Traffic Commission Agenda April 20, 2005

Motion to suspend the rules and take items 2a and 3b out of order made by Robert Trane

Item #2 – Request for Fire Lane

a) Conwell St – extend existing fire lane from Frances St to the end of Conwell St (submitted by Ald. O'Donovan)

Residents of the street appeared to voice their opinions both for and against establishing a fire lane. Those who were opposed to the fire lane felt that better enforcement of snow emergency regulations would negate the need for a fire lane and all residents asked that cars be both ticketed and towed when in violation of snow emergency regulations. It was also mentioned that the No Parking Here to Corner sign is located 14 ¹/₂ ft from the corner, which is in conflict with the Within 20 ft of Intersection Regulation. The Department of Traffic & Parking will investigate the location of the sign and relocate if necessary. Deputy Chief Graney reported that the SFD did a 4-night survey of parking on this street and concluded that the Fire Department did not have adequate access to this end of the street. Stephen Jones reported that parking enforcement of this street showed that most vehicles parked on the street are residents of Somerville with valid residential permits. After a motion was made to approve the fire lane, residents asked that the city strictly enforce it.

Request from Ames Envelope (March 16, 05) to reconsider a previous request from Nov. 17, 04 to change 10 parking spaces on Properzi Way, alongside their building, from 1 Hr Parking 8am-5pm to unrestricted parking

Robert Trane made a motion to add an item for discussion on behalf of the Board of Alderman: The BOA would like the process for making a street residential permit parking changed. Concerns were raised that the current process is both tedious and difficult and they recommend giving the Traffic Commission the authority to approve streets for permit parking without the petition process. The Director of Traffic & Parking

felt that this could cause potential problems with the residents. It was then suggested that the process be reversed so that if the Traffic Commission approved a street for permit parking and residents were against it, they could take up a petition to have it

rescinded. The Director of Traffic & Parking felt that this too could be considered tedious and difficult. Robert Trane requested that the Director submit a letter to the Board of Alderman stating the potential problems of posting streets for residential permit parking without adhering to the petition process.
