



HIGHEST AND MEDIAN SALARY BY DEPARTMENT (COLLEGE)





Humility, forgiveness and catharsis created a somber experience in the amphitheater Thursday night, as survivors and supporters gathered in a vigil to cap off this year's Take Back the Night campaign, a weeklong effort to eliminate

sexual violence in the University community.

The vigil is intended to create a safe space for survivors, said third-year College student Staige Davis, who co-chaired the committee which organized the march to the vigil from the rally in Lambeth Field.

"Every survivor has a dif-

ferent reason for telling their story, but many feel that it an important step in their healing process," Davis said. "For some, it is their very first time sharing their story publicly."

Vigil chair Emily Renda, a third-year College student, has participated in the event each year she has been at the University, but said every year

being assaulted at a fraternity.

"When I spoke at the vigil, I finally, truly began to heal," she said. "Take Back the Night was an integral part of my healing process, and without it, I don't think that I would be where I am today."

Organski now regularly gives presentations about sexual assault and bystander intervention.

"It is so critical that the community is made aware of sexual violence and its prevalence not only at our University, but also across the world," she said. "Without awareness, change will never be able to occur. I really love the slogan for [Take Back the Night] this year — End the violence. End the silence. ... It starts a conversation about this very serious and present issue."

Israeli diplomat visits University

Ambassador Michael Oren discusses U.S. alliance, regional dynamics; several students protest talk

Israeli ambassador to the United States Michael Oren spoke at the Miller Center of Public Affairs Thursday, affirming the strength of U.S.-Israeli relations despite changing regional dynamics in the Middle East.

Oren, who toured with President Barack Obama during his trip to Israel last month, sought to represent the relationship as irrevocably grounded in similar ideals of democracy, security and economic innovation.

"[Israel] is one component which you can count on remaining stable in the Middle East," Oren said. "[One state] that is militarily and economically robust. It is a coun-

try [that] has never known a second of non-democratic governance."

Oren also highlighted the United States' historic interest in protecting the Jewish homeland, echoing a speech he gave to a joint session of Congress Thursday morning on the importance of Holocaust remembrance. But even so, he said, the alliance is testing largely uncharted waters as regional tensions grow.

"We are living through historic times in the Middle East," Oren said. "Any of the assumptions we had four or five years ago about this region — we can pretty much throw them out."

Oren only briefly discussed the Palestinian-Israeli conflict, and issues regarding American disagreement with Israel's set-

tlement policy, despite a small protest staged outside.

Six to seven protesters, with signs decrying the lack of intervention in the Gaza humanitarian crisis, gathered in front of the Miller Center and remained there for the duration of the event.

"[We hope the ambassador] will look at [Palestine] from a human rights perspective," said Sasan Mousavi, third-year College student and one of protesters outside Thursday's

event. "[There are] war crimes being committed and Israel isn't doing anything about these crimes."

Though Oren did not speak about the Palestinian conflict in humanitarian terms, he did note the Israeli government's desire for a "historic peace."

Oren also discussed Israeli interests in Egypt during a brief question-and-answer session following his speech. Although Israel has maintained diplomatic relations with Egypt

since 1980, the recent regime change and growing political power of the Muslim Brotherhood has left many questioning any future partnership. Though Israel has voiced concerns about the rise of Islamic extremism, Oren said Egypt remains a key strategic partner for Israel.

"We have no illusions about the Muslim Brotherhood, but we prefer to focus not on what Egyptian leaders say, but on what they do," Oren said.

Sullivan delivers Founder's Day address

President discusses Thomas Jefferson's legacy, Universities' historical realities; recognizes Marshall Scholar, astronaut scholarship

University President Teresa Sullivan addressed students and faculty Thursday afternoon in a Founder's Day address in the Harrison Institute. Her speech focused on the University today as it would be viewed through the eyes of Thomas Jefferson.

Sullivan spoke openly about the difficulties of retaining faculty in the past following five years of pay freezes. Sullivan said the University has lagged behind other major institutions because of these wage gaps, with professors switching to other schools for higher pay. She was adamant about offering professors adequate compensation.

"It is one way to ensure

we retain a faculty of the highest grade ... as Jefferson intended," Sullivan said.

Sullivan praised the addition of female students at the University, something that during Jefferson's time was unthinkable. "[Today], we have more daughters than sons," she said.

Some students were mentioned as receiving high honors during the speech, including fourth-year College student Hillary Hurd, a Marshall Scholar, and third-year Engineering student Ellen Zhong, the second person from the University to ever receive an astronaut scholarship.

"I believe Thomas Jefferson would applaud these rewards,

but especially the destinies of high promise they expect," Sullivan said.

Sullivan also dedicated a portion of her speech to the newly discovered slave graves at the University last year near the University Cemetery.

"This too is part of our legacy, and we are exploring opportunities to appropriately recognize and interpret the contributions of enslaved persons who are an integral part of this University's story," Sullivan said.

Sullivan concluded by stressing the work ahead for the University, but remained optimistic for the future.

"We have a lot of work to do," she said. "Let's work hard, work together and let's aim high. To serve as stewards of Mr. Jefferson's University is a great honor and a great privilege. I look forward to those of you who will join me."



Johns Hopkins senior goalkeeper Cosette Larash stood 15 yards out from the cage, the ball in her stick and Thursday night's showdown between the No. 20 Blue Jays and No. 11 Virginia tied at eight with 2:57 to play. More than a minute later, Larash still held the ball, waiting for a teammate to create separation from one of the Cavaliers.

She ended up letting the ball go far too soon. Virginia junior defender Maddy Keeshan, who caused four turnovers in all, intercepted Larash's pass and found senior attacker Caroline McTiernan in front of the net. The Cavaliers' co-captain was awarded a restart after being tripped up in front of the cage.

Larash, though, thwarted McTiernan's subsequent shot.

Not a minute after Larash's save, Johns Hopkins freshman attacker Jenna Reifler cut down the middle of the Virginia defense and received a pass from junior attacker Taylor D'Amore. With 19.5 seconds on the clock, Reifler unleashed what proved to be the deciding goal in a game the Cavaliers described as a "must-win."

"We fought, we really did," McTiernan said. "We came up short, but... we fought to the very last minute. Just wish the outcome could have been different."

With the 9-8 loss, Virginia (7-8, 0-4 ACC) sits below .500 for the first time since March 16. Down to just one regular season game remaining, a matchup with rival Virginia Tech next Wednesday, the Cavaliers can do no better

than winning half of their games.

"It's a tough year for sure," coach Julie Myers said. "I mean so many one-goal games that haven't gone our way. You know, typically, if it's a close game, Virginia is used to winning those. But, you know, it's a great group of girls."

Virginia battled back against Johns Hopkins (8-5, 1-2 ALC) after the Blue Jays scored four straight goals between the 7:07 mark of the first half and the 24:50 point of the second period that put them ahead 7-4. Myers called timeout following the last goal of that stretch, another score set up by D'Amore. The 2012 First Team All-ALC selection used the attention she commanded from the Cavalier defense to find open teammates all game long, finishing with five assists.

Virginia drops heartbreaker

No. 20 Johns Hopkins scores game-winner with 19 seconds remaining to down No. 11 Cavs, 9-8

"Taylor D'Amore had a great night assisting," Myers said. "So, she looked like a real threat. We were sliding doubles to her, and she ends up with five assists."

As the Cavaliers huddled near midfield after Myers' timeout, the speakers blared, "Tonight is the night." For Virginia, it was a crucial moment in a season of unrelenting ups and downs. The Cavaliers responded to the moment's gravity.

Virginia won the ensuing draw control, and in two quick passes worked the ball to McTiernan in front of the net. McTiernan's goal ignited a 4-1 Virginia spurt capped by her game-tying score off a restart with 4:23 on the clock. Though the senior leader finished with a hat trick, her effort was not enough against an aggressive Johns Hopkins team that came into Thursday's game losers of three of its past four contests.

The matchup between Virginia and Johns Hopkins presented two distinct approaches to the game of lacrosse. This season, Virginia has limited turnovers but forced relatively few on defense. Johns Hopkins, in contrast, came into the game having turned the ball over 193 times to the Cavaliers 139, while causing

95 giveaways to Virginia's 75.

The teams' contrasting styles of play resulted in a near stalemate Thursday. Johns Hopkins earned the win, but Virginia won the ground ball battle, 14-11, while outshooting the Blue Jays, 26-20. Larash played a large role in her team's victory, recording 14 saves in total.

"[Larash] had a nice night," Myers said. "She was consistent from the opening whistle 'til the end. I mean, [she] made big save after big save, so she was hard to get around."

Though Virginia players and coaches let their emotions show after the game, they did not allow their deflating loss to torpedo their hopes for the rest of the year.

"It's really disappointing," McTiernan said. "I know this team has so much potential and so much to give, and, you know, our backs are kind of against the wall with the [NCAA] Tournament. But I know we can do it. I mean, it can only go up from here. So, I have the confidence in this team, and I hope we can get it done."

The Cavaliers will host the Hokies Wednesday in their season finale.

ting into trouble. But they should not revoke our

freedom of speech just because we are student-athletes.

We are constantly reminded that while we are athletes, we are normal students as well. If that is truly the case, then why aren't we treated that way? Last time I checked, the normal student doesn't have Twitter police.

I understand that it damages the reputation of the team and the University if an athlete goes on a cursing rampage or posts pictures of underage drinking. Without a doubt, these athletes should be punished and compliance divisions have an important role to play in this effort.

But it isn't so much a question of whether they should have authority over our social media presence, but when that authority should be exercised.

The underlying issue is that our social media police aren't clear on where they draw the line, resulting in seemingly arbitrary censorship. I know several athletes at the University who are banned from Twitter but didn't swear or post pictures of alcohol — the only two things they tell us not to do.

So if we aren't breaking any NCAA, team or compliance rules, what's the big deal?

The inconsistency of the compliance division's regulations have left many athletes in the dark as to what is appropriate behavior. Without clear guidelines to follow when judging tweets, some athletes get away with things that others don't. Now you've got unhappy athletes.

We also get banned if we favorite a tweet that is deemed inappropriate. This goes for retweets as well. So even if it doesn't directly come from us, it doesn't stop compliance or coaches

from locking us out of our social media sites.

Even more absurd is the University's policy is being forced to accept friend request or follows from our coaching staff. If we don't accept them, we get punished. This seems excessively strict and based on dubious authority.

If that's not the most ridiculous part of this whole social media crackdown, then this is: rule-breaking may result in a phone call home. Compliance has reinstated the middle and elementary school policy of calling mom and dad. This policy is as unnecessary as it is comical — particularly given that all of us are, by definition, adults.

Ranked ACC foes await No. 17 Cavaliers

Cavaliers seek to extend five-match win streak this weekend, face trying road tests against No. 19 Georgia Tech, No. 14 Clemson

The red hot No. 17 Virginia women's tennis team will look to extend its five-match winning streak this weekend when it heads south for a pair of challenging road competitions. The Cavaliers will be in Atlanta Saturday looking to knock off No. 19 Georgia Tech before traveling to South Carolina the following day to face No. 14 Clemson.

Virginia (13-7, 6-1 ACC) has won 10 of its last 11 matches after struggling early in the season. The only loss during the stretch came in a tight 4-3 decision against a talented No. 9 Duke squad. The Cavaliers boast victories against several top opponents, including a thrilling triumph over the nation's first-ranked team, North Carolina.

"We're all pretty confident at this point," senior Hana Tomljanovic said. "Individually we all play well. Our doubles have improved and we're all doing a good job in singles, so hopefully we can keep that up."

But Georgia Tech (10-7, 4-3 ACC) is on a streak of its own and has won four of its past five matches. The Yellow Jackets field strong doubles teams that has the 57th-ranked pair in the country in the

freshmen duo of Megan Kurey and Kendal Woodard. In addition, Georgia Tech is led by talented senior Elizabeth Kilborn, who is ranked No. 89 in singles play.

"This is a team that has a good spirit and competitive edge to them," coach Mark Guilbeau said. "I feel really good, though, about what our kids are doing. I think we match up really well against them."

Although Georgia Tech unquestionably boasts a strong doubles lineup, Virginia has finally settled into its pairs and has developed consistency in recent weeks. The Cavaliers have earned the doubles point in every match of their current streak.

Georgia Tech has a stellar 8-3 record at home this season. Although the long bus ride could impact Virginia, the team's early season schedule should ensure they are ready come Saturday. The Cavaliers have played a mere five home matches, excluding the ITA National Team Indoors held at Boar's Head Country Club to begin the season.

"Our kids have shown that they don't mind getting on the road," Guilbeau said. "They carry the spirit of their fans with them and do a good job, so I feel great about that."

The following day, Clemson (10-6, 5-2 ACC) will host Virginia. The Tigers are on a hot streak of their own, winning six of their past seven matches. The only loss during the run came in a 4-3 defeat to No. 1 North Carolina, and Clemson is coming off a dominant 4-1 win against No. 9 Duke on April 7.

Clemson's roster is scattered with stellar athletes, and the team has three players ranked in the top 50 for singles play. The Tigers' top-ranked player is standout sophomore Yana Koroleva, who is ranked No. 16 nationally. She will face Virginia star No. 15 freshman Julia Elbaba in a highly anticipated matchup.

Virginia's depth and confidence are peaking at the right time, with just four matches remaining in the regular season. The entire Cavalier lineup — from Elbaba at the No. 1 spot to junior Caryssa Peretz at No. 6 — is brimming with confidence, and each Cavalier has earned points in the last two weeks.

The only major item of concern for the Cavaliers are late season injuries. Virginia is already without standout freshman Maci Epstein due to an ankle injury, and last weekend Tomljanovic partially pulled a hamstring. The injuries are likely the result of the rigors of a long season, as Virginia

has played six times in the past two weeks alone.

"We've been smart as coaches to know where and when to get after it a little bit more," Guilbeau said. "The players allow us to know when we should turn that clock

A comment on comments

The managing board explains The Cavalier Daily's comment moderation policy

Yesterday we wrote about the importance of creating public spaces for students to connect and interact. At cavalierdaily.com, we strive to do just that — online. Virtual dialogue is a poor substitute for the Lawn's teeming throngs. But as The Cavalier Daily moves toward a digital-first newsroom, we are committed to fostering a web presence that is welcoming, stimulating and, above all, civil.

An informal contract governs the relationship between a newspaper and its readers. The Cavalier Daily's debts to its readers, it should be said, far outweigh our readers' obligations to us. If there were no readers, there would be no Cavalier Daily. So we are grateful for readers of all stripes. Whether you glance at our top headlines once a month or read the newspaper cover to cover each day, we are happy to have your eyes on our pages. We encourage your comments online and benefit from reading your responses to our coverage. But readers who interact with our material online or in print must abide by minimal rules of verbal conduct.

We consider online comments analogous to a letter to the editor or a guest column in the print edition. As such, we require comments to meet certain standards. Searching for praise in a thread of online comments is a fool's errand, and positivity is not a metric we use in determining which comments to delete. But we hold that obscenities, defamation and ad hominem attacks have no place in respectful public dialogue.

A string of posts on an April 9 article, "Sexual Misconduct Board presents mock trial," violated our terms of service for online comments. One offending comment, which we removed, said of Associate

Dean of Students Nicole Eramo: "How does this thing sleep at night?"

We do not pre-moderate comments, and our operations manager is the sole person responsible for comment moderation. So the ad hominem attack against Eramo — which we reprint with hesitation, as an example of how not to behave online — stood for hours before we removed it.


Another poster, under the pseudonym "burn your rapist," defamed Eramo by offering an account of mistreatment the commenter allegedly suffered during a sexual misconduct investigation. Without a way to verify the accuracy of the anonymously made allegations, we risked having our website feature libelous content. In accordance with our comment policy, we deleted the potentially defamatory material.

Some commenters are violently verbose. Others are merely violent. The comments appended to an article reflect a newspaper's character. We do not want to be responsible for creating a frightening online environment. Public dialogue cannot thrive amid abuse and intimidation.

The antidote to a toxic online atmosphere is a modicum of civility. We appreciate your contributions to fostering engaged discussion at cavalierdaily.com, and entreat you to continue posting comments. But to keep the website a safe place for everyone's words, we ask commenters to refrain from posting inappropriate material. The difference between our website and a forum like Collegiate ACB is that we strive to be a home for civil dialogue and a voice for positive change. And that goal requires, as the adage goes, moderation in all things.

A silent epidemic

As Take Back the Night ends, our responsibility to combat sexual violence continues

One in four college women have been sexually assaulted or have experienced attempted rape, according to a 2010 Department of Justice study.

Women between the ages of 16 and 24 will experience sexual violence at a rate that is four times higher than the rate for all women. And approximately 32 percent of college students are victims of dating violence.

Based on these statistics, we all know a survivor of sexual violence: a classmate in one of our lectures, a sister in our sorority, or a close friend. Yet the majority of college stu-

dents who are raped never tell anyone, and suffer in silence. The Department of Justice's study found that college students often keep quiet because they blame themselves for what happened. Victim blaming is perpetuated by "rape culture" on college campuses.

"Rape culture" manifests itself in a number of ways. It's a culture that questions what a girl was wearing or how drunk she was in response to her story. It's a culture that questions a woman's experiences by asking if she was having post-sex regret, rather than acknowledging the possibility of violence. It's a cul-

ture that doesn't want to "ruin" a man's life over one "mistake." Instead of holding perpetrators accountable, the focus is on what

victims could have done differently to prevent the assault.

While college students are at a greater risk of sexual assault than women in general, there is a culture of silence when it comes to addressing the issue of sexual violence. More importantly, most assault cases that are reported do not result

in prosecutions or convictions.

Take Back the Night, an annual

program at U.Va., hopes to end

the silence surrounding dating

violence and sexual vio-

lence at our University.

By providing an opportunity for survivors to speak out against sexual vio-

lence, the

week of events aimed to pro-

vide comfort and empow-

erment for survivors, their

friends, and our community at

large.

One in four is not just a statis-

tic. It is our fellow peers who experience real violence. In a University where we pride ourselves on a community of trust, there should be no incidents of sexual violence, and survivors

should not have to suffer in silence.

As bystanders, we all have a responsibility to help prevent incidents from occurring. While the events of Take Back the Night are over, our responsibility to support survivors and help end the violence

should continue everyday.
