# Holland & College Status Update

- We continue to review feedback we have been receiving.
  - Project website
- Ongoing engagement with Davis business/commercial property owner community via Chamber of Commerce
- At least one more community meeting expected in early spring
- Construction bid being finalized by IAM
  - Expected to be advertised for bid 2/1
  - Includes example designs for the 'expanded toolbox' such as speed tables, raised crosswalks/intersections, and refuge islands.
- Consultant preparing an expanded scope of design work
  - Preferred treatments identified for each intersection
  - Link for review

### Mobility 2021 Updates

**Council Order:** That the Mayor make to the City Council a supplementary budget request to immediately add staff and funding to the Mobility Department, which plans and deploys traffic calming infrastructure, and that the Mayor increase the Mobility Department staff and budget by at least 50% in the FY 2022 budget.
