Brittney Cooper is Associate Professor of Women's and Gender Studies and Africana Studies at Rutgers University. She teaches courses on Black feminist theory, Black Intellectual Thought, Hip Hop, Gender and Media.

Cooper is a widely sought-after public speaker at universities throughout the country and an in-demand commentator for radio, podcasts, and television. She is a regular contributor at Cosmpolitan.com and co-founder of the Crunk Feminist Collective and blog.
