could be value added," Penn said in an interview this week. "It's something that we can adapt to very quickly with the training of the Los Angeles Fire Department initially. And then we're able to take all those firemen and put them back in to serve the people in the way that we need them to."

So far, CORE has provided more than 6,500 free tests since March 30. The organization is operating at four sites with plans of expanding and will manage a new location in Los Angeles starting Friday.

About 60 staff and volunteers are working in California including 10 Peace Corps volunteers.

"Getting more people tested will help us get Angelenos the care they need and flatten the curve more quickly to slow the spread of COVID-19," Garcetti said in statement. "We are working closely with these extraordinary partners to expand access and grow capacity — and we're grateful to everyone who has stepped up to strengthen this work."

Los Angeles deputy mayor Jeff Gorell said in a tweet that CORE's efforts will help take over the city's fire department's workload and free up first responders for emergency services.

For most people, the new coronavirus causes only mild or moderate symptoms, such as fever and cough. For some, especially older adults and people with existing health problems, it can cause more severe illness, including pneumonia.

The vast majority of people recover from the new virus. According to the World Health Organization, people with mild illness recover in about two weeks, while those with more severe illness may take three to six weeks to recover.

Penn hopes other non-profit organizations and local governments will help run test sites as well. In the meantime, he said everyone should be washing their hands so often, the skin on their hands should change.

"They gotta be really crispy, or you're not doing it right," he said.

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# Joe Biden's next big decision: Choosing a running mate

Joe Biden faces the most important decision of his five-decade political career: choosing a vice president.

The presumptive Democratic presidential nominee expects to name a committee to vet potential running mates next week, according to three Democrats with knowledge of the situation who spoke on the condition of anonymity to discuss internal plans. Biden, a former vice president himself, has committed to picking a woman and told donors this week that his team has discussed naming a choice well ahead of the Democratic convention in August.

Selecting a running mate is always critical for a presidential candidate. But it's an especially urgent calculation for the 77-year-old Biden, who, if he wins, would be the oldest American president in history. The decision carries added weight amid the coronavirus pandemic, which, beyond its death toll, threatens to devastate the world economy and define a prospective Biden administration.

"We're still going to be in crisis or recovery, and you want a vice president who can manage that," said Karen Finney, a Democratic strategist who worked for Hillary Clinton's 2016 campaign. The vice president is "always important," Finney added. Still, she said, pointing to Biden's role in the Obama administration's 2009-10 recovery efforts, a crisis makes the choice of a running mate an even "more important decision than usual."

Biden faces pressure on multiple fronts. He must consider the demands of his racially, ethnically and ideologically diverse party, especially the black women who propelled his nomination. He must balance those concerns with his stated desire for a "simpatico" partner who is "ready to be president on a moment's notice."

The campaign's general counsel, Dana Remus, and former White House counsel Bob Bauer are gathering information about prospects. Democrats close to several presumed contenders say they've not yet been contacted.

Biden has offered plenty of hints. He's said he can easily name 12 to 15 women who meet his criteria, but would likely seriously consider anywhere from six to 11 candidates. He's given no indication of whether he'll look to the Senate, where he spent six terms, to governors or elsewhere.

Some Biden advisers said the campaign has heard from many Democrats who want a woman of color. Black women helped rescue Biden's campaign after an embarrassing start in predominately white Iowa and New Hampshire. Yet there's no firm agreement that Biden must go that route.

"The best thing you can do for all segments of the population is to win," said Biden's campaign co-chairman Cedric Richmond, a Louisiana congressman and former Congressional Black Caucus chairman. "He

has shown a commitment to diversity from the beginning. But this has to be based on, like the VP says, who he trusts."

Biden has regularly praised California Sen. Kamala Harris, a former rival who endorsed him in March and campaigned for him. When she introduced him at a fundraiser this week, Biden did little to tamp down speculation about her prospects.

"I'm coming for you, kid," he said.

He's also spoken positively of Stacey Abrams, who narrowly missed becoming the first African American female governor in U.S. history when she lost the 2018 Georgia governor's race.

Yet those two women highlight Biden's tightrope. At 55, Harris is talented and popular with Democratic donors, a valuable commodity for a nominee with a fundraising weakness. But she's also a former prosecutor who faces the same skepticism among progressives as Biden. Meanwhile, her home state is already firmly in the Democratic column and could make her an easy target for Republicans eager to blast the party as too liberal.

Abrams, 46, is a star for many younger Democrats, a group Biden struggled to win over in the primary. And she could help turn Georgia into a genuine swing state. But the highest post she's ever held is minority leader in the Georgia House of Representatives, a possible vulnerability in a time of crisis.

Paul Maslin, a Democratic pollster based in the battleground state of Wisconsin, said it will be impossible for Biden to please everyone.

"You can ask too much of a vice president pick to bridge everything — ideology, generational gap, gender, race, experience," he said. "There's going to be something wrong with every one of these choices."

New Mexico Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham is Democrats' only nonwhite female governor. Former Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid of Nevada has reportedly vouched for his state's Latina senator, Catherine Cortez Masto. Illinois Sen. Tammy Duckworth is a veteran who lost limbs in combat. She's of Thai heritage and has notably jostled with President Donald Trump. And Rep. Val Demings, a black congresswoman from the swing state of Florida, helped lead the House impeachment efforts against Trump.

Yet all four women are relative unknowns nationally.

Biden could go beyond Washington to Gov. Gretchen Whitmer of Michigan, one of the three Great Lakes states that delivered Trump his Electoral College majority in 2016. She's won plaudits during the pandemic and meshes with Biden's pragmatic sensibilities, winning her post in 2018 with promises to "fix the damn roads."

But it's not clear that a 48-year-old white woman from the Midwest brings Biden advantages he doesn't already have or can't find elsewhere.

# As Trump rails against mail voting, some allies embrace it

President Donald Trump is claiming without evidence that expanding mail-in voting will increase voter fraud. But several GOP state officials are forging ahead to do just that, undermining one of Trump's arguments about how elections should be conducted amid the coronavirus outbreak.

While Trump has complained that voting by mail is "ripe for fraud," Republican state officials in Iowa, Ohio and West Virginia have all taken steps to ease access to mail-in ballots, following health officials' warnings that voting in person can risk transmission of the deadly virus. The Nebraska's Republican governor urged voters to apply for absentee ballots. Florida's GOP chairman says the party will continue to run a robust vote-by-mail program.

The disconnect between Trump and Republican state officials illustrates the abrupt, hard turn the president and his national political allies have taken on the issue. Before the coronavirus hit, many in the GOP had warmed to mail-in voting, agreeing that it can be conducted without fraud and even used to their political advantage.

But Trump's hard line appears to be driven by his personal suspicions and concerns about his own reelection prospects. Statewide mail-in voting "doesn't work out well for Republicans," he tweeted this week without explanation.

Trump's comments put his Republican allies in states in the awkward position of trying to defend their practices without criticizing the president. Some said they agreed with Trump, even as their actions seem to suggest otherwise. Others suggested Trump was out of line.

It is "disappointing when anyone in leadership" makes fraud claims, said Kim Wyman, the Republican secretary of state of Washington state, which has had universal mail voting since 2010. "When it happens, the public loses confidence in the foundational pillar of our system."

Wyman was part of a group of bipartisan election officials who spoke to reporters Thursday to push for money from Congress to deal with the virus.

In Iowa, Republican Secretary of State Paul Pate did not criticize Trump directly, but said that sowing "doubt about the integrity of the process is as dangerous as vote fraud."

Iowa is mailing requests for absentee ballots to all 2.1 million registered voters ahead of special elections in July. Pate described the move as a reaction to "an emergency," adding: "You need to have some flexibility."

There is no evidence of widespread mail voting fraud. The most prominent recent fraud case occurred in North Carolina's 9th Congressional District in 2018, when a consultant hired by the GOP candidate was linked to an effort to tamper with absentee ballots.

Trump himself requested a mail ballot for Florida's GOP primary last month and he has voted absentee in previous elections. Still, this week he said "mail in voting is horrible, it's corrupt," and the Republican National Committee moved to help state parties block expansion of the franchise. The effort was most notable in Wisconsin, where thousands of voters were forced to wait in long lines after the conservative majority on the state's Supreme Court prevented the Democratic governor's last-ditch attempt to

delay the election.

But there's no consensus about Trump's position.

In Ohio, Gov. Mike DeWine and Secretary of State Frank LaRose, both Republicans, this week urged the state's voters to cast ballots via mail in the April 28 primary. The contest was shifted to virtually all-mail last month as the virus outbreak worsened.

Nebraska Gov. Pete Ricketts, a Republican, is urging all voters to request absentee ballots for next month's primary.

In West Virginia, voters are receiving applications for mail ballots for the state's upcoming primary. On Thursday, the state's Republican secretary of state, Mac Warner, told reporters he agrees with Trump that "voting by mail just opens up opportunity for fraud," but said he believed his state has necessary safeguards.

In Florida, where Republicans have dominated mail-in voting, state GOP chairman Joe Gruters also agreed with Trump that the state couldn't entirely vote by mail. But he added: "The Florida GOP will push vote-by-mail requests and returns among Republicans."

Wendy Weiser of the Brennan Center for Justice, which advocates for expanded mail voting, said there had been bipartisan agreement on the election changes needed to adjust to the coronavirus outbreak. But she said Trump's comments this week were "adding partisan fuel to decisions that should be no-brainers."

Trump has a history of making baseless claims of voter fraud. After he won the 2016 presidential election while losing the popular vote, he insisted there was widespread voter fraud. He set up a commission to investigate, but it disbanded without finding any examples.

Every state has some version of mail voting, but with widely varying rules. They range from systems like those used in Utah, Washington and Colorado, where all voters are automatically sent ballots, to Wisconsin, where a witness's signature is required for voters to return an absentee ballot. In about one-third of the states, voters need a state-sanctioned excuse to make their request.

Trump's concern about mail-in voting appears to come from a belief that the practice benefits Democrats. He tweeted that "Republicans should fight very hard when it comes to state wide mail-in voting. Democrats are clamoring for it."

In fact, Republicans in Florida and other states have used mail-in ballots to ramp up turnout among their voters, especially older and rural voters. On Wednesday, Trump tried to adjust his argument by saying that mail voting was legitimate for Republican-leaning groups such as people over age 65 or members of the military, but should not be broadly available. Trump tweeted that "100% mail-in voting" was vulnerable to abuse and should not be allowed.

In Utah, Trump's complaints baffled Justin Lee, the state's elections director. The only fraud the state finds are scattered examples of one spouse signing for another. The mail system hasn't hurt Republicans at all.

"People are turning out, 90% are using it in a very red state," Lee said. "I don't see any problems for us."

**YES:** Take the kittens to a veterinary clinic immediately.

**NO:** Estimate the kittens' age by what they look like.

Eyes still closed or just beginning to open: <b>1-2 WEEKS OLD</b>	Eyes open and alert, becoming mobile: <b>2-4 WEEKS OLD</b>	Very mobile and often talkative, can eat food: <b>4-6 WEEKS OLD</b>	Very active and playful, weighs 1-2 lbs.: <b>6-8 WEEKS OLD</b>	Very active and playful, weighs 2 lbs. or more: <b>8+ WEEKS OLD</b>
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## CAN YOU SEE THE NEST OR HIDING SPOT?

Avoid handling the kittens and watch them from a distance to see if the mama cat returns to care for them. If she does, leave the kittens with her, since it greatly increases their chances of survival.

## WHAT IF THE MAMA CAT DOESN'T RETURN AFTER SIX OR MORE HOURS?

Take action by doing one of the following:

## TAKE ACTION

- Care for the kittens.** Take the kittens to your local vet for a check-up and vaccines. Or foster the kittens through your local shelter's foster program.
- If you can't care for the kittens yourself, find someone who can.** Ask your family, friends and neighbors. When the kittens you've cared for reach eight weeks old, they're ready to be spayed or neutered, micro-chipped and adopted.

## TAKING NEWBORN KITTENS TO YOUR LOCAL SHELTER SHOULD BE A LAST RESORT.

Many animal shelters are unable to provide the around-the-clock care that kittens need. In fact, at many shelters (without the help of foster homes), newborn kittens are at risk of being killed within 24 hours of arriving. The best thing to do for kittens under four weeks of age is to leave them with the mama cat until they are eating on their own, and then contact your local shelter for spay/neuter resources.

It's a similar conundrum for others, including Minnesota Sen. Amy Klobuchar, a former rival who fits seamlessly with Biden's politics. Massachusetts Sen. Elizabeth Warren, meanwhile, could offer a bridge to progressives, but several Democrats said her age, 70, is a bigger liability than potential policy differences with Biden.

Several African American advocates and progressive leaders said the Democratic ticket's policies and empathetic appeals are

what's most important.

Black voters "have to trust the messenger," said Adrienne Shropshire, executive director of Black PAC, and "a black woman could stand up and have moral authority to lead on those big issues facing the country right now."

But she said that doesn't mean a white, Asian or Latina vice presidential nominee couldn't "speak to the systemic issues, the structural issues that allow for inequalities to persist."

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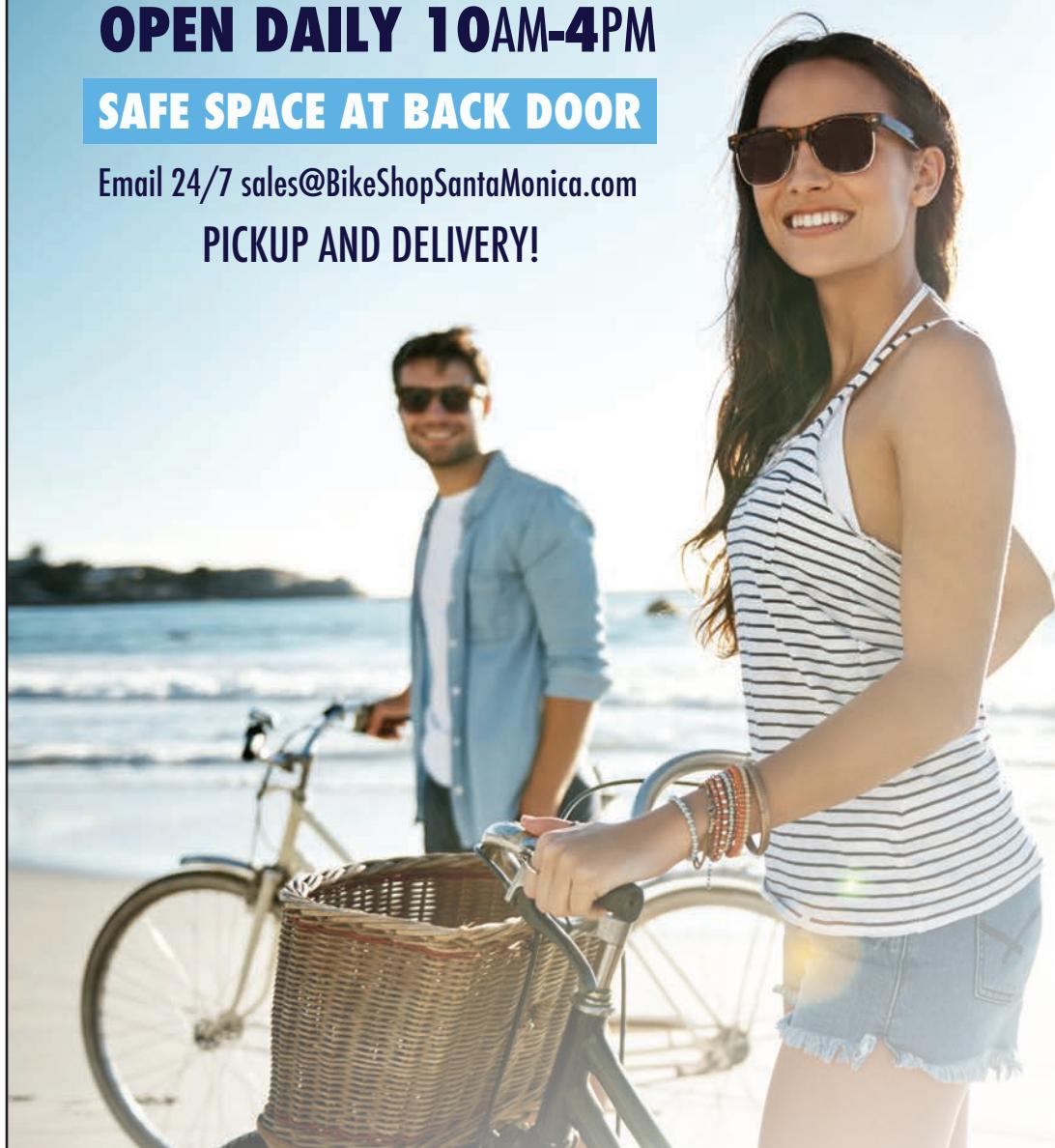

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"It was growing, (though) not as fast as I wanted it to because I still had a full-time job. But five years later, we're servicing more than 2,800 families and things are looking good," Lew said.

"However, with this pandemic going on right now, everything is messed up for a lot of people," he added. He said that Badge of Heart and its unpaid volunteers are still able to help.

The organization has pledged to provide \$10,000 to families who are furloughed from work or have lost their jobs, and Lew hopes others in the community will come together to assist as well.

"We feel the best thing we and others can do right now is to give a monetary donation because we can use that money to go out there and buy gift cards or goods while families stay home," Lew said.

"We know families and individuals are struggling so we're using the \$10,000 to buy gift cards to grocery stores, Target and places like that. We'll also continue trying to connect with other agencies who can help," Lew said. "And we know it's not going to solve the problem. But we are trying to help alleviate some of people's pain because we're all human beings and we should care for each other. That's the whole concept of this."

public buildings and schools, beaches, playgrounds and Palisades Park are closed for the duration of the "Safer at Home" ordinance.

While other public parks and Santa Monica Farmers Markets usually remain open, the city will close parks Sunday and farmers markets Saturday and Sunday to prevent people from congregating in public to celebrate Easter.

Ferrer said the stay at home order is flattening the curve, but continued physical distancing is necessary because of the county's sheer number of infections and rate of spread.

"I do not anticipate that we lift all of our restrictions on May 15, but I know every day we get closer and closer to a place where we can start relaxing some of our restrictions," she said. "(The modeling) shows we will still see an increase in cases and unfortunately people will continue to die, and until we get to the other side ... we have to take every precaution possible."

If L.A. County lifted the stay at home order, nearly all county residents would be exposed or infected with the virus by August, said Christina Ghaly, director of the L.A. County Department of Health Services.

Maintaining current physical distancing efforts through the summer would result in one in three county residents being exposed or infected, which would drop significantly if stricter physical distancing measures are implemented, Ghaly said.

Ferrer also announced an order requiring essential businesses to provide their workers with cloth masks and share with them plans to ensure compliance with physical distancing and sanitary requirements. The order, which goes into effect Wednesday, also requires customers to wear face coverings. The city

of Santa Monica announced a similar order earlier this week that took effect Friday.

An additional 18 deaths were confirmed Friday. Ten people were older than 65, seven were between 41 and 65 and one was between 18 and 40. The death toll now stands at 241 and the mortality rate is 2.9%. Sixty-seven people who have died resided in institutions, making up 28% of all deaths.

Ferrer said 2,043 people with coronavirus have been hospitalized at some point, representing about 24% of cases. Of the 1,331 people are hospitalized, 40% are in the ICU and 31% are on a ventilator, she said.

The county currently has 1,400 available ventilators, Ghaly said. She said the county's private and public health systems are projected to be able to accommodate all the patients that need care for COVID-19 over the next month. An additional 400 to 500 ICU beds will be needed, but efforts to fill that gap are already underway.

The county is investigating 1,062 cases across 159 institutional settings, including eight jail inmates and 12 prison inmates, Ferrer said. Three people residing in homeless shelters have tested positive out of 18 total cases reported among the homeless.

In Santa Monica, The Manor, The Rehabilitation Center of Santa Monica and Beachwood Post-Acute and Rehab have at least one confirmed case and are under investigation.

Ferrer said the county plans to test a random sample of 1,000 adults for COVID-19 using antibody tests, which can tell if an individual was infected but didn't develop symptoms or recovered from their illness.

The study will assess the true penetration of coronavirus in L.A. County and help officials decide when to lift the stay at home order, she said. As of Friday, more than 40,000 county residents have been tested and 15% have tested positive.

## Southern California power station erupts in fireball

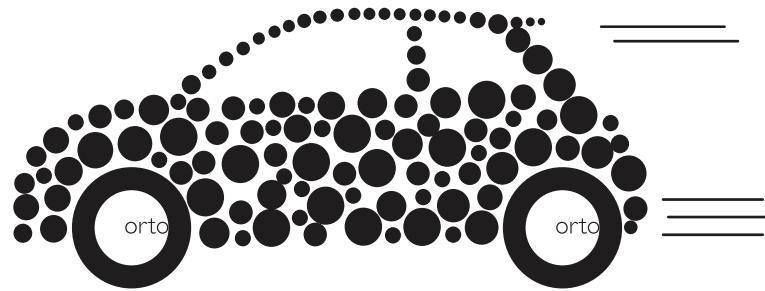
An explosion at a Los Angeles-area electrical substation sent a fireball into the air and caused brief power outages Friday but no injuries were reported, authorities said.
