* indicates site is part of a larger Route 38/28 project and might be feasible as "Early Action" standalone construction project


** indicates site is a desired safety improvement not yet in design phase



NACTO Training Workshop with City Staff

- Interdepartmental workshops on 4/29 and 4/30
 - Included Finance, Planning & Zoning, PSUF, Parking, DPW, IAM-Engineering
 - Focus on the transportation project delivery process from end to end
- Initial takeaways and next steps
 - Establish and document clear processes and workflows
 - Consistent community engagement
 - Internal kick-off meetings`
 - Analysis of existing conditions and project evaluation framework
 - Standardize internal feedback loop



Mobility Division Development Review

- How does Mobility factor in?
 - Mobility Management Plans
 - WHAT: focused on transportation demand management, mode shift, changing commuting behavior
 - WHO:
 - 20 or more units
 - 50,000 sf or more of commercial space
 - Hotels, commercial parking, non-residential with 50 or more employees
 - Transportation Impact Studies
 - WHAT:
 - Analyze the projected impacts of the proposed development on surrounding intersections and roadways
 - Analyze existing conditions of pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure; important source of data and focuses mitigation on pedestrian infrastructure, transit access, and bike infrastructure improvements
 - WHO:
 - 20 or more units
 - Greater than 50,000 sf of gross floor area
 - Greater than 25,000 sf or more of commercial space
 - Specific uses defined in Development Review Application requirements
 - Thresholds for exemptions to encourage the construction of less parking
 - Transportation Access Plans
 - WHAT: Pedestrian, bicycle, and vehicular access and circulation at a development
 - WHO: Any development requiring Site Plan Approval proposing changes to curbs, sidewalks, on-street parking, pavement markings, street ROW



Mobility Division Development Review

What types of developments do we review and what do we require?

Smallish (~20-30 unit) residential developments

- One month MBTA pass for new residents (up to 2/household)
- One month Blue Bikes memberships for new residents (up to 2/household)
- Real time transit information

Specific uses (cannabis retailers)

- Long and short-term bike parking with wayfinding signage
- Annual monitoring and reporting of employee and customer mode of travel

Large developments (lab, retail, office space) (100,000 – 500,000 sqft)

- Parking spaces for EV charging
- Parking spaces for carpool
- Sponsorship of Blue Bikes station
- Membership in a Transportation Management Agency



Other Quick Project Updates

- Lower Medford Street
 - Repaving completed on May 12
 - Pavement markings and flex post installation expected over the next few weeks, weather permitting
- Somerville Avenue
 - Raised crosswalks under construction this week Linden Street to Rossmore Street
 - Final streetscape work continues on south side (pavers, planters, irrigation, trees)
 - Prep work for final paving West of Prospect St (paving expected later in June)
- College Avenue
 - Startup work is underway, and includes drainage work at Morrison Avenue and Francesca Avenue
 - Sidewalk work to begin mid June starting at Powder House Circle and working toward Davis Square
- MassDOT Shared Streets Grant Projects
 - Mystic Ave. Bus Lane pavement markings planned for 5/24
 - Wellington Br. Bike Lanes pavement markings planned for early June
- Powder House Circle
 - Work planned to start in July/August
 - PTAC opportunity: help with outreach and education; messaging around removal of signals



Other Quick Project Updates

- Spring pavement markings priorities
 - Broadway bike lanes green; Central Broadway legends
 - Neighborways and red-backed crosswalks
 - Bow St. refresh; Elm St refresh
- Western Washington
 - Project evaluation to be completed soon; can present at June PTAC
 - Getting some pushback on parking removal; protected bike lanes
- Pearl Street
 - Working towards 25% design now, sooner is better for input on conceptual design ideally before next PTAC meeting
 - Type of input needed: Recommendations on traffic calming locations and treatment type priorities, feedback on direction of conceptual design
- Piloting using the resurfacing program for dispersed intersection treatments based on intersection scoring analysis
 - Transitioning tactical interventions to permanent safety improvements at intersections on Neighborways
 - Gilman St at Walnut St
 - Gilman St at Cross St
 - Oliver St at Glen St
 - Oliver St at Franklin St
 - Other higher priority intersections
 - Temple at Heath/Sewall
 - Cross et Everett
- Piloting corridor level 'light construction' traffic calming on streets identified as high speed or with multiple high scoring intersections
 - Including speed humps/tables on
 - Jaques St
 - Fellsway W
 - Franklin St
 - Cross St
 - Contract specs/docs in process for a CDBG funded project
